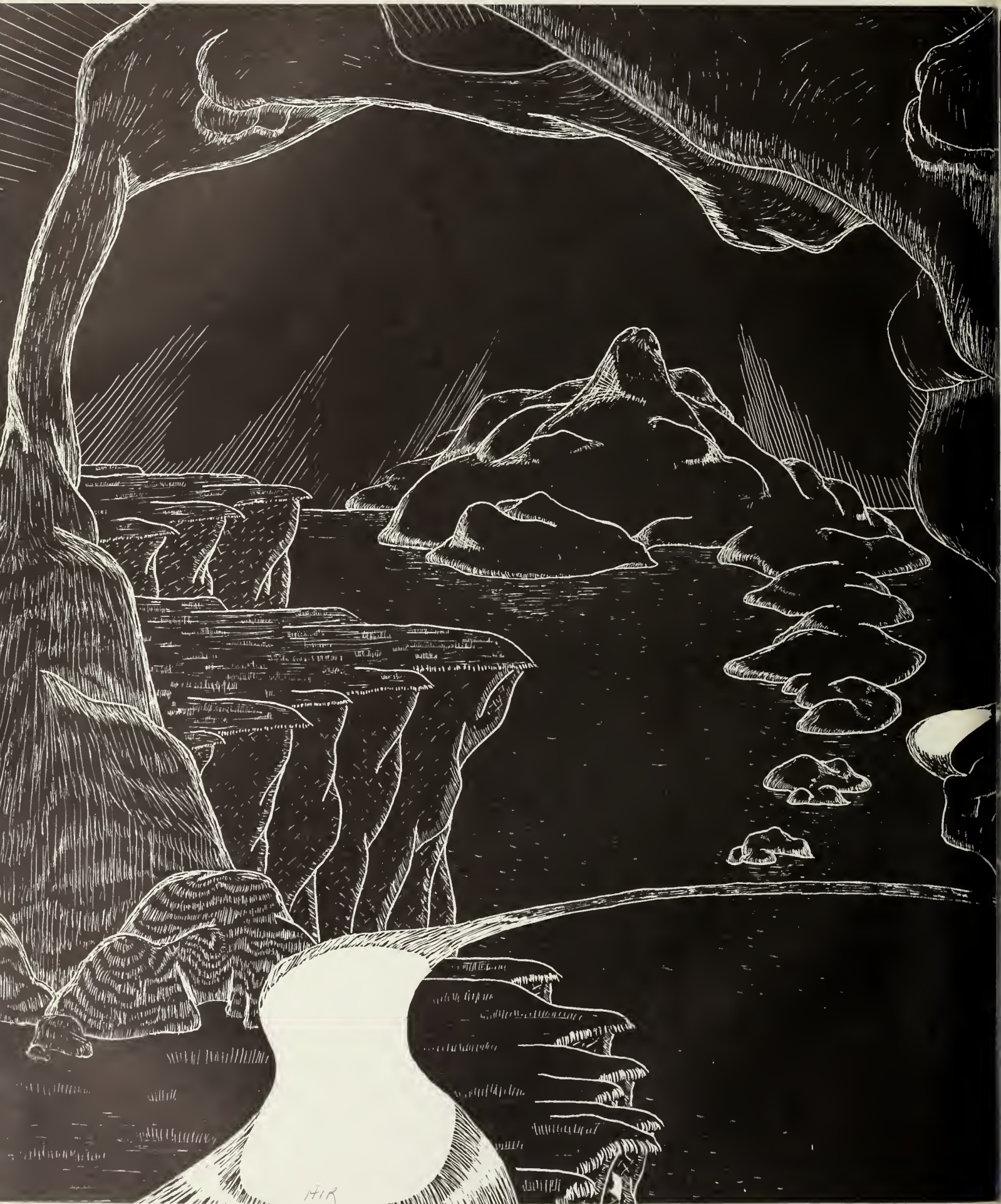

in my life I've loved them all.



