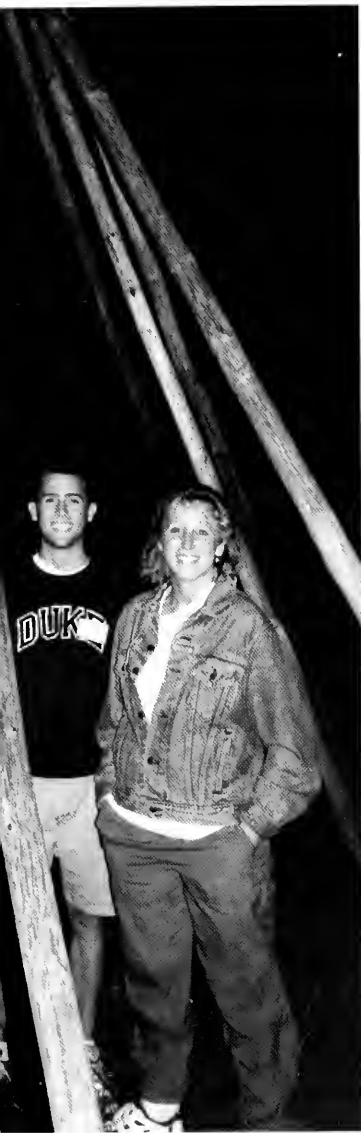

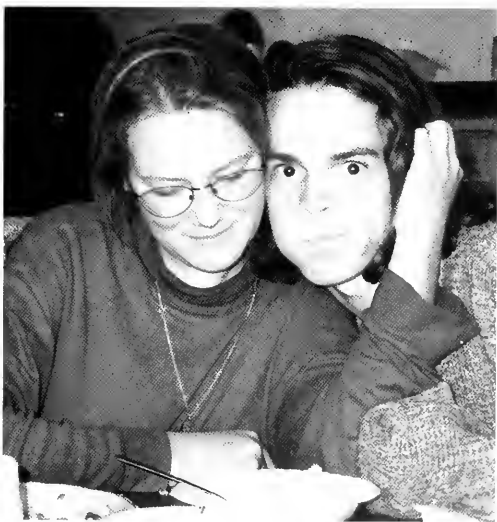

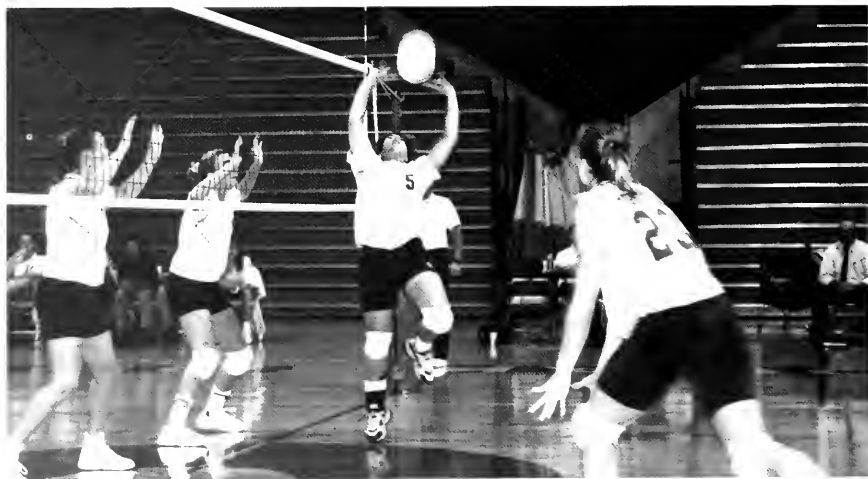

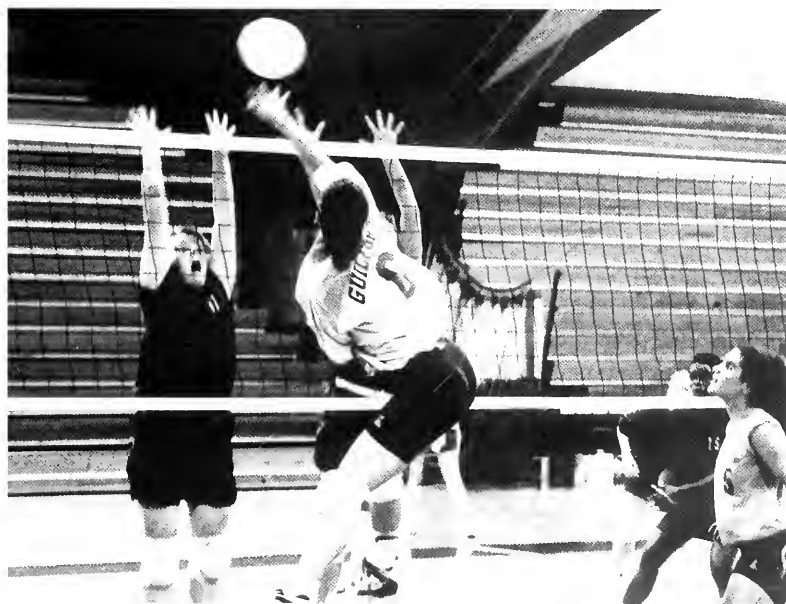

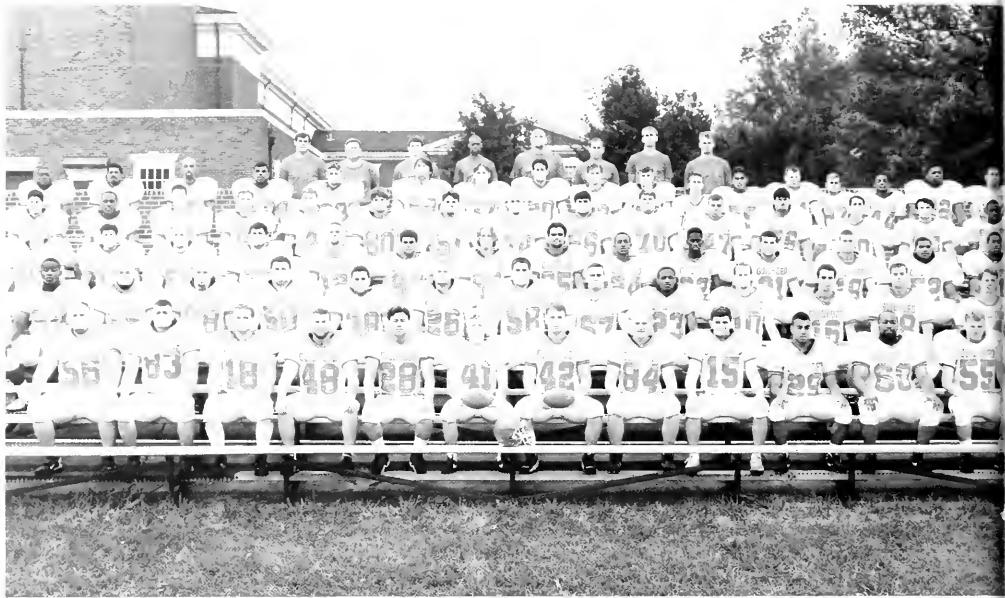

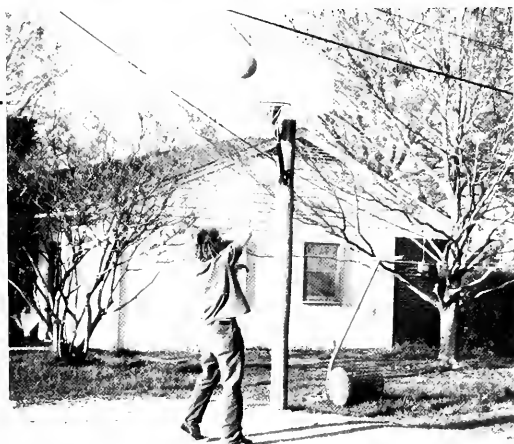

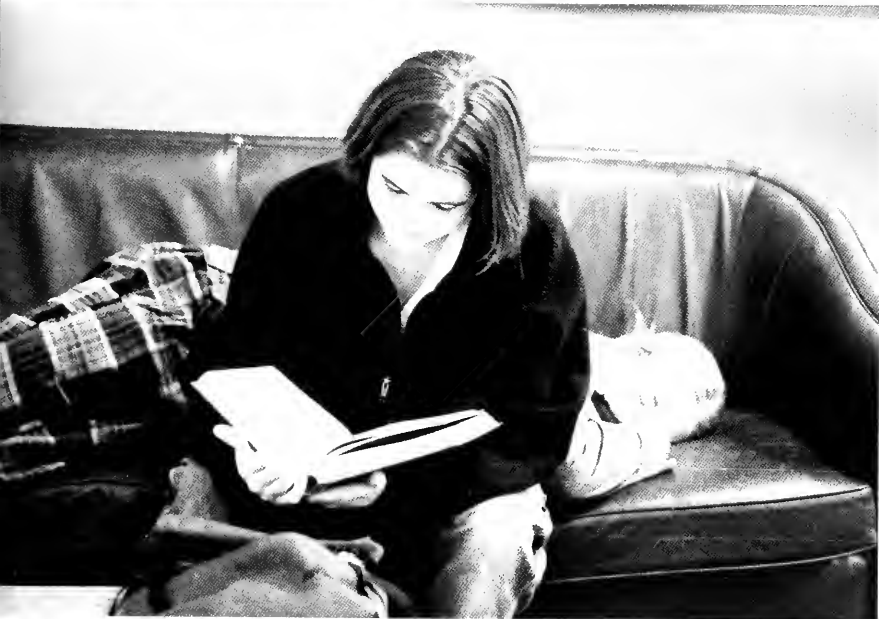

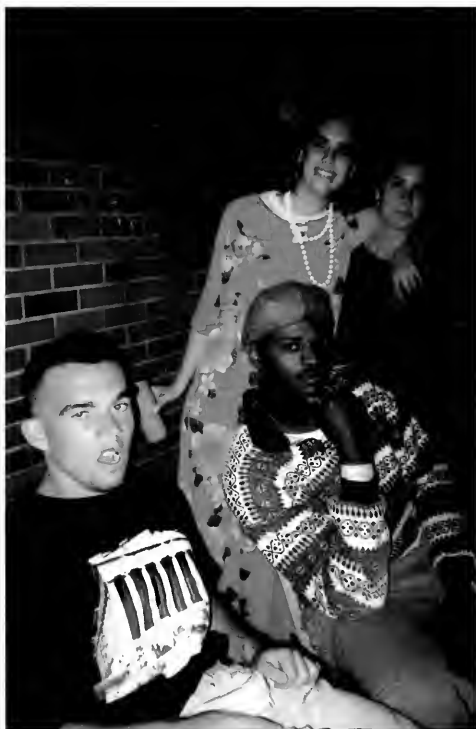

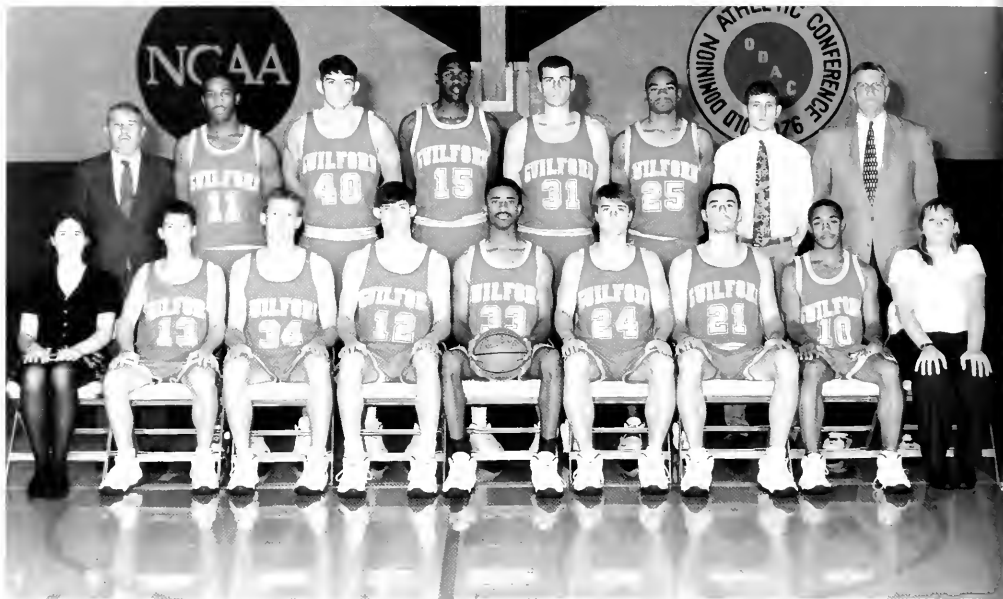

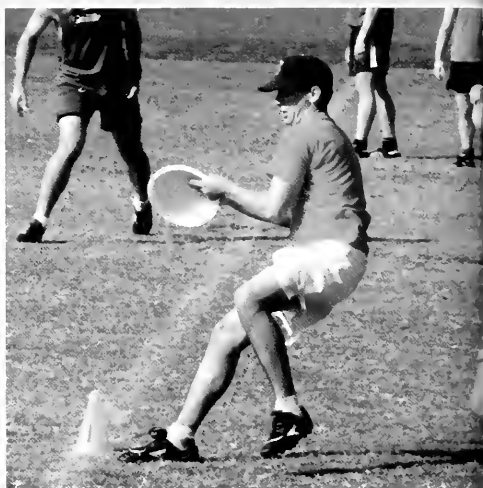
Baby Josh,

Dear Friends,

Next time you look up at those distant and untouchable lights in sky, understand that what creates them, the physics, the chemistry, the science of it functions before us on the smallest of scales. That is the commitment I speak of, and that I admire.

I learned that this love of science and astronomy is within me, an integral part of my perception of the world and of what beauty is. I fell in love again, or maybe I just had to learn that I had never stopped loving it. I discovered the pure joy in sharing my knowledge with others, no matter what level they were on. I learned to trust myself. I discovered that the beauty in the night sky is the closest I come to religion, and that when all else is crashing around me, it becomes my strength.
