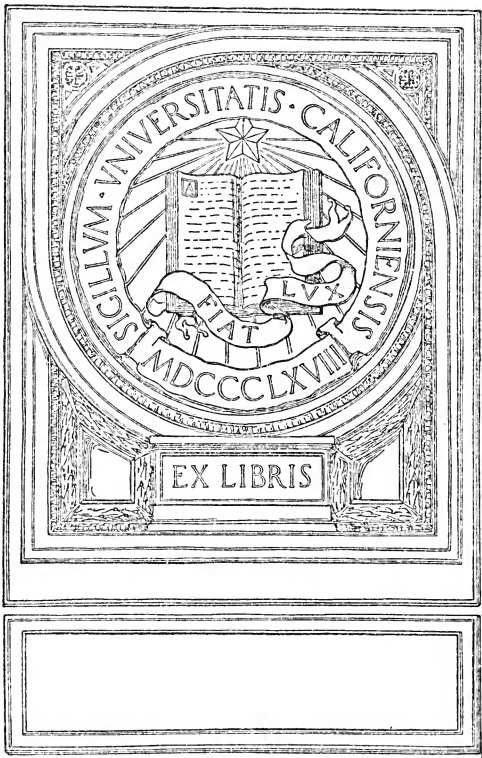

The Electors meet at the capitals of the respective States in which they are chosen, on the second day of December, and give in their ballots for President and Vice President.

In Kentucky, the law providing for the choice of electors has expired by limitation, and an extra session of the Legislature, and an extension of the former law, or the passage of a new one, will be necessary to secure to the State her electoral vote.

In 1836 this state gave her vote to Willie P. Mangum of North Carolina as President, and John Tyler of Virginia as Vice President. Since then Mr. Calhoun has gone over to the Van Buren party, and consequently the state, which at all times follows him, has arranged itself with that party. In this state Presidential Electors are elected by the Legislature, and there has been no test of the strength of parties in the state for some years. The "Great Nullifier," has completely nullified the state.
