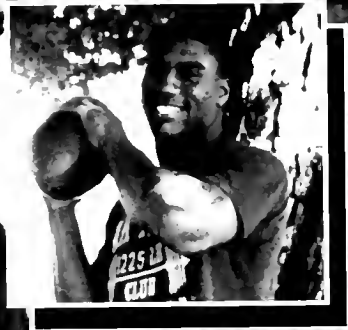

It reads:

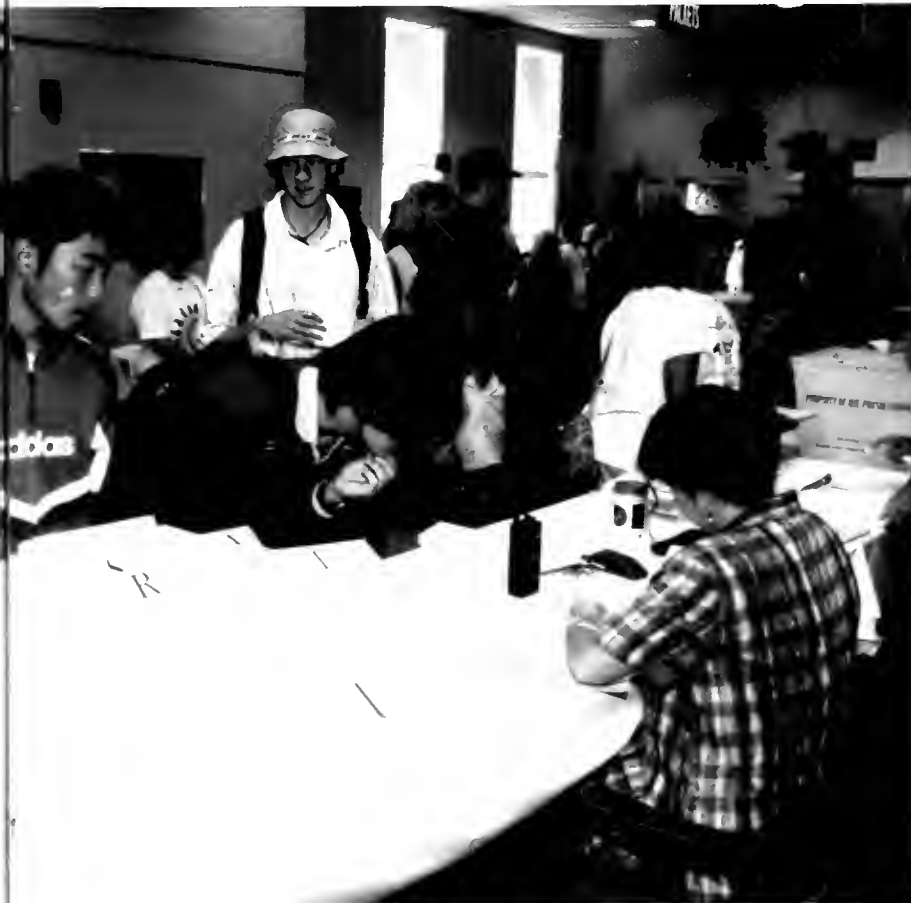

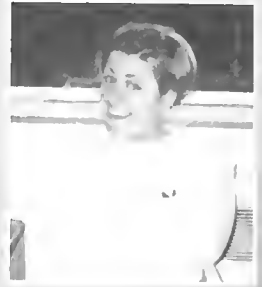

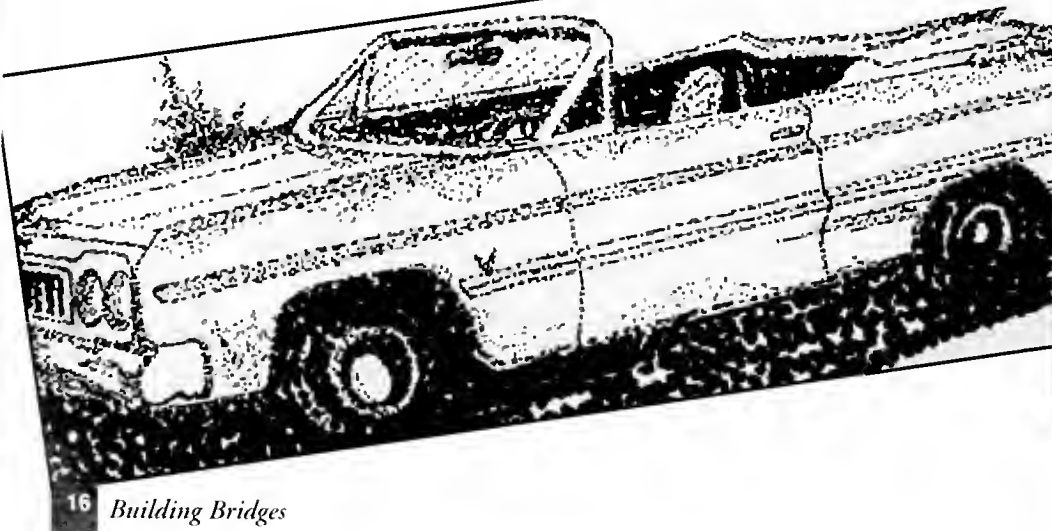

Each semester since 1986 Brevard College has sent a group of students to the small village of Altmunster, Austria to study for a complete semester. Each student carries a full course load of German, Austrian studies, and a course in music (or history). Students may also elect to take an Alpine skiing course for a PE credit. This year's group was the largest group we've ever had. The students live in apartments with roommates and do their own shopping and cooking. This year the group made numerous excursions: Vienna (5 days), Innsbruck (3 days), Gmunden, Bad Ischl, Halstatt, Ebensee, St. Florian, Salzburg Cathedral, and heard Mozart's opera, *The Marriage of Figaro* on Valentine's Day at the Operain Linz. They visited numerous museums and the concentration camp at Mauthausen. During spring break the students were free to travel wherever they wished; their various destinations included Vienna, Budapest, Venice, Genoa, Pisa, Rome, Florence, and the ski resort of Arlberg, close to the Swiss border and considered to have some of the best skiing in Austria.

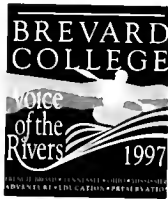

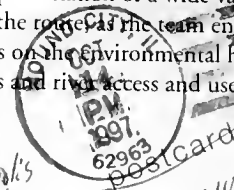

The Voice of the Rivers Expedition began at the headwaters of the French Broad River, on August 30, 1997 from King Creek on Brevard College campus, lasted 105 days. The nine-person team which includes seven hand-selected students and two adult team leaders, navigated from the headwaters of the French Broad to the Mississippi River in both whitewater and touring kayaks.

This unprecedented 2000-mile river expedition linked over 50 communities along the French Broad, Tennessee, Ohio and Mississippi rivers in an educational and environmental outreach program of a massive scale. Chief among the goals of the expedition were the presentation of a wide variety of educational programs to schools and civic groups along the route as the team entered river community they stopped and reached out with programs on the environmental history of the greater Mississippi River basin, water quality studies and river access and use.

