A Word From Our President



Dear Cumberland University Students:

Every year, Cumberland University passes milestones and creates new levels of achievement to surpass. The 1993-94 academic year was no exception; consider these accomplishments: Fall semester enrollment reached a record-breaking 1,001 students; an innovative Writing Across the Curriculum Program was implemented; the 1994 edition of "Who's Who Among American Colleges and Universities" included CU students for the first time since 1984; The Phoenix Players and the Cumberland Singers Ensemble performed in six student productions, including Cabaret — the first musical to be performed at CU; Sigma Sigma Sigma National Sorority installed Zeta Xi chapter; the football team played in its first NAIA playoff game after ending the regular season with a 9-1 record; and the 1994 graduating class of 170 was the largest in the history of the University and included the first students to complete the BSN degree program.

Cumberland University is poised and has within its grasp the potential of becoming, not only one of the best, but *the* best educational opportunity and choice for students. I want to congratulate the students of CU whose commitment to the liberal arts tradition has contributed to our reputation for academic excellence.









Extra! Extra! Extra! Bulldogs Explode!!


LEBANON, Tenn. — We are so proud of our Dawgs! In the fourth season of CU's "Risen from the Dead" football

program, the bulldogs triumphed to near perfection with a season record of 9-2 and a trip to the 1st round of the NAIA Playoffs.

The winning began with the season opener — a home game against Clinch Valley. It was the debut of new Head Coach Herschel Moore and the wing-T offense which took 333 yards while the defense forced 7 urnovers. The Bulldogs intercepted 5 passes and beat CV 24-17. On to Cambellsville — the Bulldogs' deense fortified the win, 26-21, by forcing five more turnovers. The next victim was Tusculum, who fell 17-7 to the Dawgs. After this game, CU was ranked in the top 25 in NAIA Division II rankings. The Bulldogs' record improved to 4-0 afer the next game, at Maryville Colege. The defense held Maryville to 75 yards rushing as the Dawgs won 18-6 and rose in the NAIA rankings to 17th. In a killer home win over Sewanee, the bulldogs held the Tigers to MINUS 52 yards on the ground and sacked the quarterback 15 times. CU won 14-13 and rose to 15th in the NAIA poll. The next team to feel the bite was first year program Sue Bennett. Sloshing around on a muddy Kirk field, the Bulldogs slayed the Dragons 27-0 and rose two notches in the NAIA rankings to 13th. Cu then came up with a 27-24 win against 18th ranked Union, thanks in a huge way to Chris Jefferson's 42-yard scoring pass to Terrance McClain with 1:49 left to play, which pulled the Bulldogs from behind for the

victory. The "blizzard" and frigid temps of Homecoming '94 were rough, but it didn't stop the 12th ranked Bulldogs from beating Bethel College 33-12 and rising into the top ten NAIA rankings at no. 9. NCAA Div. III giant Evansville handed the Dawgs their only regular-season loss with a score of 12-28. No matter, the raging Dawgs went to Athens, TN, and won the season finale against TN-Wesleyan 16-9. The Bulldogs finished at no. 14 in the NAIA rankings and headed to Puyallup, Washington, to take on no. 1ranked Pacific Lutheran in the first round of the NAIA Division II playoffs — a first in the history of Cumberland University. The Lutes came out with the win, 61-7, but the Bulldogs put up a good fight and came home to a school proud of her awesome 1993 football team. The team was accompanied by friends and family to Washington, but as the majority of CU's family was left in Tennessee, John Wood did a great job (as usual) of bringing the game home to us on the radio. He was assisted by injured CU player Jason Harville.

The senior leaders on the team came a long way from the "first year" team of so long ago to join with their teammates in celebrating a dream season. We knew the Dawgs could do it all along! Congratulations to all of the players, coaches, and staff who were part of the program. The Bulldogs got a new Head Coach, Herschel Moore. Moore served as an assistant under Nick Coutras and took over at the end of the '92 season. Coach Moore coached high school football in Nashville beginning at Isaac Litton High in the late 1950's. Coach Moore had a great first year, as his Bulldogs went to the first round of the NAIA playoffs and he was named Coach of the Year for NAIA District 24 and Co-Coach of the Year by the Tennessee Sports Writers Association!










