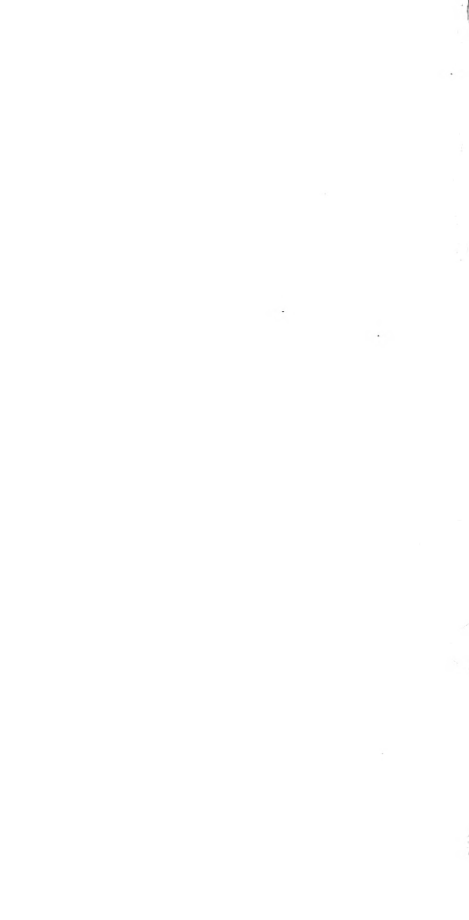


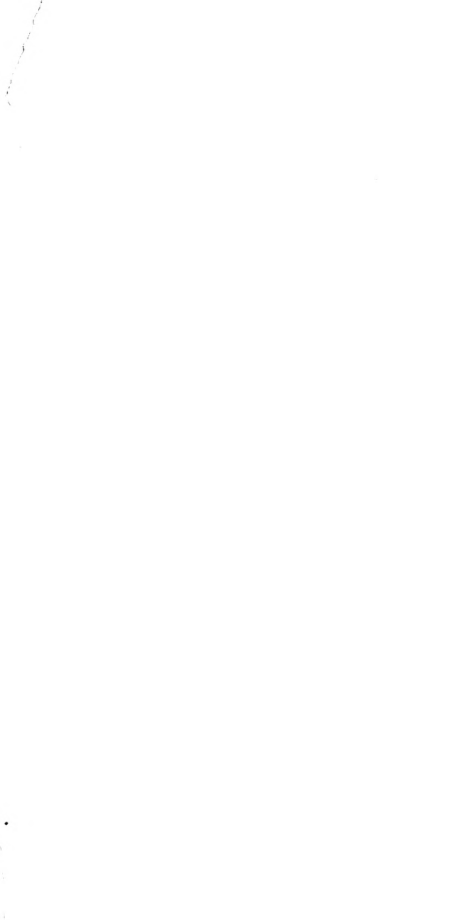

THE favorable reception the pocket Almanack met with last year has been an encouragement to publish another in the same form for the year 1780; and it is presumed that the constant usefulness of such small pocket companions will always be sufficient for their recommendation, as they shew, with a single glance of the eye, the full and changes of the moon—the day of the month and week—the rising and setting of the sun and moon—and the time of high water:—It also contains many remarkable days, such as the sitting of courts; the feasts, fasts, and other holy days observable by the episcopal church; the birth days and deaths of the principal potentates in Europe as well as other great personages; and a variety of memorable events that have taken place in the world, together with other curious and instructing matters, which it is not doubted will be useful and entertaining to the reader.

IV. There is a certain Place where the Winds, tho' frequently veering round the Compass, always blow from the North.

V. There is a Country in *Ethiopia*, to whose Inhabitants the Body of the Moon appears most enlightened when it is least enlightened.

VI. There is an Island in the *Baltic* Sea, to whose Inhabitants the Body of the Sun is visible in the Morning before it rises, and in the Evening after it sets.

ECLIPSES in the Year 1780.

THERE will be four ECLIPSES this Year, two of the SUN and two of the MOON, in the following Order, *viz.*

I. The first will be of the Sun the fourth Day of May, about Eight o'Clock in the morning; invisible to us by reason of the Moon's South Latitude.

II. The second will be of the Moon on Thursday the Eighteenth Day of May, about Six o'Clock in the morning; scarcely visible to us.

III. The third will be of the Sun, on Friday the Twenty seventh Day of October, visible, calculated as follows, *viz.*

[A Digit is the twelfth part of the diameter of the Sun.]

Some Astronomers have calculated this Eclipse to be a total one; others not so great as the above.

Time and observation must therefore discover which is the most correct.

