



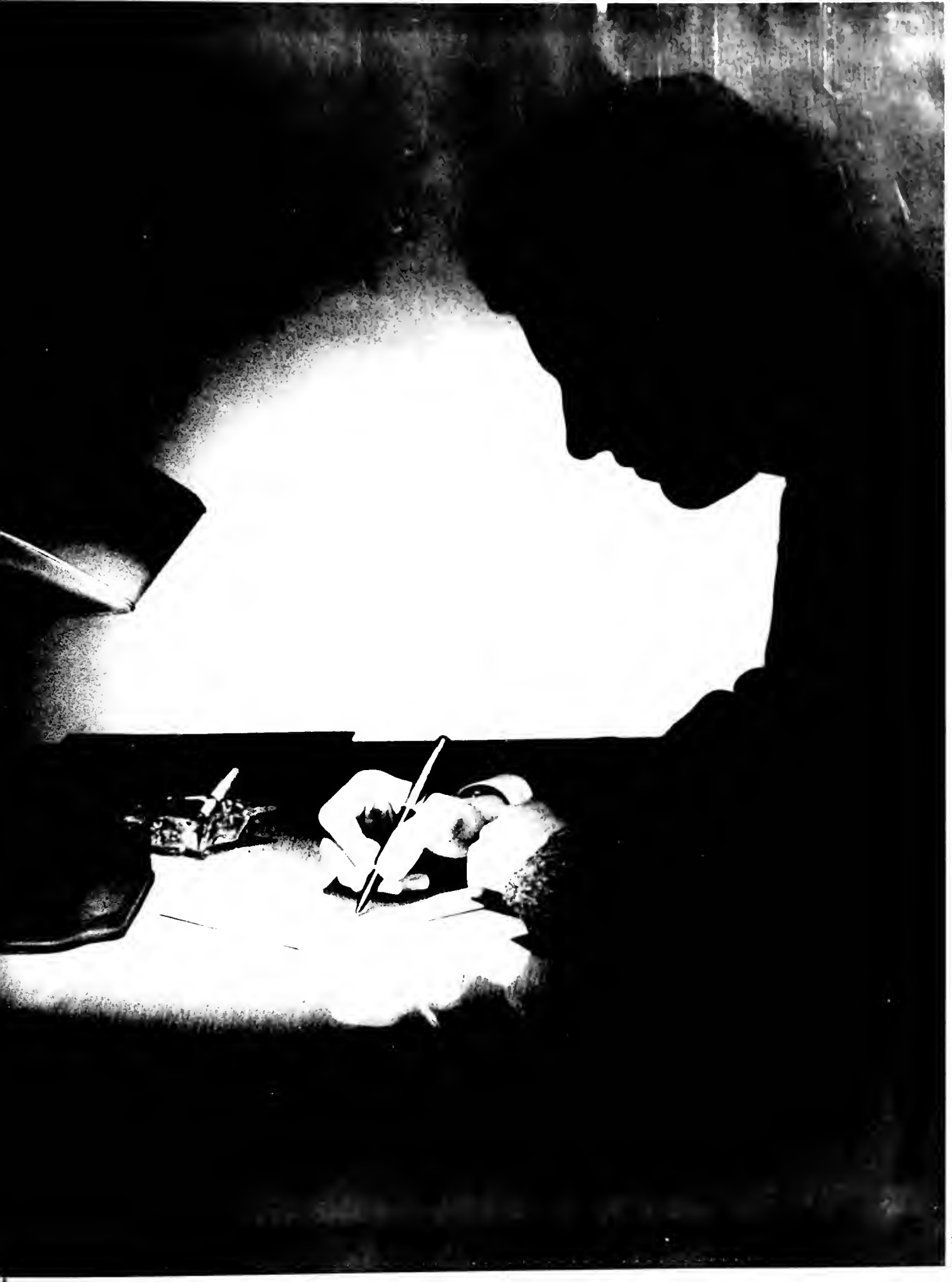

Something just as much a part of my memories as my studies, will be those pick-up baseball games or the slough-swimming in the summer and skating in the winter.

