## ECLIPSES IN 1843.

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There will be three Eclipses this year—two of the Sun, and one of the Moon.

I. The first will be of the Sun, on Tuesday, June 27, at 2h. 30m. in the afternoon; invisible in New England, because the Moon's latitude will be south. At the time of the ecliptical conjunction, the Sun will be vertical or directly overhead, in latitude  $37^{\circ} 22'$  N. nearly, and longitude  $37^{\circ} 30'$  W. from Boston, which will be west of the Sandwich Islands, in the Pacific Ocean.

II. The second will be a small Eclipse of the Moon, on Wednesday evening, Dec. 6, visible, and by calculation as follows:—

Beginning - - - - -	6h. 43m.	} Apparent time.
Middle - - - - -	7h. 36m.	
End - - - - -	8h. 29m.	

Quantity eclipsed about one sixth of the Moon's diameter on the southerly limb. The Moon will be vertically eclipsed to the inhabitants of the Barbary Coast, or rather to those of Sahara, or the Great Desert, inhabited by a few wandering Arabs.

III. The third will be of the Sun, on Thursday, Dec. 21, at 0h. 24m. in the morning, consequently invisible in America, either North or South.

## TREASURY OF MASSACHUSETTS, DEC. 31, 1842.

The total amount of ordinary receipts was \$490,845, 22. Ordinary expenditures, \$351,550 87. The excess of ordinary revenue over ordinary expenditures has been \$64,248 10, and the balance in the Treasury on the 31st of December, 1842, was \$41,652 69.

Of the State Scrip to the amount of \$294,137, which fell due during the year 1842, the redemption of which was provided for in the act of March 3d, 1842, there has been paid from the ordinary funds of the Treasury the sum of \$94,137, and the further sum of \$25,807 92, received under the provisions of the Act of March 3d, 1842, "relating to monies which may be distributed from the proceeds of the Public Lands," has been applied to the redemption of said scrip, leaving a balance of \$174,192 08; all of which has been redeemed by new scrip, payable in one, two, three and four years, except the sum of \$7,649, which has not been presented for payment.

Of the temporary loan of \$250,000 authorized by the resolve of Jan. 28, 1842, the Treasurer has had only occasion to avail himself by borrowing, in the months of February and March, the sum of \$100,000; all of which was paid in April.

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### RATE OF POSTAGE.

Every letter of a single sheet, not over 30 miles, 6 cents; over 30 and not exceeding 80, 10 cents; over 80 and not exceeding 150, 12 1-2 cents; over 150 and not exceeding 400, 18 3 4 cents; over 400, 25 cents.

Letters composed of two pieces of paper, *double* postage; three pieces, *triple*, and four pieces, *quadruple*.

Packets composed of one or more pieces of paper, or one or more other articles, and weighing one ounce, *quadruple* those rates, and in proportion for all greater weight.

Every article sent in the mail, which is not either a newspaper, magazine, pamphlet, or legislative journal, is subject to letter postage, excepting printer's bills to their subscribers, which may be sent in a newspaper, magazine, &c.

Every ship letter, originally received at an office for delivery, 6 cents, and if forwarded by post, with the addition of two cents to the ordinary rates of postage.

Letters by steam boats are subject to postage as if carried all the way by land.

Newspapers, not over 100 miles, 1 cent: over 100 miles, 1 1-2 cent; to any distance in the state where printed, 1 cent. Magazines and pamphlets, not over 100 miles, 4 cents per sheet, that is, 4 cents for every 4 pages folio, 8 quarto, 16 octavo, or 24 duodecimo, or of a smaller size; over 100 miles, 6 cents. But if published *periodically*, the postage is, not over 100 miles, 1 1-2 cent; over 100 miles, 2 1-2 cents.

Magazines and pamphlets must be marked with the number of sheets they contain.

