

Preface.

IT is not necessary to point out to an intelligent and discerning public, that if you want to know you must ask, and ask persistently. He who is interested in family history must do this more than anyone else, and continue to question and to set down facts through the generations. Old correspondents will remember the quarterly Genealogical Queries and Memoranda (1896-1900), of which the present work is a development. The simple principle to be remembered is that if you seek or can give information as to any pedigree or any family, your own or any other, let the fact be recorded in The Pedigree Directory, to which every inquirer must necessarily refer. It is a shame to hoard information and make no use of it; false pride to be ashamed to ask.

Insertions for The Pedigree Directory, 1918, should be sent in at once. The more entries inserted, the more likely is the work to be consulted.

Persons named in P.C.C. Wills proved A.D. 1750

(Typewritten Lists.)

GOOD progress has been made in the work of listing the names of persons named in wills as above, and the first year is practically finished. The plan is to take all the wills and to note the names of all the persons mentioned in them, just as they come. The year 1750 to begin with was chosen because it was the time of the beginning of much modern migration, so baffling to genealogists. Once get the names of the people mentioned in each will listed, so that they can easily be "run through" by the searcher at home, and at his leisure, much useless wear and tear will be saved, and great progress in research will be made.

To localize the names as much as possible, they are divided into "County Groups," so that those interested in a County or locality need only subscribe for that particular district.

The County Groups are as follows:—

- I. Durham, Northd., Cumbd., Westmd., Yorks.
- II. Lancs., Cheshire, Derbys., Staffs., Salop, Heref., Worc.
- III. Linc., Notts., Leic., Rutland, Warw., Northton.
- IV. Norfolk, Suffolk, Essex, Herts., Cambs., Huntn.
- V. London, Middx., Kent, Surrey, Sussex, Hants.
- VI. Beds., Berks, Bucks, Oxon., Wilts., Glouc., Mon.
- VII. Devon, Cornw., Somerset, Dorset.
- VIII. Ireland, Scotland, Wales, America, West Indies, etc., making the last Group one that takes in all outlying places and "parts beyond the seas"; places "in partibus transmarinis."

There is no need to point to the value of wills as genealogical and biographical evidence, nor to urge the pressing need of the

provision of indexes to their contents. Much has been done to make lists of testators; much remains to be done; but little towards listing the names of the persons mentioned in the wills. It is practicable to make a search for testators of a certain name, but not so for those not of the same surname mentioned as legatees and otherwise. Mention of a person in the will of someone of a different surname is often of the utmost value as an indication of his place of origin and family connexions. The difficult end of the Eighteenth Century is almost become proverbial; these lists will improve our knowledge of it.

All interested in biography and genealogy will be well-wishers to the scheme and the typewritten lists will be in constant demand by searchers. It is necessary, therefore, to point out that the number of copies struck off will be limited to the response made to this circular.
