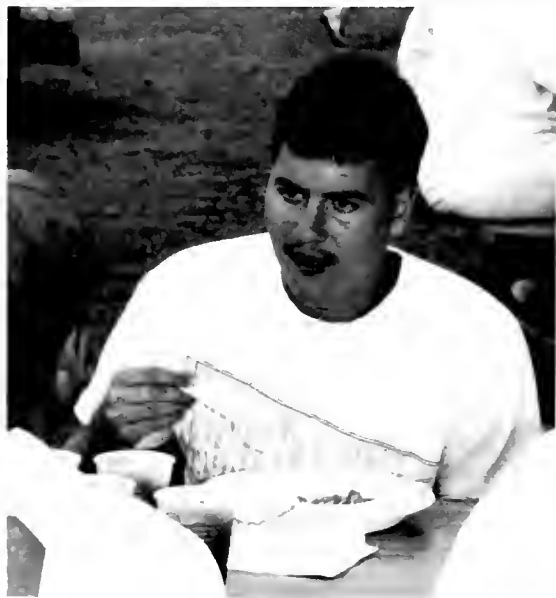

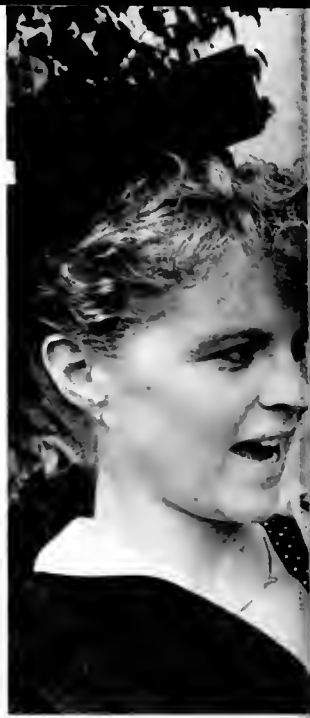

The Honors and Leaders programs are scholarships awarded by Mount Olive College on the basis of academic achievement. Students in the Honors Program must maintain a 3.2 GPA and perform a service project. Students in the Leaders Program must also perform a project and maintain a 2.8 GPA. Students in the Honors Program, advised by Ms. Costa, are enrolled in a special class where they meet the requirements for their scholarships. The Leaders Program is advised by Dean Van Norman. These students are responsible for performing 20 hours of service per semester.

Honor and Leader students perform various projects of service to the school and the community. Some of these projects include tutoring elementary and high school students, Read to Succeed, and helping at the local Boys and Girls Clubs. Through these projects the students learn responsibility and have the opportunity to benefit their school as well as their community. The students participating in these programs benefit as well through the experience gained and the knowledge they receive from those they help. This knowledge gained by serving others will remain with the students for a lifetime.

The Three Worlds Of Mount Olive College

Mount Olive College has opened two educational centers to better meet the demands for quality education. Seymour Johnson and the New Bern Centers have been two very successful additions for the College. According to Dr. Opey Jeanes, The Base Program Director at Seymour, enrollment has increased 14 percent over the 1993-94 academic year. There are many opportunities for both military and civilian students. The curriculum at Seymour Johnson offers complete programs in business management, accounting, human resource development, and a wide range of general liberal arts courses leading to a bachelors of science or arts degree.

Mount Olive College also enjoys another very successful program at its New Bern Center, under the direction of Mr. Frank Cizerle. The Center at New Bern was opened to the public last fall. The New Bern Center offers a degree leading to a Bachelor of Science Management and Organizational Development. The success of the New Bern Program assists in giving adults an opportunity to finish college and to gain better jobs. According to Cizerle, "New Bern was a good choice for the center for two very good reasons. In this area there was a demand for this type of educational program that enables students to accelerate in a degree program. Also, Mount Olive College has a lot of support from the local Baptist Churches." Currently, there are 51 students enrolled at the New Bern Center. A minimum of 126 semester hours is required for completion of a Bachelors degree.