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*The Convention of the Congregational Ministers in the  
Commonwealth of Massachusetts*

Is a voluntary Association, embracing all the Congregational Clergy of the Commonwealth, but vested with no particular authority or control over the Churches.

Their meeting is held in Boston, on the last Wednesday in May, annually, at five o'clock, P. M. and the following day. After transacting the usual business of the Convention, a sermon is delivered in public before them, and a collection made for the charitable purpose of relieving the indigent Widows of Congregational clergymen.

The Officers of the Convention are—

Rev. Nehemiah Adams, of Boston, Scribe of the Convention.

For the purpose of investigating cases of necessity, and of application for the charity of the Convention, there are two standing Committees; a Central Committee, chosen centrally, and a Reporting Committee, whose members reside in different parts of the State. The Reporting Committee are required, each year, to investigate the circumstances of the objects of this charity, whether already on the list, or needing, or applying the first time for aid, and make a particular statement to the Central Committee, directed to the Scribe of the Convention, at least one week before the meeting of the Convention. Should any member neglect so to do for two successive years, his place in the Reporting Committee shall be vacated. The Central Committee receive from the members of the Reporting Committee applications and statements of facts in behalf of subjects of the charity of the Convention, and, having considered the same, are to judge of the persons to be relieved, and the proportion to be given to each, and make report to the Convention, on the first day of their meeting, annually.

The statements of the members of the Reporting Committee are expected to contain answers to the following questions—

1. What is her age?
2. What are the number, the sex, the ages, and the circumstances of their children?
3. What is a fair estimate of her property?
4. What is her ability to help herself?
5. What connexions has she, who are bound to afford her assistance? And in what way do they assist her?
6. What is her income?
7. What peculiar circumstances render her an object of charity; or make it desirable that she should have aid this year?

## SITTINGS OF THE FEDERAL COURTS.

### SUPREME COURT.

At the seat of Government, the second Monday in January, annually.

When any of the following days happen on Sunday, the Court is to be holden on the Monday following.

#### FIRST CIRCUIT.

In *New Hampshire*, at Portsmouth, on the 8th of May; and at Exeter, on the 8th of October.

In *Rhode Island*, at Providence, on the 15th day of November; and at Newport, on the 15th day of June.

In *Massachusetts*, at Boston, May 15th and Oct. 15th.

In *Maine*, at Portland, 1st of May; and at Wiscasset, 1st of October.

#### SECOND CIRCUIT.

In *Connecticut*, at New Haven, on the last Wednesday of April; and at Hartford, on the 17th of September.

In *Vermont*, at Windsor, on the 21st day of May; and at Rutland, on the 3d of October.

In *New York*, last Monday in February, 1st Monday in April, last Monday in July and November; in Albany, 3d Tuesday in October; in Canandaigua, Tuesday next after 3d Monday in June.

### DISTRICT COURTS.

In *Maine*, at Portland, the 1st Tuesday in June, and December; and at Wiscasset, the last Tuesday in February, and on 1st Tuesday of September.

In *New Hampshire*, at Portsmouth, 3d Tuesday in March and Sept.; and at Exeter, 3d in June and Dec.

In *Vermont*, at Rutland 3d of October; and at Windsor, 21st of May.

In *Massachusetts*, at Boston, 3d Tuesday in March, and 4th in June, 2d in Sept. and 1st in December.

In *Rhode Island*, at Newport, 2d Tues. in May and 3d in Oct.; at Providence, 1st Tues. in Aug. and Feb.

In *Connecticut*, at New Haven, 4th Tues. in Feb. and Aug.; at Hartford, 4th Tuesday in May and Nov.

Exclusive of the above mentioned stated Courts, the District Judges have power to hold Special Courts, in their respective Districts, at their discretion.

By the new bill for the organization of the army, the whole number of officers and men is to be reduced to little more than 9,000. The second regiment of dragoons will be converted, after March 4, 1843, into a regiment of riflemen. The offices of Commissary General of Purchases, one Inspector General, three Paymasters, two Surgeons, and ten Assistant Surgeons, are abolished.

