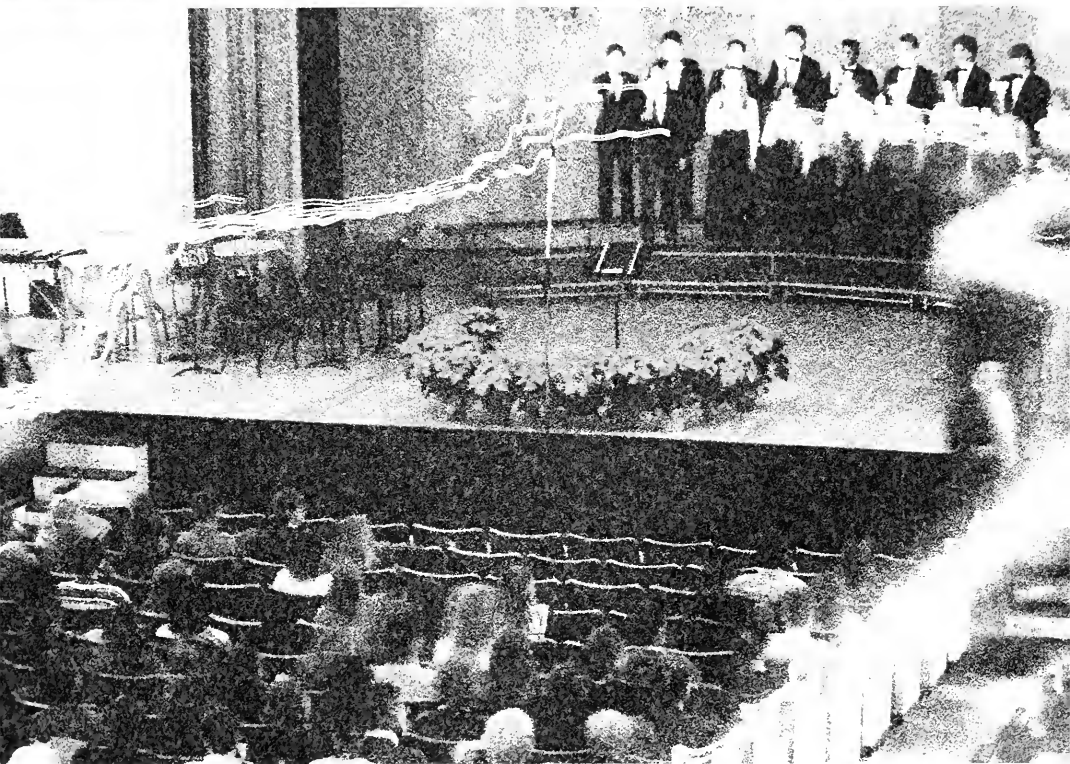

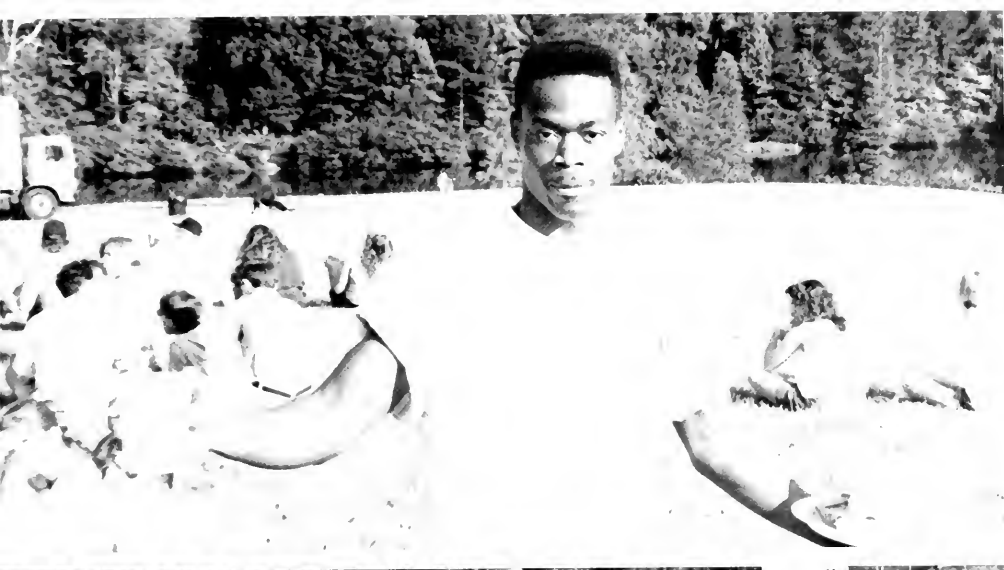

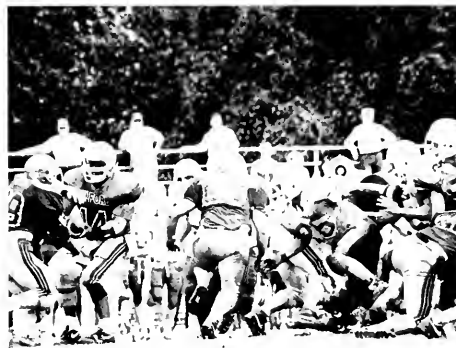

RETIRING AFTER THOUSANDS OF LETTERS



After thirteen “thoroughly enjoyable years” of working in Guilford’s mailroom, Mrs. C retired. The decision didn’t come easy though. “I’ll certainly miss the kids,” says Mrs. C, “but I’ve reached a point in my life where I need to spend more time with my husband.”

