




HOMECOMING












A Great Rookie Season










BASEBALL


FALL DRAMA









nevard College has a 144 year history as a first Drate academic institution in western North Carolina. Weaver College was founded in 1853 in Weaverville, NC by an organization called "Brotherhood of Temperance." Rutherford College was founded, also in 1853, by Robert Abernathy in Happy Home, NC. It had eight students that year. The modern era of Brevard College began in 1934 when Weaver College and Rutherford College merged with the Brevard Institute on our current campus. The newly formed Board of Trustees chose Dr. E. J. Coltrane to be the first president of the college. The college thrived as a leading private junior college for decades, but in 1996, it received full accreditation from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools as a Level II, baccalaureate degree-granting institution.








