I have the honor to state that to recover the value of a cargo of 1500 Barrels Pennsylvania Flour, exported by me from hence to Havana, I am compelled to visit said city, for the object of seeking redress from my Factor, one of the Consuls ad^o of said City, who suffered this staple not only to rot on his hands, but has attached other Property of mine in that City, on the plea that I am answerable to pay the Spanish duties on said Cargo Am \$4000.

Whenever I may appear at Havana I am advised it is the intention of my said Spanish Factor, to deposit my person in Jail under the charge of debt to him for said duties, and thus to deter me from applying to the Consulate for redress, as there is no duplicate tribunal there, like unto our U States District Court, for the convenience of such foreigners as desire to oppress their Country.

To enjoy my personal liberty at Havana, and thereby succeed in maintaining my rights as before

a native of Philadelphia, I am advised to apply to the U.S. States for protection against any effort to detain my person there.

I understand it is the practice to deliver letters with dispatches, to certain passengers hence called 'Beasts of dispatches', who sometimes claim a compensation out of the U.S. Treasury.

I now solicit from the Department of State, the ordinary letter issued by - it to a passenger, accompanied with News papers or dispatches to be addressed to our Consul at Havana, and whatever dispatch may be delivered to me, I hereby contract to deliver it at Havana, free of all charge to the United States.
