PRIVATE CIPHER CODE.

Considerations of privacy, economy and convenience unite in suggesting the use of a telegraphic code of communication with customers.

Clients, if they choose, may use Robinson's Code instead.

INVESTMENTS SOLICITED.

We respectfully solicit the investment of capital in any of the STOCKS or BONDS listed on the New York Stock Exchange, and the New York Consolidated Stock Exchange and in GRAIN, COTTON, OIL, PROVISIONS, or any other product for which there exists a QUICK MARKET at the Exchanges of New York and Chicago.

Orders may be for cash or FUTURE DELIVERY. Customary stock orders solicited. Consignments of car lots receive our most careful attention.

We shall preface our Private Code with brief explanatory paragraphs concerning the methods of modern finance.

PUBLIC EXCHANGES.

These are markets at which a large number of merchants meet DAILY, creating an immediate demand for certain staple or negotiable property.

STOCKS.

Corporations divide their property into shares called stocks. A stock certificate is an official document indicating and declaring the ownership of a certain number of shares.

BONDS.

Bonds are the SECURED PROMISES of corporations, etc., to pay borrowed money with interest.

STOCK OPERATIONS.

It is possible for all persons to deal on these Exchanges through the regular members. The prices of stocks, as they fluctuate, are reported by telegraph, and the investor can always instruct his broker by the same rapid means.

A STOCK INVESTMENT.

It is not necessary that the investor should furnish all the capital needed to buy or sell STOCKS. He may deal on what is called A MARGIN. To buy 100 shares of STOCK (\$100 per share *par value*) the client should send his broker say \$500 and the broker will carry the balance of the investment, charging only the legal interest. On 100 shares of stock bought at 90 and sold at 91, the profit is \$100.

BUYING STOCKS.

A, the client, at any point in the United States, noticing that Manhattan is 95, sends 5 per cent margin or \$500 to B, the broker, ordering a purchase of 100 shares at that price.

B buys the stock and it rises to 100. A then orders a sale. A now has a credit on the broker's books of \$1,000, less $\frac{1}{4}$ of 1 per cent commission and legal interest on the capital advanced by the broker.

SELLING STOCKS.

But a client may wish to SELL STOCKS that he thinks will decline in value. The operation explained above is reversed, and if the stock declines 5 points, the client has likewise made a profit of \$500. This is called a short sale.

The client can choose ANY STOCK DEALT IN, and take advantage of the slightest variation in price, down to $\frac{1}{8}$ of 1 per cent.

STOP ORDERS.

A STOP ORDER is a limit of price given by the client at which to close his trade in case the market reaches that limit, and is open till countermanded.

OUT OF TOWN CLIENTS.

Modern financial methods enable the client to operate with precision and security at any distance from the market.

A client may also open various accounts on the books of the broker, advancing the proper margin to cover each transaction, and specifying separate action in each.

GRAIN.

Chicago and New York are the leading grain markets of the world. The largest stores accumulate at Chicago, and New York is the largest point of export.

We are able to place orders to buy or sell grain for our clients on either the Chicago Board of Trade or the New York Produce Exchange. (In latter case be sure to add the word Abide to the cipher order.)

GRAIN ORDERS.

Trading in lots of 5,000 bu. of grain bears a close likeness to a trade in 50 shares of stock; 1 cent advance is equal to \$50 profit, the same as 1 per cent in stocks.

DEPOSITS,

To enable the commission merchant to carry out an order on the Board, the sum, say, of \$100.00 or upward is sent by express, bank draft or certified check; or money may be deposited to the commission merchant's credit at the client's own home bank. The client then orders the commission merchant to buy or sell, say 5,000 bu. of wheat, say for May delivery. The merchant will instantly enter the market and execute the order at the price that is ruling at that moment.

MAKING AND CLOSING TRADES.

Supposing that in January the client orders his commission merchant to buy 5,000 bushels of wheat for May delivery at 55c. and deposits 2c per bushel (\$100) as margins. Should wheat advance to 57c and the client order the deal closed, the client will receive back his margin and his profit of \$100, less commission, and will be free of the deal, although the commission merchant may have to remain in the deal until May. Then, in May, the wheat purchased in January for May is delivered at the purchase price to the merchant, and he in turn delivers it to the person who bought it from his client when the client left the deal.

On the other hand, if the client orders the merchant to sell 3,000 bu. of wheat for May delivery at 55c. depositing as before, and it advances to 56c. the client can order the merchant to buy it, and the merchant, after buying, will render an account of the trade, remitting to the client the difference remaining to his credit. If this order to buy had not come to the merchant, he would have called for more margins, and not receiving same, would be forced to close the deal with a greater loss, through exhaustion of margins. Thus the client should at all times be vigilant in supplying the merchant with margins and in replying speedily to calls for same.

TRANSFERS FROM ONE MONTH TO ANOTHER

consist in selling wheat you may have bought for some future month before the arrival of such month, and buying the same amount for a more distant future; or, *vice versa*, buying wheat you have sold for some future month before the arrival of such month.