The following arrangement of military geographical departments, having been duly submitted and approved, is published for the Government of the Army.

Department, No. 1. West Florida, and the States of Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Tennessee and Kentucky. Head-Quarters, from the 1st of November to the 30th of June in each year, at New Orleans, and for the remainder of the year at the Bay of St. Louis, or Baton Rouge, as the Commander may elect.

Department, No. 2. The country West of the Mississippi, North of Louisiana and Texas, and South of 37th degree of North Latitude. Head-Quarters, Fort Smith.

Department, No. 3. The State of Missouri, (above the 37th degree of North Latitude;) the State of Illinois; the Iowa Territory; that part of the Wisconsin Territory West of the 13th degree of Longitude West from Washington; and the Indian country North and West of the lines indicated. Head-Quarters, Jefferson Barracks.

Department, No. 4. The States of Indiana, Ohio, and Michigan; the part of the Wisconsin Territory not included in Department No. 3, and the Indian country North. Head-Quarters, Detroit.

Department, No. 5. The States of Pennsylvania, New York, Vermont, New Jersey, Connecticut, and Rhode Island. Head-Quarters, Troy, N. Y.

Department, No. 6. The States of Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Maine. Head-Quarters, Portland.

Department, No. 7. The States of Delaware, Maryland and Virginia. Head-Quarters, Fort Monroe.

Department, No. 8. The States of North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia. Head-Quarters, Sullivan's Island, Harbor of Charleston.

Department, No. 9. (Temporary,) East and Middle Florida. Head-Quarters in the field.

Brevet Major-General Gaines is, for the present, assigned to Department No. 1, and Brigadier-General Wool, to Department No. 5.

The senior officer in the command of troops in a Department, will command such Department until an officer of higher rank shall be sent to the same.

## NORTH EASTERN BOUNDARY.

Gov. Davis, in his Message of 1842, says :

The boundary from the monument, at the head of St. Croix river, to the Rocky Mountains, a distance probably of three thousand miles, has been finally adjusted, though a large portion of this line has until now been in dispute. It is believed that at all points on this extensive route except at the north-east angle, Great Britain has conceded the claims of the United States ; and among other things, has surrendered an important portion of territory on the line of Vermont and New York, containing the fortification at Rous's Point, to which territory her claim was unquestioned, though it was believed to be in the United States till the surveys were made under the treaty of Ghent. This fortification, which commands the outlet of Lake Champlain, was commenced soon after the last war by the United States, because of the military importance of the site, but the work was suspended when the true line was traced.

By the boundary, as agreed to between Maine and the British Provinces, a territory, of which the two States were co-proprietors, most of which is uninhabited, is relinquished, and each of the States is to receive the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, as an equivalent therefor, and to enjoy the free navigation of the St. John, with the benefit of the Colonial market. There are other stipulations by which the expenses of maintaining a civil posse upon this frontier are to be reimbursed, and the fund in the hands of provincial officers arising from the sale of timber unlawfully cut down is secured to the States.

Adhesive felt for sheathing vessels, alcornoque, aloes, antimony crude, argol, assafœtida, ava root, barilla, bark of cork tree, unmanufactured ; bells or bell metal, only fit to be remanufactured, and chimes of bells ; brass in pigs or bars, and old brass only fit to be remanufactured ; Brazil wood, crude brimstone, and flour of sulphur, bullion, burr stones unwrought ; cantharides, chalk, clay unwrought ; cochineal, coins of gold and silver, copper for the use of the mint, copper in pigs or bars, and copper ore ; plates or sheets of copper for sheathing vessels, but none is to be so considered except that which is 14 inches wide and 48 inches long, and weighing from 14 to 34 oz. per square foot ; old copper fit only to be remanufactured ; cream of tartar, emery, flints, ground flint, gold bullion, gold epaulets and wings, grindstones, gum Arabic, gum Senegal, gum tragacanth, India rubber, in bottles or sheets, or otherwise, unmanufactured, and old junk, oakum, kelp, kermes, lac dye, leeches, madder root, mother of pearl, nickel, nux vomica, palm leaf unmanufactured, palm oil ; Peruvian bark, pewter when old and only fit to be remanufactured ; platina unmanufactured, ivory unmanufactured ; plaster of Paris unground, rattans and reeds unmanufactured, rhubarb, saltpetre when crude, sarsaparilla, shellac, silver bullion, silver epaulets and wings, stones called polishing stones, stone called rotten stone, sumac, tartar when crude, teuteneque, tumeric, weld, woods of all kinds, when unmanufactured, not herein enumerated.