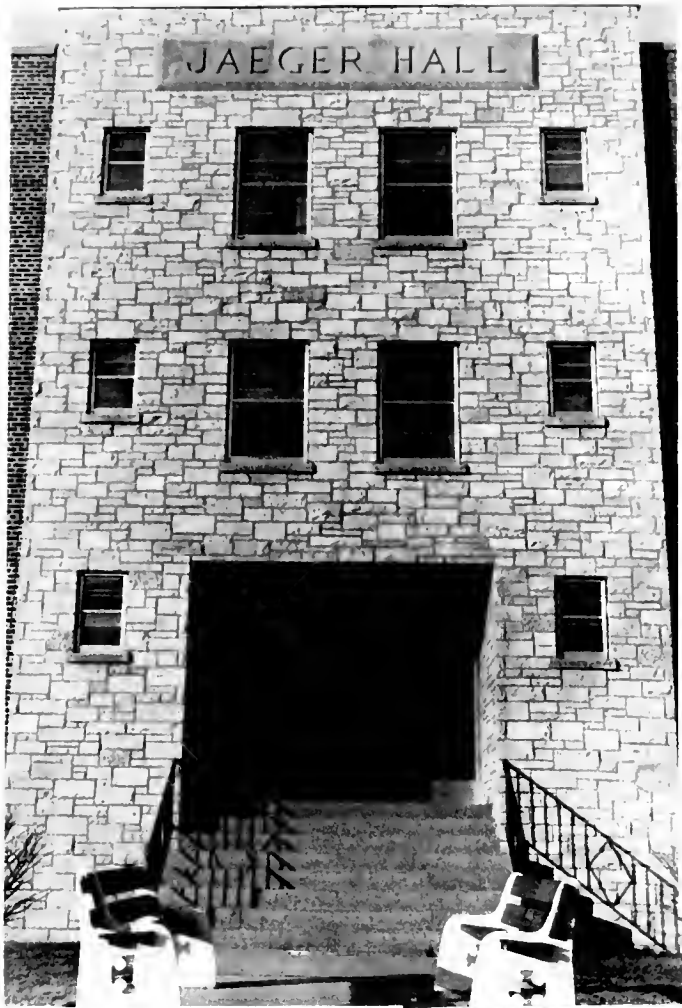
And I'll always remember the peace and quiet beauty of the chapel in the late afternoon hours when I dropped in for a visit with the One who helped me the most during my years here

To Mary, Our Queen and Mother, this shrine is humbly dedicated. It is a monument, built as a personal plea for a lasting world peace.

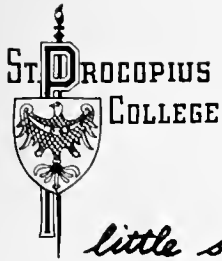
Mary is offering us a lasting peace, placed in the center of a golden platter carved of prayer and sacrifice.

Dear Seniors:



Efforts were particularly successful this year in uniting the collegians and the academites on the staff and in giving both equal opportunities in the publishing of the school paper.



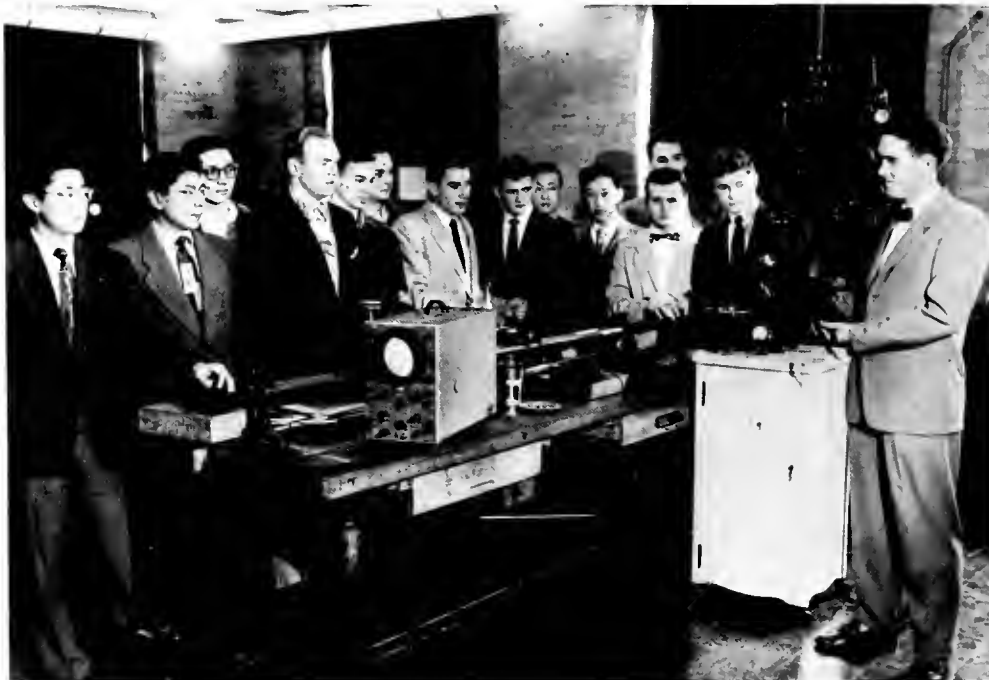
