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P R E F A C E.

NEARLY twenty years ago the church, of which the writer was and still is the Pastor, adopted the responsive reading of the Psalms, by the Minister and the Congregation, at each Service on the Lord's Day, as a prescribed and permanent part of its public worship.

As it was the wish of all there concerned with the matter to have the ancient hymns read antiphonally, dividing the successive verses into their parallel and responding clauses, and as no book was then at hand in which they were suitably printed for this purpose, or were arranged in 'Lessons' of a convenient length, a small volume was hastily prepared, which it was thought might for a time supply the need of the waiting congregation.

It has served its purpose well, and has silently made its way, to the grateful surprise of the compiler, into more than four hundred churches, of different communions, in our own country, and into American chapels in Europe.

The custom of such responsive reading has also secured earnest friends, and enlisted for itself their intelligent interest, wherever it has been tried; and while, at the outset, a not unreasonable fear was entertained, by those to whom the thought of it was new, that it might tend to protract unduly the services of worship, or possibly to introduce into such services an element of 'formalism,' of questionable value, so far as is known the congregations which have adopted it would now be entirely unwilling to displace it. Their attachment to it grows, as the custom continues.

It is believed to have proved itself, beyond the expectation of those who first favored it, a useful and a delightful part of public worship:—instructive, by continually recalling the minds of congregations to the jubilant or pathetic words of the Scripture, in which experience has given a voice to the teachings of revelation; inspiring to devotion, by the quickening impression which it communicates of that intense, ever-living temper, of adoration, trust, penitence, hope, which has never found another expression so majestic or so tender as in these ancient consecrated lyrics; exalting to the tone of worship—illuminating, even, as to the intrinsic nobleness of its function—since it unites, in spirit certainly, and measurably in form, the worship of to-day, in recent congregations, with that of the day of martyrs and confessors, whose most familiar and hallowed songs were the Psalms, responsively chanted; with that of the

synagogue, in which the Master was wont to worship; with that, indeed, of the august Temple, divinely appointed, by whose educating services the way of the Lord was prepared on the earth, and all whose types shall find their only complete fulfilment in the day of the glory of the Church Universal.

The objection to prescribed forms of prayer, of human composition—though framed by men as properly revered as Calvin or Melancthon, as Chrysostom or Basil—is one which will probably always continue widely to be felt. Multitudes of Christians will certainly prefer, hereafter as now, that the Minister shall offer the public confession, supplication, and thanksgiving, as he did in the day of Justin Martyr, even at the solemn celebration of the Eucharist, “according to his ability”; that this shall be to him a motive for intent and prayerful preceding preparation for the service of God’s House; and that on his worshipping spirit, as moved from above to immediate utterance of desire and praise, the spirit of the assembly shall be uplifted toward the Throne in the Heavens.

But no theory of church-worship can be sustained, no practice of it will remain satisfactory, which does not provide a large place for the reading of the Scriptures; and no form of Divine Service will ever accomplish its best effects for those who take part in it which does not engage the interested attention alike of the older and the younger, by calling on all to perform in it fitting and solemn responsive offices. Dumbness, when voluntary, seems related to stupor. The Church which strives, and is victorious, spontaneously seeks acclaiming voices, as well as the notes of trumpet and organ, to animate the struggle, and to celebrate the joy.

The recital of the Psalms, on every Lord’s Day, by the Minister and the People answering each other, appears wholly free from just objection. It not only assures, as has been suggested, important direct aids and benefits to those engaged in it; it has the delightful charm upon it of demonstrating freshly, all the time, the perennial unity of feeling and of faith, among those who bear different Christian names, but who equally turn to the venerated Psalter for instruction and impulse in the things of experience; who are almost ready, even, to say of it, as many devout singers of the Church have reverently said, “all my springs are in thee.” It seems as certain as any thing in the future that this is to be, more and more, a familiar and a favorite practice with congregations which delight in the prayers of the Psalms, not less than in their praises, though nowise inclined to accept the use of liturgical forms. The ‘Songs of degrees’ have been named, rather, by a distinguished critical scholar, ‘Songs of the homeward marches.’ All the Psalms have been felt to be such by many devout and faithful spirits, as they have sung them in the paths of their pilgrimage, towards the Home upon the heavenly hills. The Church itself is more and more to find them such, as it advances toward Millennium.

In connection with the lessons of encouragement and of counsel which have

come from many years' use of the Psalms, in the manner referred to, the need of a book adapted to the purpose, more complete than the one first compiled, and more carefully arranged, has for some time been recognized; and the present volume is the fruit of a wish to supply such need, at least for one beloved congregation.

The Psalms contained in it are divided as before, according to the rule of that intrinsic and governing 'Thought-rhythm' which constitutes a characteristic beauty of Hebrew poetry; and they are arranged, as far as possible, with reference to their principal subjects, and their prevalent tone of feeling, without regard to the order of the pages on which they have been wont to be printed, or to the possible or probable order of the dates of their composition. The end in view being the present practical impressiveness of this part of worship, and its rich fruitfulness in spiritual impulse, an inward unity has been sought in the selections; and external questions, concerning them or their authors, have been wholly laid aside. A Psalm of supplication is thus associated with others of its kind; while those of adoration, confidence, hope, are similarly combined.

This seems the most appropriate way of using the ancient and quickening lyrics, in a modern assembly, and the way most truly honorable to them. Whatever differences of historical relation appear in different parts of the Psalter, the whole constitutes, plainly, a realm by itself, in the imperial compass of the Scripture; as much so as does the earlier Pentateuch, whose division into five books, the somewhat similar traditional division of the Psalter into five associated parts has often been said to resemble. The whole collection of petitions and praises grew out of the unique career of the People of God, from the day of Moses, the Servant of God, down toward if not to the day of the Maccabees. It is equally available, in all its extent, to those who would use it for present ministration to spiritual feeling. And it is obviously wholly unimportant, with reference to this office, whether two Psalms were composed or not by the same writer, were composed or not at about the same time; whether they sprang out of one set of circumstances, or out of two, resembling each other, though separated by years; whether they have been commonly printed side by side, or on different leaves, in the copies of the Bible. As hymns born of the Holy Ghost, when touching with divinest fire the souls of their respective writers, they are properly associated, in a volume like this, by the essential harmonies which they show in their present appeal to the mind of the worshipper. Any other possible order of arrangement, for the purpose in view, must of necessity be mechanical and confusing. The compiler is quite aware that he has not always accomplished his purpose. The difficulties in the way of a perfect success will present themselves at once to any who follow him in his endeavor. But his rule has been, that only by their special coincidences of sentiment and tone are the hymns, whose common inspiration he rejoices to recognize, fitly connected with each other in a manual like the present.

In deference to a wish expressed by others, rather than from any strong impulse in himself, he has added to the collection of Psalms some other selections, not only from Messianic prophecies, but from the poetry of the book of Job, from the Proverbs, from Ecclesiastes, and one or two from the book of The Revelation. It has been thought that such passages—especially those which represent the gnomic and didactic poetry of the ancient church, widely differing in tone from the lyric, though kindred in structure—may be found to be of use, particularly on occasion of exceptional services.

It is hoped that the book, as now arranged, may prove acceptable to those who have come to prize and to love that element in worship which it would subserve, but who have felt the obvious deficiencies of the preceding collection. It is hoped, also, that it may tend, in the measure of its influence, to commend the responsive reading of the Psalms to still other congregations, who may wish to expand and enrich their services, making them at once more popular in their character, and also more serious, more scriptural, more devout.