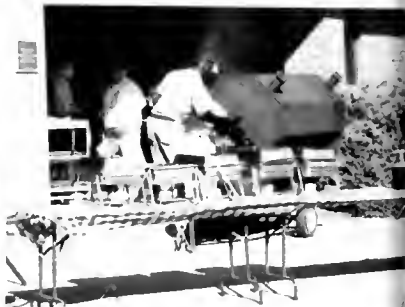

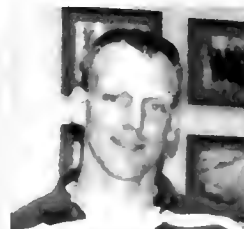

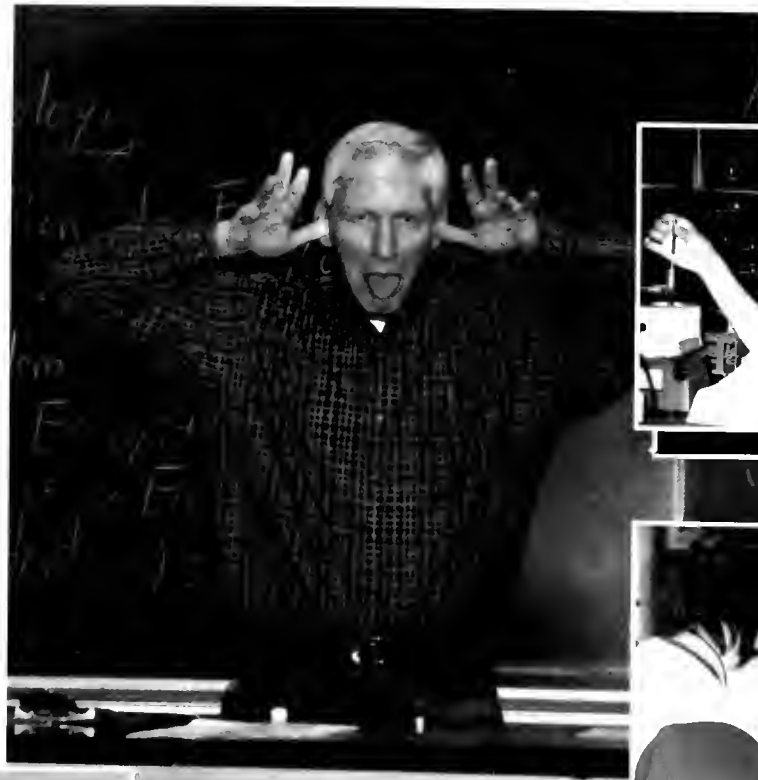

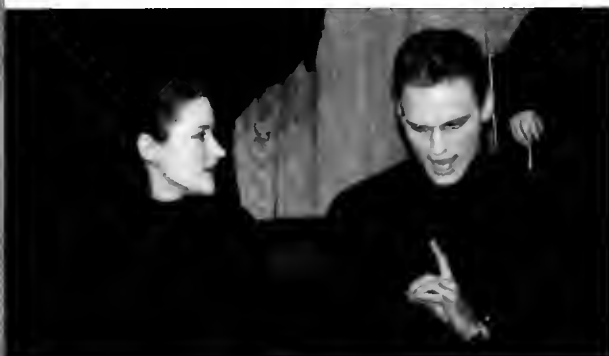

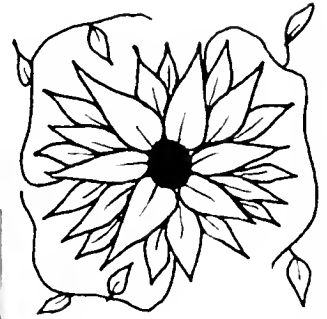

Stars have too long been symbols of the unattainable. They should not be so. For although our physical hands cannot reach them, we can touch them in other ways.

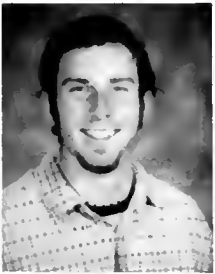
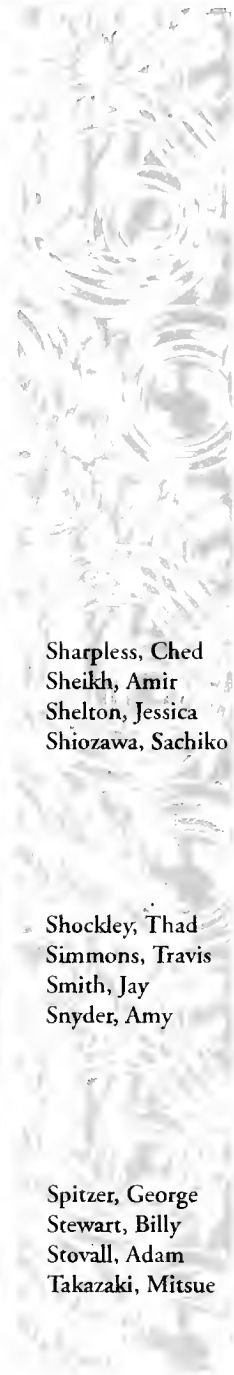

