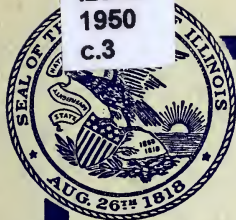

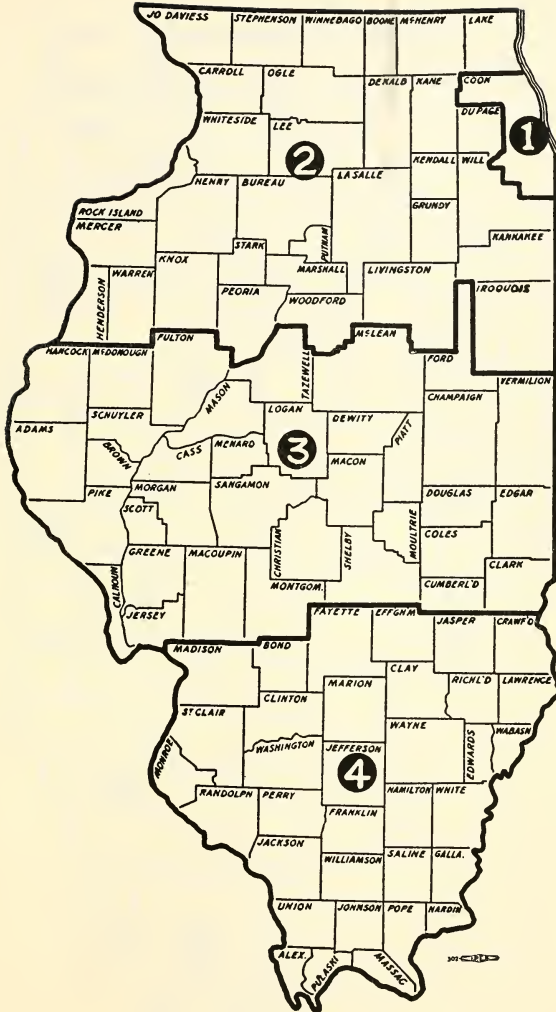

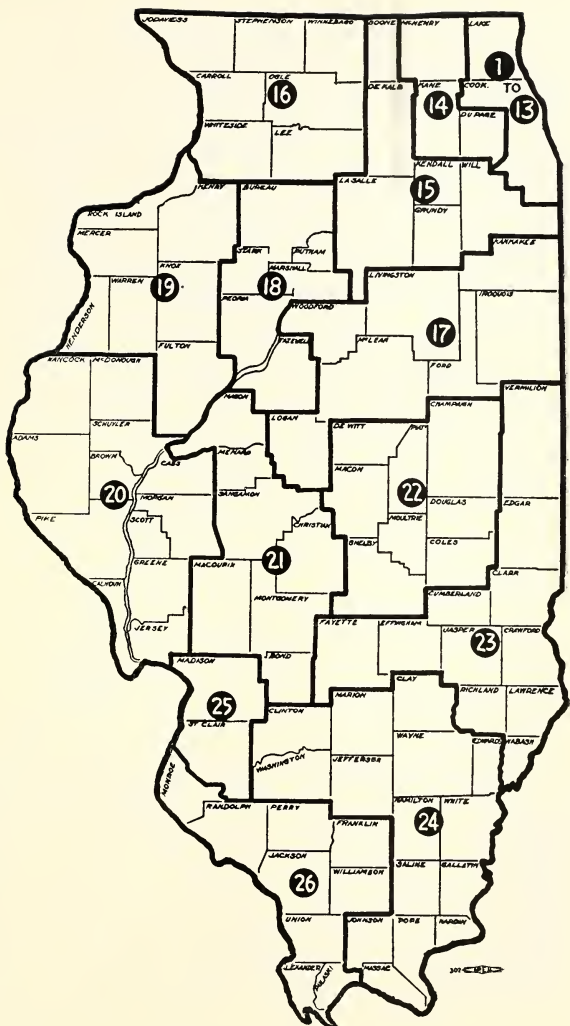


Supreme Court District Apportionment.

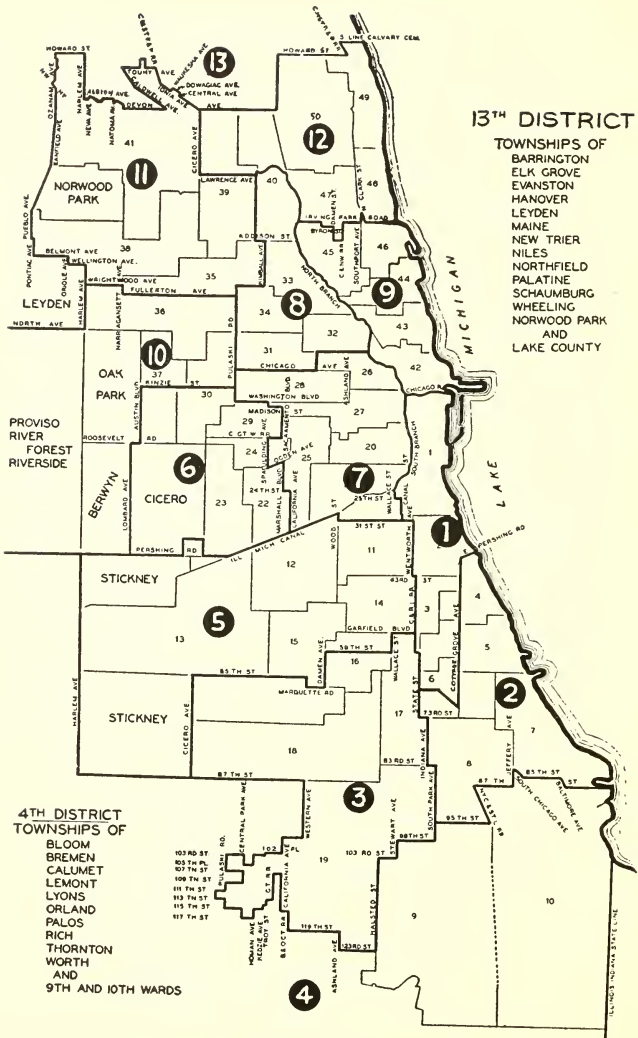


Appellate Court District Apportionment.