But whether it shall have a wide circulation, or one more restricted, it has brought already its rich reward to him who has arranged it. It has led him into contact, day by day, while he has been occupied in the work of preparing it, with the devout and heroic spirits of the past; from whom our arts and sciences were hid, and who had not the full vision of Christ, but who alone, in the world of their time, saw God in His glory, and expected the triumph of His kingdom in the earth; who were penetrated profoundly with the sense of their sinfulness, but who were at the same time exultingly aware of the power and grace which remained for them in the heavens; who were therefore courageous in the midst of adversity, and humble and grateful in the day of success; whose prayers have always praises in them, while the most joyful melodies of their worship are full, as well, of supplication; through whom the Spirit divinely spake.

His self-imposed task has thus brought to the writer a constantly fresh and clearer sense of the spiritual riches infolded with a skill surpassing man's in this book of the Scriptures, which has been well named 'the Little Bible.' And whatever of time and of thought have been called for, in the work of arranging them for wider use among the churches, are gratefully dedicated to Him whom the Psalms invoke and celebrate, with an utterance rivalling the reach of the heavens in sovereign sublimity, yet fitting itself to the varying needs of worshipping souls with an adjustment as distinct as that of the sunshine to human eyes:—and to those, as well, by whatever name distinguished among men, who love and who seek His earthly courts!

The Ten Commandments.

[EXODUS XX : 1—17.]

AND God spake all these words, saying,

V. Honor thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee.

VI. Thou shalt not kill.

VII. Thou shalt not commit adultery.

VIII. Thou shalt not steal.

IX. Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.

X. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor any thing that is thy neighbor's.

HEAR ALSO THE WORDS OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST :

[MATTHEW XXII : 37—40.]

Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment.

And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.

N O T E .

THE following selections from the Psalms, and from other poetical parts of the Bible, are arranged to be read by the Minister and the People responsively, according to their original structure and design.

The lines printed in the Roman letter are to be read by the Minister.

The lines set inward from the margin, and printed in Italics, are to be read by the People.

Any lines printed in small Capitals are to be read by the Minister and the People together.

The selections are combined in Lessons, which experience has shown to be of a convenient length for use by Congregations ; and those referring to one general subject are for the most part associated with each other.

The Index, at the end, refers to the page on which any Psalm, or other selection, may be found.

Lesson 1. (PAGE 11.)

PSALM I.

BLESSED is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly,

O LORD, open thou my lips ;

And my mouth shall show forth thy praise.

For thou desirest not sacrifice ; else would I give it :

Thou delightest not in burnt offering.

The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit :

A broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise.

Do good in thy good pleasure unto Zion :

Build thou the walls of Jerusalem.

Then shalt thou be pleased with the sacrifices of righteousness,

{ *With burnt offering and whole burnt offering :*

{ *Then shall they offer bullocks upon thine altar.*

PSALM CXXX.

OUT of the depths have I cried unto thee, O LORD. LORD, hear my voice:

Let thine ears be attentive to the voice of my supplications.

If thou, LORD, shouldest mark iniquity, O LORD, who shall stand ?

But there is forgiveness with thee, that thou mayest be feared.

I wait for the LORD, my soul doth wait,

And in his word do I hope.

My soul waiteth for the LORD, more than they that watch for the morning :

I say, more than they that watch for the morning.

Let Israel hope in the LORD :

For with the LORD there is mercy,

And with him is plenteous redemption,

And he shall redeem Israel from all his iniquities.

Have mercy also upon me, and answer me.

When thou saidst, Seek ye my face ;

My heart said unto thee, Thy face, LORD, will I seek.

Hide not thy face far from me ; put not thy servant away in anger :

{ *Thou hast been my help ;*
 { *Leave me not, neither forsake me, O God of my salvation.*

When my father and my mother forsake me,

Then the LORD will take me up.

Teach me thy way, O LORD,

And lead me in a plain path, because of mine enemies.

Deliver me not over unto the will of mine enemies :

For false witnesses are risen up against me, and such as breathe out cruelty.

I had fainted unless I had believed to see the goodness of the LORD in the land
of the living.

Wait on the LORD:

Be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart :

Wait, I say, on the LORD.

GIVE ear to my words, O LORD ;
Consider my meditation.

Hearken unto the voice of my cry, my King and my God :

For unto thee will I pray.

But let all those that put their trust in thee rejoice :

{ Let them ever shout for joy, because thou defendest them :

{ Let them also that love thy name be joyful in thee.

For thou, LORD, wilt bless the righteous ;

With favor wilt thou compass him as with a shield.

PSALM XXXIII.

REJOICE in the LORD, O ye righteous :
For praise is comely for the upright.

Praise the LORD with the harp :

Sing unto him with the psaltery, and an instrument of ten strings.

Sing unto him a new song ;

Play skillfully with a loud noise.

For the word of the LORD is right ;

And all his works are done in truth,

He loveth righteousness and judgment :

The earth is full of the goodness of the LORD.

By the word of the LORD were the heavens made ;

And all the host of them by the breath of his mouth.

He gathereth the waters of the sea together as a heap :

He layeth up the depth in storehouses.

Let all the earth fear the LORD :

Let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of him.

For he spake and it was done :

He commanded, and it stood fast.

The LORD bringeth the counsel of the heathen to nought :

He maketh the devices of the people of none effect.

The counsel of the LORD standeth forever,

The thoughts of his heart to all generations.

Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD ;

And the people whom he hath chosen for his own inheritance.

The LORD looketh from heaven ;

He beholdeth all the sons of men.

From the place of his habitation he looketh,

Upon all the inhabitants of the earth.

He fashioneth their hearts alike ;

He considereth all their works.

There is no king saved by the multitude of a host :

A mighty man is not delivered by much strength.

A horse is a vain thing for safety :

Neither shall he deliver any by his great strength.

Behold, the eye of the LORD is upon them that fear him,

Upon them that hope in his mercy ;

To deliver their soul from death,

And to keep them alive in famine.

Our soul waiteth for the LORD :

He is our help and our shield.

For our heart shall rejoice in him,

According as we hope in thee.

{ *Every one that sweareth by him shall glory :*

{ *But the mouth of them that speak lies shall be stopped.*

PSALM LXXXIV.

HOW amiable are thy tabernacles,
O LORD of hosts !

My soul longeth, yea, even fainteth for the courts of the LORD :

My heart and my flesh crieth out for the living God.

Yea, the sparrow hath found a house,

And the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young.

Even thine altars, O LORD of hosts,

My King and my God.

Blessed are they that dwell in thy house :

They will be still praising thee.

Blessed is the man whose strength is in thee ;

In whose heart are the ways of them.

Who passing through the valley of Baca make it a well :

The rain also filleth the pools.

They go from strength to strength,

Every one of them in Zion appeareth before God.

O LORD God of hosts, hear my prayer :

Give ear, O God of Jacob.

Behold, O God our shield,

And look upon the face of thine anointed.

For a day in thy courts is better than a thousand.

{ *I had rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God,*
 { *Than to dwell in the tents of wickedness.*

For the LORD God is a sun and shield :

{ *The LORD will give grace and glory ;*
 { *No good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly.*

O LORD of hosts,

Blessed is the man that trusteth in thee.

LESSON II. (PAGE 30.)

PSALM LXXV.

PRAISE waiteth for thee, O God, in Zion :

And unto thee shall the vow be performed.

O thou that hearest prayer, unto thee shall all flesh come.

{ *Iniquities prevail against me :*

Thou makest the outgoings of the morning and evening to rejoice.

Thou visitest the earth, and waterest it :

Thou greatly enrichest it,

With the river of God, which is full of water :

Thou preparest them corn, when thou hast so provided for it.

Thou waterest the ridges thereof abundantly, thou settlest the furrows thereof :

Thou makest it soft with showers, thou blessest the springing thereof.

