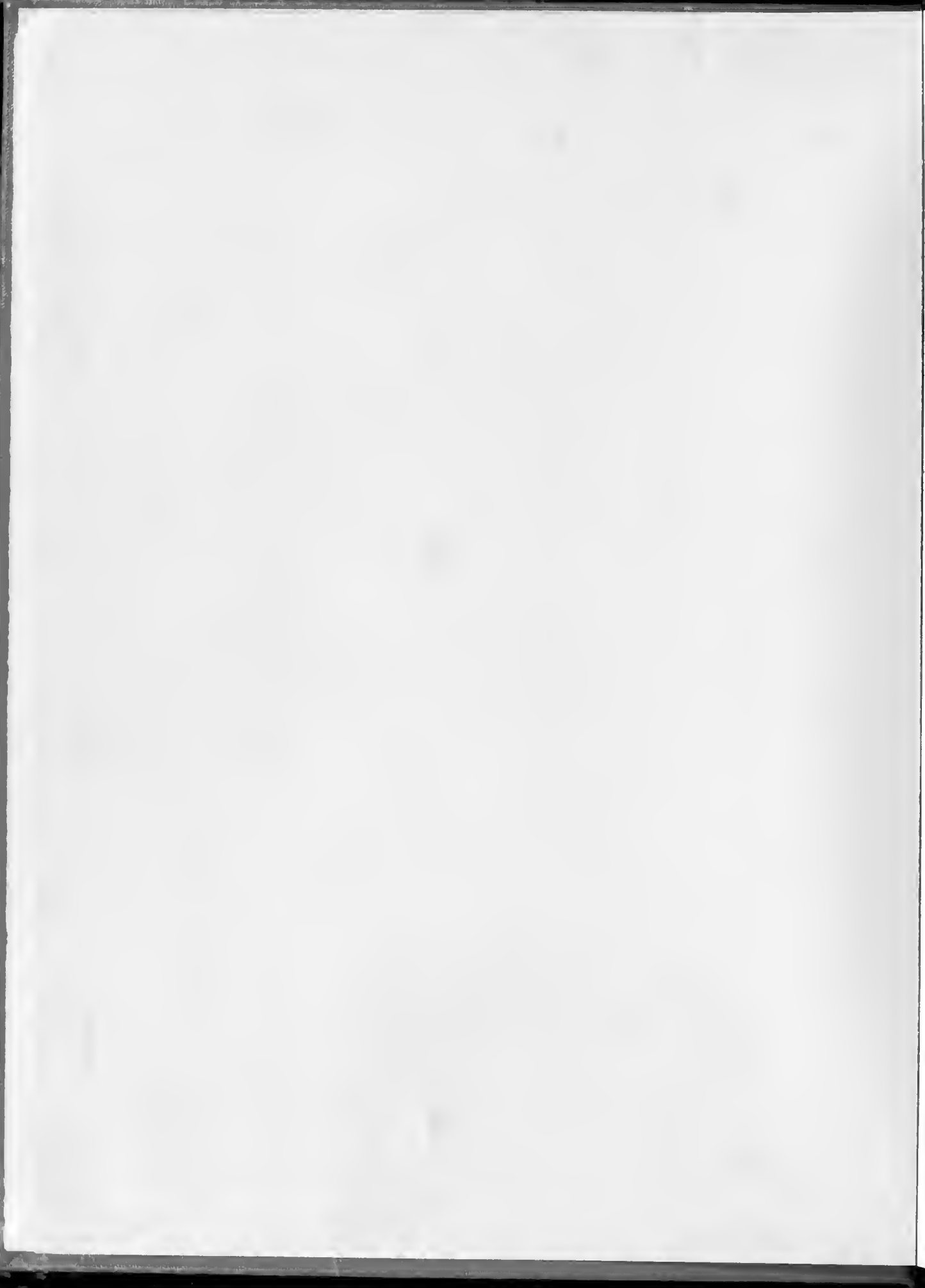

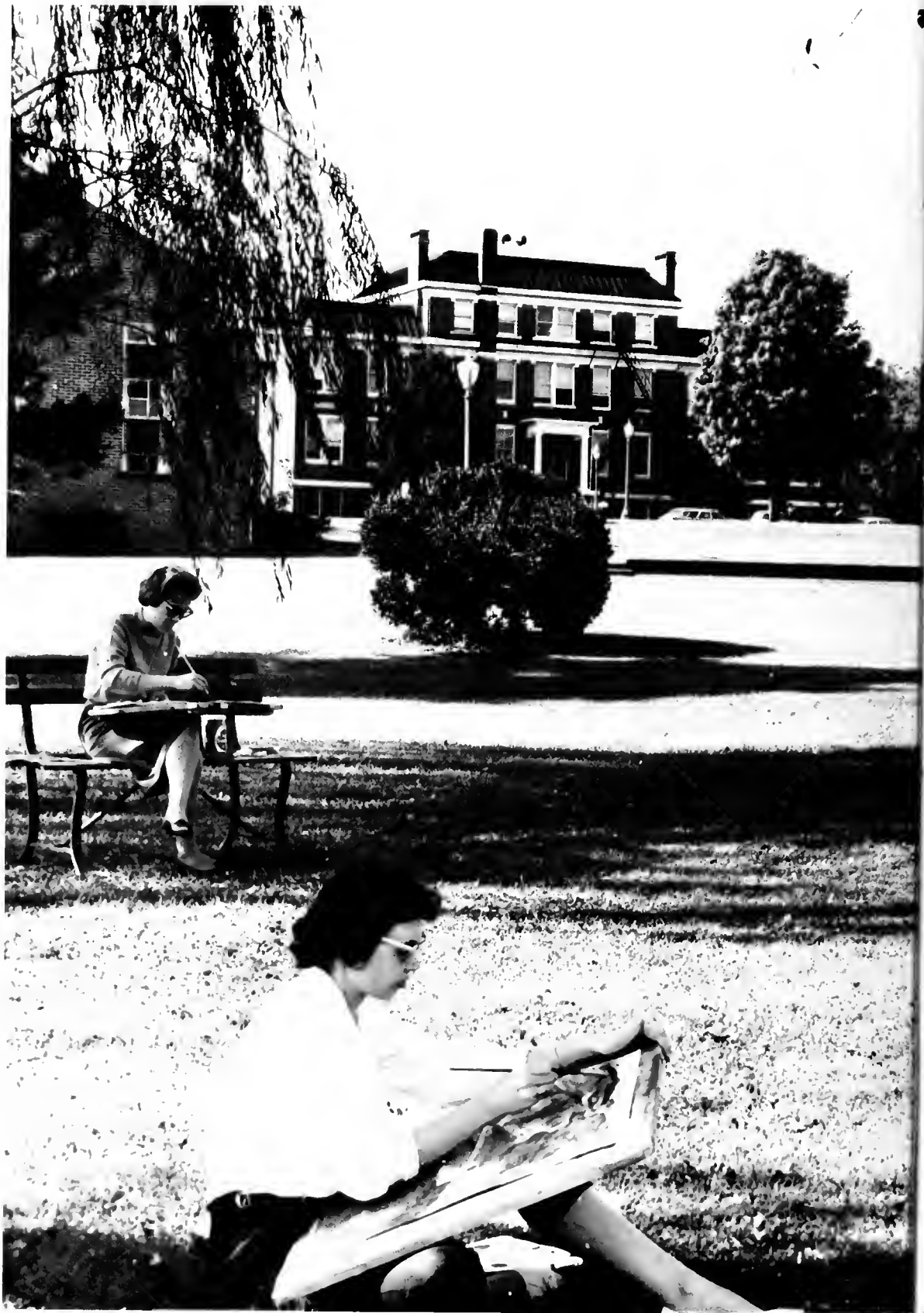

INTRODUCTION

Brevard College, beautiful in campus grounds, and contemporary in buildings and educational philosophy, honors its Methodist sponsorship and its early origin. The college dates from 1853 when Rutherford College was founded by Robert Laban Abernethy, a Methodist minister. Initially, the college was an academy, and through progressive stages came to be a seminary and a four-year college until its union with Weaver College and Brevard Institute into Brevard College at the site of Brevard Institute.

Weaver College, so named in 1912, was incorporated in 1872 under the presidency of James A. Regan, and became a Methodist college officially in 1883. Breverd Institute was founded in 1895 by Reverend and Mrs. Fitch Taylor as a pioneering venture among mountain young people.





THIS IS BREVARD

Transylvania County, in which Brevard is located, was organized in the spring of 1861. The town of Brevard dates from 1867. The area is the principal gateway to Pisgah National Forest. Its many waterfalls have earned the area the picturesque title "Land of the Waterfalls."



