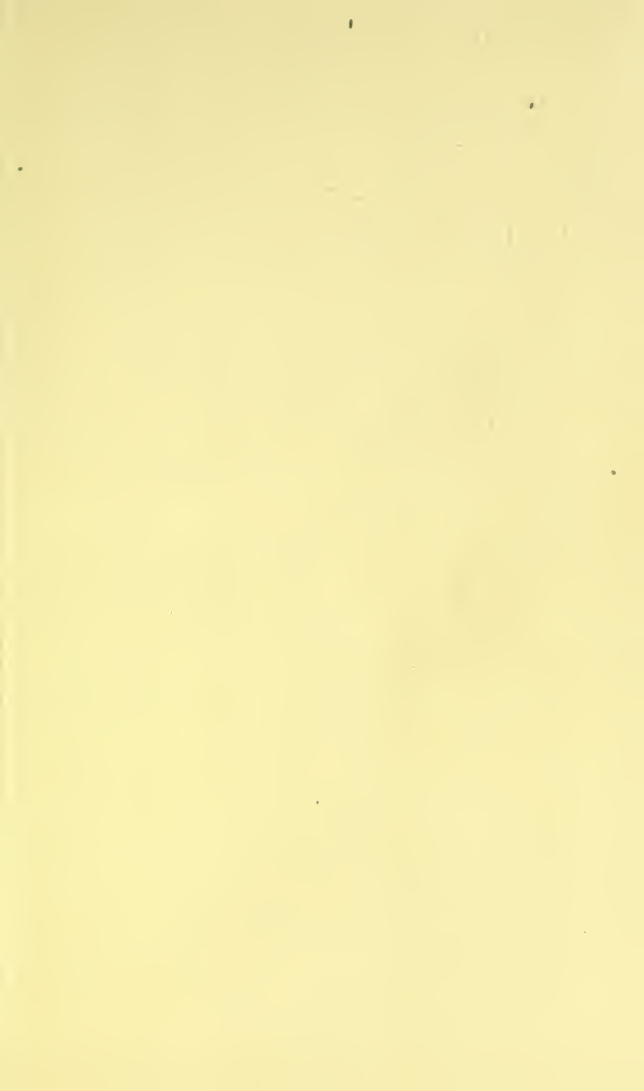

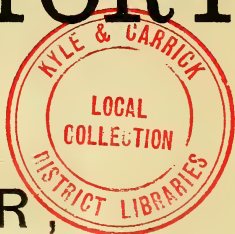

3. No order is allowed to contain a fractional part of a penny.

4. No money Order can be issued, unless the applicant furnish in full the surname. and at least the initial of one Christian name, both of the remitter and the payee, together with remitter's address. In the case of Foreign Orders the full address of the payee must be given; and if the Order be payable to a native in British India, the Tribe or Caste. and the Father's name. must also be furnished

Exceptions—1st. When the remitter directs at the time of issue (which he is at liberty to do), that the order. by being crossed like a cheque, be made payable only through a bank, it is left to his option to give or withhold the name of the payee.

2nd. If the remitter or payee be a peer or a bishop, his ordinary title is sufficient.

3rd. The usual designation of a firm is sufficient, except in the case of a company trading under a title which does not consist of the names of the persons composing it, as the "Carron Company."

A Money Order, when once issued, cannot be cancelled.

POSTAL ORDERS.

Postal Orders, for certain fixed sums from 1s up to £1, are now issued to the public at all Post Offices at which Money Order business is transacted.

3. The person to whom a Postal Order is issued must, before parting with it, fill in the name of the person to whom the amount is to be paid, and may fill in the name of the Money Order Office at which the amount is to be paid. The person so named must, before payment can be made, sign the receipt at the foot of the Order, and must also fill in the name of the Money Order Office, if that has not been already done.

4. Every person to whom a Postal Order is issued should keep a record of the number, date, and name of office of issue to facilitate enquiry if the Order should be lost.

No Money Order, or Savings Bank business is transacted on a Sunday or Sacramental Fast Day.

APPLICATIONS TO RETURN LETTERS.—A letter, when it has once been posted, cannot be returned to the writer, but must be forwarded to the person to whom it is addressed.

CHANGE AND BAD MONEY.—No Postmaster is bound to give Change, or is authorised to demand Change; and when any money is paid at this office, whether as change or otherwise, no question as to its right amount, goodness, or weight can be entertained after it has been removed from the counter.

POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS.

1. Post Office Savings Banks are established at all Money Order Offices in the United Kingdom, and are open for the receipt and payment of money daily during the hours appointed for Money Order business.