Thou crownest the year with thy goodness ;

And thy paths drop fatness.

They drop upon the pastures of the wilderness :

And the little hills rejoice on every side.

The pastures are clothed with flocks;
 { *The valleys also are covered over with corn*
 { *They shout for joy, they also sing.*

PSALM LXVI.

MAKE a joyful noise unto God, all ye lands :
Sing forth the honor of his name : make his praise glorious.
 Say unto God, How terrible art thou in thy works!
Through the greatness of thy power shall thine enemies submit themselves unto thee.
 All the earth shall worship thee, and shall sing unto thee ;
They shall sing to thy name.
 Come and see the works of God :
He is terrible in his doing toward the children of men.
 He turned the sea into dry land :
They went through the flood on foot : there did we rejoice in him.
 He ruleth by his power forever ; his eyes behold the nations :
Let not the rebellious exalt themselves.
 Oh bless our God, ye people,
And make the voice of his praise to be heard :
 Which holdeth our soul in life,
And suffereth not our feet to be moved.
 For thou, O God, hast proved us :
Thou hast tried us as silver is tried.
 Thou broughtest us into the net ;
Thou laidst affliction upon our loins.
 Thou hast caused men to ride over our heads ;
 { *We went through fire and through water :*
 { *But thou broughtest us out into a wealthy place.*
 I will go into thy house with burnt offerings :
I will pay thee my vows,
 Which my lips have uttered,
And my mouth hath spoken, when I was in trouble.
 I will offer unto thee burnt sacrifices of fatlings,
With the incense of rams : I will offer bullocks with goats.
 Come and hear, all ye that fear God,
And I will declare what he hath done for my soul.
 I cried unto him with my mouth,
And he was extolled with my tongue.
 If I regard iniquity in my heart,
The LORD will not hear me :

But verily God hath heard me ;

He hath attended to the voice of my prayer.

Blessed be God, which hath not turned away my prayer,

Nor his mercy from me.

PSALM LXXXI.

SING aloud unto God our strength ;

Make a joyful noise unto the God of Jacob.

Take a psalm, and bring hither the timbrel,

{ *I answered thee in the secret place of thunder :*

{ *I proved thee at the waters of Meribah.*

Hear, O my people, and I will testify unto thee :

O Israel, if thou wilt hearken unto me ;

There shall no strange God be in thee :

Neither shalt thou worship any strange God.

I am the LORD thy God, which brought thee out of the land of Egypt :

Open thy mouth wide, and I will fill it.

But my people would not hearken to my voice ;

And Israel would none of me.

So I gave them up unto their own hearts' lust ;

And they walked in their own counsels.

Oh that my people had hearkened unto me,

And Israel had walked in my ways !

I should soon have subdued their enemies,

And turned my hand against their adversaries.

The haters of the LORD should have submitted themselves unto him :
But their time should have endured for ever.
 He should have fed them also with the finest of the wheat :
And with honey out of the rock should I have satisfied thee.

PSALM LXXXV.

LORD, thou hast been favorable unto thy land :
Thou hast brought back the captivity of Jacob.
 Thou hast forgiven the iniquity of thy people ;
Thou hast covered all their sin.
 Thou hast taken away all thy wrath :
Thou hast turned thyself from the fierceness of thine anger.
 Turn us, O God of our salvation,
And cause thine anger toward us to cease.
 Wilt thou be angry with us for ever ?
Wilt thou draw out thine anger to all generations ?
 Wilt thou not revive us again :
That thy people may rejoice in thee ?
 Shew us thy mercy, O LORD,
And grant us thy salvation.
 I will hear what God the LORD will speak :
 { *For he will speak peace unto his people, and to his saints :*
 { *But let them not turn again to folly.*
 Surely his salvation is nigh them that fear him ;
That glory may dwell in our land.
 Mercy and truth are met together ;
Righteousness and peace have kissed each other.
 Truth shall spring out of the earth ;
And righteousness shall look down from heaven.
 Yea, the LORD shall give that which is good ;
And our land shall yield her increase.
 Righteousness shall go before him ;
And shall set us in the way of his steps.

As well the singers as the players on instruments shall be there :
All my springs are in thee.

And to sing praises unto thy name, O Most High :

To show forth thy loving-kindness in the morning,

And thy faithfulness every night,

Upon an instrument of ten strings, and upon the psaltery ;

But my horn shalt thou exalt like the horn of an unicorn :

I shall be anointed with fresh oil.

Mine eye also shall see my desire on mine enemies,

And mine ears shall hear my desire of the wicked that rise up against me

The righteous shall flourish like the palm tree ;

He shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon.

Those that be planted in the house of the LORD,

Shall flourish in the courts of our God.

They shall still bring forth fruit in old age ;

They shall be fat and flourishing ;

To show that the LORD is upright :

He is my rock, and there is no unrighteousness in him.

Let the sinners be consumed out of the earth,

Bless thou the LORD, O my soul.

Praise ye the LORD.

To bind his princes at his pleasure, and teach his senators wisdom.

Israel also came into Egypt ;

And Jacob sojourned in the land of Ham.

And he increased his people greatly ;

And made them stronger than their enemies.

He turned their heart to hate his people,

To deal subtilly with his servants.

He sent Moses, his servant ;

And Aaron whom he had chosen.

They showed his signs among them,

And wonders in the land of Ham.

He sent darkness, and made it dark ;

And they rebelled not against his word.

He turned their waters into blood, and slew their fish.

Their land brought forth frogs in abundance, in the chambers of their kings.

He spake, and there came divers sorts of flies, and lice in all their coasts.

He gave them hail for rain, and flaming fire in their land.

He smote their vines also, and their fig trees ; and brake the trees of their coasts.

He spake, and the locusts came, and caterpillars, and that without number,

And did eat up all the herbs in their land,

And devoured the fruit of their ground.

He smote also all the firstborn in their land,

The chief of all their strength.

He brought them forth also with silver and gold ;

The earth opened, and swallowed up Dathan,

And covered the company of Abiram.

And a fire was kindled in their company ;

The flame burned up the wicked.

They made a calf in Horeb,

And worshipped the molten image.

Thus they echanged their glory

Into the similitude of an ox that eateth grass.

{ They forgot God their saviour,

{ Which had done great things in Egypt ;

{ *Wondrous works in the land of Ham,*

{ *And terrible things by the Red Sea.*

Therefore he said that he would destroy them,

{ *Had not Moses his chosen stood before him in the breach,*

{ *To turn away his wrath, lest he should destroy them.*

Yea, they despised the pleasant land,

They believed not his word ;

But murmured in their tents,

And hearkened not unto the voice of the LORD.

Therefore he lifted up his hand against them,

To overthrow them in the wilderness ;

To overthrow their seed also among the nations,

And to scatter them in the lands.

They angered him also at the waters of strife,

So that it went ill with Moses for their sakes :

Because they provoked his spirit,

So that he spake unadvisedly with his lips.

{ They did not destroy the nations,

{ Concerning whom the LORD commanded them :

{ *But were mingled among the heathen,*

{ And they served their idols :

{ Which were a snare unto them.

{ *Yea, they sacrificed their sons*

{ *And their daughters unto devils.*

{ And shed innocent blood,

{ Even the blood of their sons and of their daughters,

{ *Whom they sacrificed unto the idols of Canaan ;*

{ *And the land was polluted with blood.*

Therefore was the wrath of the LORD kindled against his people,
Inasmuch that he abhorred his own inheritance.
 And he gave them into the hand of the heathen ;
And they that hated them ruled over them.
 Their enemies also oppressed them,
And they were brought into subjection under their hand.
 Many times did he deliver them ;
 { *But they provoked him with their counsel,*
 { *And were brought low for their iniquity.*

The God of Israel is he that giveth strength and power unto his people.