The above duties are imposed by the first nine sections of the law.

Section 10, enacts that on all unenumerated articles shall be imposed a duty of 20 per cent. ad valorem.

Sec. 11. An additional 10 per cent. shall be levied on all goods which shall be imported in vessels not of the United States, when no specific discrimination is made by the bill ; and 10 per cent. additional on all goods except those brought from beyond the Cape of Good Hope in foreign vessels provided no treaty speculations be infringed thereby.

Sec. 12. All duties shall be paid in cash, or the goods will be sold after 60 days' detention.

Sec. 13 prescribes the method of selling, and means for the owner to recover the overplus.

Sec. 14 allows a drawback on foreign sugar refined in and exported from the United States, equal in amount to the duty paid on the foreign sugar; of 5 cents per gallon on spirits distilled from molasses till 1843, when it shall be only 4, and annually reduced 1 cent.

Sec. 15 enacts that no drawback shall be allowed to goods entitled to debenture unless exported within three years after their import.

Sec. 16 provides the mode of valuation of all goods paying ad valorem duties, enacting that all costs, charges and commissions except insurance shall be added to the market value.

Sec. 17 empowers collectors and appraisers to take testimony necessary for valuation.

Sec. 18 provides for cases of disagreement on appraisal.

Sec. 19 enacts penalties for attempts to evade the payment of duties.

Sec. 20 imposes on non-enumerated articles the same duties as those enumerated which they most resemble shall pay.

Sec. 21 dictates the method of appraisal.

Sec. 22 provides for ports where there are no appraisers.

Sec. 23 directs the Secretary of the Treasury to make necessary rules for faithful appraisals.

Sec. 24 directs collectors to follow the Secretary's instructions.

Sec. 25 provides that the act shall not apply to vessels that shall have left their last port East of the Cape of Good Hope or beyond Cape Horn, prior to Sept. 1, 1842.

Sec. 26 provides that the penalties of the law of June 30, 1842, shall be continued.

Sec. 27 requires the Secretary annually to ascertain and report what articles have paid a duty of more than 35 per cent. ad valorem.

Sec. 28 prohibits the importation of indecent prints and books.

Sec. 29 establishes a ton at twenty hundred weight, at one hundred and twelve lbs. each.

Sec. 30. This Section is added, enacting that while the Distribution of the Public Lands is suspended, the ten per cent. allowed to the Western States shall also be suspended.

*Articles of Treaty between Great Britain and China,  
Aug. 29, 1842.*

Art. 1. Lasting peace and friendship between the two empires.

Art. 2. China to pay twenty-one millions of dollars in the course of the present and three succeeding years. Immediate payment, \$6,000,000 ; in 1843, 6,000,000 ; in 1844, 5,000,000 ; in 1845, 4,000,000.

Art. 3. The ports of Canton, Amoy, Foo-chow-foo, Ningpo, and Chinghae, to be thrown open to British merchants, consular officers to be appointed to reside at them, and regular and just tariffs of import and export (as well as inland transit) duties to be established and published.

Art. 4. The island of Hong-Kong to be ceded in perpetuity to her Britannic Majesty, her heirs and successors.