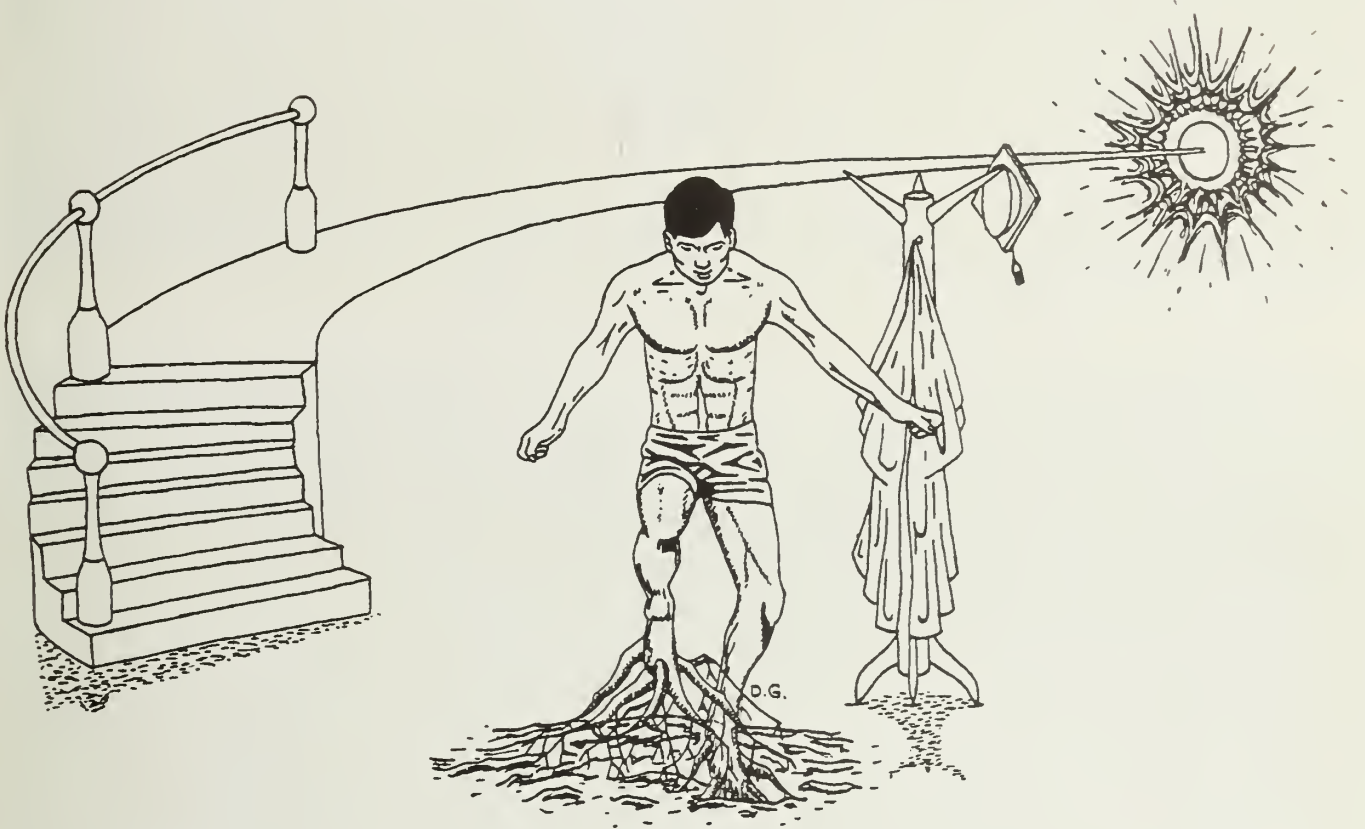


### Dedication

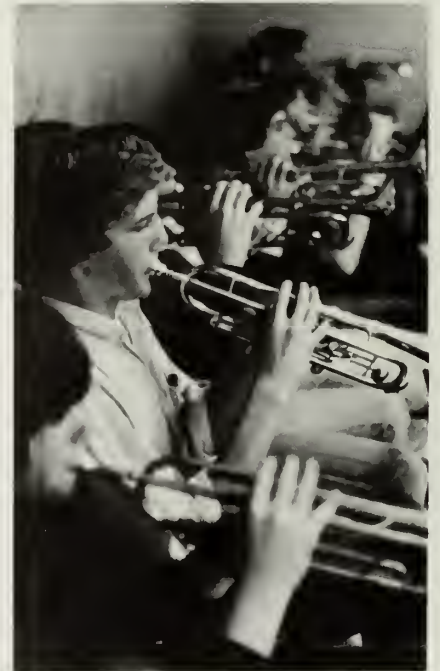






