



injuries hurt them badly as they lost five straight. Then came the annual Thanksgiving tilt with Elon and the Maroon and Gray came through to win for the third straight year. Carl Jones and Bill Rogers won All-Conference honors and Charlie Strider received an honorable mention.





Spring came and we buried the "hatchet" and ex-


tended the hand of fellowship to the Freshmen at the annual Freshman-Sophomore picnic.