### *Your Achievement Resource*

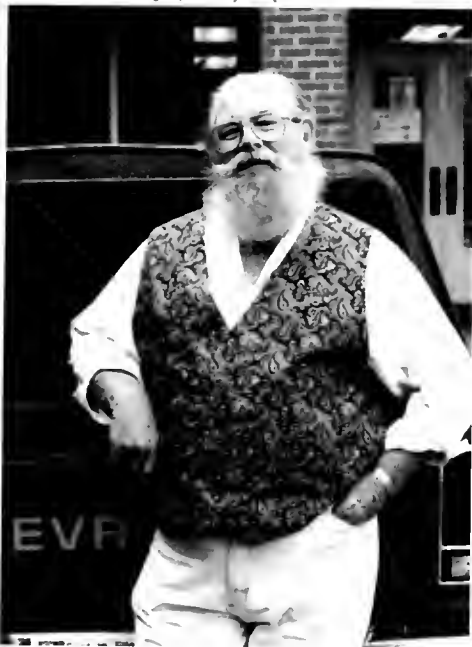

# SAM COPE



After 29 years of creative service to Brevard College, Sam Cope, Iva Buch Seese Distinguished Service Professor of Theater has retired.

Sam was hired at Brevard College in 1969 as an instructor of piano in the music department. He soon became involved in the production of musicals, which eventually led to non-musical theater productions. In 1975 he was asked to teach drama full-time on a temporary basis. This "temporary" appointment became his occupation for the next 22 years.

During his career at the College he directed over 50 musicals and plays, designed and constructed sets and, in partnership with his talented wife, Clare, made thousands of costumes. One of the first non-musical productions that Cope directed at the College was *The Miracle Worker*, a play about Helen Keller that Cope describes as a "powerful, positive play." The last production he directed at the College in the fall of 1996 was the rollicking play *You Can't Take It With You* about a family of eccentric artists, dreamers, and inventors. This is one of Cope's favorites. "I like plays that are wacky and creative and that feature characters who love and support one another. I myself have fortunate in that I've had a tremendous amount of love in my life," says Cope.

# A TRIBUTE TO VIRGINIA TILLOTSON



Virginia Tillotson is a primary reason why the Brevard College Music Department has gained national prominence. In the past thirty-two years, she has served the department through teaching (woodwinds, ensemble conducting, and theory) and through administration (two different times as chair of the department and of the Fine Arts Division). In the variety of ways she has served, her primary emphasis has been upon achieving excellence in all facets of our educational endeavors, and much of the success we enjoy today has resulted both directly and indirectly from her influence. As an administrator, especially, she has built upon the success of her predecessors in the office, and her dedication to excellence is most evident in the fact that our music curriculum has been fully accredited continuously since 1967 by the National Association of Schools of Music. For many years we were one of only about a dozen two-year schools which enjoyed such accreditation, and our graduates have been eminently competitive and successful in their transfer to some of the most well-known schools of music in the United States.



As a conductor, she has taken the Brevard Chamber Orchestra to a level of excellence equal to or greater than that of the orchestras in other cities of the region, in all cases with a larger population base and most likely with larger budgets as well. Her true genius lies in the ability to assemble a group of outstanding professional instrumentalists and to pull together polished and exciting performances of music, most of which is very difficult and demanding, with a maximum of two rehearsals per concert. Her rapport with the orchestra is obviously warm and mutually

respectful, and the enthusiastic audiences of maximum capacity which have continued throughout her tenure as conductor of the orchestra bear eloquent testimony to her influence upon the cultural life of this community.

We go far beyond enunciating professional accomplishments in our tribute, however. Whether one thinks of her as Virginia, "Ginny," "Miss T.," or "Tilly," the image that comes to mind is one of a ready smile, an encouraging word, a willingness to listen, a capacity for understanding, and an ability to seek and find answers to questions—even when they seem insoluble. For these, and for other reasons far too numerous to mention, we salute and pay tribute to Virginia Tillotson, one of the true pillars of the community we know as Brevard College.

