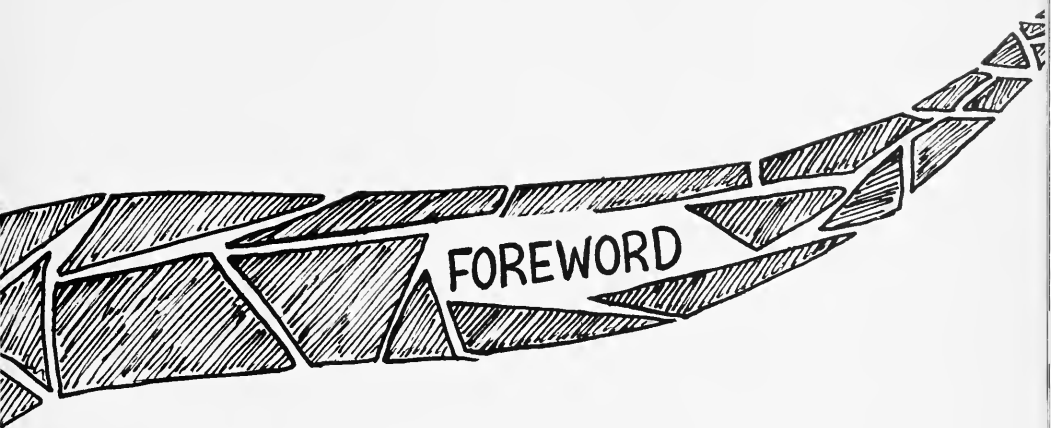






DEDICATED TO EDWARD BURROWS

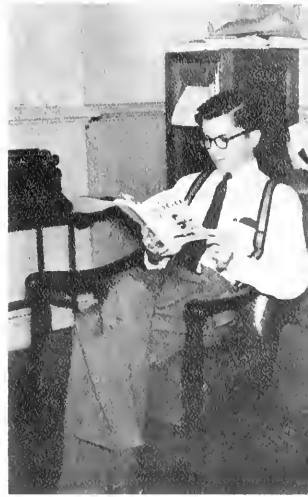