2. At these Banks deposits of one shilling, or any number of shillings, will be received; but no one may deposit more than £30 in one year ending 31st December, or make a further deposit when the total amount standing to his credit has reached £150 exclusive of interest.

3. Interest at the rate of £2 10s per cent. per annum (which is at the rate of sixpence in the pound for each year, or at the rate of one halfpenny on each complete pound for each month, reckoning from the first day of the calendar month next following the day on which a complete pound has been deposited, up to the last day of the calendar month preceding the day on which the money is withdrawn) is allowed until the sum due to a Depositor amounts to £200 when interest ceases to be allowed. The interest due to each Depositor is added to the principal due to him on the 31st December in each year.

INLAND LETTERS—RATES OF POSTAGE.

The rates of postage when prepaid are as follows, viz. :—

A letter above the weight of 12 oz. is liable to a postage of 1d for every ounce, beginning with the first ounce. Thus, a letter weighing 14 and 15 ounce must be prepaid 1s 3d.

A letter posted unpaid is chargeable on delivery with double postage; and a letter posted insufficiently prepaid is chargeable with double the deficiency.

RE-DIRECTION.

1. Every inland re directed letter, post-card, or other postal packet is liable to an additional postage (at the prepaid rate) for each re-direction, unless both the original and the second address be within the delivery of the same Post Office, or Sub-Office, or Rural walk, and the re-direction be made by an Officer of the Post Office. Thus, on a paid or unpaid letter not exceeding 1 oz in weight re-directed, either by an Officer of the Post Office, or by any one else, to a different delivery, an additional postage is levied of one penny;

and if the weight be more than 1 oz., but less than 2 oz., of three halfpence, and so on.

Exception.—No charge for re-direction is made on Government letters.

2. An inland registered letter, when re-directed to any place within the United Kingdom, is only liable to the same additional charge as an ordinary letter.

3. If an inland registered letter, when re-directed, instead of being taken back to the Post Office to be dealt with as a registered letter, is dropped into the letter box as an ordinary letter (the word "registered" not having been erased, or having been erased in pencil only), it becomes liable to the same treatment as any other letter which is marked registered and found in the letter box; and must be surcharged with a registration fee of 8d minus the value of any stamps already affixed for the registration.

4. Notices of removal, and Applications for letters to be re-directed, must in all cases be duly signed by the persons to whom the letters are addressed, and in provincial towns they must be sent to the local Postmaster. In London printed forms of notice can be obtained at any Head District or Branch Office or from the Letter Carrier of the walk; and when filled up and signed, they should be given to the Postmaster of the district or to the Letter Carrier; but owing to the frequent removals which take place in the Metropolitan district, it is desirable, for the prevention of mistakes, that persons who are about to change their residence should inform their correspondents beforehand of their intention, so that their letters may be directed in the first instance to their new address.

5. A Postmaster is not bound to re-direct for a person temporarily leaving his home, and not having a private bag or box, unless the house be left uninhabited.

ADDRESSES TO THE QUEEN AND PETITIONS TO PARLIAMENT.

Petitions and Addresses to Her Majesty, forwarded direct, are exempt from postage; and such petitions and addresses as also petitions to either House of Parliament, if sent to a Member of either House, are likewise exempt, provided they do not weigh more than two pounds, and are without covers, or are in covers open at the ends. No letter, or other enclosure, however, must be inserted and if one be found such enclosure, unless it bears the proper number of postage stamps, will be charged as an unpaid letter.

INLAND NEWSPAPERS.

For each inland newspaper, whether posted singly or in a packet, the postage, when prepaid, is one half-penny; but a packet contain-

ing two or more registered newspapers is not chargeable with a higher rate of postage than would be chargeable for a book packet of the same weight, viz., one half penny for every two oz., or part of that weight.

A newspaper posted unpaid, or a packet of newspapers posted either unpaid or insufficiently paid, is treated as an unpaid or insufficiently paid book packet of the same weight

The newspaper wrappers are sold at 10 for $5\frac{3}{4}$ d.

The Post Cards are sold at the following prices :—Thin Cards, 7d ; Stout Cards. 8d per dozen.

Foreign Post Cards may be sent to all the countries comprised in the General Postal Union.

Foreign Post Cards with an impressed stamp of 1d and $1\frac{1}{2}$ d each are sold at that rate, and are transmissible to the majority of the countries of the Union without extra charge.

Registered Letter Envelopes sold at 12 for 2s $2\frac{1}{2}$ d, or $2\frac{1}{4}$ d each.