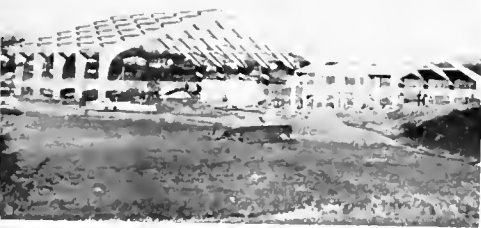


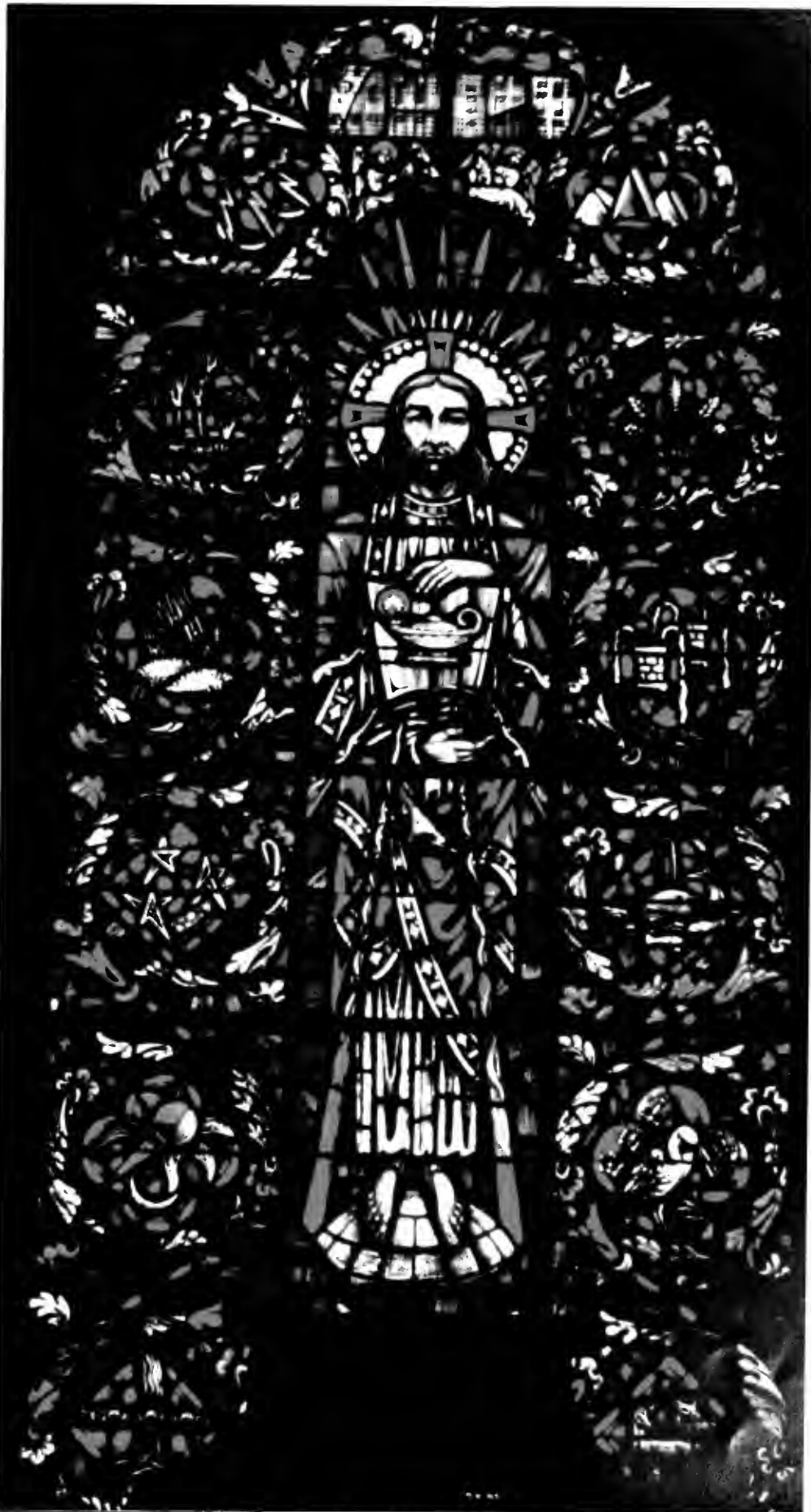

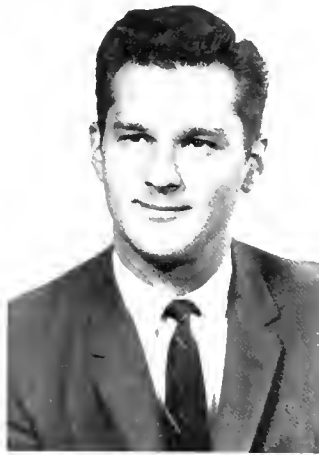


COLLEGE PROGRAM SEEKS TO SERVE FACET OF STUDENT LIFE

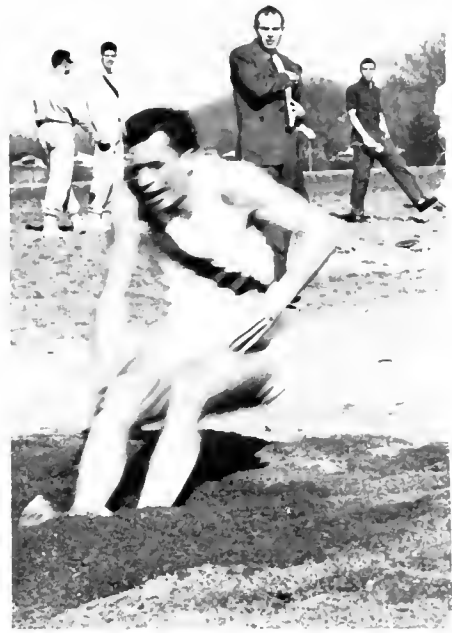
