

Police Commissioner Curtis was at his office today and transacted the following business:

The Superintendent of Police was directed to promulgate the following to the Department by General Order:-

It is manifest that the places in the Police Force of Boston formerly held by the men who deserted their posts of duty, have by this action been rendered vacant. I am advised by the Attorney General that upon the existing facts the offices formerly held by the members of the Police Force to whom I have referred, are in fact and in law vacant. I shall accordingly proceed in accordance with law and in strict compliance with the requirements of the Civil Service Laws to fill these vacancies with new men. I have submitted to the Mayor of Boston recommendations for immediate adoption relating to a revision of salaries for the lowest paid members of the Police Force; and I shall later submit recommendations for a revision of the entire salary list.

I have further requested the Civil Service Commission to grant me authority to appoint to the Police Force any veteran as defined by Chap. 150 of the General Acts of 1919, whether such veteran be a resident of Boston or not. The Attorney General has ruled that such veteran must be a resident of the Commonwealth but need not be a resident of the city of Boston.

The Superintendent of Police is hereby directed to make the following details for duty at the State Primary in this city on Tuesday, September 23, 1919:

1. Three Patrolmen for duty in the office of the election commissioners from 12 o'clock, noon, September 22, until relieved.
2. A Sergeant and ten Patrolmen for duty in Court square, keeping carriages in line, from 4 o'clock, a. m., and directing to proper entrance to election commissioners' office carriages returning from polling places with ballot boxes, from 4 o'clock, p. m., September 22, until relieved.
3. The necessary number of Patrolmen from the several police divisions to attend the several polling places in this city on State Primary Day, to preserve order and protect voters in the full exercise of their rights.
4. Two hundred and nineteen Patrolmen to convey the registering ballot-boxes, voting lists and other documents from the election commissioners' office, City-Hall Annex, Court square, to the polling places, and deliver them to the Warden or clerk of the precinct. Allowing no person to take or examine them before such delivery. They will report promptly as follows: Patrolmen from the First, Second, Third and Fourth Divisions at office of the Board of Election Commissioners, City-Hall Annex, at 5 o'clock, a. m.; Patrolmen from the Seventh, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth, Thirteenth, Fourteenth and Fifteenth Divisions will report at their respective station-houses at 4 o'clock, a. m. (excepting the patrolman for ward 24, precinct 2, who will report at station-house of Division 18 at 4.30 o'clock, a. m.); Patrolmen from the Fifth, Sixth, Fifteenth and Sixteenth Divisions at 4.30 o'clock, a. m.; and those of the Seventeenth Division to report at the station-house of Division 17 at 5.30 o'clock, a. m. (excepting the Patrolman for ward 24, precinct 1, who will report at the station-house of Division 18 at 4.30 o'clock, a. m.) and proceed thence in carriages or motor vehicles to the election commissioners' office (excepting those the Patrolmen for ward 24, precincts 1 and 2, as aforesaid, will proceed to their respective precincts in a motor vehicle from the station-house of Division 18 with other officers of that division.)
5. Two Patrolmen from Division 18 to report at the election commissioners' office on Monday, September 22, at 3 o'clock, p. m., thence to proceed in a vehicle, to be provided for the purpose, to the station-house of Division 18 with the ballot-boxes and paraphernalia required for the primary in ward 24.
6. Six Patrolmen from Division 18, and Patrolmen from Division 19 and one Patrolman from Division 17 to report at the station-house of Division 18 at 4.30 o'clock, a. m., September 23; thence to proceed in a motor vehicle, to be provided for the purpose, with the ballot-boxes and other paraphernalia, and distribute the same to the various precincts in ward 24.
7. On arrival at the polling places on election day and on departure, officers will remain at the disposal of the precincts for registering

Security from the election commissioners, and hand the key of the registering ballot-box to the warden. On delivery of the ballots to the warden, the police officer will take from him a receipt for the ballots, which receipt will be returned to the election commissioners.

8. After the warden has opened the box and allowed the election officers and the public to see that it is empty, the box is to be again locked and the key given to the police officer, who is to retain it until after the polls have closed, except that the warden may be allowed to open the box for the purpose mentioned in Section 3 of the circular issued by the Board of Election Commissioners, entitled: "Instructions to Police Officers on Primary Day." They will remain on duty at the polling places during such hours as their superior officers may designate. Commanding officers will exercise their judgment in relieving officers during the day, but will see that one or more officers are always on duty at the polls.

9. When the polls close, the officers detailed for the purpose will receive the unused and spoiled ballots, registering ballot-box and key thereof, voting lists envelope, signed by the warden and other election officers, receipts for ballots, stamps for marking spoiled ballots, carry them to the election commissioners' office, and deliver them to some member of the Board of Election Commissioners in person.

10. When the ballots are sorted and counted the officers detailed for the purpose will receive in the box sent for the purpose the tally sheets and ballots, which box is to be sealed and signed by the election officers. The officers will then bring the box, official return, precinct seal, press return and stamps for marking defective ballots to the office of the election commissioners, and deliver same to some member of the Board of Election Commissioners.

11. After the close of the polls, a vehicle, to be provided for the purpose, will be sent to the various precincts in Ward 24, to bring police officers with regular ballot-boxes, unused ballots, etc., to the station-house of Division 18, from which place only two officers need accompany the vehicle with the regular ballot-boxes, unused ballots, etc., to the office of the election commissioners.

12. While the polls remain open an officer of rank will visit the polling-places in each division at stated intervals, to be designated by the captain, and in case of any disturbance will report the fact to the commanding officer at the station-house without delay. If additional men are needed beyond the number available in that division, the officer in charge will communicate immediately with Headquarters.

13. Special attention is called to the circular issued by the Board of Election Commissioners, entitled: "Instructions to Police Officers on Primary Day," and commanding officers of divisions will see that each officer detailed for duty on State Primary Day is furnished with a copy.

When the majority of the Police Force in the city of Boston abandoned their duties and their positions, leaving the city without adequate police protection, citizens from all walks of life left their professions, their businesses, their occupations, and their studies, and offered themselves as special policemen to protect life and property in this city. Every one of them was aware that he was placing himself in a position where he would be called upon to perform duties arduous, unaccustomed, and dangerous beyond those of the patrolmen in normal times. Nevertheless, without hesitation, expecting and receiving no recompense, and actuated solely by a realization of their duties as citizens, they came to the service of the city in its hour of need, and rendered service conspicuous in its performance for fidelity and efficiency.

The Police Commissioner would appreciate the opportunity of expressing in person to each of the volunteer patrolmen the deep sense of obligation under which he rests, and the gratitude and the thanks of the Police Department and of the city of Boston. That being impossible, he issues this statement as a General Order which is incorporated in the records of this Department, and which will remain part of the official record testifying to the loyal service of these citizens. The city and the commonwealth both have a right to and do feel proud of its citizen volunteer police, nor will either be ever unmindful of its obligation to them.