I will sing a new song unto thee, O God :

Upon a psaltery and an instrument of ten strings will I sing praises unto thee.

It is he that giveth salvation unto kings :

Who delivereth David his servant from the hurtful sword.

Rid me, and deliver me from the hand of strange children,

{ *Whose mouth speaketh vanity,*

{ *And their right hand is a right hand of falsehood :*

That our sons may be as plants grown up in their youth ;

That our daughters may be as corner stones, polished after the similitude of a palace ;

That our garners may be full, affording all manner of store ;

That our sheep may bring forth thousands and ten thousands in our streets :

That our oxen may be strong to labor ; that there be no breaking in, nor going out :

That there be no complaining in our streets.

Happy is that people, that is in such a case :

Yea, happy is that people whose God is the LORD.

PSALM IX.

I WILL praise thee, O LORD, with my whole heart ;

I will show forth all thy marvellous works.

I will be glad and rejoice in thee :

I will sing praise to thy name, O thou Most High.

When mine enemies are turned back,

They shall fall and perish at thy presence.

For thou hast maintained my right and my cause ;

Thou satest in the throne judging right.

Thou hast rebuked the heathen, thou hast destroyed the wicked,

Thou hast put out their name for ever and ever.

{ *Thou that liftest me up from the gates of death :*

That I may show forth all thy praise in the gates of the daughter of Zion :

I will rejoice in thy salvation.

The heathen are sunk down in the pit that they made :

In the net which they hid is their own foot taken.

The LORD is known by the judgment which he executeth :

The wicked is snared in the work of his own hands.

The wicked shall be turned into hell,

And all the nations that forget God.

For the needy shall not always be forgotten :

The expectation of the poor shall not perish for ever.

Arise, O LORD ; let not man prevail :

Let the heathen be judged in thy sight.

Put them in fear, O LORD :

That the nations may know themselves to be but men.

The righteous shall be glad in the LORD, and shall trust in him ;

And all the upright in heart shall glory.

PSALM LXII.

TRULY my soul waiteth upon God :

From him cometh my salvation.

He only is my rock and my salvation ;

He is my defence ; I shall not be greatly moved.

How long will ye imagine mischief against a man ?

{ *Ye shall be slain all of you ;*

{ *As a bowing wall shall ye be, and as a tottering fence.*

They only consult to cast him down from his excellency :

They delight in lies : they bless with their mouth, but they curse inwardly.

My soul, wait thou only upon God ;

For my expectation is from him.

He only is my rock and my salvation :

He is my defence ; I shall not be moved.

In God is my salvation and my glory :

The rock of my strength, and my refuge, is in God.

Trust in him at all times ;

Ye people, pour out your heart before him : God is a refuge for us.

Surely men of low degree are vanity, and men of high degree are a lie :

To be laid in the balance, they are altogether lighter than vanity.

Trust not in oppression, and become not vain in robbery

If riches increase, set not your heart upon them.

God hath spoken once ; twice have I heard this ;

That power belongeth unto God.

Also unto thee, O LORD, belongeth mercy :

For thou renderest to every man according to his work.

PSALM CXXIV.

IF it had not been the LORD who was on our side,

Now may Israel say ;

If it had not been the LORD who was on our side,

When men rose up against us :

Then they had swallowed us up quick,

When their wrath was kindled against us :

Then the waters had overwhelmed us,

{ *The stream had gone over our soul :*

{ *Then the proud waters had gone over our soul.*

Blessed be the LORD,

Who hath not given us as a prey to their teeth.

Our soul is escaped as a bird out of the snare of the fowlers :

The snare is broken, and we are escaped.

Our help is in the name of the LORD,

Who made heaven and earth.

Unto such as keep his covenant and his testimonies.

For thy name's sake, O LORD, pardon mine iniquity ;

For it is great.

What man is he that feareth the LORD ?

Him shall he teach in the way that he shall choose.

His soul shall dwell at ease ;

And his seed shall inherit the earth.

The secret of the LORD is with them that fear him ;

And he will show them his covenant.

Mine eyes are ever toward the LORD ;

For he shall pluck my feet out of the net.

Turn thee unto me, and have mercy upon me ;

For I am desolate and afflicted.

The troubles of my heart are enlarged :

O bring thou me out of my distresses.

Look upon mine affliction and my pain ;

O keep my soul, and deliver me :

Let me not be ashamed ; for I put my trust in thee.

Let integrity and uprightness preserve me ; for I wait on thee.

Redeem Israel, O God, out of all his troubles.

PSALM XXXVI.

THE transgression of the wicked saith within my heart,
That there is no fear of God before his eyes.

For he flattereth himself in his own eyes,

Until his iniquity be found to be hateful.

The words of his mouth are iniquity and deceit :

He hath left off to be wise, and to do good.

Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion !
 { *When the LORD bringeth back the captivity of his people,*
 { *Jacob shall rejoice, and Israel shall be glad.*

PSALM LXXXII.

GOD standeth in the congregation of the mighty ;
He judgeth among the gods.

How long will ye judge unjustly,
And accept the persons of the wicked ?

Defend the poor and fatherless :
Do justice to the afflicted and needy.

Deliver the poor and needy :
Rid them out of the hand of the wicked.

They know not, neither will they understand ;
 { *They walk on in darkness :*
 { *All the foundations of the earth are out of course.*

I have said, Ye are gods ;
And all of you are children of the Most High.

But ye shall die like men,
And fall like one of the princes.

Arise, O God, judge the earth :
For thou shalt inherit all nations.

My heart is fixed, O God, my heart is fixed :

Awake, psaltery and harp : I myself will awake early.

I will praise thee, O Lord, among the people :

I will sing unto thee among the nations.

For the shields of the earth belong unto God :
He is greatly exalted.

And washed my hands in innocency.
 For all the day long have I been plagued,
And chastened every morning.
 If I say, I will speak thus ;
Behold, I should offend against the generation of thy children.
 When I thought to know this,
It was too painful for me ;
 Until I went into the sanctuary of God ;
Then understood I their end.
 Surely thou didst set them in slippery places ;
Thou castedst them down into destruction.
 How are they brought into desolation, as in a moment !

Marvellous are thy works ; and that my soul knoweth right well.

My substance was not hid from thee, when I was made in secret,

And curiously wrought in the lowest parts of the earth.

Thine eyes did see my substance, yet being unperfect ;

{ *And in thy book all my members were written,*

{ *Which in continuance were fashioned, when as yet there was none of them.*

How precious also are thy thoughts unto me, O God !

How great is the sum of them !

If I should count them, they are more in number than the sand :

When I awake, I am still with thee.

Surely thou wilt slay the wicked, O God !

Depart from me, therefore, ye bloody men.

And am I not grieved with those that rise up against thee ?

I hate them with perfect hatred :

And lead me in the way everlasting.

Lesson 48. (PAGE 102.)

FROM PSALM LXXVIII.

GIVE ear, O my people, to my law :
Incline your ears to the words of my mouth.

I will open my mouth in a parable :

I will utter dark sayings of old :

Which we have heard and known,

And our fathers have told us.

We will not hide them from their children,

{ *Showing to the generation to come the praises of the LORD,*
 { *And his strength, and his wonderful works that he hath done.*

{ For he established a testimony in Jacob,

{ And appointed a law in Israel,

{ *Which he commanded our fathers,*

{ *That they should make them known to their children :*

That the generation to come might know them,

{ *Even the children which should be born ;*

{ *Who should arise and declare them to their children :*

That they might set their hope in God,

And not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments :

{ And might not be as their fathers,

{ A stubborn and rebellious generation ;

{ *A generation that set not their heart aright,*

{ *And whose spirit was not steadfast with God.*

{ The children of Ephraim, being armed, and carrying bows,

{ Turned back in the day of battle.

