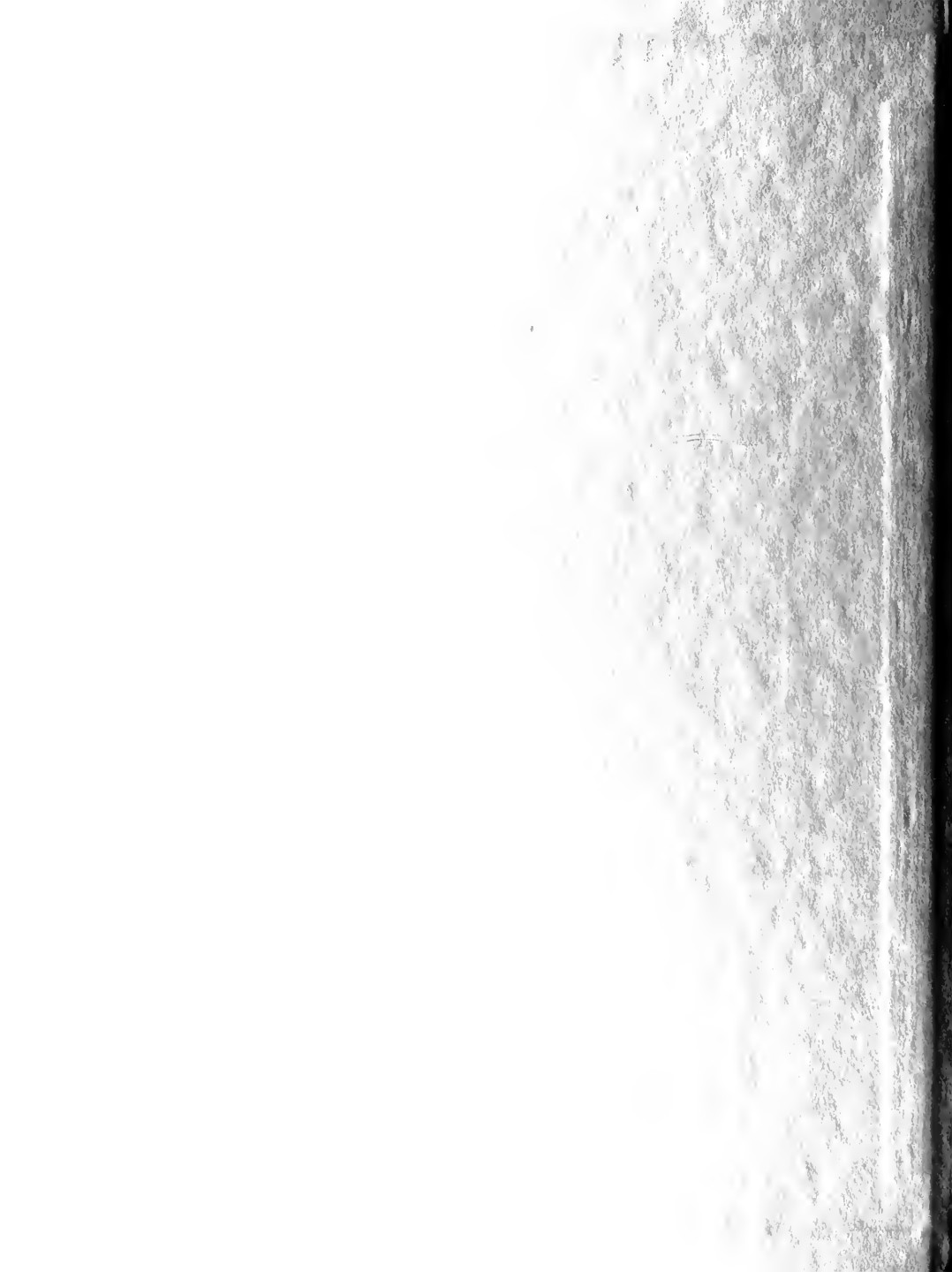