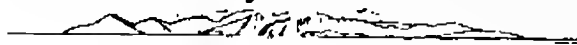

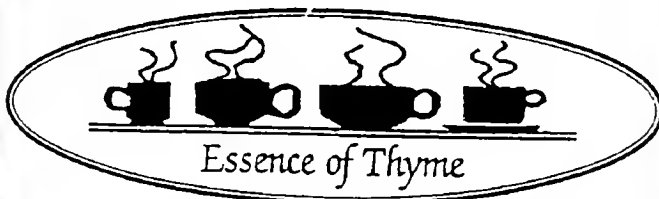

## JEAN SHAW

Geneva (Jean) Lance Shaw, Associate Professor of Biology. B.A., Winthrop College (Zoology); M.S., The University of Tennessee at Knoxville (Zoology); Ph.D., University of Kansas (Microbiology)

Geneva grew up in the mountains of western North Carolina, and before coming to Brevard College in 1989, she taught for seven years at various institutions in the Midwest, including the University of Kansas, Rockhurst College and Tugaloo College (Mississippi). Prior to that, she spent many years in research in tropical diseases, receiving a National Science



Foundation Post-Doctoral Fellowship at the University of Massachusetts in 1980. At Brevard, Geneva taught Human Anatomy and Physiology, General Biology for non-majors, and Principles of Biology for majors.

Geneva has served as advisor to students interested in the health sciences reflecting her early interest in human diseases. Returning to the mountains of North Carolina, however, rekindled a desire to know more about the plants, animals and people native to the region. Field trips into the forest and along the streams and waterfalls were an integral part of her biology courses. Much of her free time is spent hiking and studying the history of this area. She still enjoys a dip in the refreshing waters of "Sliding Rock," a favorite since childhood.

"I love these mountains where my ancestors dwelt, and teaching at Brevard has given me an opportunity to share the wonders of the area with my biology students. Working with colleagues who share this excitement in the natural world is a real plus. To conclude a strenuous day of presenting often complex ideas in modern science with a quiet walk beside a mountain stream is an aspect of my life I treasure most."