They kept not the covenant of God, and refused to walk in his law.

And forgot his works,

And his wonders that he had showed them.

Marvellous things did he in the sight of their fathers,

In the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan.

He divided the sea, and caused them to pass through ;

And he made the waters to stand as an heap.

In the daytime also he led them with a cloud,

And all the night with a light of fire.

He clave the rocks in the wilderness,

And gave them drink as out of the great depths.

He brought streams also out of the rock,

And caused waters to run down like rivers.

{ And they sinned yet more against him

{ By provoking the Most High in the wilderness.

And they tempted God in their heart by asking meat for their lust.

Yea, they spake against God :

They said, Can God furnish a table in the wilderness ?

{ Behold, he smote the rock, that the waters gushed out,

{ And the streams overflowed ;

Can he give bread also ? Can he provide flesh for his people ?

Therefore the LORD heard this, and was wroth ;

{ *So a fire was kindled against Jacob,*

{ *And anger also came up against Israel ;*

Because they believed not in God,
And trusted not in his salvation :
 Though he had commanded the clouds from above,
And opened the doors of heaven,
 And had rained down manna upon them to eat,
And had given them of the corn of heaven.
 Man did eat angels' food :
He sent them meat to the full.
 For all this they sinned still,
And believed not for his wondrous works.
 Therefore their days did he consume in vanity,
And their years in trouble.
 When he slew them, then they sought him :
And they returned and inquired early after God.
 And they remembered that God was their rock,
And the high God their redeemer.
 Nevertheless they did flatter him with their mouth,
And they lied unto him with their tongues.
 For their heart was not right with him,
Neither were they steadfast in his covenant.
 } But he, being full of compassion, forgave their iniquity,
 } And destroyed them not :
 { *Yea, many a time turned he his anger away,*
 { *And did not stir up all his wrath.*
 For he remembered that they were but flesh :
A wind that passeth away, and cometh not again.
 He cast out the heathen also before them,
 { *And divided them an inheritance by line,*
 { *And made the tribes of Israel to dwell in their tents.*
 Yet they tempted and provoked the most high God,
And kept not his testimonies :
 But turned back, and dealt unfaithfully like their fathers :
They were turned aside like a deceitful bow.
 For they provoked him to anger with their high places.
And moved him to jealousy with their graven images.
 Moreover he refused the tabernacle of Joseph,
And chose not the tribe of Ephraim :
 But chose the tribe of Judah,
The mount Zion which he loved.
 And he built his sanctuary like high palaces,
Like the earth which he hath established for ever.
 He chose David also his servant,
And took him from the sheepfolds :

From following the ewes great with young
 { *He brought him to feed Jacob his people,*
 { *And Israel his inheritance.*
 So he fed them according to the integrity of his heart ;
And guided them by the skillfulness of his hands.

LESSON 49. (PAGE 105.)

PSALM XXXIX.

I SAID, I will take heed to my ways, that I sin not with my tongue :
I will keep my mouth with a bridle, while the wicked is before me.
 I was dumb with silence,
I held my peace, even from good ; and my sorrow was stirred.
 My heart was hot within me,
While I was musing the fire burned :
 Then spake I with my tongue, LORD, make me to know mine end,
 { *And the measure of my days, what it is ;*
 { *That I may know how frail I am.*
 Behold, thou hast made my days as an handbreadth ;
 { *And mine age is as nothing before thee :*
 { *Verily every man at his best state is altogether vanity.*
 Surely every man walketh in a vain show :
 { *Surely they are disquieted in vain :*
 { *He heapeth up riches, and knoweth not who shall gather them.*
 And now, Lord, what wait I for ?
My hope is in thee.
 Deliver me from all my transgressions :
Make me not the reproach of the foolish.
 I was dumb, I opened not my mouth ;
Because thou didst it.
 Remove thy stroke away from me :
I am consumed by the blow of thine hand.
 When thou with rebukes dost correct man for iniquity,
 { *Thou makest his beauty to consume away like a moth :*
 { *Surely every man is vanity.*
 Hear my prayer, O LORD, and give ear unto my cry ;
Hold not thy peace at my tears.

For I am a stranger with thee,
And a sojourner, as all my fathers were.
 O spare me, that I may recover strength,
Before I go hence, and be no more.

PSALM LXXI.

IN thee, O LORD, do I put my trust :
Let me never be put to confusion.
 Deliver me in thy righteousness, and cause me to escape :
Incline thine ear unto me, and save me.
 Be thou my strong habitation, whereunto I may continually resort :
 { *Thou hast given commandment to save me ;*
 { *For thou art my rock and my fortress.*
 Deliver me, O my God, out of the hand of the wicked.
Out of the hand of the unrighteous and cruel man.
 For thou art my hope, O LORD GOD :
Thou art my trust from my youth.
 By thee have I been holden up from the womb :
 { *Thou art he that took me out of my mother's womb ;*
 { *My praise shall be continually of thee.*
 I am as a wonder unto many ;
But thou art my strong refuge.
 Let my mouth be filled with thy praise
And with thy honor all the day.
 Cast me not off in the time of old age ;
Forsake me not when my strength faileth.
 For mine enemies speak against me ;
And they that lay wait for my soul take counsel together,
 Saying, God hath forsaken him :
Persecute and take him ; for there is none to deliver him.
 O God, be not far from me :
O my God, make haste for my help.
 Let them be confounded and consumed that are adversaries to my soul ;
Let them be covered with reproach and dishonor that seek my hurt.
 But I will hope continually,
And will yet praise thee more and more.
 My mouth shall show forth thy righteousness,
And thy salvation all the day ; for I know not the numbers thereof.
 I will go in the strength of the LORD GOD :
I will make mention of thy righteousness, even of thine only.
 O God, thou hast taught me from my youth :
And hitherto have I declared thy wondrous works.

Now also when I am old and grayheaded, O God, forsake me not ;

{ *Until I have showed thy strength unto this generation.*

{ *And thy power to every one that is to come.*

Thy righteousness also, O God, is very high,

Who hast done great things : O God, who is like unto thee !

Thou, which hast showed me great and sore troubles, shalt quicken me again,

And shall bring me up again from the depths of the earth.

Thou shalt increase my greatness,

And comfort me on every side.

I will also praise thee with the psaltery, even thy truth, O my God ;

Unto thee will I sing with the harp, O thou Holy One of Israel.

My lips shall greatly rejoice when I sing unto thee ;

And my soul, which thou hast redeemed.

My tongue also shall talk of thy righteousness all the day long :

For they are confounded, for they are brought unto shame, that seek my hurt.

Lesson 50. (PAGE 107.)

PSALM CXIX : 97—128.

O H how love I thy law !

It is my meditation all the day.

Thou, through thy commandments, hast made me wiser than mine enemies :

For they are ever with me.

I have more understanding than all my teachers :

For thy testimonies are my meditation.

I understand more than the ancients,

Because I keep thy precepts.

I have refrained my feet from every evil way,

That I might keep thy word.

I have not departed from thy judgments :

For thou hast taught me.

How sweet are thy words unto my taste !

Yea, sweeter than honey to my mouth.

Through thy precepts I get understanding :

Therefore I hate every false way.

Thy word is a lamp unto my feet,

And a light unto my path.