## D.H.S. Band

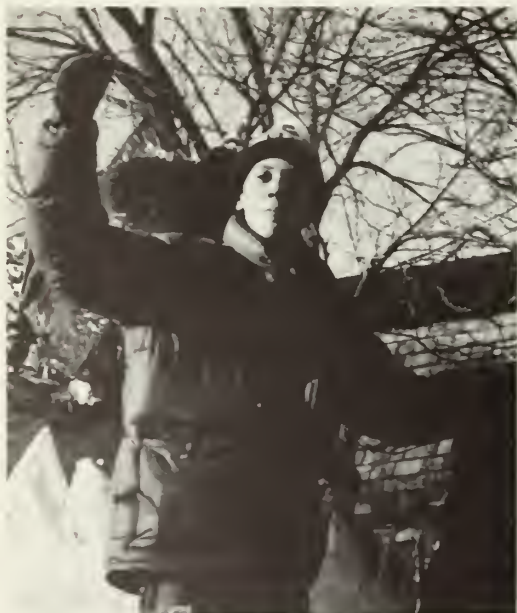






## Homecoming Week-end 1976

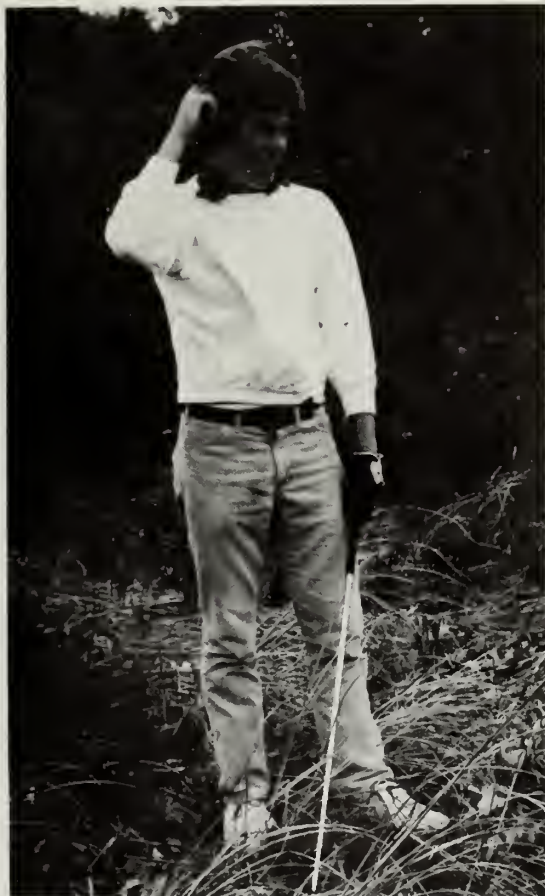