IV. The last will be of the Moon, on Saturday the Eleventh Day of November, visible, calculated as follows, *viz.*

A Geographical Description of the World

EUROPE, situate between 101. West and 65d. East Longitude, and between 36 and 72 degrees North latitude, is bounded by the frozen ocean on the North, by Asia on the East, by the Mediterranean Sea on the South (which divides it from Africa) and the Atlantic ocean on the West, being 3000 miles long, and 2500 broad. The grand divisions of this part of the World are, France, Spain, Portugal, Italy, Switzerland, Austrian and United Netherlands, Germany, Bohemia, Hungary, Transylvania, Sclavonia, Croatia, Poland, Russia, Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Turkey in Europe. — The most eminent Islands are Great Britain, Ireland, Iceland, Sicily, Sardinia, Ivica, Majorca, Minorca, Corsica, Cephalonia, Corfu, the Archipelago Islands, and Candia.

ASIA. The Continent of Asia is situate between 25 and 148 degrees of East Longitude, & between the Equator and 72 degrees of North latitude; 4800 miles long, and 4300 broad; is bounded by the frozen ocean on the North, by the Pacific ocean on the East, by the Indian ocean on the South, and on the West by the Red Sea, the Levant, Archipelago, Bosphorus, Propontis, Bosphorus, Black Sea, the Rivers Don, Tobol, and Obi. — The principal Kingdoms and States are, Turkey in Asia, Arabia, Persia, Assyria, China, Arabia, Mesopotamia, India, Media, Palestine, Chaldea, Tartary, Siberia. — The most remarkable of the Islands are the Turkish in the Archipelago and Levant, and those of Japan, Formosa, the Philippines, Molucco's, Borneo, Java, Sumatra, Batavia, Ceylon, and the Maldives.

AFRICA, is a Peninsula joined to Asia by an Isthmus, and situate between 18 degrees West and 50 East longitude; and between 37 and 35 South latitude; bounded by the Mediterranean Sea (which divides it from Europe) on the North; by the Isthmus of Suez, the Red Sea and the Indian ocean on the East; by the Southern ocean on the South; and by the Atlantic Ocean on the West; being 4300 miles long, and 4200 broad, and is divided into the following Kingdoms, viz. Egypt, Barbary, Numidia, Ethiopia, Nubia, Congo, Abyssinia, Guinea, &c. — The chief Islands are Madagascar, St. Helena, Cape Verd Islands, St. Thomas, Canaries, Madeira, Azores.

AMERICA, or the new World, is situate between 35 and 145 degrees of West longitude, and between 80 North and 58 South latitude; bounded by the land and seas about the Arctic Pole on the North; by the Atlantic ocean (which separates it from the old World) on the East; by the vast Southern ocean on the South; and by the Pacific ocean on the West; being upwards of 8000 miles in length from North to South; but its greatest breadth scarce 3000 miles.—It is divided into North and South America; the former containing the Provinces of Mexico, Florida, Georgia, Carolina, Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Jerseys, New-York, New-England, Nova-Scotia, and Canada.—The latter contains the Brazils, Peru, Chili, Patagonia, Amazonia, Paraguay, and Terra Firma.—The most noted Islands are Cuba, Hispaniola, Porto Rico, the Virgins, Trinidad, Margarett, Chiloe, Juan-Fernando, Jamaica, Newfoundland, Barbados, St. Kitts, Antigua, Nevis, Dominica, Barbuda, Anguilla, Montserrat, Tobago, St. Vincent, St. Lucia, Bahamas, Bermuda, St. Martins, Guadaloup, St. Bartholomew's, Desada, Marigalante, Martinico, Granada, St. Croix, Curracoa, St. Eustatia, St. Thomas.

Of the natural Division of the Earth

BY the natural division of the Earth is meant the parts on its surface formed by nature; such as Continents, Oceans, Islands, Seas, Rivers, & Mountains.

The ancients were of various opinions with regard to the figure of the Earth; some imagined it to be cylindrical, others believed it to be in the form of a drum; but it was generally thought to be a vast extended plane, bounded by the horizon, and that all beneath it was Hades, or the region of Spirits; but the industry of succeeding ages banished these unphilosophical opinions, and experience, that touchstone of truth, has established a spherical figure beyond all contradiction.

The *Globe* consists of Land and Water, whereof one quarter of the surface only is land.

The Land is divided into two great Continents, viz. the Eastern and Western (besides Islands)

The Waters are divided into three extensive oceans, (besides lesser seas) viz. the Atlantic, the Pacific, and the Indian ocean.

The Atlantic, or Western ocean, is 3000 miles wide.

The Pacific ocean, which divides America from Asia, is 10,000 miles over. And,

The Indian ocean, lying between the East Indies and Africa, is about 3000 miles over.

A *Continent* is a large portion of Land, contiguous, not separated by any Sea.

An *Ocean* is a great body of Water which divides such Continents, and washing their borders or shores;

A *Sea* is a Water confined by the Land, as the Mediterranean and Baltic Seas.