I have sworn, and I will perform it,
That I will keep thy righteous judgments.
 I am afflicted very much :
Quicken me, O LORD, according unto thy word.
 Accept, I beseech thee, the freewill offerings of my mouth, O LORD,
And teach me thy judgments.
 My soul is continually in my hand :
Yet do I not forget thy law.
 The wicked have laid a snare for me :
Yet I erred not from thy precepts.
 Thy testimonies have I taken as a heritage for ever :
For they are the rejoicing of my heart.
 I have inclined mine heart to perform thy statutes
Always, even unto the end.
 I hate vain thoughts :
But thy law do I love.
 Thou art my hiding-place and my shield :
I hope in thy word.
 Depart from me, ye evil doers :
For I will keep the commandments of my God.
 Uphold me according unto thy word, that I may live :
And let me not be ashamed of my hope.
 Hold thou me up, and I shall be safe :
And I will have respect unto thy statutes continually.
 Thou hast trodden down all them that err from thy statutes :
For their deceit is falsehood.
 Thou puttest away all the wicked of the earth like dross :
Therefore I love thy testimonies.
 My flesh trembleth for fear of thee ;
And I am afraid of thy judgments.
 I have done judgment and justice :
Leave me not to mine oppressors.
 Be surety for thy servant for good :
Let not the proud oppress me.
 Mine eyes fail for thy salvation,
And for the word of thy righteousness.
 Deal with thy servant according unto thy mercy,
And teach me thy statutes.
 I am thy servant ; give me understanding,
That I may know thy testimonies.
 It is time for thee, LORD, to work :
For they have made void thy law.

Therefore I love thy commandments

Above gold ; yea, above fine gold.

Therefore I esteem all thy precepts concerning all things to be right ;

And I hate every false way.

Lesson 51. (PAGE 109.)

PSALM CXIX : 129—160.

THEY testimonies are wonderful :

Therefore doth my soul keep them.

The entrance of thy words giveth light ;

It giveth understanding unto the simple.

I opened my mouth, and panted :

For I longed for thy commandments.

Look thou upon me, and be merciful unto me,

As thou usest to do unto those that love thy name.

Order my steps in thy word :

And let not any iniquity have dominion over me.

Deliver me from the oppression of man :

So will I keep thy precepts.

Make thy face to shine upon thy servant ;

And teach me thy statutes.

Rivers of water run down mine eyes,

Because they keep not thy law.

Righteous art thou, O LORD,

And upright are thy judgments.

Thy testimonies that thou hast commanded are righteous

And very faithful.

My zeal hath consumed me,

Because mine enemies have forgotten thy words.

Thy word is very pure :

Therefore thy servant loveth it.

I am small and despised :

Yet do not I forget thy precepts.

Thy righteousness is an everlasting righteousness,

And thy law is the truth.

Trouble and anguish have taken hold on me :

Yet thy commandments are my delights.

The righteousness of thy testimonies is everlasting :

Give me understanding, and I shall live.

I cried with my whole heart ; hear me, O LORD :

I will keep thy statutes.

I cried unto thee ;

Save me, and I shall keep thy testimonies.

I prevented the dawning of the morning, and cried :

I hoped in thy word.

Mine eyes prevent the night watches,

That I might meditate in thy word.

Hear my voice, according unto thy loving-kindness :

O LORD, quicken me according to thy judgment.

They draw nigh that follow after mischief :

They are far from thy law.

Thou art near, O LORD ;

And all thy commandments are truth.

Concerning thy testimonies, I have known of old

That thou hast founded them for ever.

Consider mine affliction, and deliver me :

For I do not forget thy law.

Plead my cause, and deliver me :

Quicken me according to thy word.

Salvation is far from the wicked :

For they seek not thy statutes.

Great are thy tender mercies, O LORD :

Quicken me according to thy judgments.

Many are my persecutors and mine enemies ;

Yet do I not decline from thy testimonies.

I beheld the transgressors, and was grieved ;

Because they kept not thy word.

Consider how I love thy precepts :

Quicken me, O LORD, according to thy loving-kindness.

Thy word is true from the beginning :

And every one of thy righteous judgments endureth for ever.

Lesson 52. (PAGE 111.)

PSALM LV.

GIVE ear to my prayer, O God ;

And hide not thyself from my supplication.

Attend unto me and hear me ;

I mourn in my complaint, and make a noise ;

Because of the voice of the enemy, because of the oppression of the wicked :

For they cast iniquity upon me, and in wrath they hate me.

My heart is sore pained within me :

And the terrors of death are fallen upon me.

Fearfulness and trembling are come upon me,

And horror hath overwhelmed me.

And I said, Oh that I had wings like a dove !

For then would I fly away, and be at rest.

Lo, then would I wander far off,

And remain in the wilderness.

I would hasten my escape,

From the windy storm and tempest.

Destroy, O LORD, and divide their tongues :

For I have seen violence and strife in the city.

Day and night they go about it upon the walls thereof :

Mischief, also, and sorrow, are in the midst of it.

Wickedness is in the midst thereof :

Deceit and guile depart not from her streets.

For it was not an enemy that reproached me : then could I have borne it ;

{ *Neither was it he that hated me that did magnify himself against me ;*

{ *Then I would have hid myself from him :*

But it was thou, a man mine equal, my guide, and mine acquaintance.

{ *We took sweet counsel together,*

{ *And walked unto the house of God in company.*

Let death seize upon them, and let them go down quick into hell :

For wickedness is in their dwellings, and among them.

As for me, I will call upon God ;

And the LORD shall save me.

Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray, and cry aloud :

And he shall hear my voice.

He hath delivered my soul in peace from the battle that was against me :

For there were many with me.

God shall hear, and afflict them, even he that abideth of old.

Because they have no changes, therefore they fear not God.

He hath put forth his hands against such as be at peace with him :

He hath broken his covenant.

The words of his mouth were smoother than butter, but war was in his heart :

His words were softer than oil, yet were they drawn swords.

Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee :

He shall never suffer the righteous to be moved.

But thou, O God, shalt bring them down into the pit of destruction :

{ *Bloody and deceitful men shall not live out half their days ;*

{ *But I will trust in thee.*

PSALM LVI.

BE merciful unto me, O God : for man would swallow me up ;
He fighting daily oppresseth me.

Mine enemies would daily swallow me up :

For they be many that fight against me, O thou Most High.

What time I am afraid, I will trust in thee.

In God I will praise his word,

In God I have put my trust ;

I will not fear what flesh can do unto me.

Every day they wrest my words :

All their thoughts are against me for evil.

They gather themselves together,

They hide themselves, they mark my steps, when they wait for my soul.

Shall they escape by iniquity ?

In thine anger cast down the people, O God.

Thou tellest my wanderings :

Put thou my tears into thy bottle : are they not in thy book ?

When I cry unto thee, then shall mine enemies turn back :

This I know ; for God is for me.

In God will I praise his word :

In the LORD will I praise his word.

In God have I put my trust :

I will not be afraid what man can do unto me.

Thy vows are upon me, O God :

I will render praises unto thee.

For thou hast delivered my soul from death :

{ *Wilt not thou deliver my feet from falling,*

{ *That I may walk before God in the light of the living ?*

LESSON 53. (PAGE 113.)

PSALM CII.

HEAR my prayer, O LORD,

And let my cry come unto thee.

Hide not thy face from me in the day when I am in trouble ;

{ *Incline thine ear unto me :*

{ *In the day when I call answer me speedily.*

For my days are consumed like smoke,

And my bones are burned as a hearth.

My heart is smitten, and withered like grass ;

So that I forget to eat my bread.

By reason of the voice of my groaning my bones cleave to my skin.

I am like a pelican of the wilderness : I am like an owl of the desert.

I watch, and am as a sparrow alone upon the housetop.

{ *Mine enemies reproach me all the day ;*

{ *And they that are mad against me are sworn against me.*

For I have eaten ashes like bread,

And mingled my drink with weeping.

