CHARGE: VIOLATION OF SECTION 19 OF RULE 35 OF THE RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Specification: Joining and belonging to an organization, club or body composed of present or present and past members of the force and known as the Policemen's Union, which is affiliated with the American Federation of Labor, an organization, club or body outside the Department and not a Post of the Grand Army of the Republic, the Spanish War Veterans or the American Legion of World's War Veterans.



(excepting the Patrolman for ward 24, precinct 1, who will report at the station-house of Division 13 at 4.30 o'clock, a. m.) and proceed thence in carriages or motor vehicles to the election commissioners' office (excepting that the Patrolmen for ward 24, precincts 1 and 2, as aforesaid, will proceed to their respective precincts in a motor vehicle from the station-house of Division 13 with other officers of that division.)
5. Six Patrolmen from Division 18, one Patrolman from Division 19 and one Patrolman from Division 17 to report at the station-house of Division 18 at 4.30 o'clock, a. m., December 16; thence to proceed in a motor vehicle, to be provided for the purpose, with the ballot-boxes and other paraphernalia, and distribute the same to the various precincts in ward 24.
7. On arriving at the polling-places to which they are assigned, officers will deliver to the warden or clerk of the precinct the registering ballot-box, voting lists and such other documents as may be

received from the election commissioners, and hand the key of the registering ballot-box to the warden. On delivery of the ballots to the warden, the police officer will take from him a receipt for the ballots, which receipt will be returned to the election commissioners.

8. After the warden has opened the box and allowed the election officers and the public to see that it is empty, the box is to be again locked and the key given to the police officer, who is to retain it until after the polls have closed, except that the warden may be allowed to open the box for the purpose mentioned in Section 3 of the circular issued by the Board of Election Commissioners, entitled: "Instructions to Police Officers on Election Days." They will remain on duty at the polling places during such hours as their superior officers may designate. Commanding officers will exercise their judgment in relieving officers during the day, but will see that one or more officers are always on duty at the polls.

9. When the polls close, the officers detailed for the purpose will receive the unused and spoiled ballots, registering ballot-box and key thereof, voting lists envelope, signed by the warden and other election officers, receipts for ballots, and stamps for marking spoiled ballots, carry them to the election commissioners' office, and deliver them to some member of the Board of Election Commissioners in person.

10. When the ballots are sorted and counted, the officers detailed for the purpose will receive in the box sent for the purpose the tally sheets and ballots, which box is to be sealed and signed by the election officers. The officers will then bring the box, official return, precinct seal, press return and stamps for marking defective ballots to the office of the election commissioners, and deliver same to some member of the Board of Election Commissioners.

11. After the close of the polls, a vehicle, to be provided for the purpose, will be sent to the various precincts in ward 24, to bring police officers with regular ballot-boxes, unused ballots, etc., to the station-house of Division 18, from which place only two officers need accompany the vehicle with the regular ballot-boxes, unused ballots, etc., to the office of the election commissioners.

12. While the polls remain open an officer of rank will visit the polling places in each division at stated intervals, to be designated by the Captain, and in case of any disturbance will report the fact to the commanding officer at the station-house without delay. If additional men are needed beyond the number available in that division, the officer in charge will communicate immediately with Headquarters.

The New England Fuel Administrator requests the assistance of the Police to secure in Boston the full observance of the United States Fuel Conservation Regulations. A copy of these regulations is sent herewith and Commanding Officers will read the same at the several roll calls and impress upon the members of their Divisions the importance of carrying them out. Division Commanders will call to the special attention of the men in their Divisions the first regulation, which applies to all show window lighting and unnecessary street lighting, particularly advertising signs. They will instruct their men especially to bear in mind

1. That the order applies until due notice is given to the contrary.
2. That the police have no authority to prosecute.
3. That when the officer observes an apparent violation of the rules and regulations, he should so inform in a polite manner, a responsible person, the proprietor if possible, upon the premises.
4. Should the officer later observe that the conditions have not been remedied or that the violation is upon premises that have been closed, he will report the fact at the end of his tour of duty, and his Commanding Officer will at once forward the report to Headquarters for transmission to the Office of the Fuel Administrator.

This is a very important duty imposed upon the Police Department and it must be impressed upon the men that they must act promptly and energetically. They must promptly report conditions that seem to them in violation of the order contained after they have notified the violator. That is to say, if the officer notifies the occupant of certain premises that in the officer's opinion he is violating the order and finds the same condition existing when he next comes around on that tour of duty, he must report that fact.

Where it is impossible, as in the case of display and outside advertising signs to find the person maintaining the same, or their agents, report must be made on that.

Many persons, no doubt, will violate this order through ignorance, but if the men of the Force act vigorously and courteously, the number of such violations will undoubtedly rapidly decrease, which will be to the credit of the Department.




