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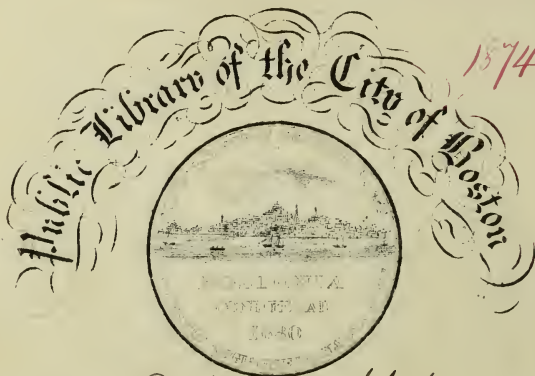

REPORT OF THE AUDITORS.

The Auditors of the Town of Brighton, chosen at the regular meeting in March, 1873, to examine and audit the accounts of the Treasurer for the current year, have attended to their duty, and herewith submit their report in print agreeably to the vote of the citizens.

They have examined the accounts of the Treasurer, and find them correctly kept and properly vouched, and a balance of cash in the Treasury of one hundred and fifty-eight dollars and forty-four cents.

The following amounts have been properly approved and allowed, but remain as a debt of the Town: —

The Auditors have endeavored to present in the final report of the town affairs a full statement of all transactions of the past year, but they have not been able, after repeated solicitations, to procure from the several officials and committees the customary reports, and they are reluctantly com-

pelled to omit those of the Selectmen, School Committee and Trustees of Holton Library, together with many others of minor importance. At the close of the municipal existence of the town, it would be gratifying to present to the inhabitants a full and detailed record of the past year ; but the prevailing impression has been that the act of annexation has blotted out the year's affairs, and the officers chosen at the annual meeting have ignored their amenability to their constituents for an account of their stewardship.