Because of thine indignation and thy wrath :

For thou hast lifted me up, and cast me down.

My days are like a shadow that declineth ;

And I am withered like grass.

But thou, O LORD, shalt endure for ever ;

And thy remembrance unto all generations.

Thou shalt arise, and have mercy upon Zion :

For the time to favor her, yea, the set time, is come.

For thy servants take pleasure in her stones.

And favor the dust thereof.

So the heathen shall fear the name of the LORD,

And all the kings of the earth thy glory.

When the LORD shall build up Zion,

He shall appear in his glory.

He will regard the prayer of the destitute,

And not despise their prayer.

This shall be written for the generation to come,

And the people which shall be created shall praise the LORD.

For he hath looked down from the height of his sanctuary ;

From heaven did the LORD behold the earth ;

To hear the groaning of the prisoner ;
To loose those that are appointed to death ;
 To declare the name of the LORD in Zion,
And his praise in Jerusalem ;
 When the people are gathered together,
And the kingdoms, to serve the LORD.
 He weakened my strength in the way ;
He shortened my days.
 I said, O my God, take me not away in the midst of my days :
Thy years are throughout all generations.
 Of old hast thou laid the foundation of the earth :
And the heavens are the work of thy hands.
 They shall perish, but thou shalt endure :
Yea, all of them shall wax old like a garment ;
 As a vesture shalt thou change them, and they shall be changed :
But thou art the same, and thy years shall have no end.
 The children of thy servants shall continue,
And their seed shall be established before thee.

PSALM XIII.

HOW long wilt thou forget me, O LORD ?
For ever ? how long wilt thou hide thy face from me ?
 { How long shall I take counsel in my soul,
 { Having sorrow in my heart daily ?
How long shall mine enemy be exalted over me ?
 Consider and hear me, O LORD my God :
Lighten mine eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death :
 Lest mine enemy say, I have prevailed against him ;
And those that trouble me rejoice when I am moved.
 But I have trusted in thy mercy ;
My heart shall rejoice in thy salvation.
 I will sing unto the LORD,
Because he hath dealt bountifully with me.

LESSON 54. (PAGE 115.)

PSALM CXLIII.

HEAR my prayer, O LORD,

{ Give ear to my supplications :

{ In thy faithfulness answer me, and in thy righteousness.

And enter not into judgment with thy servant :

For in thy sight shall no man living be justified.

{ For the enemy hath persecuted my soul ;

{ He hath smitten my life down to the ground ;

He hath made me to dwell in darkness, as those that have been long dead.

Therefore is my spirit overwhelmed within me ;

My heart within me is desolate.

I remember the days of old :

I meditate on all thy works ; I muse on the work of thy hands.

I stretch forth my hands unto thee :

My soul thirsteth after thee, as a thirsty land.

Hear me speedily, O LORD : my spirit faileth :

{ Hide not thy face from me,

{ Lest I be like unto them that go down into the pit.

{ Cause me to hear thy loving-kindness in the morning ;

{ For in thee do I trust :

{ Cause me to know the way wherein I should walk ;

{ For I lift up my soul unto thee.

Deliver me, O LORD, from mine enemies :

I flee unto thee to hide me.

Teach me to do thy will ; for thou art my God :

Thy spirit is good ; lead me into the land of uprightness.

Quicken me, O LORD, for thy name's sake :

For thy righteousness' sake bring my soul out of trouble.

And of thy mercy cut off mine enemies,

And destroy all them that afflict my soul : for I am thy servant.

PSALM XL.

I WAITED patiently for the LORD ;

And he inclined unto me, and heard my cry.

He brought me up also out of an horrible pit, out of the miry clay,

And set my feet upon a rock, and established my goings.

And he hath put a new song in my mouth, even praise unto our God :

Many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the LORD.

Blessed is that man that maketh the LORD his trust,

And respecteth not the proud, nor such as turn aside to lies.

Many, O LORD my God, are thy wonderful works which thou hast done,

And thy thoughts which are to us-ward :

They cannot be reckoned up in order unto thee :

If I would declare and speak of them, they are more than can be numbered.

Sacrifice and offering thou didst not desire :

{ *Mine ears hast thou opened :*

{ *Burnt offering and sin offering hast thou not required.*

Then said I, Lo, I come :

In the volume of the book it is written of me,

I delight to do thy will, O my God :

Yea, thy law is within my heart.

I have preached righteousness in the great congregation :

Lo, I have not refrained my lips, O LORD, thou knowest.

I have not hid thy righteousness within my heart ;

{ *I have declared thy faithfulness and thy salvation :*

{ *I have not concealed thy loving-kindness and thy truth from the great congregation.*

Withhold not thou thy tender mercies from me, O LORD :

Let thy loving-kindness and thy truth continually preserve me.

For innumerable evils have compassed me about :

{ *Mine iniquities have taken hold upon me,*

{ *So that I am not able to look up ;*

They are more than the hairs of mine head :

Therefore my heart faileth me.

Be pleased, O LORD, to deliver me :

O LORD, make haste to help me.

{ Let them be ashamed and confounded together

{ That seek after my soul to destroy it ;

Let them be driven backward and put to shame that wish me evil.

Let them be desolate for a reward of their shame

That say unto me, Aha! aha!

Let all those that seek thee rejoice and be glad in thee :

Let such as love thy salvation say continually, The LORD be magnified.

But I am poor and needy ; yet the Lord thinketh upon me :

Thou art my help and my deliverer ; make no tarrying, O my God.

Lesson 55. (PAGE 117.)

PSALM LXXXVIII.

O LORD God of my salvation,
I have cried day and night before thee :
 Let my prayer come before thee :
Incline thine ear unto my cry ;
 For my soul is full of troubles :
And my life draweth nigh unto the grave.
 I am counted with them that go down into the pit :
I am as a man that hath no strength :
 Free among the dead, like the slain that lie in the grave,
Whom thou rememberest no more : and they are cut off from thy hand.
 Thou hast laid me in the lowest pit,
In darkness, in the deeps.
 Thy wrath lieth hard upon me,
And thou hast afflicted me with all thy waves.
 Thou hast put away mine acquaintance far from me ;
 { *Thou hast made me an abomination unto them :*
 { *I am shut up, and I cannot come forth.*
 Mine eye mourneth by reason of affliction :
LORD, I have called daily upon thee, I have stretched out my hands unto thee.
 Wilt thou show wonders to the dead ?
Shall the dead arise, and praise thee ?
 Shall thy loving-kindness be declared in the grave ?
Or thy faithfulness in destruction ?
 Shall thy wonders be known in the dark ?
And thy righteousness in the land of forgetfulness ?
 But unto thee have I cried, O LORD ;
And in the morning shall my prayer prevent thee.
 LORD, why castest thou off my soul ?
Why hidest thou thy face from me ?
 I am afflicted and ready to die from my youth up :
While I suffer thy terrors I am distracted.
 Thy fierce wrath goeth over me ;
Thy terrors have cut me off.
 They came round about me daily like water ;
They compassed me about together.
 Lover and friend hast thou put far from me,
And mine acquaintance into darkness.

PSALM LXIX.

SAVE me, O God ;

For the waters are come in unto my soul.

I sink in deep mire, where there is no standing :

I am come into deep waters, where the floods overflow me.

I am weary of my crying : my throat is dried :

Mine eyes fail while I wait for my God.

They that hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of mine head :

They that would destroy me, being mine enemies wrongfully, are mighty :

Then I restored that which I took not away.

O God, thou knowest my foolishness ;

And my sins are not hid from thee.

Let not them that wait on thee, O Lord God of hosts,

Be ashamed for my sake :

Let not those that seek thee be confounded for my sake,

O God of Israel.

