#### A Brief History of St. Mark's Church.

This historical sketch must of necessity be very limited in its form, as it is the desire of the author not only to survey the past, but to present such material in our Manual that will be valued assistance in the attainment of a greater Church, and the building of a strong Christian character.

In the year 1898 fifty eight members withdrew from Christ English Evangelical Lutheran Church, believing it to be for the best interests of the kingdom of Christ, and accordingly convened in the home of Mr. Peter Fuhrmann, and on the evening of September 9th, 1898, organized themselves into a Congregation, forty-five becoming charter members of the new Church, which adopted the name of St. Mark's English Evangelical Lutheran Church, and officers were elected.

Wagners Hall was rented on Hudson and Mott Streets, in which the Sunday School and Church services were held for twenty months until the erection and completion of the present Church.

The lot, purchased from Mr. George Fitzgeorge, April 1899, upon which the Church is built, cost \$2300.00, the Church building \$10,000 and the equipment \$1650.00.

On the 20th of December, 1898, Rev. J. Morgan Cross, the first Pastor was called, who labored successfully until Nov. 2, 1902. From the inception steps were begun looking to the erection of a suitable edifice. Work was begun on the building in August, 1899, and the Corner-stone was laid with appropriate services October 1st, and the dedication services were held May 27th of the following year.

Under the efficient faithful leadership of Rev. Cross, the Church grew numerically and spiritually and a strong membership built up.

Rev. I. Walton Bobst was then called and accepted taking charge of the work, February 1, 1903, and labored until Sept. 1, 1914, eleven years and seven months with splendid results, carrying the work on to greater efficiency, and increasing the membership of the congregation. During his Pastorate, the lot adjourning the Church was purchased for \$1500.00 and the house occupied by the Janitor for \$1900.00.

Rev. M. Arthur Spotts having been called to the Pastorate, assumed his duties Dec. 1, 1914, pressing zealously on the work so well begun by faithful and fearless leaders for God's cause, who commanded and deserved the respect and support of the entire community and city.

We have dealt largely with the material and financial progress of the Congregation. But there has been a life, a growth, an influence that cannot be stated in figures or measured in statistics. Beside this new equipment has been added during the present Pastorate, consisting of a new Pipe Organ, costing \$2000.00, and new electric lights within and without the Church, costing \$100.00, all of which has been paid for, giving the Church a complete equipment of \$19,450.

With a loyal united Congregation, with the consciousness of great and wonderful blessings as our heritage, we look forward in the Great of the Church, believing that greater blessings and more glorious triumphs are to be ours, as we look forward to the future welfare and prosperity of the Kingdom of Christ in this part of His vineyard.

#### How to Study the Bible

By Rev. M. Arthur Spotts.

The first thing is to make up your mind that you will put some time **every day** into the study of the Word of God. It is one of the most fruitful resolutions that any Christian ever made. Many a life that has been barren and unsatisfactory has become rich and useful through the introduction into it of regular, persevering, daily study of the Bible.

This study may not be very interesting at first, the results may not be very encouraging; but if one will keep constantly at it, there will be developed a beautiful character and the whole life will be enriched. Nothing should be allowed to interfere with your daily study of the Bible, sickness only, being

excusable.


It is impossible to make a rule that will apply to every one as to the amount of time that shall be given each day to the study of the Word. Some people can give an hour a day, but even if not more than fifteen minutes can be given, a great deal can be accomplished.

The best time to study or read for your devotion is in the early morning hours. Try a few verses to start with and ask the Lord to help you with the duties of the day before you, and you will be able to say, like many have said to me, it was really wonderful how well the work went on. And yet it is only according to promise, but how slow we are to comply with the Lord's commands and to claim His promises.—Mal. 3:10.

In the second place, don't be satisfied with merely reading the Bible, but make **a study** of it, by verses,

chapters and Books.

To find the beauty of the Bible demands that you re-read many passages, thoughtfully and prayerfully.

The first thing to ask concerning a verse is, what does this verse mean? Then ask, what does it mean for me? And, is that all it means? Look up any important words in the verse and follow out the other references given in connection with the verse. Any Bible will do for the study, but if you can get or have a Chain Reference or Scoffilled Bible, they will be a great help in clearing many difficult passages for you.

God pronounces that man blessed who "meditates," on the Word of God "day and night."—Ps.

1:2.

In the third place, you will find it interesting to study the Bible topically. We are interested to know what other people have to say on subjects, why not then, try to find out what God has to say. The best way to know this is to go through the Bible and follow a certain subject. The topical method of Bible study is the simplest, most fascinating and yields the largest immediate results.

Mr. Moody favored this method. It fills one's mind full on any subject studied. For instance, you wish to make a study of the word, "Love," "Prayer," "Grace," "Atonement," "Sin," "Justification," "The New Birth," "Repentance,"

"Adoption" and "Assurance."

Then you select that word in your Concordance, found in the back of your Bible, turn to the word suggested or the one you wish to study and follow out the Bible reference under each one.

Then in the fourth place, you should use pen and paper in your Bible study. Underscore the verses you study and anything helpful that comes to you. Write it in your note book.

In the fifth place, **Study the Bible by Chapters**. If you have time for only a few verses, then continue to read until you have completed the chapter. Skipping around all over the Bible is like a man

beteing the air.

Then select certain chapters you wish to study and it is well to take a whole book and study the chapters in their order. The Acts of the Apostles or the Gospel of John is a good book to begin with. In time one may take up every chapter in the Bible, but it would not be wise to begin with Genesis. Read the chapter through five times, reading it aloud at least once. As you re-read it, many new points will be brought out. Follow this by dividing the chapter into its natural divisions and find headings for them that describe in the most striking way their contents.

In the Sixth place. Study the Bible as the Word

of God.

It is an entirely unique book, and as such should lead us to a greater earnestness and more careful and candid study to find out just what it teaches

other than any other book.

We should be willing to submit to its teachings when definitely ascertained, even when these teachings appear to us unreasonable or impossible. Remember it is, "The Word of God" and man cannot put his finite self against the wisdom and greatness of God.

There should be absolute reliance upon all its promises in all their length and breadth and depth

and height. Look each day for some new promise from your infinite Father. Give obedience to every command that it is evident from the context applies to you. Remember it is God's voice speaking to you and every hour spent in Bible study will be an hour's walk and talk with God.

Study the Bible in the Seventh place **Prayerfully**. The author of the book is willing to act as an interpreter of it. Bow your head and pray the prayer of the Psalmist, "Open mine eyes that I may behold wonderous things out of Thy law."

Each time you open the Bible to study it for a few minutes or many, ask God to give you the open and discerning eye, and expect him to do it. Look for the things concerning Christ' in all scriptures.

Improve your spare moments in Bible study.

Carry a small Bible in your pocket or a testament wherever you go. Ladies should have a small testament in their hand bags. It is a good companion, and while waiting for meals, or trains or a trolley or riding on the ears, improve your time by reading God's word. Store away the Scripture in your mind and heart, for it will keep you from sin, from false doctrine and will fill your heart with joy and peace, will give you victory in your own life and enables you to lead others to the foot of the Cross.