Gertrude Cloutier arrived at Guilford in August of 1978, but she wasn’t Gertrude Cloutier for long. “I was known as Mrs. C from the day I got here,” Mrs. C says with a smile that indicates approval. “It makes it easier for everybody.”

After thirteen years of hard work, it certainly seems Mrs. C deserves a rest. Working in the mailroom is not easy. “It’s hard to work in such cramped quarters,” says Mrs. C, “but I have the kind of attitude that can tolerate it.” In her thirteen years she has never missed a day of work due to poor weather, even though she commutes 20 miles a day from Pleasant Garden.

The entire Guilford College community appreciates Mrs. C’s solid service, but we will remember her as a friend. Mrs. C had an especially strong relationship with the students.

In 1986 she received the faculty award for service to students which was the highlight of her Guilford career. “I never dreamed such an award would be given to me,” says Mrs. C.

“I think she should have received the award last year,” says Skip Davenport, “She’s a warm and personable lady I could always talk to.”

Claude Mudimbe concurs, “I remember once I was having a bum day and I just needed someone to talk to. Mrs. C was there and she listened to what I had to say.”

But all of the student friendships Mrs. C develops do not end in four years. She still corresponds with students who have graduated years ago. Mrs. C has even attended student weddings. She travelled to Ireland in 1988 to see Ruth Pim get married and went to Spartanburg, South Carolina, last year to see the wedding of Kim Montgomery. Through the years, Mrs. C has always been a friend to the student.

Her husband is the main reason Mrs. C retired, but she had 1200 little reasons to stay — the Guilford students! “The kids have always come first for me,” says Mrs. C, “Guilford has been good for me and good to me.” I think we could all say the same thing about Mrs. C.

--IN MEMORIAM--

Grimsley Taylor Hobbs
1923-1990
Philosophy professor, former
President of Guilford College



In the last few days preceding Thanksgiving break, the Guilford College community was shocked and distraught by the deaths of two well-known and popular professors. Quickly-organized memorial services helped ease the shock and pain of the wide-felt loss. Grice and Hobbs have since been praised for their contributions to the college; many students, staff, and faculty members will long remember the impact these men had on them.

The following pieces are excerpts of memorials printed in *The Guilfordian*. Both are reprinted with permission of *The Guilfordian* and their respective authors.

GRIMSLEY HOBBS

-- Bill Rogers

Grimsley's days as president were not always easy ones. He led the college through periods of social upheaval. There were controversies over curricular development and the social codes of the college. And there were some difficult times in working with the Board [of Trustees]. But Grimsley's stature as a man, both physically and personally, carried him through these times with a continuing sense of vision and a disciplined quality of determination.

Artistry takes many different forms; John Grice was an artist among teachers. His secret was no secret at all; he simply wanted to share his enthusiasms and, above all, his voracious appetite for learning. His scorn for cant, for the merely vogueish, or for meretricious and slip-slop pretense of scholarship was part of this. John Grice was what he seemed to be; pretense and intrigue were entirely foreign to his nature. So he gained devoted friends among his colleagues and admiring students to whom he gave his best, and of whom he demanded the best in return.

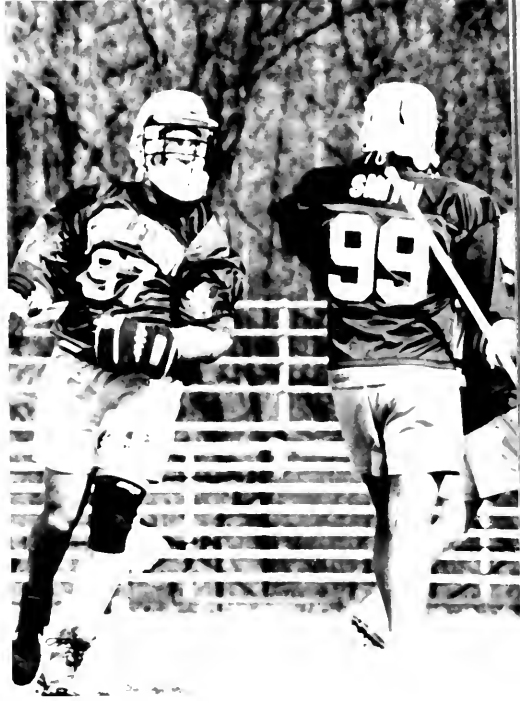

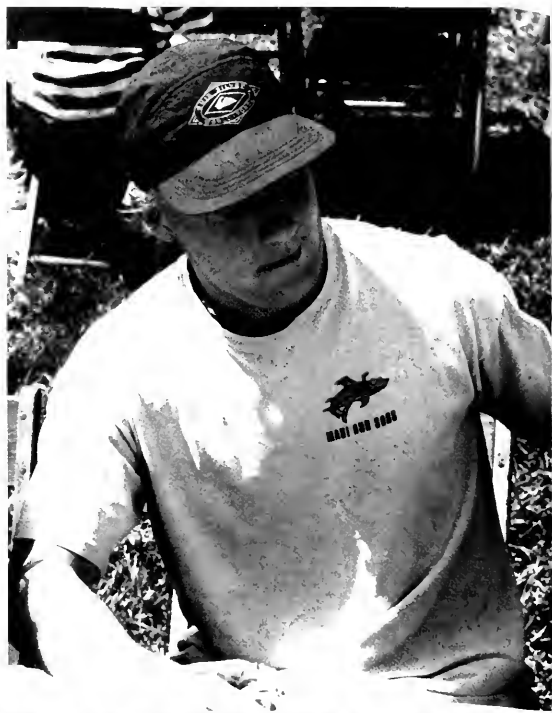
