

The Voice of the Rivers Expedition began at the headwaters of the French Broad River, on August 30, 1997 from King Creek on Brevard College campus, lasted 105 days. The nine-person team which includes seven hand-selected students and two adult team leaders, navigated from the headwaters of the French Broad to the Mississippi River in both whitewater and touring kayaks.

This unprecedented 2000-mile river expedition linked over 50 communities along the French Broad, Tennessee, Ohio and Mississippi

rivers in an educational and environmental outreach program of a massive scale. Chief among the goals of the expedition were the presentation of a wide variety of educational programs to schools and civic groups along the together the team entered river community they stopped and reached out with programs on the crivic mental history of the greater Mississippi River basin, water quality studies and river access and use.








The Underground is a popular place to open your books, spread them out on the table, write your name on a couple of pages, and talk to your friends!


#### You Can Touch the Stars



Liping Lin received her doctor of education degree from Harvard University.



# A TRIBUTE TO VIRGINIA TILLOTSON



Virginia Tillotson is a primary reason why the Brevard College Music Department has gained national prominence. In the

past thirty-two years, she has served the department through teaching (woodwinds, ensemble conducting, and theory) and through administration (two different times as chair of the department and of the Fine Arts Division). In the variety of ways she has served, her primary emphasis has been upon achieving excellence in all facets of our educational endeavors, and much of the success we enjoy today has resulted both directly and



indirectly from her influence. As an administrator, especially, she has built upon the success of her predecessors in the office, and her dedication to excellence is most evident in the fact that our music curriculum has been fully accredited continuously since 1967 by the National Association of Schools of Music. For many years we were one of only about a dozen two-year schools which enjoyed such accreditation, and our graduates have been eminently competitive and successful in their transfer to some of the most -well-known schools of music in the United States.

As a conductor, she has taken the Brevard Chamber Orchestra to a level of excellence equal to or greater than that of the orchestras in other cities of the region, in all cases with a larger population base and most likely with larger budgets as well. Her true genius lies in the ability to assemble a group of outstanding professional instrumentalists and to pull together polished and exciting performances of music, most of which is very difficult and demanding, with a maximum of two rehearsals per concert. Her rapport with the orchestra is obviously warm and mutually

respectful, and the enthusiastic audiences of maximum capacity which have continued throughout her tenure as conductor of the orchestra hear eloquent testimony to her influence upon the cultural life of this community.

We go far beyond enunciating professional accomplishments in our tribute, however. Whether one thinks of her as Virginia, "Ginny," "Miss T.," or "Tilly," the image that comes to mind is one of a ready smile, an encouraging word, a willingness to listen, a capacity for understanding, and an ability to seek and find answers to questions—even when they seem insoluble. For these, and for other reasons far too numerous to mention, we salute and pay tribute to Virginia Tillotson, one of the true pillars of the community we know as Brevard College.





# The Wilderness Experience

Somewhere below the mountain's summit the trail we followed from the valley is gone. Wide as a boulevard beside our morning camp, it narrowed away from the river, collapsed to a suggestion of ferns, and now has disappeared beneath stump-spill and jackstraw trees. The last blaze mark was an hour ago, and as we scan the cryptic woods the light drops across our packs in the fading slant: we are lost.

When the Puritans gazed at Plymouth's beach from the deck of their worn ship, they did not know a sea of trees spread before them as vast as the ocean behind; they knew only their fears: beasts and devils, unimaginable darkness. They hacked the wilderness into graveyards and clearing, pushed it back with scaffolds and cabins, each acre of ragged stumps a sanctuary.

In the deep gloom of rhododendrons, I recall how every season someone veers from a mountain trail and dies, someone who did not expect to, and I begin to understand the Puritans.

I see myself in stiff cloths, swinging an axe against the wall of woods around me, waiting to be back at the river beside a dwindling fire, not pulling myself through heath-hells and rough gullies choked with roots.

With the logic of the lost, we pull toward the trailhead, hand over hand, the hardest way, the only way back to what we think we know.
