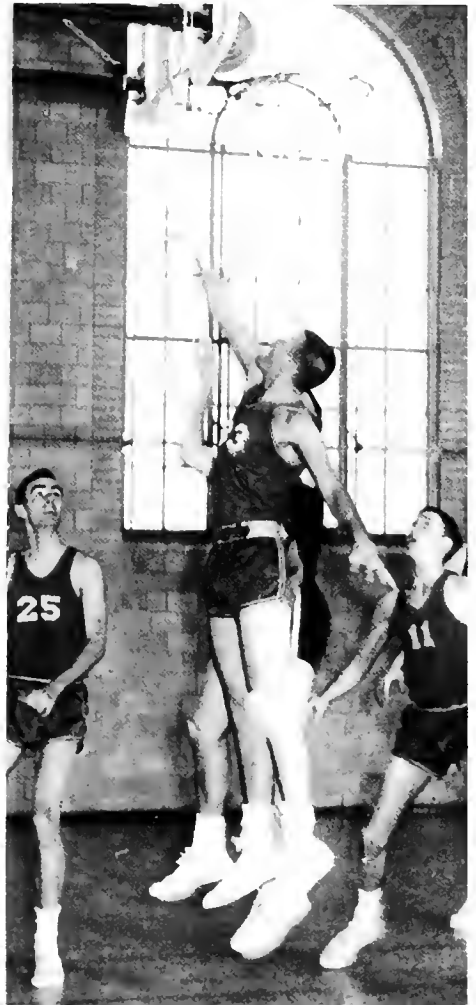


coach bartheleme

volleyball is a winter sport which was avidly supported this year at st. mary's . . . this year's teams participated in a round robin tournament from which an all-star team was chosen . . .

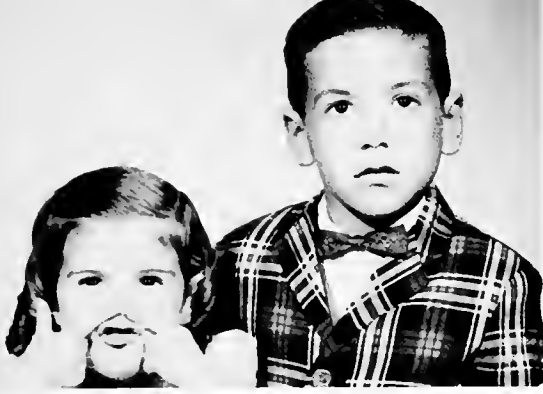
the athletic association is an organization designed to promote athletic competition and to increase class spirit and loyalty toward the school . . .

the athletic board consists of executive officers and sports managers which sponsor invitational matches, waterfront activities, and social events . . .

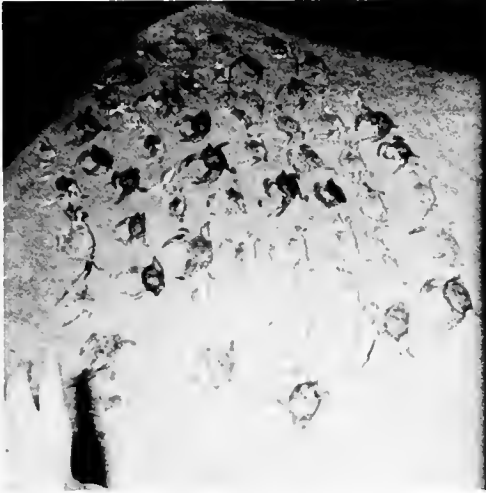
