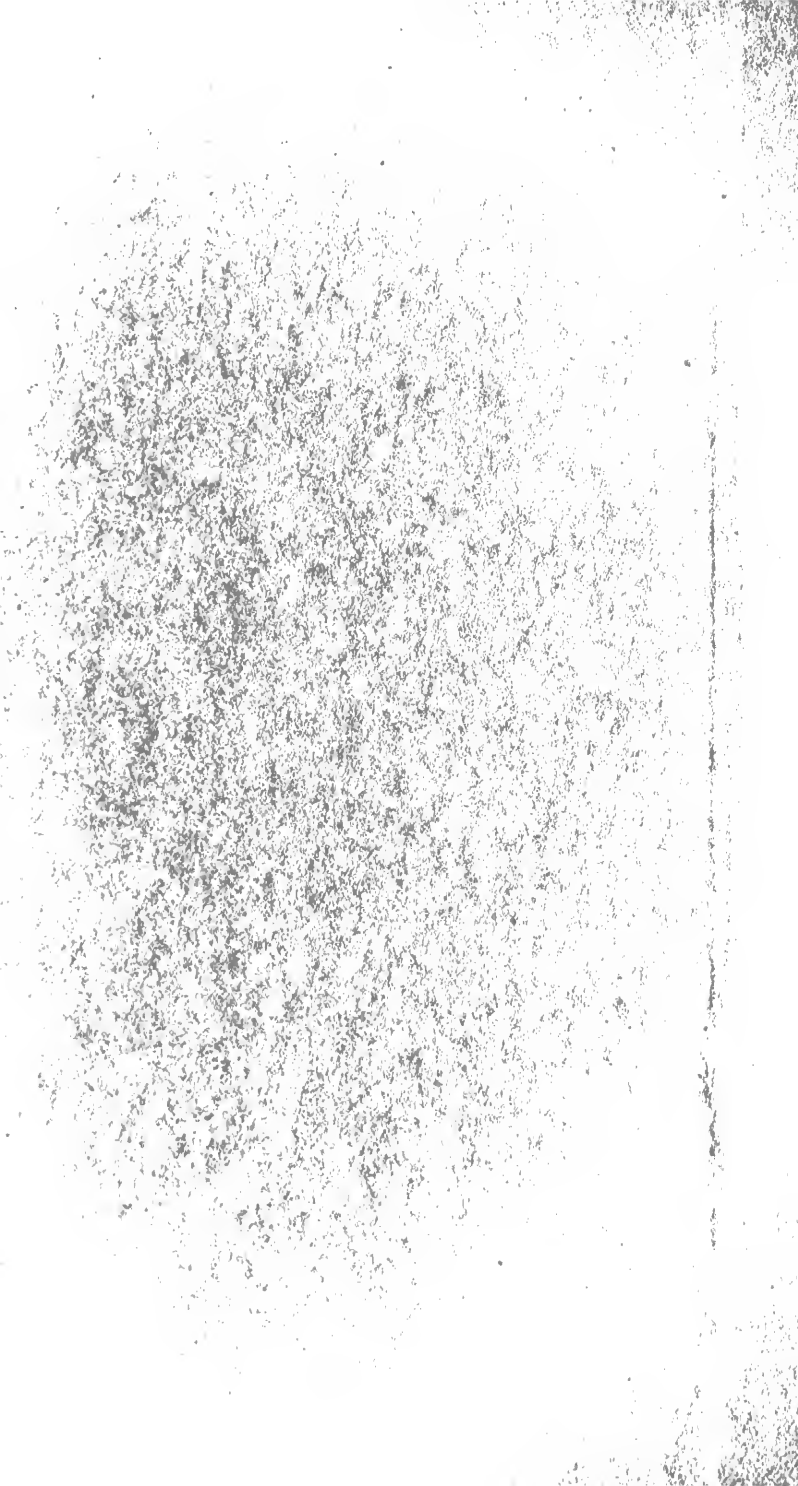


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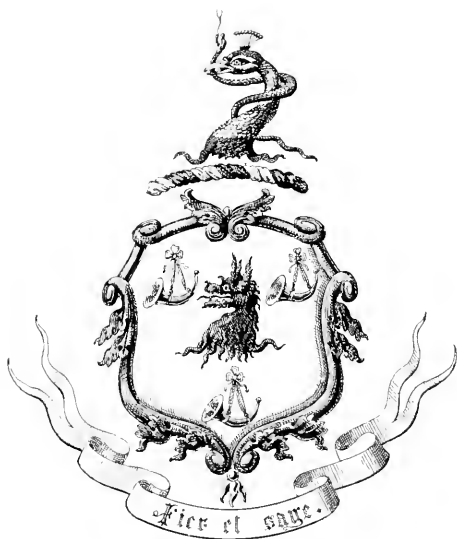

Capt. **Gamaliel Bradford**, 3rd child Col. Gamaliel and Sarah (Alden) Bradford.

