History of Class of 1928

VOLUME I.

E. W. McCauley was captain of the football squad, and Dan Long Newman was captain of the basketball team. Other members of our class played an active part in athletics.

March 2, 1927, we entertained the seniors.

David Brown Harrell gave a certificate recital in piano.

Our quietness as juniors only served as proof of our sincerity of purpose in our work.

Father Time again shifts the scene, and we have blossomed out into seniority and its accompanying dignity and responsibility.

January 4, 1928, we paid our last matriculation fee to the business manager.

Among the notable activities on the campus was the junior-senior banquet. How nice it seemed to be entertained by the juniors. They seemed to have entirely forgotten the time when they were freshmen and we were sophomores.

Then came senior-sophomore day. Once more we exercised the power of sophomore rule.

May 1, our graduating theses were presented for approval. How relieved we felt to know that we were that near graduation.

May 25. All examinations were over, and we enjoyed a final outing together, our senior picnic.

May 29, 1928. A look at the four years that have just passed brings a sigh of relief that we have reached our goal; but this sigh is closely followed by another of regret at leaving our Alma Mater with its associations, friendships, trials, rewards, moments of pleasure, its hours of disappointments, its loves—and we almost wish we were starting again. But the determination that has brought us successfully to the close of our college career will surely carry us through life with its problems. And now as we receive our diplomas and leave our Alma Mater, it is with the hope that we may ever reflect credit on you and that we may do our part in the making of a greater Elon College and a better world.

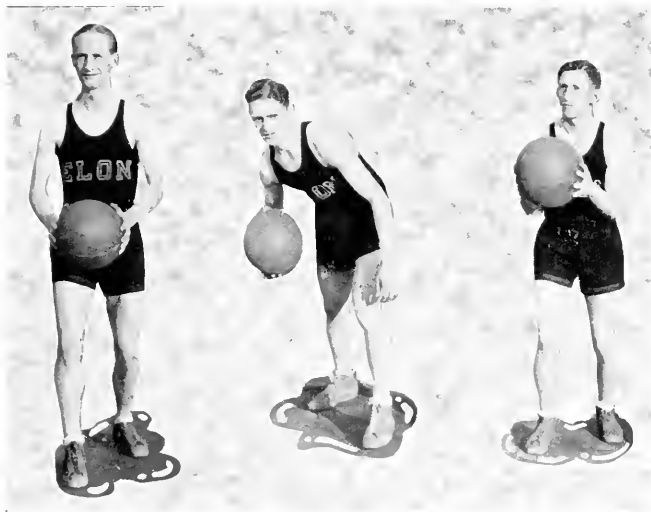




ROBERT E. SIMS, JR.

DAN LONG NEWMAN

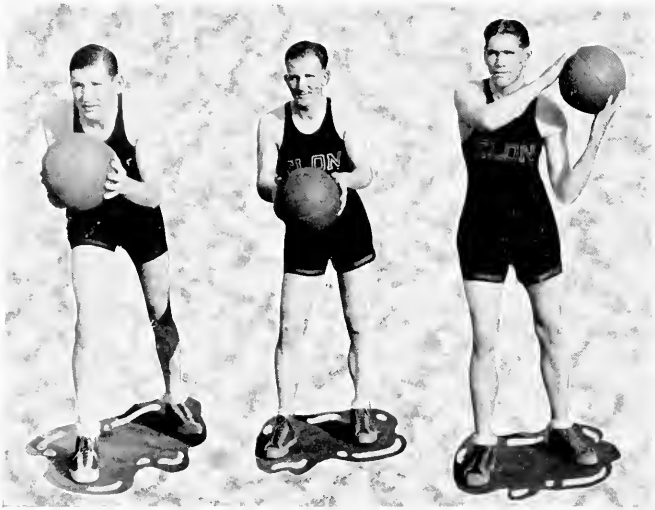

CLARENCE J. CRUTCHFIELD

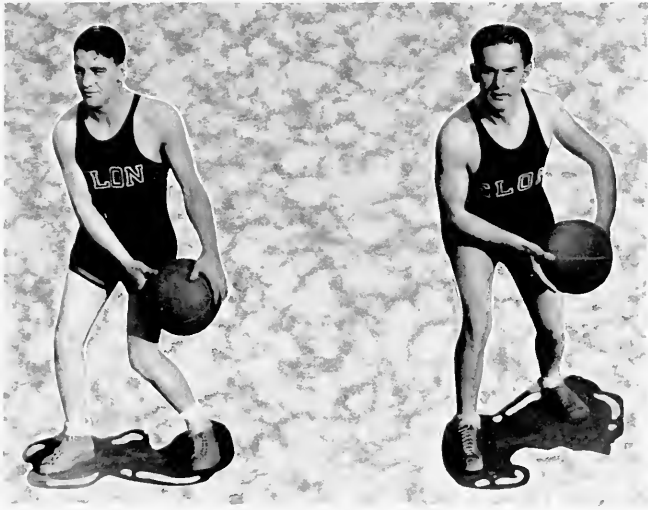