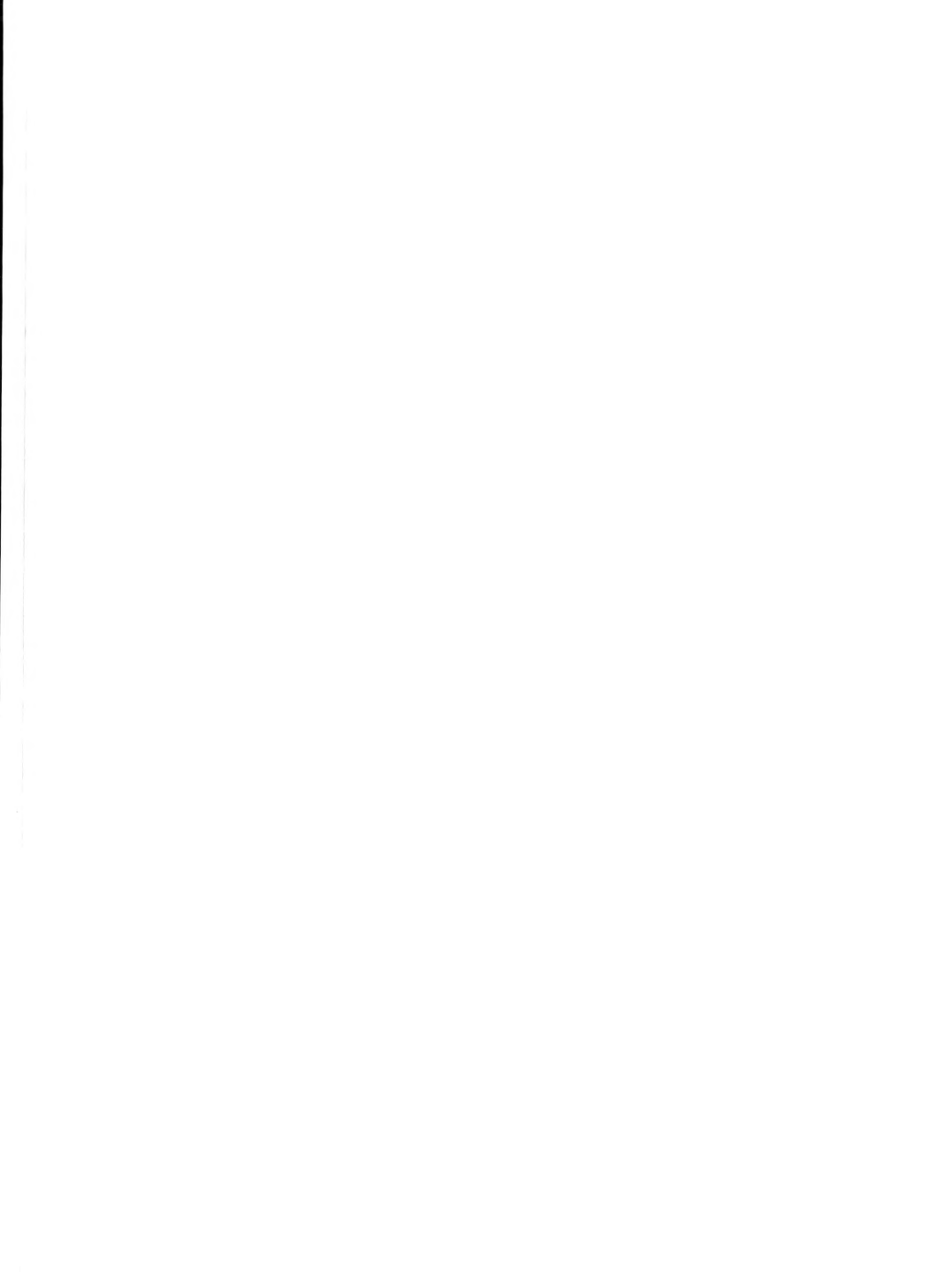