B. Nov. 4, 1763, at Duxbury, Mass.; d. March 7, 1824, at Cambridge, Mass. He served in the War of the Revolution with his father and held the rank of Lieutenant at the age of 17 years. At one time he commanded an armed merchantman, and in an engagement with pirates in the Mediterranean, he lost a leg, but came off victorious. He was appointed Warden of the Mass. States Prison, which office he held for many years. He m. Aug. 6, 1792, Elizabeth Hickling, dau. William and Elizabeth (Hudson) Hickling, b. Aug. 22, 1770, at Boston, Mass.; d. May 19, 1817, at Duxbury, Mass. 9 children.

No. 1.—Capt. Gamaliel Bradford was a direct descendant from Gov. Wm. Bradford on his father's side, and on his mother's side from John Alden of the Mayflower, as follows:

Gov. Wm. Bradford,¹ b. 1589, Austerfield, Eng; d. May 9, 1657, Plymouth, Mass. He m. as his 2d wife, Aug. 14, 1623, Mrs. Alice (Carpenter) Southworth, b. ——— 1591; d. March 26, 1670.

Major Wm. Bradford,² b. June 17, 1624; d. Feb. 20, 1704. He m. as his 1st wife in 1652, Alice Richards, dau. of Thos. Richards, who came over in ship "Mary and John" in 1630, and settled at Dedham.

Lieut. Sam'l Bradford,³ b. ——— 1668, at Plymouth, d. April 11, 1714, at Duxbury. He m. June, 1680, Hannah Rogers, dau. John and Elizabeth (Dennison) Rogers.

Judge Gamaliel Bradford,⁴ b. May 18, 1704, at Duxbury, and d. there April 24, 1778. He m. Aug. 30, 1718, Abigail Bartlett, dau. Benjamin and Ruth (Pabodie) Bartlett.

Col. Gamaliel Bradford,⁵ b. Sept. 2, 1731, at Duxbury, and d. there Jan. 4, 1807. He m. as his 1st wife, Sarah Alden, on March 10, 1757.

No. 2.—Also, John Alden¹ was of the Leydeu Church and came over in the Mayflower. He was b. — 1590, and d. Sept. 12, 1687. He was last survivor of signers of the Compact. He m. Priscilla, dau. of Wm Mullins.

No. 3.—Wm. Ripley¹, with his wife, two sons and two daughters, came in 1638 from Hingham, Eng., and settled in Hingham, Mass. He m. the second time Aug. 29, 1654. Mrs. Elizabeth Thaxter, widow of Thos. Thaxter, and d. July 20, 1656. She m. again for third time Jan. 20, 1658, John Dwight, of Dedham, and d. July 17, 1660.

John Ripley², b. in England; d. Feb. 12, 1684, at Hingham. He m. Elizabeth Hobart dau. Rev. Peter Hobart, who was b. in England in 1632, and d. 1692 at Hingham.

Peter Ripley³, b. Oct. 24, 1698; d. April 22, 1742. He lived in Hingham. He m. April 27, 1706, Sarah Lazelle, dau. John and Elizabeth (Gates) Lazelle, b. Nov. 29, 1666; d. Sept. 12, 1706.

Peter Ripley⁴, b. Oct. 25, 1695; d. April 28, 1765. He lived at Hingham. He m. Jan. 5, 1721, Silence Lincoln.

Nathaniel Ripley⁵, b. Sept. 18, 1721, at Hingham. He moved first to Woodstock, Conn. and late in life to Barre, where he d. — 1788. He m. Dec. 20, 1753, Lydia Kent, dau. Ebenezer and Hannah (Gannett) Kent; b. April 24, 1725; d. June 27, 1816, both at Hingham.

Rev. Ezra Ripley, D. D., b. April 20, 1750, at Woodstock, Conn.; d. Sept. 21, 1841, at Concord, Mass. He was grad. H. C. in 1776, and pastor of church at Concord for fifty years. He m. Nov. 16, 1778, Mrs. Phebe (Bliss) Emerson, widow of Rev. Wm. Emerson, and dau. Rev. Daniel and Phebe (Walker) Bliss; b. Oct. 28, 1741, and d. Feb. 16, 1825.

Rev. Saml. Ripley, D.D., b. Mar. 11, 1723; m. Sarah Alden Bradford, No. 7198. He fitted for college in the public schools of his native town, and graduated from H. C. in 1804. On Nov. 29, 1809, he was settled over the Unitarian Church at Waltham, as the successor of Dr. Cushing. He resigned after the union of the two Unitarian churches, and was minister of the church at Lincoln. In 1846 he resigned this pastorate and returned to his early home at Concord. He died suddenly of disease of the heart in his carriage, on his way home from the depot, on Nov. 24, 1847. Ralph Waldo Emerson says of him; "He was a man of ardent temperament frank, generous, affectionate, public spirited, and with an humble estimate of himself."

