I would add that if the government has fixed or shall fix a sum to be paid by persons liable to draft, or actually drafted, in lieu of personal service, I, or an agent whom I shall leave behind, would prefer to pay such sum immediately to the government, on the delivery and cancellation of the proposed bond, if the government should prefer to receive such payment instead of a substitute.

I shall leave this letter and enclosed passport, with the charges for a new passport, with the Provost Marshal General M. M. Phair, to whom you will please address the new passport, to prevent all doubt as to its sufficiency for the object above proposed. Re-

1. That the term "citizen," as used in the order of the Secretary of War, includes persons of foreign birth, who have conferred upon them the right to hold real estate and are entitled to vote at elections.
2. That persons who have voted at elections are estopped from denying their legal right to do so, and having the right to hold real estate, and having exercised the franchise of a citizen will be held to discharge its obligations.
3. Minors occupy the status of their fathers.
4. That every person upon the list is presumed to be properly enrolled and to entitle any person to be erased, satisfactory evidence must be made to the Commissioner to rebut such legal presumption and to establish the fact necessary to be proved, or it must be known to the Commissioner on his personal knowledge.
5. That a certificate of the county surgeon for disability is *prima facie* evidence to entitle the person to be erased from the roll.

A gentleman by the name of J. P. Greenwald, (of the State of Ohio,) who is connected in business with one of my brothers desires to go to the island of Cuba and other of the West India islands, but is unable to leave, as he informs me without a passport from the State Department. The business of the firm with which he is connected is in the West Indies, and it is a matter of considerable importance to the partners that he should leave at an early date. If not inconsistent with the public interest I will feel obliged to you if you direct a passport to be sent for Mr Greenwald to the care of Mr Horatio Nunes, Philadelphia, Pa.

I am afraid we are doing badly out here in the West. Mumfordsville has surrendered and Bragg is reported marching steadily on to Louisville, destroying rail road bridges and trestle works behind him, in order to prevent the advance by Buell. Why Buell did precede him at Mumfordsville, (he had been for several days at Bowling Green,) no military man here can imagine. I have nothing to say

against Buell, but I think Rosecrans would have
been bolder and more expeditious. I am afraid, if
Bragg continues to advance, there will have to be consi-
derable augmentation of our forces, here, to save
Louisville. I have implicit faith in providence, but
it is providence operating through natural means - clear
heads, loyal hearts and stalwart arms. One of our greatest
misfortunes has been that we have been compelled to
experiment with untried men to see what kind
of Generals they would make.

My dear Sir
It is a long time since we exchanged a note. The last epistolary communication from me to You, was penned to introduce a Mr. Wilkins upon the request of the claimants of the Rancho (or Estancia) called 'La Bolsa de Tomales' in Marine County of this State (California), being personally acquainted with said individual, but one of those interested in said Rancho. It had been confirmed here by the Intendentes and the U. S. District Court, and forwarded for final decision to the Attorney General in Washington, who - as the claimants deemed confident - would dismiss the appeal, which however has not been the case, it has been transferred to the U. S. Supreme Court, which - as I understand will begin its session in December proximo. Truly for the benefit of the case I could have wished it to have been decided in favor of the claimants, otherwise it would be decidedly to my benefit, if the Estate belonged to the U. S. Side the majority of these Mexican grants and claims I believe that this few questions would not admit of much 'sifting'. I would particularly request your kind offices to be exercised towards me, to be and inform me, when the case 'Bolsa de Tomales Rancho' claimed by one Gallego is likely to come on for trial and decision. It will - I dare say - be a plea to express the wish to be informed how it stands in regard of probable result. Mr. A. J. Weston purchased the most valuable part of that Rancho from the claimants, I took a mortgage on the same, to secure an interest in it for my son who is farmer (in January) and at the time intended to come out here. My son changing his plan, and the mortgage not being paid when due, it was presented and the Estate sold to a good friend of mine (subject to the mortgage) and the understanding that Mr. Weston has the right to redeem it previous to the first of January 1863. Should this be done my claim ceases, otherwise it will come into my possession, and in case of its proving to be U. S. property the more valuable, on account of additional 500 Acres, which Mr. Weston improved, but are in dispute between him & the claimants, while the U. S. would by the Law relinquish the entire Rancho to the former and his heirs. Besides this real Estate affair which concerns me, I have another favor to solicit, namely a passport from the State Department. My business interests will call me off or about the commencement of 1863 (the coming year) on a tour to Europe via Mexico, without touching the Eastern States previous my return. With all the work is now in a confusion it would not do to go without such an instrument in the character of a 'Non-descript'. In January 1861 I received the list from Washington in New York, of which I beg leave to give you the particulars (Signatures) on foot. There being no legal claims upon my mortal remains - so objections will probably be raised against granting the above mentioned wish. -

I deeply deplore the civil war raging amongst us, I wish
heart and soul - it could have been avoided, and that the Union
of so vast a country, in itself constituting a World within
itself, might have inviolably been preserved, but my
experience and all I have seen and learned in this world, conduce
to the conviction, that no Union of whatever kind and
character, can in its real and true significance be introduced by
compulsion, that human institutions need be conservative,
and that permanently no good government can or will
emerge from Universal unqualified Suffrage.

Congress I think was much in fault not to have passed
an efficient general Bankruptcy Law previous to your meeting.
I hope we will have the steamer - Mail, re-established, the
Overland Mail does by no means appear reliable, and the
Security of Communication is the very sinews of Commerce.
 Hoping soon to have the gratification to hear of your

RESTRICTIONS ON TRAVEL. The following note from Judge Advocate Turner would appear that the restrictions on foreign travel have moved only in the States where the war has already taken place:

WAR DEPARTMENT, Washington,
City, D. C., Sept. 23, 1866.

John M. Andrews, Esq., New York City.
In answer to yours of the 20th, addressed to Hon. Wm. H. Seward, I say that persons liable to military duty, residing in States where the draft has taken place, and not drafted, need no permit to leave the United States from the War Department. Yours ob't serv't,

Passports will, however, be required from these parties, but no \$1000 bond, as hitherto.— The passports are to be obtained from the Department of State, as before the war. The new passport tax of three dollars will, however, be levied, in accordance with the provisions of the recent tax law.
