# JAMES REYNOLDS

Rhode Island and Providence Records state that James Reynolds<sup>1</sup> petitioned the Assembly for land in King's Province, May 13, 1665. He took the oath of allegiance, May 20, 1671 He was taken with others to the prison in Hartford, for refusing to acknowledge allegiance to the Colony of Connecticut, May 24, 1677. "He and forty-one other inhabitants of Narragansett petitioned the King to put an end to the differences about the government," July 29, 1679. In 1687 was overseer of the poor. In 1688 served on grand jury. "In 1690 was conservator of the peace."

In "American Ancestry," James is called the son of William, of Kingstown R. I., in 1647. Some genealogists state that James was born in England in 1617. *M.* Deborah — in 1646. She was *b*. in 1620. He *d*. in 1700-02, in No. Kingstown, R. I. His will was proved in 1702. The children of James and Deborah were:
