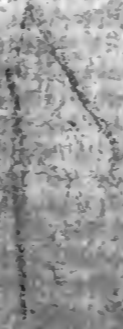
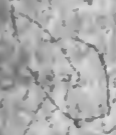


TO THE PUBLIC.

IMPRESSED with a grateful sense of the high favour with which it has been the public pleasure to honour their undertaking, it is to the compilers a subject of extreme regret that they have been constrained thus long to delay the publication of the Census Directory for 1811. They however trust that the motives which induced them to this delay, mistaken as they have partially been, will advocate the extenuation of this default: this ill success is the offspring of events which might have misled the most acute discernment, and set at defiance the most active ability.

In addition to what was at first promised to the public, the compilers, anxious to give every possible satisfaction, contemplated to give a statement of the manufactures of the state of Pennsylvania, its census, and that of each individual county. To this end information has from day to day been expected, and the publication in consequence retarded. In this they have been much deceived, the returns of several distant counties being not yet received.—Unwilling longer to trespass on the public patience, it is therefore concluded to omit for the present the manufactures and census of Pennsylvania, excepting those of the City and County of Philadelphia, and as soon as a full and complete account can be obtained, to publish and deliver them, as an addenda to this volume, either on a sheet or in a pamphlet.—Besides which it will contain all removals, late establishments and other information which may be useful and is here omitted.

The clemency of the public is also solicited for any inaccuracies in this work which may come under their notice, and as the compilers were untutored to the task, it is hoped their labours will be received with candour and indulgence.

APPENDIX.

Account of the rise, progress and improvement of the City of Philadelphia.

The city of Philadelphia, capital of the State of Pennsylvania, lies in latitude $39^{\circ} 57'$ north, and longitude 75° west from the meridian of London, upon the western bank of the river Delaware, which is here a mile in breadth, about one hundred and twenty miles from the Atlantic Ocean by the course of the bay and river, and about fifty five miles from the sea in a South Eastward direction. The largest commercial ships can come to this city; sloops go 35 miles further, and boats that carry eight or nine tons can go 100 miles further up the Delaware. It was laid out by William Penn, the first proprietor and founder of the province, in the year 1683, and settled by a colony from England, which arrived in that and the preceding years, and was increased by a constant and regular influx of foreigners to so great a degree, that, in less than a century, and within the life-time of the first person born within it of European parents, it was computed to contain in the city and suburbs, six thousand houses and forty thousand inhabitants.

The ground plot of the city is an oblong square, about one mile North and South, and two miles East and West, lying in the narrowest part of the isthmus between the Delaware and Schuylkill rivers, about five miles in a right line above their confluence. The plain is so nearly level, except upon the bank of the Delaware, that art and labour were necessary to dig

common sewers and water courses, in many places, to drain the streets.

In the beginning of this settlement, it was expected that the fronts on both rivers would be first improved for the convenience of trade and navigation, and that the buildings would extend gradually in the rear of each, until they would meet and form one town extending from east to west; but experience soon convinced the settlers the Delaware front was alone sufficient for quays and landing places, and that the Schuylkill lay at too great a distance to form part of the town on its banks,—whence it followed that the city has increased northward and southward of the original plot on the Delaware front, and now occupies a space of about four miles, and greatly exceeds the Eastern and Western extent.

The city has been twice incorporated, and the limits thereof restrained to the oblong originally laid out by William Penn, without including the Northern and Southern suburbs. This plot is intersected by a number of streets at right angles with each other, nine of which run East and West, from Delaware to Schuylkill, and twenty three North and South, crossing the first at right angles, forming one hundred and eighty four squares or lots for building. The streets running East and West are named (except High st. near the middle of the city) from the trees found in the colony, Vine, Sassafras, Mulberry, High, Chestnut, Walnut, Spruce, Pine, and Cedar; and those running North and South from their numeral order, beginning at Delaware river. Front is first, then Second, and so on to the Thirteenth, whence the numerical order ceases from Delaware Front, and begins at Schuylkill in the same order as First or Front, Second, &c. to Eighth, between which and Thirteenth is Broad street, so named from its being the widest in the city. As a distinguishing mark the streets have Delaware or Schuylkill affixed to their numeral names, as Delaware Second street, &c. With respect to their widths, High street is one hundred feet, Broad street one hundred and thir-

teen, Mulberry sixty, and all the others fifty feet wide: within the improved parts of the city they are paved with pebble stones in the middle, which usually contains three fifths of the whole breadth, and on each side with bricks: curb stones are sunk level with the brick pavement, at their edges, and form an excellent defence against the approach of carriages. These stones also assist in forming gutters for carrying off the water, which are more permanent than those formerly in use, the convexity of the stone pavements throwing all the water against their perpendicular sides, immediately in contact with the bottom of which is a pavement of bricks four or five inches wide.

