Gulford College Public Interest Research Group, a chapter of the North Carolina Public Interest Research Group (NC PIRG), is a student-run, consumer and environmental research and advocacy group. PIRG's main concerns are: consumer protection, environmental quality, student rights, government accountability and corporate responsibility. After two full years on campus, students working with PIRG have many proud accomplishments. This past year students conducted public opinion surveys of Greensboro citizens' views on the state's food tax and the Duke Power Company bus system. They helped research a major report, "Voting in the Public Interest: Your Legislators' Records in the 1979 Session of the North Carolina General Assembly." With Energy Awareness becoming part of Gulford PIRG in the early Fall, the group sponsored two film series and coordinated a Solar Homes Tour. In October, PIRG sponsored along with the Residence Hall Program Board, a Voter Registration Drive. More than 200 students took advantage of this opportunity. Working with the IDS 101 program and the Career Development Office PIRG students put together an "Alternative Careers Day" which featured a panel discussion and an "Organization Fair". PIRG also sponsored a visit to the state legislature in Raleigh to watch government in action. PIRG Members appeared before the state Utilities Commission to testify for increased energy conservation and alternative energy development. PIRG members also pushed for increased public transportation before the Greensboro City Council while at the same time they opposed a request by Duke Power Company to raise its bus fares. Let's not forget the covered-dish suppers and the hundreds of smiling sun buttons in 13 different languages. Another year of growth for PIRG and student activism is alive and well at Gulford College.
