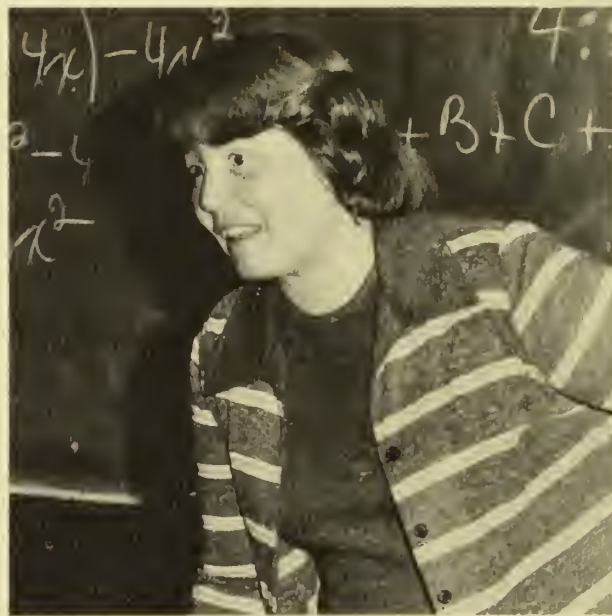


The bay is calm for a time

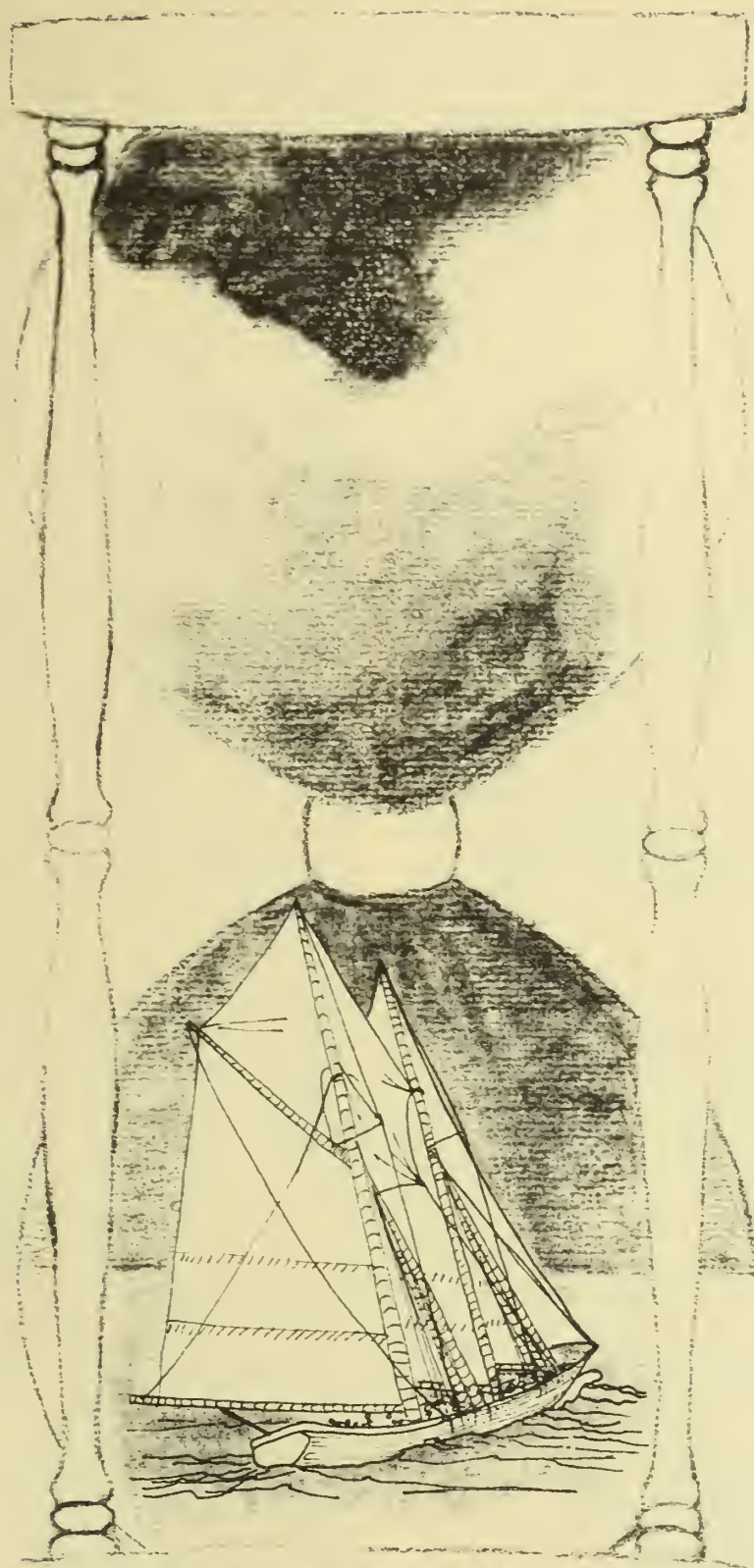
Homecoming Weekend 1978

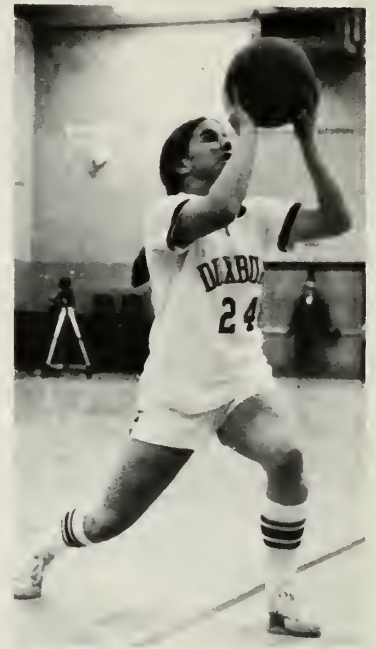


Girls Basketball
