



#### MEMORANDUMS,

#### TRADITIONAL AND STATISTICAL,

RELATIVE TO

#### PHILADELPHIA.

FOR ROBINSON'S DIRECTORY.

A T the arrival of William Penn, in 1682, there were eight or ten caves, that had been dug in the bank of the Delaware, and one house, which is yet standing, at the northwest corner of Front and Dock streets. It was built for a tavern, and ferry across the creekwhich then intersected the ground plot of the city, to the Swedish settlement and church at Weccacoe. There was also a meeting for divine worship, established by the people called Quakers, at Shackamaxon [now Kensington]; where resided the celebrated Indian chief, king Tammany, who has been popularly dubbed, according to the usage of European nations, tutelar saint of Pennsylvania.

It is traditionally remembered, that once, when the proprietary and his friends, in the city, were going to the meeting above-mentioned, after a sudden fall of rain, they found the inlet, over which is now thrown Pool's Bridge, so-deep and turbulent, that they could not get over; on which William Penn, with all christian humility, propos-

ed sitting down upon the logs, and there delivered the first sermon that ever was preached

in Philadelphia.

No less than fifty sail of settlers arriving within the first three years, from England, Ireland, Wales, Holland, and Germany, provisions became very scarce, and many of the poor would have suffered for want, if the Indians had not supplied them with what little corn and venison they could spare; and if it had not been for the seasonable flights of wild pidgeons, which are said to have come in such flocks as to darken the air, flying at the same time so low that they could be knocked down with sticks and stones.

A meeting house was built upon the centre square, in the year 1684, with a view to the mutual accommodation of the future settlers, who were then supposed likely to form their establishments upon the Schuylkill, as well as the Delaware front of the city. One of the first plots for a burying ground, was accordingly laid out upon the west side of the river, near the intersection of Market street; and it is occasionally related, that after an interment in this ground, upon a winter's day, the attendants were bewildered in a snow storm, and with difficulty found their way back again to the bank of Delaware.

In the year 1717, the German Mennonists, and other foreigners, arrived in such numbers, as to impress the government with apprehensions of their becoming too powerful for the original settlers; or connecting themselves with the Indians, to the injury of the proprietaries. They, however, mostly settled in the country; and Philadelphia appears to have increased but slowly, from the beginning to the middle of the eighteenth century.

In the summer of 1749, however, no less than twenty-five sail arrived with German passengers,

at once introducing 12,000 of those frugal and industrious settlers, from whom Pennsylvania derives so large a portion of her wealth and prosperity. Great numbers of emigrants also arrived about this time from Ireland, and other parts; and the imports of the capital from the mother country, were increased in thirty years, from 15 to

100,000/ sterling a year. About this time, viz. fifty or sixty years ago, such was the Lilliputian size of Philadelphia, that it was common to ride out on horseback to the country boxes of the citizens, many of which were within the present circumference of the town. To one of them called Rehoboth, which is now standing a little back from the street, in Fourth street between Vine and Callowhill streets, a friend of the writer remembers to have often gone,.. with other boys, two or three on a horse, for a country excursion; and one of his acquaintances recollects a temporary abode in a house, now immersed in Third street; where it was then thought prudent to get home before night, on account of a piece of dark woods between that and the city. Water and Chesnut streets were, long after this period, the principal streets in Philadelphia, and Fourth street continued for many years to be the extent of Market street to the westward, beyond which the squares were laid out in orchards and pasture grounds, under post and rail fence, excepting the garden of the famous Judge Kinsey, whose town house is yet standing near Fifth street, subdivided into different tenements, one of which is occupied as a tin-smith's shop.

inadequacy, nay, the impolicy of such a representation, for the complicated interests of the first city in the union, is too obvious to be enlarged upon; and it is hoped that when the next census shall require a new apportionment of the national representation, the welfare of our most populous and commercial towns will not be indiscriminately sacrificed to the geometrical regularity of an election district; but that the citizens of Philadelphia, and New York, will enjoy the privilege of electing their own representatives in the proportion to which their population, no less than their comparative importance, entitles them.

ing to such invoice, but if not determined at the time of entry, the tare or tares as above shall be granted and allowed.

### Allowances for Leakage and Breakage.

Two per cent. allowed on the guage on all merchandize

paying duty by the gallon, contained in casks...

Ten per cent. on all beer, ale and porter in bottles, and five per cent. on other liquors in bottles, to be deducted from the invoice quantity in lieu of breakage; or it shall be lawful to compute the duties on the actual quantity by tale, at the option of the importer, at the time of cntry.

### REMARKS.

1. No ship or vessel, from foreign ports, or coming by sea from any port of the United States, shall be permitted to report, make entry or break bulk, till the master shall deliver to the postmaster all letters under his care, or within his power, other than such as are to be delivered at the port of entry, or such as are directed to the owner or consignee of such ship or vessel; and on oath or affirmation, to be taken of such delivery, the master to receive two cents for every letter so delivered.

2. Goods from foreign ports cannot be unladen but between sun-rise and sun-set, without special licence, under a penalty of four hundred dollars on the master, and every other person concerned, disability from holding any office under the government of the United States for seven years, and being advertised in the newspapers; with forfeiture of the goods; which, if amounting to 400 dollars, will subject

the vessel, and apparel also, to forfeiture.

3. Goods removed before guaged and weighed, and if wines, spirits or teas, before being marked, without per-

mission, are forfeited.

4. Persons giving or offering a bribe, forfeit from two hundred to two thousand dollars.—Inspectors and officers of the revenue cutters, may go on board, examine and search vessels, have access to the cabin, and seal packages; and after sun-set, secure hatches, &c.—Persons in charge of vessels, for breaking fastenings, but in the presence of an officer, forfeit five hundred dollars.

### THE LYING-IN AND FOUNDLING HOSPITAL.

The patients to be admitted into this Hospital, are the sick in body or mind, except with contagious diseases; these are admitted from the Hospital Dispensary, as out

patients.

Forty paupers are allowed to be received at one time and no more, the funds at present not being sufficient to provide for a larger number; but the charity will be extended to the poor, in proportion to the increase of the capital stock, which can only arise from future legacies or contributions, no tax being assessed on the citizens for the support of this institution.

In the mean time the affluent are recived, as pay patients, from three to eight dollars a week, according to their circumstances in life, and the profit made by their board is applied with the interest of the capital, to the support of

poor patients.

Accidents, however, such as fractures, bad bruises, are admitted GRATIS, if brought within twenty-four hours after they happen, and the doors are to be opened at all hours to receive them.

In all other cases, applications should be made to one of the attending physicians and managers, whose names are published monthly in Poulson's papers. But on the fourth, and seventh day of every week, those managers and physicians attend regularly at the hospital from 10 to 12 o'clock in the morning, on purpose to receive and discharge patients, where if the applicant applies, it will often save much trouble.