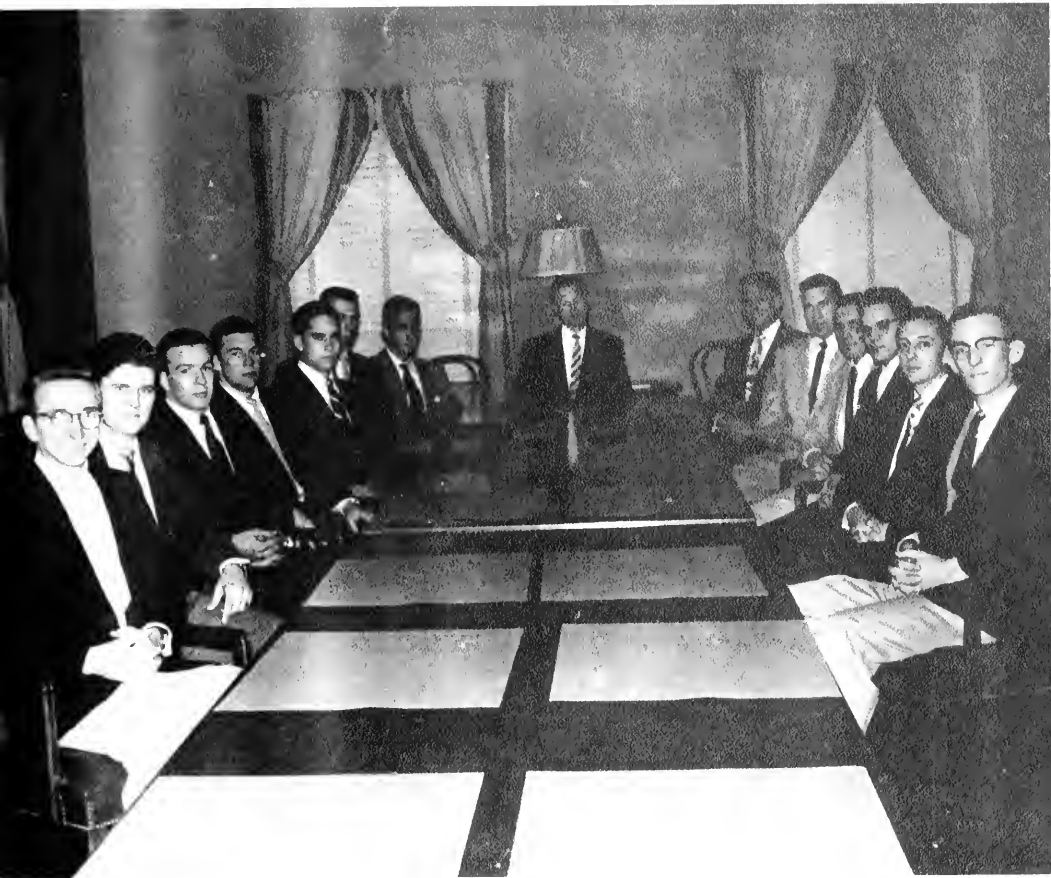

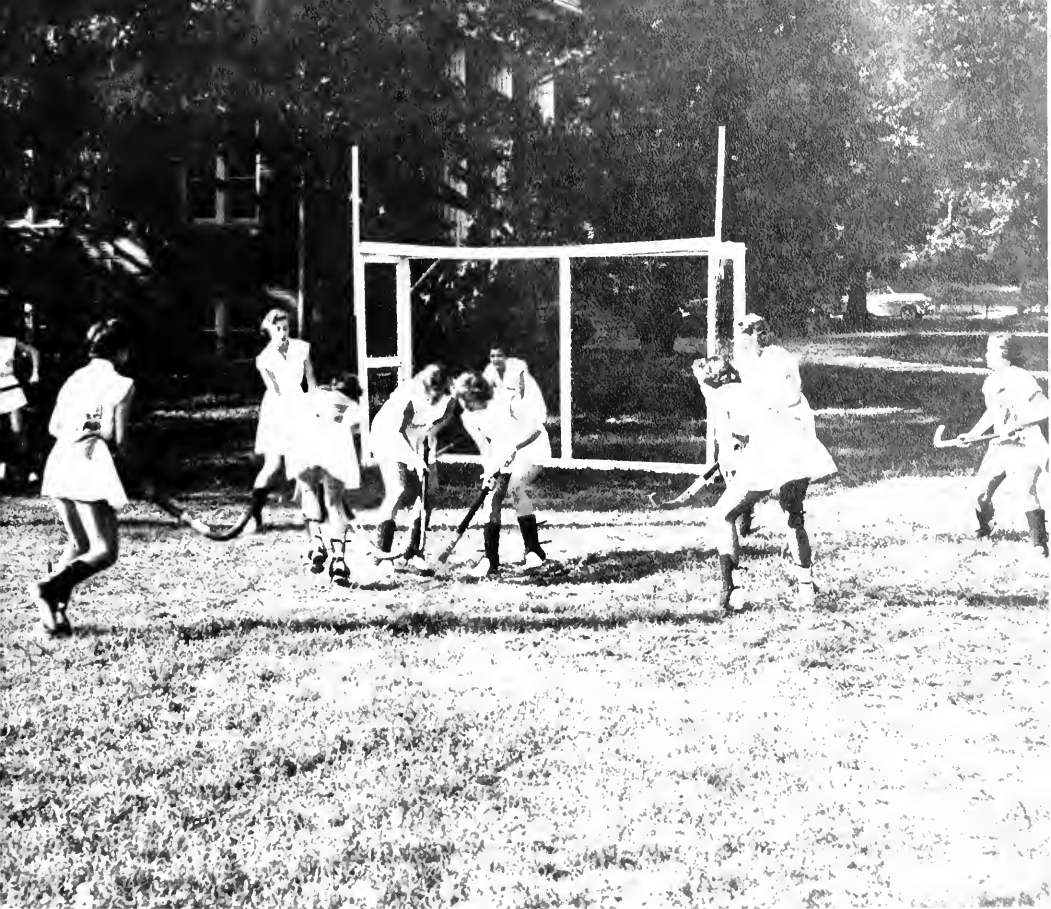

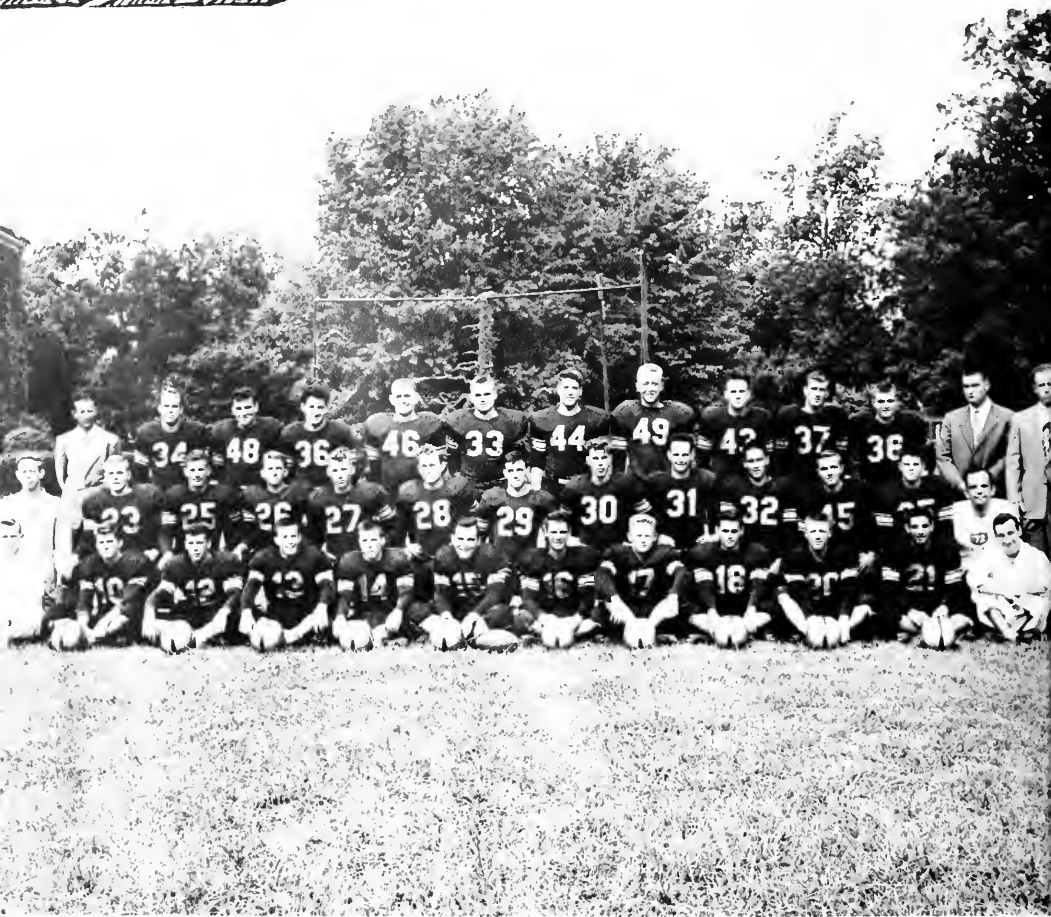