## *The Wilderness Experience*

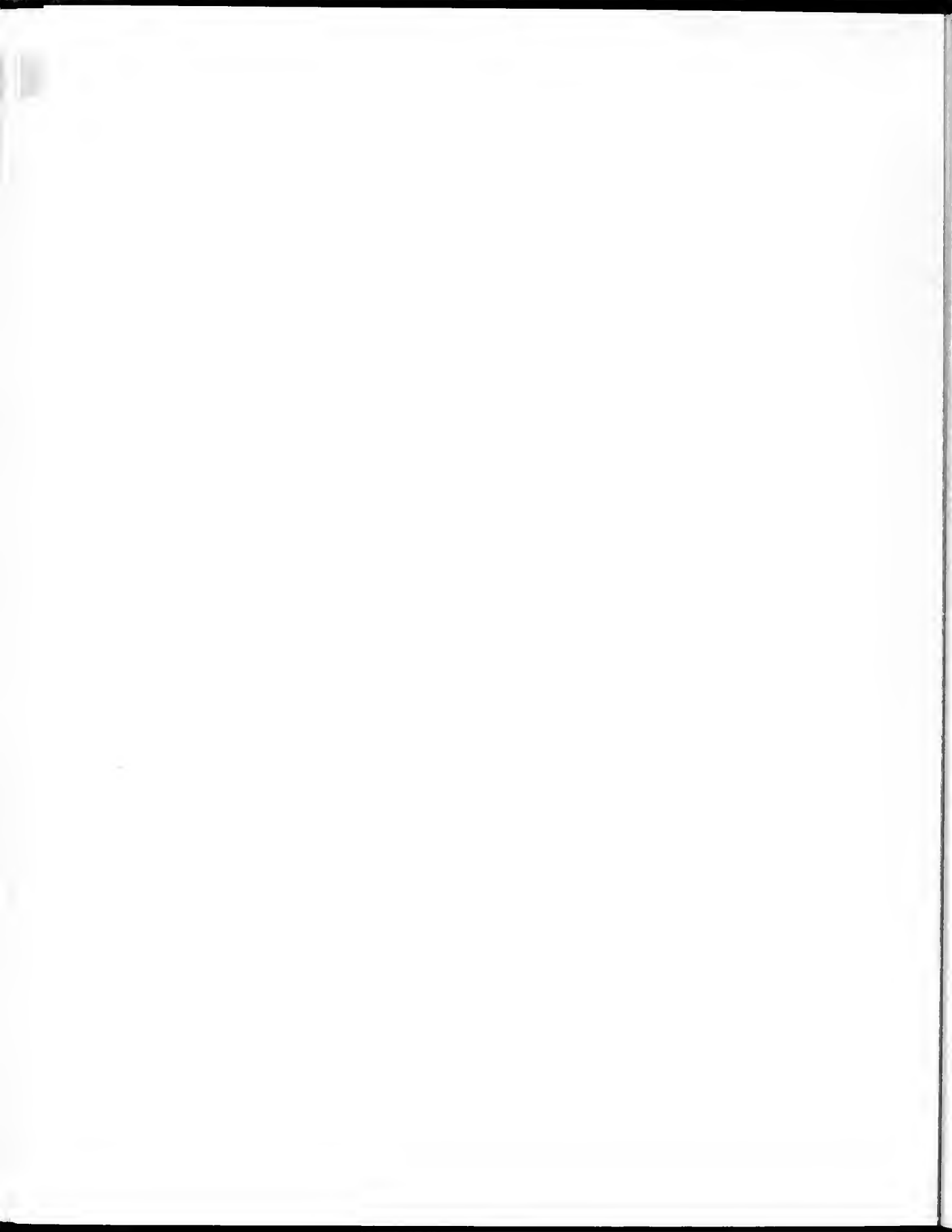