Because for thy sake I have borne reproach :

Shame hath covered my face.

I am become a stranger unto my brethren,

And an alien unto my mother's children.

For the zeal of thine house hath eaten me up ;

And the reproaches of them that reproached thee are fallen upon me.

When I wept, and chastened my soul with fasting,

That was to my reproach.

I made sackcloth also my garment ;

And I became a proverb to them.

They that sit in the gate speak against me ;

And I was the song of the drunkards.

But as for me, my prayer is unto thee, O LORD, in an acceptable time :

O God, in the multitude of thy mercy hear me, in the truth of thy salvation.

Deliver me out of the mire, and let me not sink :

Let me be delivered from them that hate me, and out of the deep waters.

Let not the waterflood overflow me,

Neither let the deep swallow me up,

And let not the pit shut her mouth upon me.

Hear me, O LORD ; for thy loving-kindness is good :

Turn unto me according to the multitude of thy tender mercies.

And hide not thy face from thy servant ;

For I am in trouble : hear me speedily.

Draw nigh unto my soul, and redeem it :

Deliver me because of mine enemies.

Thou hast known my reproach, and my shame, and my dishonor :

Mine adversaries are all before thee.

Reproach hath broken my heart; and I am full of heaviness :

{ *And I looked for some to take pity, but there was none ;*

{ *And for comforters, but I found none.*

They gave me also gall for my meat ;

He hideth his face ; he will never see it.

Arise, O LORD ; O God, lift up thine hand :

Forget not the humble.

Wherefore doth the wicked contemn God ?

He hath said in his heart, Thou wilt not require it.

{ Thou hast seen it :

{ For thou beholdest mischief and spite, to requite it with thy hand :

The poor committeth himself unto thee ; thou art the helper of the fatherless.

Break thou the arm of the wicked and the evil man :

Seek out his wickedness till thou find none.

The LORD is King for ever and ever :

The heathen are perished out of his land.

LORD, thou hast heard the desire of the humble :

Thou wilt prepare their heart, thou wilt cause thine ear to hear :
To judge the fatherless and the oppressed,
That the man of the earth may no more oppress.

PSALM LIX.

DELIVER me from mine enemies, O my God :
Defend me from them that rise up against me.

Deliver me from the workers of iniquity,

Slay them not, lest my people forget :

{ *Scatter them by thy power ;*
{ *And bring them down, O Lord our shield.*

{ For the sin of their mouth and the words of their lips

{ Let them even be taken in their pride :

And for cursing and lying which they speak.

Consume them in wrath, consume them, that they may not be :

{ *And let them know that God ruleth in Jacob,*
{ *Unto the ends of the earth.*

And at evening let them return ;

And let them make a noise like a dog, and go round about the city.

Let them wander up and down for meat,

And grudge if they be not satisfied.

But I will sing of thy power ;

{ *Yea, I will sing aloud of thy mercy in the morning :*

{ *For thou hast been my defence and refuge in the day of my trouble.*

Unto thee, O my strength, will I sing :

For God is my defence, and the God of my mercy.

And the LORD shall cover him all the day long,

And he shall dwell between his shoulders.

And of Joseph he said,

Blessed of the LORD be his land,

For the precious things of heaven,

For the dew, and for the deep that coucheth beneath,

And for the precious fruits brought forth by the sun,

And for the precious things put forth by the moon,

And for the chief things of the ancient mountains,

And for the precious things of the lasting hills,

And for the precious things of the earth and fulness thereof.

And for the good-will of him that dwelt in the bush :

Let the blessing come upon the head of Joseph,

And upon the top of the head of him that was separated from his brethren.

His glory is like the firstling of his bullock,

And his horns are like the horns of unicorns :

With them he shall push the people together, to the ends of the earth :

{ *And they are the ten thousands of Ephraim,*

{ *And they are the thousands of Manasseh.*

There is none like unto the God of Jeshurun,

{ *Who rideth upon the heaven in thy help,*

And underneath are the everlasting arms :

And he shall thrust out the enemy from before thee ;

And shall say, Destroy them.

{ *Who is like unto thee, O people saved by the LORD,*

And thine enemies shall be found liars unto thee ;

(The Song of Moses.)

I WILL sing unto the LORD, for he hath triumphed gloriously :
The horse and his rider hath he thrown into the sea.

Thou didst blow with thy wind, the sea covered them :
They sank as lead in the mighty waters.

Who is like unto thee, O LORD, among the gods ?
 { *Who is like thee, glorious in holiness,*
 { *Fearful in praises, doing wonders ?*

Thou stretchedst out thy right hand,
The earth swallowed them.

Thou in thy mercy hast led forth the people which thou hast redeemed :
Thou hast guided them in thy strength, unto thy holy habitation.

The people shall hear, and be afraid :
Sorrow shall take hold on the inhabitants of Palestina.

Then the dukes of Edom shall be amazed ;

{ *The mighty men of Moab, trembling shall take hold upon them ;*

{ *All the inhabitants of Canaan shall melt away.*

{ Fear and dread shall fall upon them :

{ By the greatness of thine arm they shall be as still as a stone ;

{ *Till thy people pass over, O LORD,*

{ *Till the people pass over, which thou hast purchased.*

Thou shalt bring them in, and plant them in the mountain of thine inheritance,

In the place, O LORD, which thou hast made for thee to dwell in,

In the sanctuary, O LORD, which thy hands have established.

The LORD shall reign for ever and ever.

And Miriam the prophetess, the sister of Aaron, took a timbrel in her hand ;

And all the women went out after her, with timbrels and with dances.

{ And Miriam answered them,

{ And who shall declare his generation :

{ *For he was cut off out of the land of the living :*

{ *For the transgression of my people was he stricken.*

And he made his grave with the wicked,

And with the rich in his death ;

Because he had done no violence,

Neither was any deceit in his mouth.

Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him ;

He hath put him to grief :

When thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin,

{ *He shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days,*
 { *And the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand.*

And a voice came out of the throne, saying, Praise our God, all ye his servants,
And ye that fear him, both small and great.

And I heard as it were the voice of a great multitude,
And as the voice of many waters, and as the voice of mighty thunders,
saying, Alleluia : for the Lord God omnipotent reigneth.

Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honor to him :
For the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his wife hath made herself ready.

And to her was granted that she should be arrayed in fine linen, clean and white :

For the fine linen is the righteousness of saints.

And he saith unto me, Write, Blessed are they which are called unto the marriage supper of the Lamb.

And he saith unto me, These are the true sayings of God.

And I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse ;
And he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he doth judge and make war.

His eyes were as a flame of fire, and on his head were many crowns ;
And he had a name written, that no man knew, but he himself.

And he was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood :
And his name is called The Word of God.

And he hath on his vesture and on his thigh a name written,
King of kings, and LORD of lords.

{ *Neither whatsoever worketh abomination, or maketh a lie :*

{ *But they which are written in the Lamb's book of life.*

And he showed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal,

Proceeding out of the throne of God and of the Lamb.

In the midst of the street of it, and on either side of the river, was there the tree of life,

{ *Which bare twelve manner of fruits, and yielded her fruit every month :*

{ *And the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations.*

And there shall be no more curse :

But the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it ; and his servants shall serve him :

And they shall see his face :

And his name shall be in their foreheads.

And there shall be no night there; and they need no candle, neither light of the sun;

For the Lord God giveth them light: and they shall reign for ever and ever.

Blessed are they that do his commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life,

And may enter in through the gates into the city.

I Jesus have sent mine angel to testify unto you these things in the churches.

I am the root and the offspring of David, and the bright and morning star.

And the Spirit and the Bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come.

And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely.

He which testifieth these things saith, Surely I come quickly:

Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all.
