
Football Review

The past football season has been the most outstanding season in the history of Elon. Coach Walker drilled and trained his men to the highest efficiency any Elon football team has ever reached.



Since the society has been organized it has turned out some outstanding men, and the society still plays a very important part on the campus toward moulding young men for their future career.