The client in this operation buys or sells, the seller agreeing to deliver the commodity at the stated price in some future stated month, and the buyer agreeing to receive it then.

The time of the month when the delivery may be made is always optional with the seller.

COTTON.

The method of dealing in cotton futures is by 100 bales of 500 lbs. each, 100 bales weighing 50,000 lbs. This is the minimum order. Any future month of delivery may be chosen.

In the New York Cotton Exchange and at other markets of the United States the American cent is divided into 100 parts or points; thus a fluctuation of 50 points is equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ cent a pound. Each point marks a difference of \$5 on a hundred bales. If 100 bales of cotton are bought, say, at 5 cents, an advance of 10 points would show a profit of \$50, an advance of 20 points would make \$100.

MARKET ORDERS.

Experience teaches all parties concerned that an order to buy or sell **AT THE MARKET PRICE AT THE MOMENT**, is better than an order to buy or sell at an upset price which the market does not afford. When a market is falling, it is because of lack of support, and the dealer who is soonest in will go with it further before the equilibrium is reached. Close attention to the course of the market, and prompt action are, therefore, essential to success. To buy or sell, **AT THE MARKET**, is wisest, and there can then be no mistake or oversight. Orders good for more than one day should add one of the cipher words which pertain to **OPEN ORDERS**. Where price is not stated, it is understood that the order shall be executed at the market.

QUANTITIES, AND FUNDS NEEDED.

100 shares of Stock, margined by 2 to 5 points, or \$200 to \$500 on each 100 shares. We can place orders as small as 10 share lots, and multiples of 10 with proportionate margin on deposit.

5,000 bushels of Wheat, Corn or Oats, with margins of 2 to 5 cents a bushel, or \$100 to \$250. We can unite small orders of 1,000 bushels, but it is much better to deal in regular quantities.

250 barrels of Mess Pork, with a margin of \$1 per barrel, or \$250 on each 250 barrel lot. Mess Pork offers a popular investment.

50,000 pounds of Short Ribs, with a margin of 40 cents per 100 pounds, or \$200 on the lot.

250 tierces of Lard, with a margin of 30 cents per 100 pounds, or \$255 on the lot.

100 bales of Cotton, with a margin of \$1 per bale, or \$100 on the lot.

The Chicago Board of Trade opens at 9:30 a. m. and closes at 1:15 p. m., Central Time. On Saturdays the session closes at noon.

The Exchanges are always closed on holidays—Sundays, Elections, Decoration, Independence, Thanksgiving, and other Civic Festivals.

Our private wires enable us to act on the moment, either in New York or Chicago. We pay telegraphic tolls both ways ON ALL ORDERS, and in this way offer you an advantage in Grain and Provisions that Western houses may not confer.

DEPOSITS AND PROFITS.

These are always subject to your command. Any trade can be closed at any time, and it is not necessary to wait for the contract to mature on delivery day.

We accept **NO DISCRETIONARY ORDERS**, nor do we carry on a campaign of bull or bear opinions. As to the future of prices, we know no more than our investor, and perhaps less. To the entirely inexperienced, the phrases used in the following code supply the leading details of market life.

CONFIDENTIAL RELATIONS.

Success as Agents and Brokers imposes upon us the necessity of preserving that degree of caution and secrecy touching personal relations that the trader desires and appreciates.

TO CORRESPONDENTS.

We desire a correspondent in every community who will make us his agent for the transaction of such business herein outlined as is consistent with our market rules. **WE HAVE NO AGENTS**, but solicit the business and orders of parties who act either for themselves or others, and who will make us **THEIR AGENTS** for the execution of **THEIR ORDERS**.

SENDING FUNDS THROUGH BANK.

This is an exceptionally good method. You deposit funds with your local banker or express company. The cashier wires us immediately, **AT OUR EXPENSE**, the amount placed to **OUR CREDIT**, for **WHOSE ACCOUNT**, and we are thus enabled to act at once. Some preliminary knowledge must be had of all parties, which may be secured by letter. **WITH THIS METHOD ESTABLISHED**, the greatest promptitude is assured.

HOW TO USE OUR CODE.

STOCK EXAMPLE:—"Astral, Decrepitude, Altars. Declaring, Jilt, Demerit," translated reads, "Buy 100 shares Manhattan at 95 cents. Have deposited \$500 to your credit in bank here. Bank will wire you confirming this."

GRAIN EXAMPLE (All grain and provision orders are understood to apply to the Chicago Board of Trade unless otherwise specified):—"Babbit, Demoralize, Beget, Deadlight, Invalid," translated reads, "Buy five thousand bushels No. 2 contract* wheat, May delivery, at 80 cents; order open until canceled."

GRAIN EXAMPLE FOR THE NEW YORK PRODUCE EXCHANGE:—If the above order is meant to be executed on the New York market, please add the word "Abide," which translated reads, "New York Produce Exchange."

Great care should be used in writing the words of the cipher, as the context gives no aid in reading the right word.

*The word "contract" is always understood in all orders for future delivery.
