In London atone in 1621 thete were stateri t, be $](1, t) 00$ strangers, ${ }^{n}$ and they had been canyiner on 121 dif: ferent trales. ${ }^{\text {b }}$ Suveral, in spite of the statutes ol 1st Rich. Ill. and If and 15 IIen. V'lll. agranst receiving mppentices and mervants, employel more than two journeymen or fisur servants who were not the King's suljects; submitted to no recrulations as to the number of thoir apmentices; and frequented fars and markets, paying less dues than the freemen.

The complaints unde against the industry of the uliens and their use of machinery are instructive even at this duy":-

mondsey，as well as of Newington and Lambeth．a These returns resulted in no gool to the complainante，who renewed in 1621 their statement of the inconvenionce arising from the great influx of strangers，and proposals were made for a yearly registry，for exacting＇partwape according to their station，for forbibling the use of retail trades，for the reandation of the mumber of apprentices， and lor restricting their use of lairs and markets；ant，on Both July，1621，a commission was isured to the newly apprinted Lord Kecper（John Willimms），the Lomd lligh Treasurer（Linad Lord Cranficld），the Ittomey－General（Sir＇Thomas Coventry），Holicitor－ General（Sir Fohert Ileath），and others，to consiler of the statntes concerning aliens，and cither to induce them to conform with the laws arrealy in force，especially regarding mot selling by retail and the use of hamliomit trades，or to modify the laws lior the better convenience of stramgers and gome of the sulject，umber such direce tions as his Majesty should from time to time prescribe．And an the same day directions were given by the liing to the Commis－ sioners to take a yearly account of all aliens resident in England， to permit all wholesale merchants to continue their trade，but to restrain all retailers，unless they would submit to restrictions as to servants and apprentices，and pay quarterage as the English in their several companies did．None who were servants to the Englisli were to be taxed，except for registration，but all were to give bond to keep these orders，or clse depart the realm；and all refractory persons were to lue dealt with according to law．In January， $1622,{ }^{\text {e }}$ the Goldsmiths ${ }^{\circ}$ Company complaned of 183 alien Goldsmiths for making counterfeit jewels and engrossing trade， ${ }^{4}$ Ib，vol．xcix．Nus． $2-4,42-7$ ，and vol，exviii）．The names in the London returns in 1618 are printent in the Ayrendix（rost，p．60）．to make the lists more complete．

## REPORT OF TIIE COUNCI

> OF
> THE CAMDEN SOOIETY,
> ELECTED Brd MAY, 1861.

T'ue Council of the Comden Society, elected on the srd May, 18fil, refers with pleasure to the Report of the Auditors for evidence of the satisfactory state of the Soeicty's finanees, but reцrets tos state that, during the past year, the numbers of the Soeicty have been reduced by the deaths of many most valuable and influential Members.

In common with evary other Institution in the country which has for its uljects the enenurarement of Literature, Seience, or Art, the Camden Society has to deplore the loss of one Member, distinguished not more by exalted pesition than by extensive aequirements, and by the enlightened spirit in which he exereised the influence derived from those cireumstances, for the welfare of all elasses of the community. The Council feels that in thus acknowledging the high merits of the Illustrion's Prixee, whose loss has been so deeply and curnestly lamented, and its sympathy with Her Majesty moder this heavy trial, expression is only given to the feclings by which the whole Society is animated.

The Council has also to regret the death of one of the original founders of the Society, Josepil IIuxper, Esq., lately a Tice-President of the Society of Antiquaries, and one of the Assistant Keepers of the Public Records. Mr. Hunter not only gave the Council for many years the atvantage of his extensive antiquarian learning, but also edited for the Society the volume of Ecclesiastical Documents published in 1839-10, and the Diary of Thomas Carturiyht, Lord Bishop of Chester, puibished in 1842-3.

The first is a volume of very amusing character, abounding in gossip and personal allusions; and, from the eare with which it is edited, the Suciety will feel the loss which historical literature has sustaned by the early death of its accomplished Editor.

The Proccedings in the County of Fent contril)ute a vast amount of new and vatuable information upon a very important period of our history ; and the same may well be said of the volume of the Parliumentary Debutes in 1610 , in which is detailed at far greater length than has hitherto been recorded the commencement of the great struggle between the Crown and the House of Communs.

The Council has further the pleasure of amouncing, that Mr. Way, whose labours on the Promptorium were interrupted by his removal inte
the country, has kindly taken advantage of a temporary visit to London to resume his task. The Council trusts that, in the course of the present year, the Members will receive the conclusion of this important work; unquestionably the most valuable eontribution to philological knowledge which has been published for many years.

The endeavours so frequently made by former Councils to procure inereased facilities for searches for literary purposes among the lesisters of Early Wills in the Prerogative Court are doubtless in the recollection of the Members. Those endenvours have not proved in vain. I small room for literary inquirers has now been set apart at Doctors' Commons. Literary persons are indebted to Sir Cresswell C'resswell, the Judge of the Prerogative Court, for this valuable concession, which it may reasonably be hoped will contribute to the greater accuracy of all future genealogical and historical publications.

The present Council has shared the anxiety of all former Councils to maintain unimpaired the high character of the Society's publications. In this. respect the Council deems that all friends of the Society have much reason to be proud. The eighty-one volumes which have now been published by the Suciety* entain many works of singular and first-rate historical importance; among them are of course some of more value and some of less, but there are none which can be pronounced to have becu unworthy of publication. The literary future of the Society seems equatly full of hope. Some of the recent volumes are among the most interesting and the best edited: Editors in every way eompetest present themselven whenever needed, whitst the store of unpublished materials applicable to the purposes of the society seems inexhaustible. Under such cirrumstances all future Councils will. no doubt, feel deeply the responsibility whieh rests upon them, and sedulously endeavour, as the present Council has dene, to maintain the high standard of publication which has been set before them.