Besides the before mentioned streets, there are many others not originally laid down in the plot, the most public of which are Water street and Dock street. Water street is thirty feet wide, running below the bank at the distance of about forty feet Eastward from and parallel to Front street, extending from the North line of the city Southward to the bridge over the Dock, which was formerly a drawbridge but converted into a stone arch thirty years since. From the bridge it is forty feet wide, in a right line, to Pine street, and leaves a row of houses without yards, on the bank, in its whole length, between it and Front street. Southward of Pine street there is an offset of about eighty feet Eastward, and the street from thence to Cedar street is forty five feet wide and called Penn street. This street, in the original plan, was intended only for a cart-way, to accommodate the wharves and stores to be erected under the bank, and not to rise more than five feet above it, so as to leave the river open to the view from the west side of Front street; but the inhabitants were soon convinced that the ground on both streets was too valuable to be kept unimproved, in any degree, merely for the sake of a prospect, and it is now closely built with lofty houses (except a few vacancies here and there) throughout the whole front, on both sides, and commodious

wharves are extended into the river, at which the largest ships that use the port can lie in safety to receive and discharge their cargoes, and are defended from the ice in winter, by the piers made of logs, extending into the river, sunk with stone and filled with earth, so as to be equally firm with the main land.

Dock street is the only crooked street in the city, beginning at the bridge in Front street, extending North-Westward in a serpentine tract, through two squares, across Second and Walnut streets, and terminating at Third street: another branch extends South-Westward across Spruce street, and terminates at Second street. The ground occupied by this street, and by the lot which is between it and Spruce street, below the bridge, was formerly a swamp, and was given by William Penn to the corporation for the use of the city. It was intended as a place to dig a bason and docks, to shelter the shipping; but experience proved that ships could be defended from the ice by the piers extended into the river, and that the dock could not be kept clean but at an expense far beyond its utility, wherefore it was neglected, till it became a nuisance offensive to the smell and injurious to the health of the inhabitants, and was, by act of Assembly, ordered to be arched over and covered with earth, whereby the city acquired a beautiful street, more than one hundred feet in breadth towards the water, and not less than ninety in the narrowest part.

The number of the streets, lanes, and alleys laid out by the owners of the lots before they were built on, is too great to be here enumerated, there being scarce a square that is not intersected by one or more of them; some of them continued in a right line through several squares, and so spacious as to be easily mistaken for main streets—others only through one square.

Lamps of two branches each are disposed at convenient distances in all parts of the city, and are

lighted every night, excepting when the light of the moon renders this unnecessary.

The general height of the ground on which the city stands is nearly forty feet above the level of the Delaware; but some of the streets are considerably lower, particularly Water street, some stores in which have sometimes sustained considerable damage, when the river happened to be raised by flood and a strong South-Easterly wind.

The public mint, at which the national money is coined, is at this place.

Eight daily newspapers are published in this city beside a number of periodical literary works, some of which are in high repute, and have a circulation in every part of the United States.

The trade of Pennsylvania is principally carried on from this city, and there are few commercial ports in the world, in which Philadelphia ships may not be found in some season of the year.

The houses of public worship are numerous and are as follow:

Four Baptist, two German Calvinist, four Protestant Episcopal, four Friends, three German Lutheran, one Swedish Lutheran, two Jewish Synagogues, four Methodist, one Moravian, nine Presbyterian, four Roman Catholic, one Universalist, one African Baptist, one African Episcopal, and two African Methodists, a number of which are finished with a degree of elegance that would do honour to any city in Europe. Christ Church is furnished with a full chime of bells. The Episcopalian churches are furnished each with an organ, as are the Roman Catholic and some of the German churches. The Catholic churches, and some others have also elegant choirs of vocal music.