The 1998-1999 school year marked a time of change and growth.

The start of the school year surprised many, with the resignation of the elected Senate president over the summer of 1998. However, Senate went full steam ahead in the fall despite obstacles.

In the fall of 1998, Guilford's alcohol policy was revised. It prohibited the possession of open containers outside of student's residences on campus.

A major issue for 1999 was the possible outsourcing of the campus bookstore. Students expressed their opposition in Senate meetings, petitions, and through a silent protest. The decision is still undetermined.

Housing got tighter this year with the demolition of the Dana Houses, allowing more students to live off campus.

Some departments have been downsized while others have been increased, with the hiring of new professors in the English, Philosophy, Sociology/Anthropology, and History departments.

The very yearbook you are reading started off the year with a staff of two. Slowly but surely, the book came together with the help of a few dedicated students and many late night hours in the Pub Suite.

The 1999 Quaker hoped to frame all the memories, changes, and events of the past nine months.

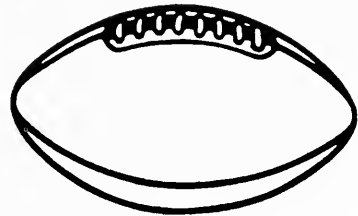

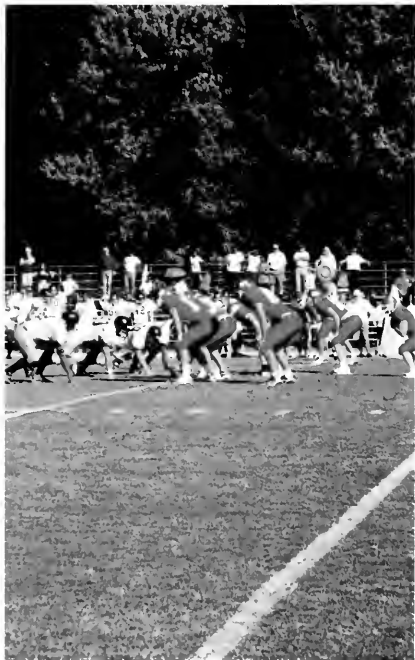

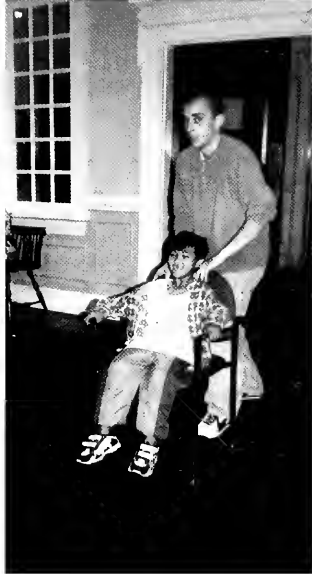

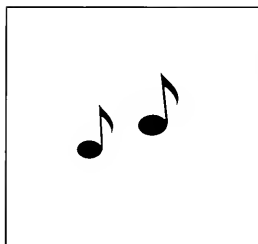

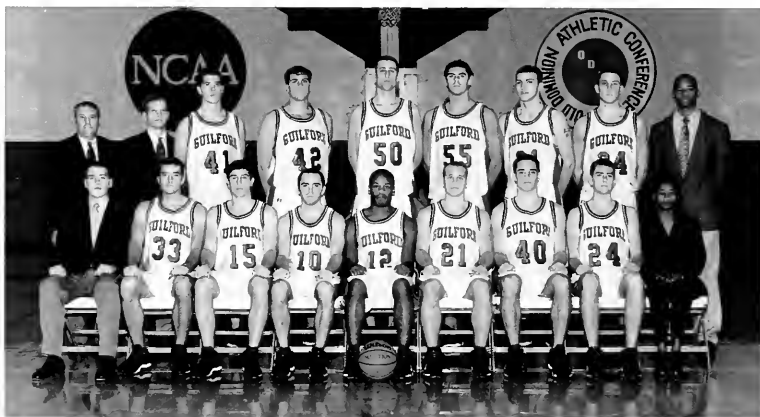