## D.H.S. Golf

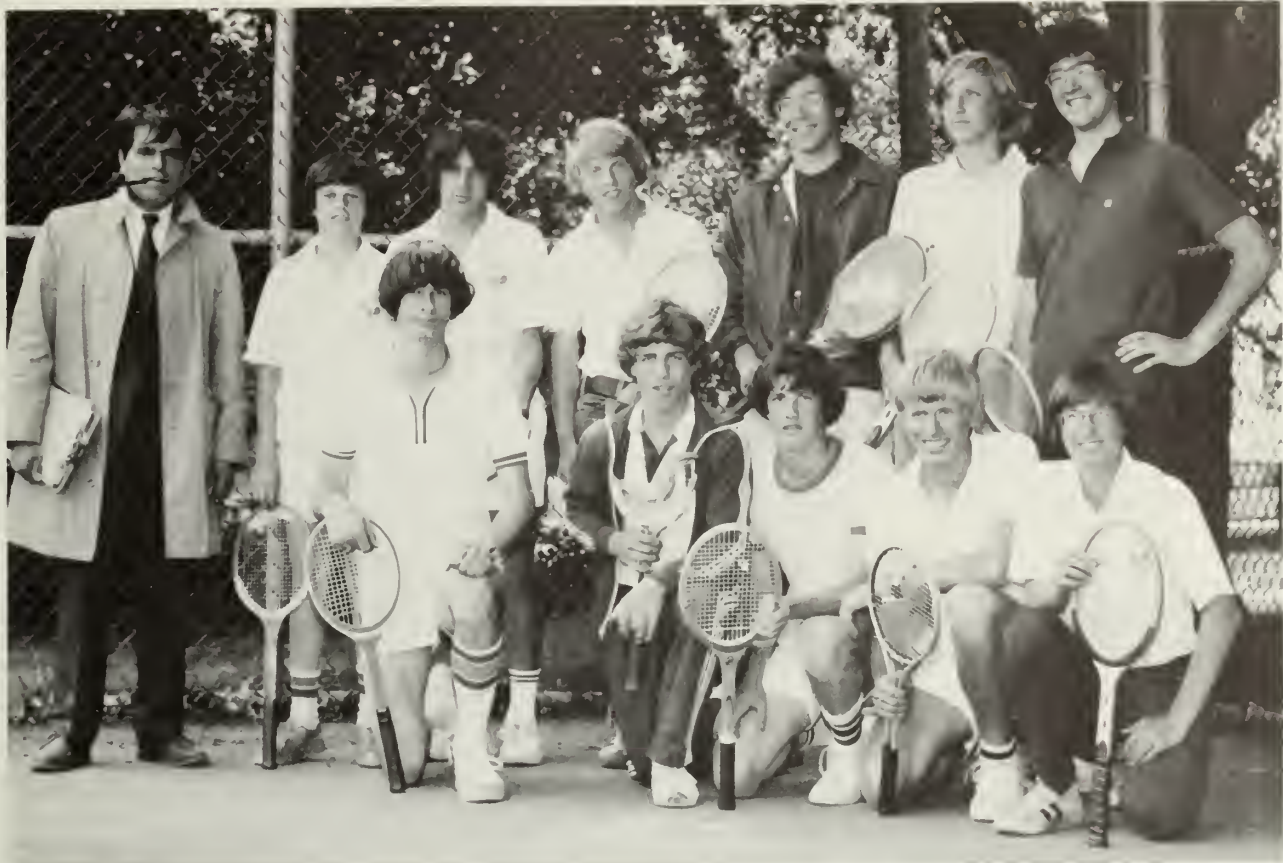

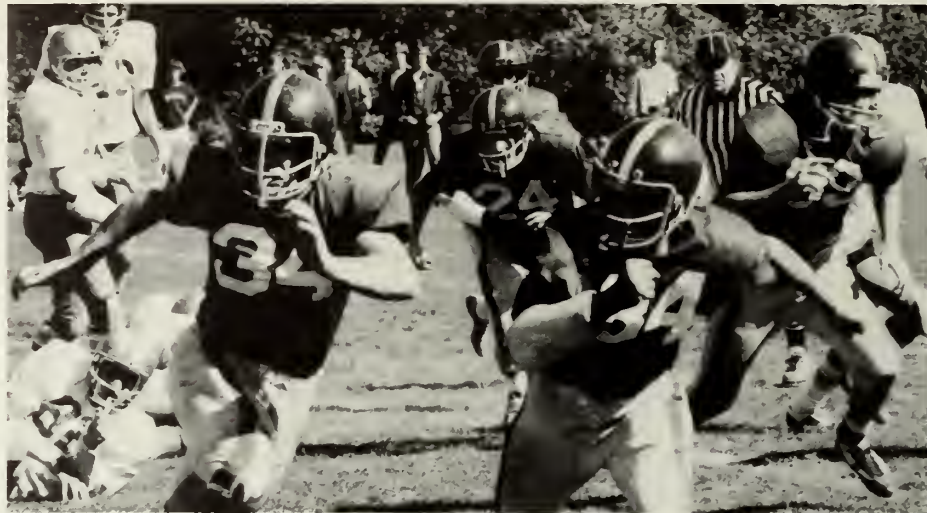
# Tournament