The other public buildings in this city are the University and College, a State-house and offices, city Court-houses, a county Court-house, a Commissioners' hall for the district of Southwark, the Philosophical Society's Hall, a Dispensary, a Health Office, a Hospital, and offices; an Alms House, five

incorporated Banks, two dramatic Theatres, an Equestrian Circus, a Riding School, a public Library, a Medical Theatre and Laboratory; a Reservoir, or Water Works, an Academy of Fine Arts, a new Masonic Lodge, two public Jails, eight brick Markets; five in High street, one in Second street, and two in the Northern Liberties, and a new Hall built by the German society. The city is provided with a number of private and public charitable Societies, and almost every religious sect, has one or more Schools under its particular direction, where their own poor are allowed the benefit of education gratis. By a late salutary measure (the taxation of dogs) learning promises to be more generally diffused, the monies accruing being applied to the laudable purpose of education, which offers to the poor, indiscriminately, the advantages of knowledge. Sunday Schools, for the instruction of children, who would otherwise spend that day in idleness and profanation, have been long instituted, and have a tendency to amend the morals and conduct of the rising generation. There are also, a sufficient number of academies for the instruction of both sexes; besides three English, and one French circulating library belonging to private citizens.

The associated Hoase and Fire Companies are numerous, and are eminently distinguished for their promptitude and alertness, and a society is instituted for the protection of moveable property, which was heretofore exposed to great risk during the calamity of fires.

Few Cities can boast of more useful improvements in manufactures, in the mechanical arts, in the art of healing, and particularly in the science of humanity, than Philadelphia.

An asylum for the reception of deluded females, who are desirous of abandoning a life of infamy and vice has been instituted, and the humane and worthy end which it proposes, cannot be too highly estimated, when we reflect that the advantages are held out to a class of beings, whom the rigidity of custom has precluded from a return to virtue, by denying them admittance in untainted society.

The environs of Philadelphia are finely cultivated. Kensington to the northward is beautifully situated and is noted for the high degree of eminence to which it has arrived in naval architecture: the southern extremity claims equal praise.

A comparative view of the progress of this City, must indeed awaken admiration. One hundred and fifty years have not yet elapsed, since the proprietary first laid it out in a wilderness, inhabited by untutored savages. This, as was before remarked, was in the year 1683: in the year 1811, we behold it rich and flourishing, daily augmenting in extent and population, respectable in Science, Commerce, and the Arts, and justly claiming a distinguished rank among the crowded cities of the world. To account for an improvement so rapid and unparalleled, we have only to reflect on the mildness and wisdom of the laws, by which we are governed and protected; these advantages have invited industry and ingenuity, to forsake the less politic parts of the earth, and to embrace with eagerness a transition from need and oppression; to plenty and independence, while a regulation founded no less in benevolence than justice, and which secures to the religious of every denomination the free and uninterrupted exercise of these several and peculiar tenets, has been productive of the most beneficial effects.

Pennsylvania and lying-in Hospital.

The history of this eminent institution is too well known to need particular notice here. In 1774 it lost, by the depreciation of continental money, about ten thousand pounds, nearly one half of its productive estate.—Subscriptions were however solicited, and by the united exertions of the managers successively employed, and the receipt of some legislative aid it has at length arrived at its present eminence.

Philadelphia Dispensary, Fifth below Library street, Was instituted in April 1786.—Its object is to afford medical relief to the indigent sick. It is supported by annual subscriptions of one guinea, or ten guineas a life subscription. The contributors recommend the patients: such as are able to go out receive medical assistance at the dispensary, where the apothecary resides, and the medicines are kept on six days of the week: those who cannot go abroad are visited at their own residences, prescriptions for whom may be had at any time.

The hours of tuition are, at least two hours in the forenoon, and two hours in the afternoon of each Sunday, at such times as will not interfere with divine worship. The schools are adjoining the Presbyterian church, corner of Coates' and Second streets, No. 5, Appletree alley, and Front near Shippen.

The funds for the support of these schools arise from an annual contribution of one dollar, donations, legacies, &c. A contribution of ten dollars entitles the contributor to membership for life. Society for alleviating the miseries of public Prisons,

THE PHILADELPHIA UNION SOCIETY,

For the education of poor female children, was instituted in November 1804; incorporated on the 28th April, 1808. This establishment owes its origin to two female societies, the members of which belonged to the second and third Presbyterian churches of Philadelphia, and who associated for pious purposes — Nearly three hundred children have already received the benefits of this society. The funds are supplied by subscriptions and donations.

Philadelphia Society for promoting Agriculture.

This society was formed in 1785, and has been productive of considerable benefit, not only from the labours of the members thereof, but also by having given birth to many similar institutions in this and the neighbouring states. Two volumes 8vo. of their memoirs have been lately published.

American Philosophical Society.

Philosophical essays are successively published, selected from papers read before them.