No. 7.—John Howland¹ came over in the "Mayflower" as a servant or attendant on Gov. Carver. He became a prominent man in the Colony and d. Feb. 23, 1672-3. He m. soon after his arrival Elizabeth Tilley, dau. of Edward Tilley.

Lieut. John Howland,² b. Feb. 24, 1626-7, at Plymouth. He removed to Barnstable about 1658. He m. Oct. 26, 1651, Mary Lee, dau. of Robert.

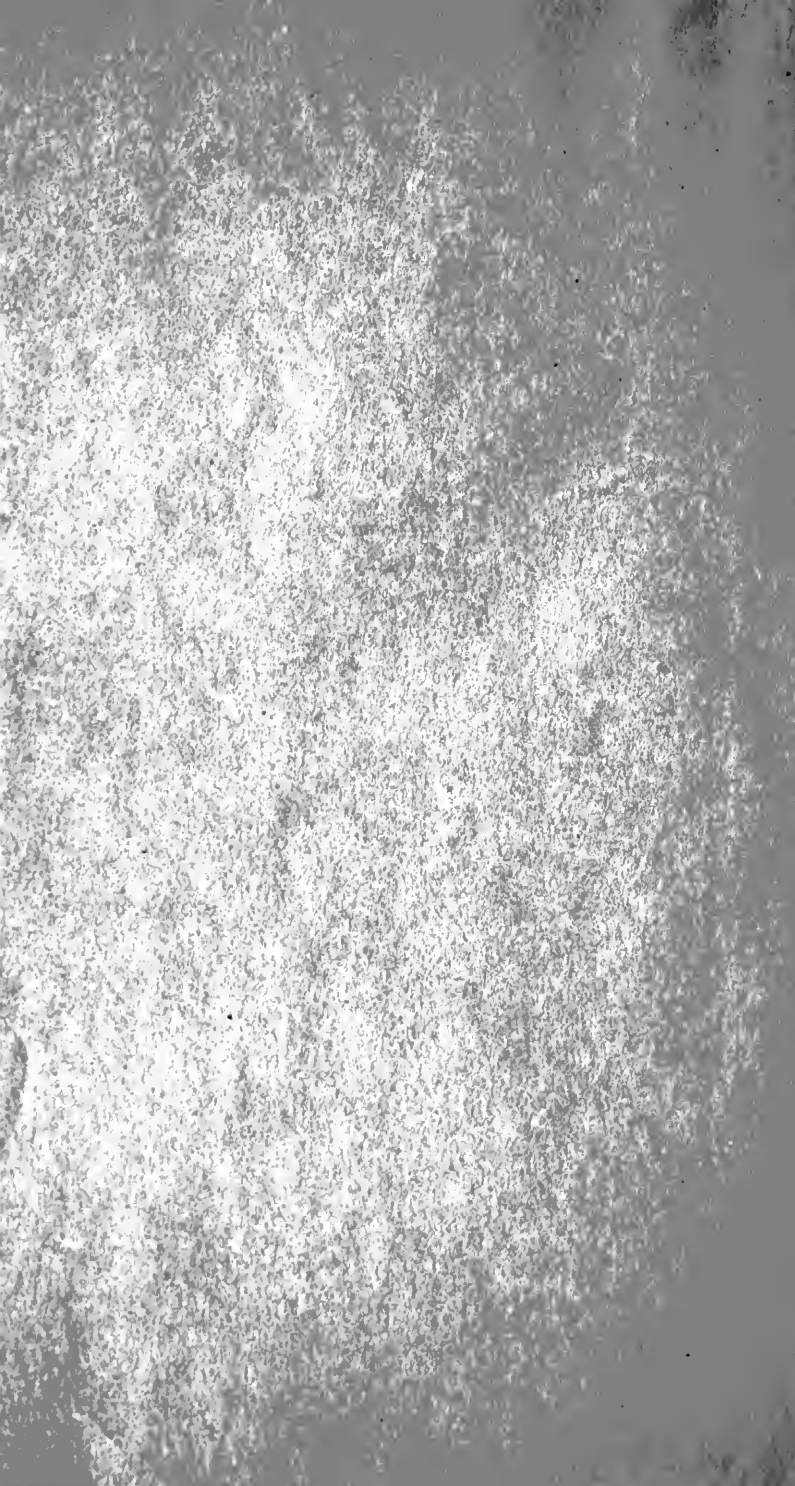