A *Bay* or *Gulf*, is a part of the Sea almost surrounded by Land, as the Gulf of Mexico, the Bay of Biscay, Torbay, &c.

A *Strait*, is a narrow Passage out of one Sea into another, as the Strait of Gibraltar, or that of Magellan.

A *Lake*, is a Water surrounded by Land, as Lake George, Lake Champlain, &c.

A *Peninsula*, is a Country almost surrounded by the Sea, as Arabia, the Morea, and Crim Tartary.

An *Isthmus*, is a narrow Neck of Land which joins a Peninsula to some other Country, as the Isthmus of Darien, which joins North and South America.

A *Cape* or *Promontory*, is a Point of Land extending a considerable Way into the Sea, as Cape Cod & Cape Ann.

A *Mountain* is a part of the Land more elevated than the adjacent country, whereby it is seen at a greater distance than the neighbouring low Lands.

An *Island* is a part of dry Land, surrounded by Water.

A *Channel* is an arm of the Sea running between two shores and broader than a Strait.

A *Road*, is a Place defended from most Winds by some Islands or Head Land, affording shelter and good anchorage for ships.

A *Creek* is a narrow part or arm of the Sea running a little way into the Land.

Rivers are streams of Water flowing chiefly from the mountains, and running in long narrow channels or cavities thro' the Land, till they either fall into the Sea, or into other Rivers, which at last discharge their Waters into the Sea.

A Remedy for the Stone or Gravel.

TAKE one ounce of the salt of tartar, and dissolve it in a pint of boiling rain water; then pour it on three ounces of lime; take about 30 drops of this infusion in a pint of broth made of the leanest of veal, having first been well skimmed of every particle of fat.—The broth must be sipped by degrees, so as to be an hour in taking the pint; three pints must be taken in a day, abstaining from all acids, salt or salt meat, or fat of any kind, or vegetables, except turnips, potatoes & onions. The patient may eat beef, mutton, veal, lamb, chickens, ducks, and rabbits, but without any sauce except their own gravy; their drink water, with a little rum or brandy in it; and to use such exercise as can be taken without pain; and if they expect any benefit from the medicine they must persevere in the use of it, even tho' they find no amendment for a few weeks.

The above remedy is similar to that of Mrs. Stevens's, (for the disclosing of which she received £.5000 from Parliament) also of Dr. Chittick's celebrated nostrum; they being nothing more than a weak veal broth medicated with a greater or less quantity, as circumstances require, of soap lye, or some substance of which a fixt alkaline salt is the basis, not specifically different from soap lye.—Such are the virtues of these medicines, that the urine of those who have taken them, particularly the soap lye, in a few weeks becomes a menstruum in which stones, which come from the bladder, are soluble, as has been often proved by experiment.

A speedy Cure for a Sprained Foot or Ankle.

FIRST, let it be fomented with vinegar, a little warm, for four or five minutes at a time once every four hours; this will render the circulation of the fluids, in the parts affected, more easy, and either prevent its swelling, or promote its subsiding.

Second, let the person stand three or four minutes at a time on both his feet in their natural posture, and sometimes move the strained foot; and sometimes, when sitting with his foot on a low stool, let him move it this way and that as he can bear it; this will contribute much to contract the over-stretched vessels, and to recover a due circulation of their fluids through them.

Third, let a gentle dry friction with a warm hand be sometimes used to the parts affected, which will conduce much to the same ends.

Two hours after every application of the vinegar, let the parts affected be just wetted with rectified spirits of wine, and then gently rubbed.

By these means persons have recovered from the effects of very violent sprains in a few days, when others have been weeks in recovering, where different ways of management were used, such as continual resting of the strained foot, and disuse of its motions, &c.

Recipe for a recent Cold.

BOIL half a pound of honey and clarify it, then throw therein one lemmon, peel and all, first cut into thin slices, which boil till tender, then add a little saffron.—The patient is to eat some of the peel, and take a little of the syrup of en, to ease and cure the cough.

A Question.

A Shepherd in time of war, was driving a flock of sheep and was met by three plundering parties of soldiers. The first party obliged him to deliver them one half of his flock and half a sheep; the second party obliged him to deliver them one half of what the first party had left him and half a sheep; the third party obliged him to deliver them one half of what the second party had left him and half a sheep, all which orders he punctually performed without killing or dividing a sheep, and had just twenty left. Now it is required how many sheep he had in this flock at first.

Of Contentment.

GOOD and bad, affluence and want, felicity and misfortune, all great or little, just as we suit ourselves to them. Some look upon little accidents as great afflictions, and a slender advantage as high profusity.—He is the richest man who desires no superfluous, and wants for no necessary. The discontented rich are poor, and those unhappy whom small misfortunes subdue.