The stated meetings are held at their hall, in 5th, below Chesnut street, on the first Friday evening of every month, from October to May inclusive, and on the third Friday of every month, during the rest of the year. Conversation meetings every Friday evening, excepting at the times of stated meetings. A valuable library belongs to this association. Elections first Saturday in January. In 1787, the physicians of this city associated under this title, for the purpose of extending medical knowledge, and for promoting harmony and uniformity in the practice of physic. The Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts,

Was founded in the year 1805, by the voluntary association and contributions of a number of gentlemen of the city of Philadelphia. It was soon after incorporated by the legislature. The object of this institution is to improve and refine the public taste in works of art, and to cultivate and encourage our native genius, by providing elegant and approved specimens in the arts for imitation, and schools of instruction. A beautiful and appropriate building was erected in Chestnut street, between 10th and 11th streets, and a number of casts, paintings, and engravings, procured and deposited there. The Academy has lately received a most magnificent present from Gen. Armstrong, which was received by him from the Emperor of France.

A large building has just now been added to that first erected, for the exhibition of paintings, and the accommodation of the necessary drawing rooms, schools, &c. &c.

"Society of Artists of the United States."

This Society was instituted for the purpose of supplying what was deficient in the Academy of Fine Arts, and principally for the establishment of schools and public exhibitions, and the distribution of prizes and medals, which objects are managed by the two societies in conjunction. It is composed of 100 professional members, of whom 40 are "Academicians," the remainder "Associates," and 100 amateurs; a president, four vice-presidents, who are considered as professors, one of painting, one of sculpture, one of architecture, and one of engraving, and a secretary and treasurer. Each member on his election pays five dollars, and one dollar quarterly afterwards; but on paying fifty dollars, is exempt from all other contributions. These sums, together with the proceeds of annual exhibition, and the fees for pupils, constitute the funds of the society. Officers for the present year,

PHILADELPHIA LIBRARY.

Fifth, corner of Library Street.

The foundation of the present library was laid in the year 1731. A number of gentlemen having raised the sum of one hundred pounds by subscription, a small library was formed.

From this time the stock of books was increased, and the company was incorporated in 1742. In 1769, three other companies were blended with it. Since this event the members and the property have continued to increase. Some valuable machines for the purposes of natural philosophy, &c. and a variety of natural and artificial productions belong to the company. The shares are forty dollars each, and an annual payment of two dollars in addition.

The number of members are at present 700—the number of works about 11,630—the number of volumes about 19,400.

* * To this library is annexed a rare and valuable collection of books, the bequest of James Logan Esq. to the public.

PEALE'S MUSEUM.

In the upper apartments of the State-House.

This splendid Establishment for the display of the works of nature and art, is the fruit of individual perseverance, now rendered worthy of the patronage it receives from the State Legislature. No museum in Europe contains a better collection of quadrupeds and birds, the latter of which is unrivalled in beautiful arrangement and appropriate decoration; nor is there any where to be seen a more extensive gallery of original portraits, of characters rendered interesting during the American Revolution, or by their talents and genius in art and science, either in Europe and America. The collection was first begun by Mr. C. W.

Peale and has been continued by his son Rembrandt, especially with many of the most distinguished characters in Europe; besides these, the fishes, insects, minerals and numerous miscellaneous curiosities, render it the resort of all strangers. It is here professor Barton makes his demonstrations in natural history to his pupils.

Vine Company of Pennsylvania.

This company was incorporated in the year 1802, for the purpose of carrying on the cultivation of the Vine-plant, on a more extensive scale than had hitherto been attempted in the United States. The number of shares to the stock is 1,000, at 20 dollars each; and a handsome farm has been purchased for a vineyard, at Spring-Mill, on the Schuylkill, thirteen miles from the city. There are now upwards of 30,000 Vine-plants in a vigorous state, which require nothing but the necessary funds to secure success.

Quarterly stated meetings of the society are held on the last Saturday in April, July, October, and January. The officers consist of a president, five managers, a treasurer, and secretary, who are chosen on the last Saturday of January annually. They are as follow :

UPSAL BOTANIC GARDEN.

A Botanic Garden and Nursery was commenced in the spring of 1809, in the immediate vicinity of this city, near the junction of the Germantown and township-line roads; the extent of ground is 20 acres, well and advantageously watered; the varieties of soils and exposures which it produces and exhibits, is of considerable importance in an institution of this kind.

In the summer of the last year, the proprietor had erected an elegant building for the preservation of exotics, which is now furnished with an immense variety; and the garden generally, at this time, is said

to contain several thousand species and varieties of plants, foreign and indigenous, many of which are of considerable importance in medicine, agriculture, horticulture and the arts. The proprietor of this garden, Mr. Bernard M'Mahon, a few years ago, published in this city a work on horticulture in general, entitled "The American Gardeners' Calendar," which appears to have thrown a new light on our former system of gardening; the good effects of which are here generally acknowledged; and are visible in the superabundance of fine fruits and vegetables, annually accumulating in the markets of this city.

