




coach bortheleme

valleyball is a winter spart which was avidly supported this year at st. mary's . . . this year's teams participated in a raund robin tournament from which on all-star team was chosen . . .


the athletic association is an arganization designed to promate athletic competition and to increase class spirit and loyalty toward the school . . .