Art. 5. All subjects of her Britannic Majesty, (whether natives of Europe or India,) who may be confined in any part of the Chinese empire, to be unconditionally released.

Art. 6. An act of full and entire amnesty to be published by the Emperor under his imperial sign manual and seal to all Chinese subjects, on account of their having held service or intercourse with, or resided under the British government, or its officers.

Art. 7. Correspondence to be conducted on terms of perfect equality amongst the officers of both governments.

Art. 8. On the Emperor's assent being received to this treaty, and the payment of the first 6,000,000 dollars, her Britannic Majesty's forces to retire from Nankin and the Grand Canal, the military posts at Chinghae to be also withdrawn, but the islands of Chusan and Kulangsoo are to be held until the money payments and the arrangements for opening the ports be completed.

Thus have the English not only gained every object for which war was made on three hundred millions of people, but have also concluded this Treaty of Peace and opened an intercourse with the most fertile provinces of the empire. In place of one port for carrying on trade, British ships are to be allowed free access

to five, namely—Canton, Amoy, Foo-chow-foo, Ningpo and Chinghae. The position and advantages of Canton and Amoy are well known. Ningpo and Chinghae are equally advantageous, and will afford a short communication with the great tea district in that quarter, and also secure intercourse with Nankin and other large cities along the Grand Canal, and the noble river Yang-tze-keang, where a British fleet, many miles up the country, now for the first time in the history of the world, lies safely at anchor. Foo-chow-foo is to the west of these places, and is situated on a fine river called Min, which takes its rise in the black tea district, and flows past Chaou, Yen-ping, and other cities of great importance.

*Origin of the names of the Months of the Year, and of the Days of the Week.*

By the Romans, January was so called from Janus, an ancient king of Italy.

February, from Februa, a word denoting purgation by sacrifices.

March, from Mars.

April, from the Greek appellation of Venus.

May, from Maia the mother of Mercury.

June, from Juno.

July, from Julius Cæsar.

August, in honor of Augustus Cæsar.

The other four months, namely, September, October, November and December, still retain their numerical Latin names.

By the Saxons, the first day of the week was called Sunday, from their adoration of the Sun, on that day.

Monday, from their usual custom of worshipping the Moon on that day.

Tuesday, in honor of one of their idols called Tuisco.

Wednesday, from the appellation of Woden, another of their idols.

Thursday, from the name of an idol called Thor, to whom they paid their devotions upon that day.

Friday, from the name of Friga, an imaginary goddess by them worshipped.

Saturday, as is supposed from Saturn, or Seater, by them worshipped.

The Royal Mail Steamers have now been in commission two years and a half, and have performed their trips with remarkable regularity. They have made forty-nine voyages, and the average time occupied in these passages, is 14 days and 18 hours. The Steamers have, during the year 1842, made 20 passages—bringing 815 passengers from Liverpool, and 190 from Halifax, to Boston; and carrying 459 to Liverpool, and 183 to Halifax, from Boston.

## DR. HERSCHEL'S TABLE

*For Foretelling the Weather, through all the Lunations  
of each Year, forever,—amended by*

DR. ADAM CLARKE.

This table and the accompanying remarks are the result of many years' actual observation; the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the sun and moon, in their several positions respecting the earth, and will, by simple inspection, show the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom or never found to fail.

*Observations.*—1. The nearer the time of the moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, are to *midnight*, the fairer will the weather be during the seven days following.

2. The space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two next morning.

3. The nearer to *mid-day* or *noon*, the phases of the moon happen, the more foul or wet weather may be expected during the next seven days.

4. The space for this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon. These observations refer principally to the summer, though they affect spring and autumn nearly in the same ratio.

5. The moon's change, first quarter, full, and last quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, i. e. from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the *wind*, as is noted in the table.

6. Though the weather, from a variety of irregular causes, is more uncertain in the latter part of autumn, the whole of winter, and the beginning of spring, yet, in the main, the above observations will apply to those periods also.
