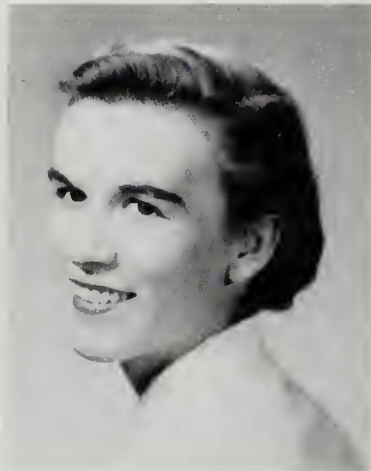
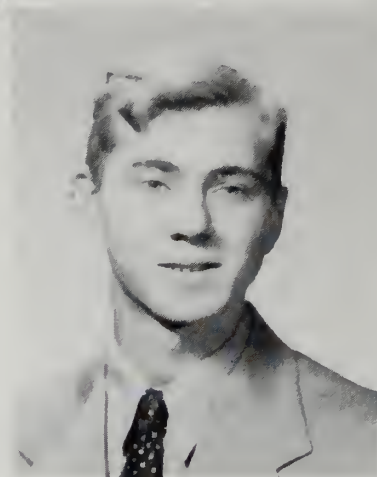
JACQUELIN EMERSON MARR

MARILYN LOUISE STARKWEATHER

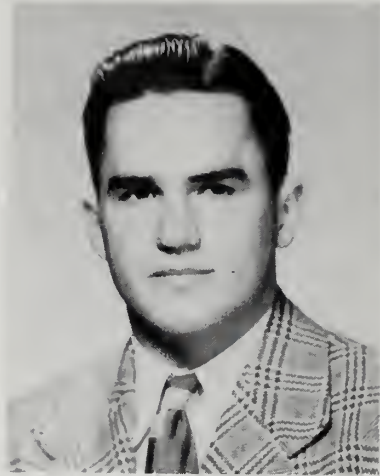

*Danny*

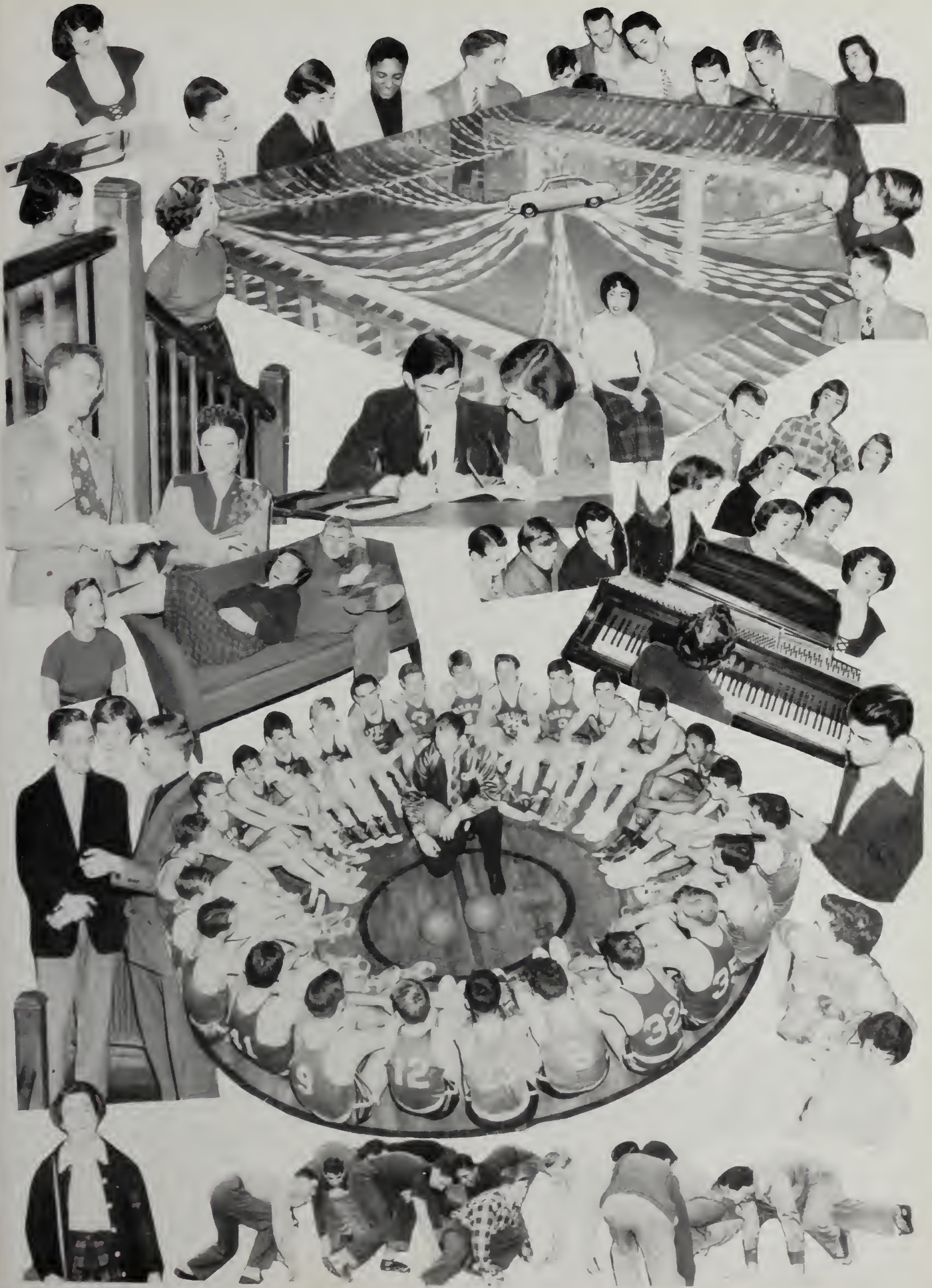
