Until then, beware of any helpers. Helpers are con-men who promise something for nothing. They spoil you and keep you dependent and immature

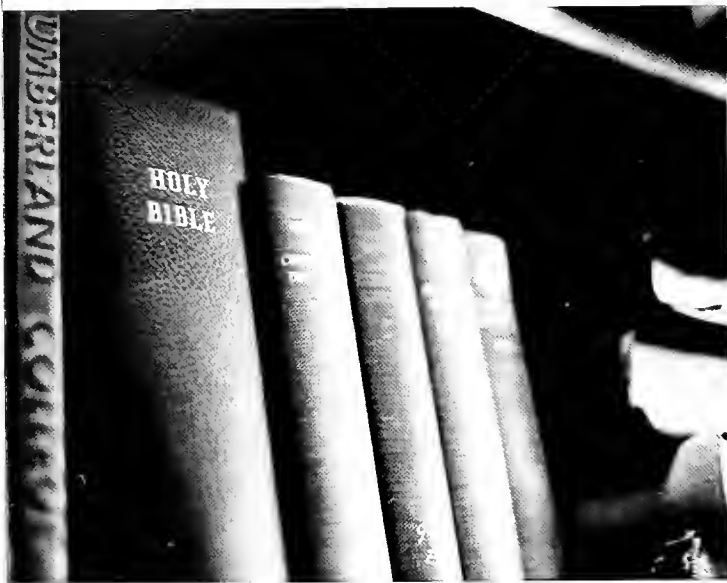

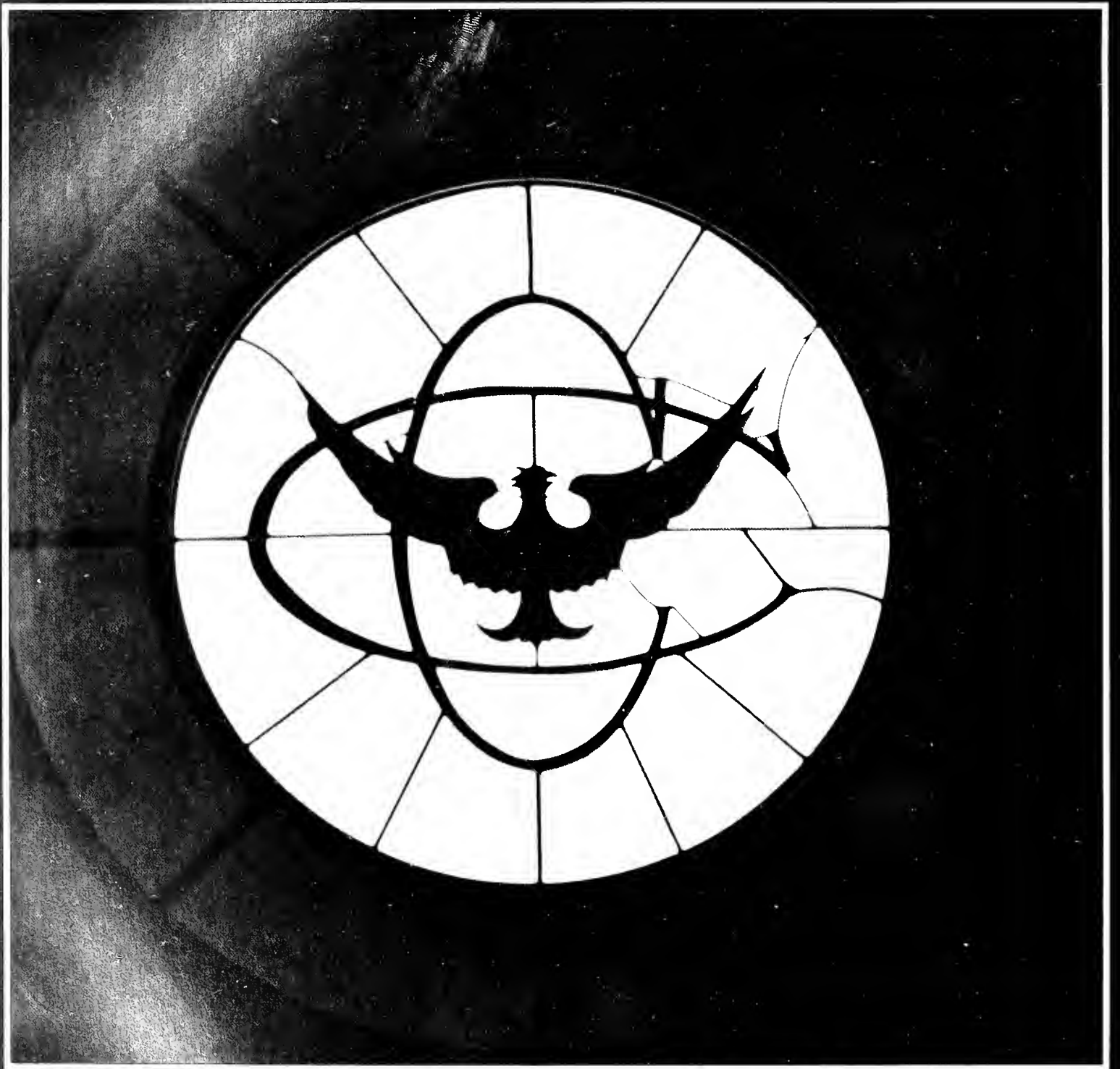
Without any writing, we'll all forget each other. However, the annual staff is apparently too lazy to write anything; they just want to measure pictures and play with their power.
