to the Class of 1938*

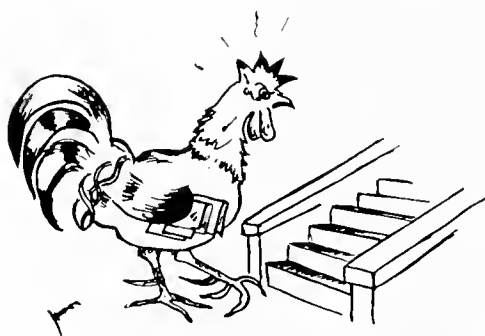