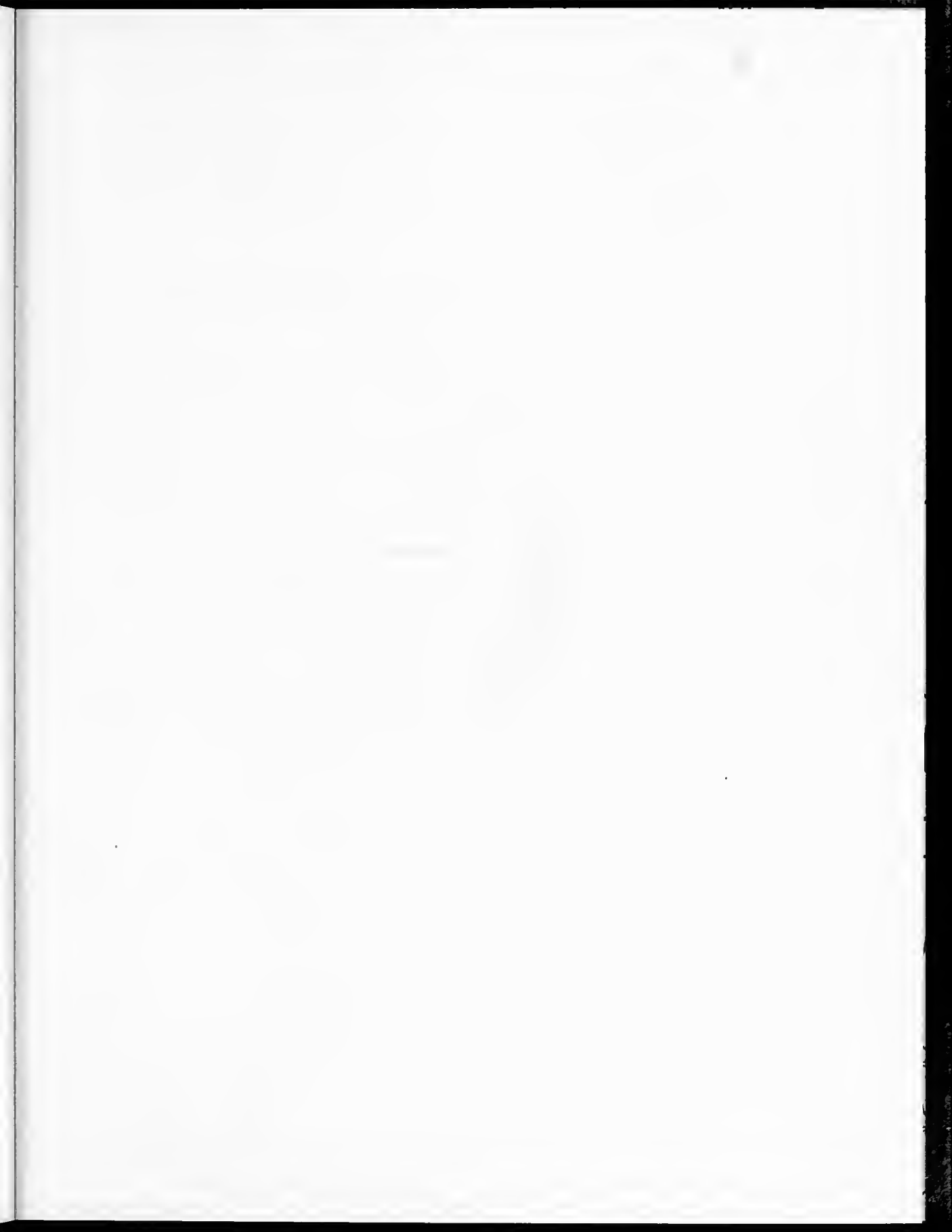
*Somewhere below the mountain's summit

in the fading slant: we are lost.*