THE NEW THEATRE,

Was first established in the year 1793, by the late Thomas Wignell and Alexander Reinagle, by subscriptions of sundry citizens, in shares of 300 dollars each. It first opened in January 1794, with a new company of comedians, musicians and mechanics, engaged at a vast expence in Europe.—In the year 1799 it passed from the possession of Wignell and Reinagle into the hands of the present stockholders, amongst whom are some of the most respectable of our citizens, who, at a considerable expence enlarged and finished the buildings. They have leased the property, for a term of years, to the present managers Messrs. Warren and Wood, who also have contributed largely to the beauty and convenience of the establishment, by expending a considerable sum in fitting up and decorating the internal part of the theatre.

This establishment supports upwards of one hundred persons, who are regularly employed during the winter season, besides the circulatorin of a large sum of money weekly in this city, for the requisite materials, &c. This theatre is well attended by all classes of citizens, and is under as good regulations as any other establishment of this description. It is supposed it will contain about 2500 persons.

POST OFFICE ESTABLISHMENT.

The post office establishment is under the direction of a post master general, whose office is called the general post office, and is kept at the seat of government.

Congress, by special acts, established such post-roads as appear to them expedient. At this time there is a main post road which extends 1733 miles, from Scodie, on the north-eastern extremity of the Sea coast of the United States, to St. Mary's on the south-eastern extremity, and another main post road, which leads from the seat of government to New Orleans, being the distance of 1233 miles, and branches or cross roads, which keep up a communication between the capital of the United States and the capital of the individual States, and also with every city or village of any note. The aggregate of the extent of the several post roads is 31,616 miles.

The mail is carried by contracts made with the post master general, who has divided the whole into nearly four hundred and sixty routes or contracts, and stipulates for its conveyance as often and with such expedition as he finds the public interest requires. It is now carried every day between the great commercial

towns; twice a week to the capitals of each state where they are not commercial, and once a week to other places. The usual rate of travelling on the cross roads is 40 miles a day, and from sixty to one hundred and twenty miles in twenty-four hours, between the great commercial towns.

Post offices are established by the post master general, at such places as he considers expedient. There are already rising of two thousand (1809) post offices in the United States.

Stages are erected for the conveyance of the mail and passengers, from Wiscasset in Main, to St. Mary's in Georgia, and on many of the cross roads.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

For single letters, (such as are composed of one piece of paper) and carried not exceeding 40 miles, eight cents; over 40 miles, and not over 90 miles, ten cents; over 90 miles, and not over 150 miles, 12 1-2 cents; over 150 miles, and not over 300 miles, 17 cents; over 300 miles, and not over 500 miles, 20 cents; over 500 miles, 25 cents. Double letters, or those composed of two pieces, double those rates; triple letters, or those composed of three pieces, triple those rates; quadruple letters, or those composed of four pieces, quadruple those rates; packets or letters, containing more than three inclosures, are charged by weight, each quarter ounce being equal to a single letter.

POSTAGE ON NEWSPAPERS.

Each paper carried not exceeding 100 miles, one cent; over 100 miles, and out of the state where printed, one and a half cents.

POSTAGE ON MAGAZINES OR PAMPHLETS.

For each sheet carried not over 50 miles, one cent; over 50 miles, and not over 100 miles one and a half cents; over 100 miles, two cents.

Neither magazines nor pamphlets are admitted into the mail, when they are addressed to places to which the mail is carried on horseback, if the post master is

of opinion that they will impede the transportation of the mail.

Those who send letters may either pay the postage in advance, or leave it to be paid by their correspondents.

When letters have lain in a post office three months they are then called dead letters, and are returned to the general post office, where they are opened; if they contain nothing which appears to be valuable they are destroyed; if they contain any thing which appears to be valuable they are returned to the writer, if his residence is known, and if not known, they are preserved in the office.

REMARKS ON THE FOREGOING TABLE.

Since the 24th of January 1803, the convenience, utility, and security of mail coaches have been extended in different parts of the United States, over post roads, to the distance of 3,085 miles, where they never had been contemplated previous to that period.

Since the third of March 1801, the post roads have increased forty-four and three-fourths per cent. The establishment of mail coaches have been increased sixty-nine and an half per cent. The daily transportation of the mail by stages has increased 2427 miles, and the whole daily transportation of the mail has increased 3,950 miles.
