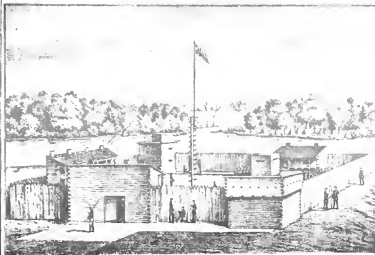
The Photo-Gravures show the city in its loveliest garb.

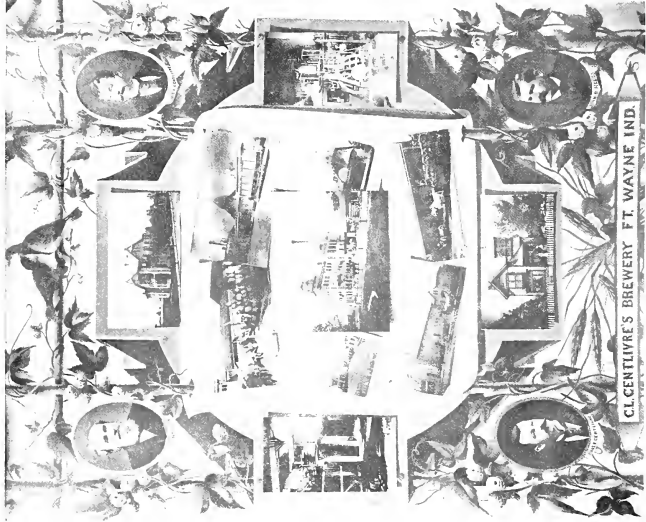

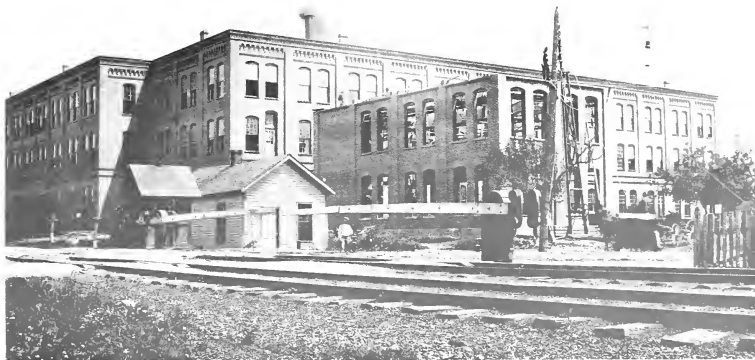

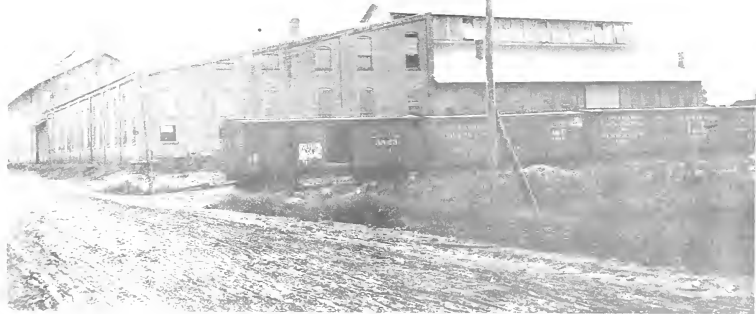

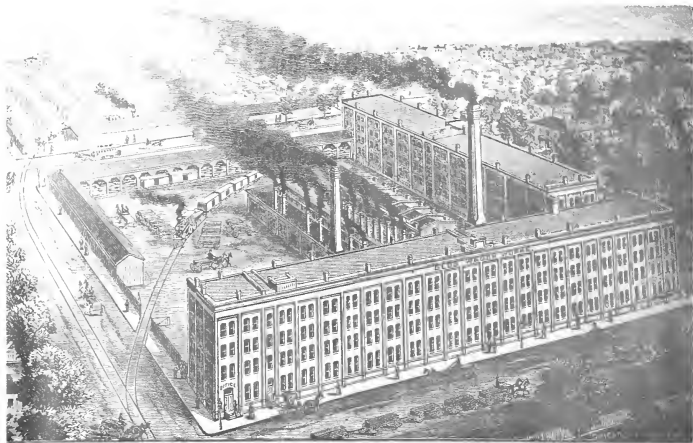

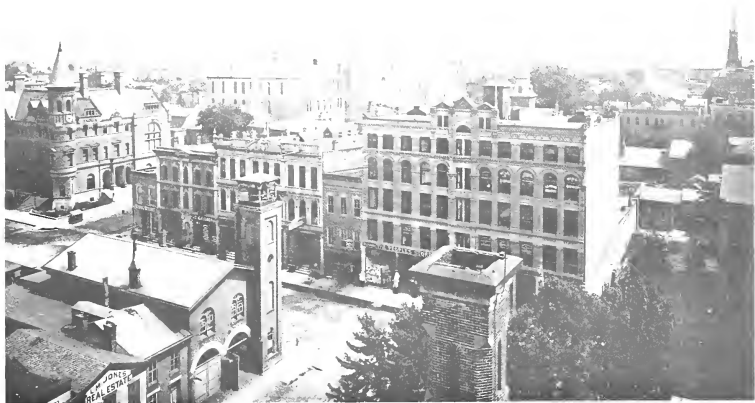

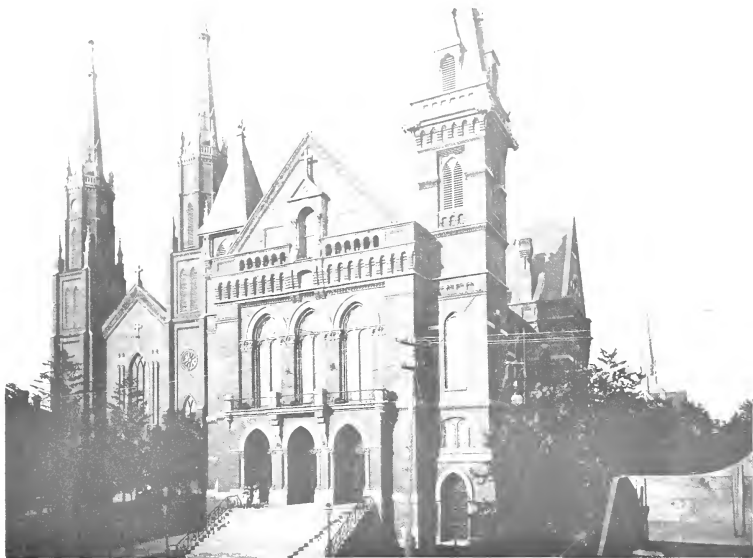