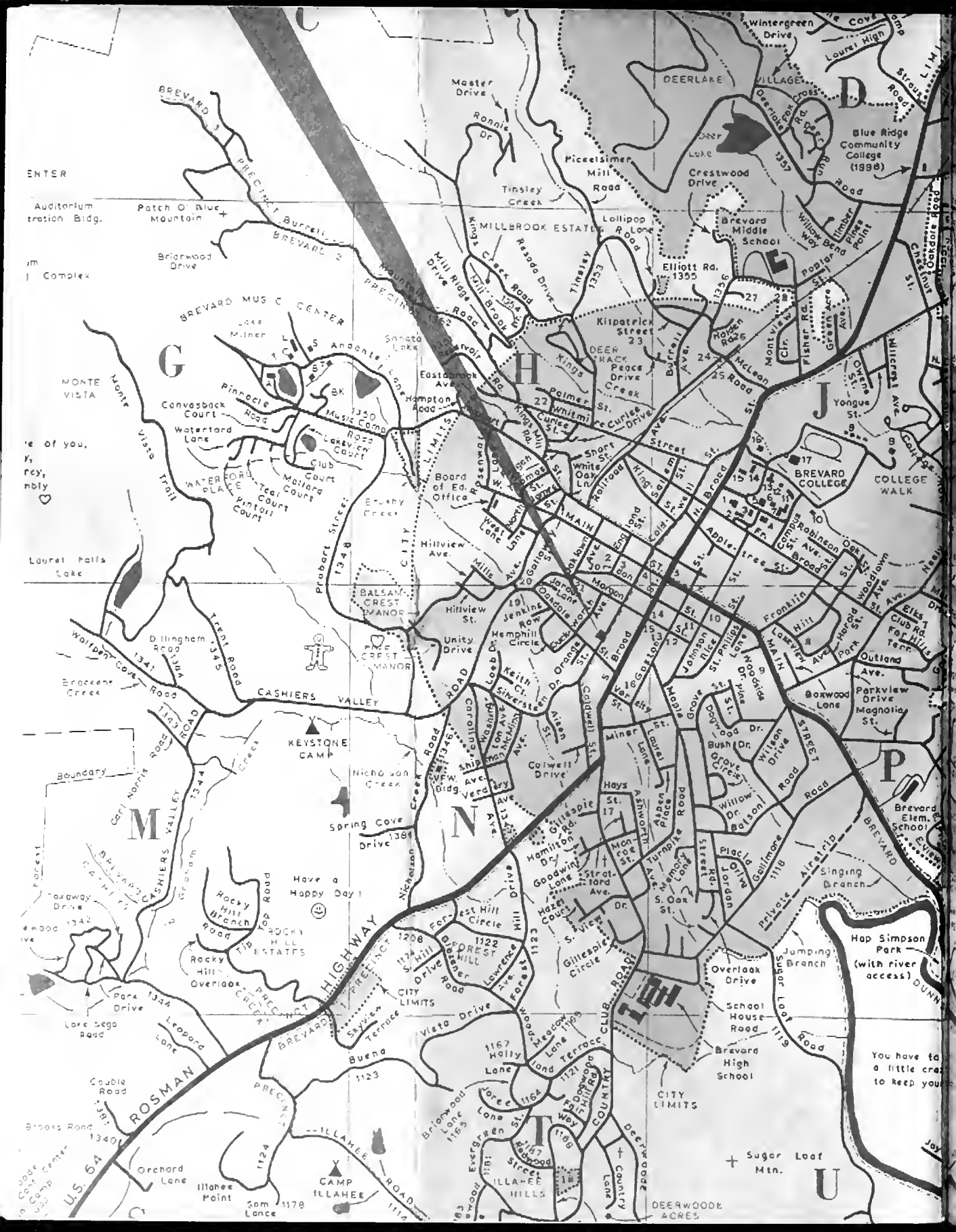
*When the Puritans gazed at Plymouth's beach

