

Introduction.

The text upon which the following phonological investigations are based, has been edited by Prof. Bülbring, for the Early English Text Society [part 97].

The MS. is preserved in the British Museum [Additional M.S. 17, 376].

The date of the MS. is discussed by Prof. Konrath in the introduction to his edition of William of Shoreham [EE. TS. ES. 86]¹⁾, where he makes the following remarks.

"The date of the MS., according to Sir Frederic Madden, is the earlier half of the 14th century. In a colophon at the end of the poem on the seven deadly sins [p. 114 of the present edition] the name of Archbishop Simon of Canterbury is mentioned. This is Simon Mepham, a Kentishman who held the see from 1327 to 1333. So the MS. cannot have been written before 1327. Mr. Wright attributes it to the beginning of the reign of Edward III. But is it really so early as that? Varnhagen ['Englische Studien' II, p. 86, footnote], speaking of the portion which contains the poems, thinks that it can scarcely be assigned to an earlier date than the last quarter of the 14th century, and if I were to judge only from internal evidence, especially that of the spelling, I should be strongly inclined to agree with him. Dr. Furnivall, however, assures me that in his opinion the MS. cannot be later than 1350."

Morsbach, Mittelenglische Grammatik, p. 9, says that the oldest and best of the two MS. belongs to the last quarter of the fourteenth century.

My original plan was to write a complete grammatical investigation of the text, and to determine its dialectical peculiarities with relation to other texts and the modern English dialects of the district to which presumably it belongs. For personal reasons, however, — especially on account of my failing health — I have found myself compelled to limit my present work to a merely statistical phonology on an etymological and historical basis.

I have used Prof. Bülbring's MS. glossary in the preparation of the work, and have checked all forms and references myself. Hence the whole responsibility lies with me.

Prof. Bülbring has moreover given me the following corrections to his edition: —

- 72, 12. Read: *Se! þes synzers and.*
- 10, 7. Instead of *partener* read *parcener*.
- 48, 18. For *iū* read *in*.
- 56, 13. Read *vñ-to* instead of *vñ to*.
- 61, 10. Read *zou, ze, zour*, instead of *you, ye, your*.
- 28, 7. Read *flaume* instead of *flamne*.
- 72, 12. Read *enflaumed* instead of *enflammed*.

I give a complete phonology: every form is included, and a sufficient number of passages given. All quotations of numbers after 150, refer to the pages in Prof. Bülbring's edition. In the arrangement of the material I have mainly followed H. Stodte, Über die Sprache und Heimat der Katherine-Gruppe, Göttingen 1896. In conclusion, I may here say that I feel it a great pleasure, to express my grateful thanks to Prof. Bülbring, not only for suggesting the theme of the dissertation, but also for giving me much valuable assistance in the arrangement of the material, and improving the whole work greatly.

§ 1. O. E. *a* from W. G. *a*.

O. E. *a* is preserved, or in open syllables lengthened to *ā*, according to well-known rules. I have included here all forms in which possibly u/a-Umlaut had changed W. G. *a* into *ea* (as in Anglian *fearan*), because no distinction is made here between O. E. *a* and *ea*. Likewise also the possible effect of the smoothing of *ea* to *æ* (as in Anglian *mæcian*) does not appear.

§ 25. Smoothing and palatal mutation.

In most cases the ME. development has obscured the differences of the O. E. forms which ought to be considered here. For instance *ekand* may just as well come from O. E. *ēacand* as from *ēcand*, no distinction being made by our scribe between *ē* and *ē*. But in the following instances the forms of our text still betray their origin more or less unmistakeably.

Final Remarks.

There can be no doubt, that our text is Midland, as it contains no specifically Northern features, such as the preservation of O. E. *a* unrounded or the absence of palatalisation of *c* and *ȝ* before original palatal vowels; nor does it contain more than a sprinkling of forms which show specifically Southern features. These latter are very few in number, being at the most one thousandth of the whole vocabulary. There are two possible ways of explaining their presence, either as being due to *scribal* influence; or as actual borrowings of Non-Midland forms in the dialect of the author of the Psalter.

Actual dialect mixture of the latter kind does not seem to have taken place here, as the number of Non-Midland forms is very small. When Heuser [I.F. XVII, Anz. p. 76] speaks of the „von Bülbiring edierte Prosapsalter, mit seinem unglücklichen Mischdialekte“, he seems to be wrong. From a dialectical point of view the text generally is reliable, though the numerous mistakes of the scribe (cp. the introduction to the printed edition, p. IX) render it more difficult to investigate. It is possible that some of the supposed Southern forms are merely cases of bad spelling.

The fact that in this MS. the Psalter was copied by the same hand which copied Shoreham's poems, makes it quite possible that part of the Non-Midland forms are due to this

scribe. Morsbach [M. E. Gram. § 3, p. 10] states that the scribe who copied to MS. of the poems was not of Kentish origin.

Possibly he spoke a southern dialect, a fact which would certainly make clear the source of the southern forms.

The tests for distinguishing between the East and West divisions of the Midland dialect are few. The most reliable lies in the treatment of the present participial ending, which appears in the East as *-ende*, in the West as *ande*.

The Psalter has, as a rule, *-ande* therein agreeing with the West Midland, e. g. *hezand* 3, 3; *liztenand* 18, 9; *spredand* 103, 3; *wrekand* 88, 4, etc.; but *derend* 54, 3; and *penchend* 73, 19 occur, which may possibly be merely bad spellings.

Older *a* before *n* appears as *o* usually in the West Midland Dialect. The Psalter has *a* if not lengthened, whereas Myrc seems always to have *o*. The Alliterative Poems have both *a* and *o*.

I have found no examples of the verbal endings *-us*, *-ud*, which Morsbach states to be West Midland.