INLAND BOOK POST.

The following are the regulations for the Inland Book Post :—

The postage is one half-penny for every two oz. or part of that weight.

A packet posted wholly unpaid is charged with double the book postage ; and if posted partially prepaid, with double the deficiency.

A book packet may be posted either without a cover (in which case it must not be fastened, whether by means of gum, wafer, sealing-wax, postage stamp, or otherwise), or in a cover entirely open at both ends, so as to admit of the contents being easily withdrawn for examination ; otherwise it is treated as a letter. For the greater security of the contents, however, it may be tied at the ends with string ; Postmasters being authorised to cut the string in such cases, although if they do so they must again tie up the packet.

CIRCULARS—*i e.*, letters which, according to internal evidence, are being sent in identical terms to several persons, and the whole or the greater part of which is printed, engraved, or lithographed, may also be sent by book post.

ABUSE OF THE BOOK POST.

It seems to be but imperfectly understood, that there is no legal way of sending a letter, other than a Circular letter, through the post for a postage of a half penny, except by means of a post card.

A notion appears to prevail that, because a post card, which is open to inspection, may have a letter written or printed upon it, any card whatever, and even any piece of paper, if only it be placed in an open wrapper, may be sent through the post with a letter written or printed upon it for a postage of a half-penny.

It seems necessary, therefore, to explain for the guidance of the public—

1. That the letter rate of postage must be prepaid for any communication of the nature of a letter, whether it be placed in a closed envelope or in an open cover, unless a post card be used for the purpose, or unless the letter be a circular letter, —*i e.*, a letter having internal evidence that it is intended for transmission, in identical terms, to several persons, and the whole or greater part of which is printed, engraved, or lithographed.
2. That cards having merely a half-penny adhesive stamp affixed to them must not bear any communication of the nature of a letter, unless it be a circular letter.

Large numbers of letters, not being circular letters, are from time to time found in half-penny wrappers, contrary to the express provisions of the book post; and, as the officers of the department are instructed to surcharge all such letters with additional postage, it will save not only trouble to the Post Office but annoyance to the public, if care be taken always to pay letter postage for letters other than circular letters, unless they be written or printed on post cards.

REGISTRATION.

The fee for registering a letter, newspaper, or book packet passing between any two places in the United Kingdom is 2d.

Every letter, &c., to be registered should be presented at the counter, and a receipt obtained for it, and should on no account be dropped into a letter-box. If, contrary to this rule, a letter marked “Registered” be dropped into a letter-box, it will, “if directed to any place in the United Kingdom,” be liable to a registration fee of 8d, instead of the ordinary fee of 2d.

Every article presented for registration must be enclosed in a strong cover, securely fastened. If the article contains money, it must, in order to gain the benefit of the guarantee, be enclosed in a Registered Letter Envelope sold by the Post Office; and if coins are sent they must on no account be put in loose, but must be packed and enclosed in such a way as to move about as little as possible.

All inland letters which contain coin, watches, or jewellery, even though they be posted without registration, are treated as registered, and are charged on delivery with a registration fee of 8d in addition to the ordinary postage; and any such letters which cannot be registered in time to be forwarded by the Mail for which they are posted are detained for the next despatch.

The registration of a packet makes its transmission much more secure, inasmuch as under ordinary circumstances, a registered packet can be traced through its whole course, and thus the loss of a registered packet is a very rare occurrence.

ARTICLES NOT ALLOWED TO BE SENT BY POST.

1. It is forbidden to forward by post any indecent or obscene print, painting, photograph, lithograph, engraving, book or card, or any other indecent or obscene article. or any letter, newspaper, publication, packet, or card, having thereon any words, marks, or designs of an indecent, obscene, libellous, or grossly offensive character. Anything posted contrary to this prohibition will be stopped and sent up to the Returned Letter Office, London.

2. Postmasters are instructed not to receive any letter which there is good reason to believe contains anything likely to injure the contents of the mail bag, or to do bodily harm to any officer of the Post Office. If such a packet be posted without the Post master's knowledge, or if at any time before its despatch he should discover any such packet, he is directed not to forward it, but to report the case, with the address of the packet. to the Secretary. The following are examples of the articles referred to :—

A glass bottle. or glass in any form; leeches, game, fish, meat, fruit, or vegetables; bladders or other vessels containing liquids; gunpowder, lucifer matches, or anything which is explosive or liable to sudden combustion; razors, scissors, needles, forks, or other sharp instruments are also forbidden, except when sent in packets or samples to foreign countries on the conditions mentioned in Rule.