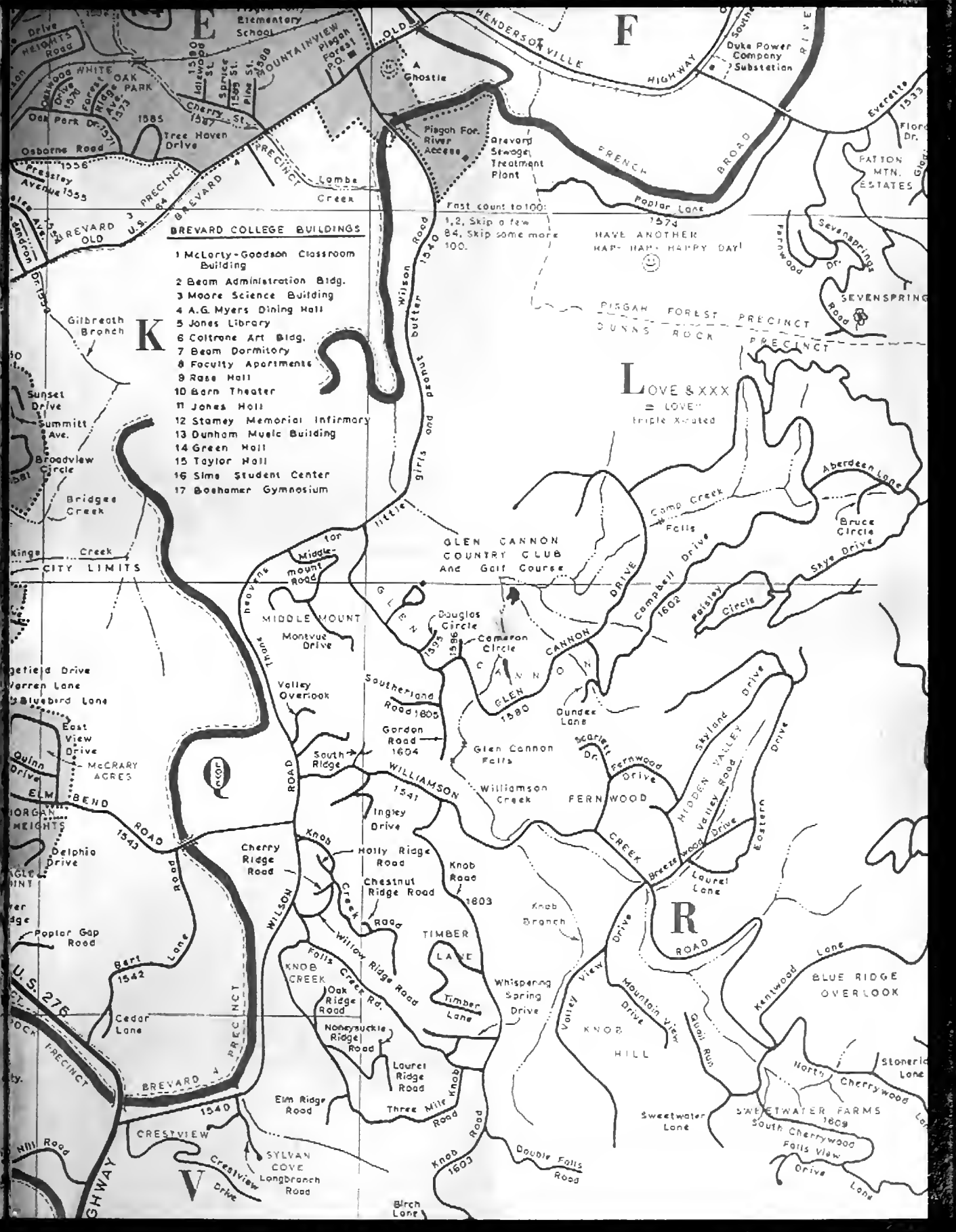
