





Charles C. Hendricks: The Heart of Guilford College

We all admire those people who dedicate their lives to something greater than themselves. People have called such individuals heroes, saints, and loved ones. They are honored for their dedication, revered for their selflessness, and marveled for their passion. Such people are rare as is their passion. Selflessness, dedication and passion were not rare in the life of Charlie Hendricks.

Many of us here at Guilford recognize the name Hendricks, but not everyone knows much about the man behind the name. This year Charlie C. Hendricks, the man whom many say was the heart of Guilford College, was sadly lost. In the last couple of years, not many people were able to see him due to his declining health. I had the pleasure to meet him once, he was a wonderful man who I would have loved to talk with more. The best way to understand Charles Clifford Hendricks, or Charlie as he was better known, is to hear a little about his life and how others saw him.

Charlie was born in 1918 and grew up in Archdale, North Carolina in a Quaker community. His family lived on and worked the fields of a farm, however five out of the eight children in his family went off to college, including Charlie who attended Guilford College. Charlie and his brother Richard came here together in the fall of 1936. He remained in school until 1940 when he went back home to help on the farm and work with the Civilian Public Service. In 1949, Charlie was finally able to come back and complete his degree.

After officially becoming an alumnus, he stayed, and worked in various places and departments all over campus. From the manager of the soda shop to the college's first Director of Admissions, Charlie always enjoyed being around the students. He was so friendly and trusting of the students that he would lend out his car (filled with gas) and even money. He was the person on campus that everyone knew they could trust or ask for help.



For over sixty years, Charlie Hendricks had touched everyone in every department at Guilford. He was not just a student or a staff member, but a person that through his passion, selflessness, and dedication represented everything that Guilford College was and still is. His memory will live on in our hearts as the man who was the persona of Guilford College. Charlie will surely be missed.



"I am the fifth of five presidents of Guilford College for whom Charlie Hendricks has worked. There have been eight in total so that is quite an accomplishment. His presence and contributions over many years were among the earliest things I learned upon arriving on campus. The expression been there, done that applies to Charlie more then anyone else I've ever known in higher education. In fact, when Don and Britta McNemar hosted me for breakfast upon my appointment, the only other person at the table was Charlie—a true right of passage for new presidents."

"I met Charlie soon after arriving at Guilford in 1975. I shared a thanksgiving dinner with him and his neighbor, Ed Burrows, my sophmore year. I nearly always found an excuse to drop by Charlie's house around dinnertime every night. A couple of years later he gave me a T-shirt for Christmas that had the words 'Hey Charlie' on the front and 'What's for dinner?' on the back."

"When I first arrived on the Guilford campus in September of 1949, one of the first people I met was Charlie Hendricks. You knew right away that he was the manager of the soda shop, which was the social meeting place. Charlie warmly welcomed new students to campus. Since it was necessary that I worked while in college to help defray expenses, Charlie provided me with a job working in the dinning room. I think we were paid 40 cents an hour. Charlie was always willing to help 'his boys.' He would loan them money, his car (filled with gas), anything. He was the only person on campus that everyone knew would befriend anyone."

"I remember the first time I saw Charlie. I was working the phones of a telethon trying to drum up some interest in the choir tour later that spring. There was Charlie talking up a storm, he just seemed to know everyone. He spoke so loud and everyone he called was his best friend. Then he would begin laughing at some inside joke from fourty years ago, I imagine. How odd, this old man sitting in a room full of college kids, what a curiosity, a relic from a bygone era. As I got to know Charlie better and better over the years, I often thought back on that first meeting and had to laugh to myself. Yes, Charlie is a precious antique, but he is never out of place at Guilford. He was right at home there in the telethon, because Charlie has always been active in every aspect of the school. During the choir trip, Charlie and I got acquainted...I told Charlie I would not be able to return to Guilford because my father had lost his job, and Guilford was to expensive. That was when 'Mr. Guilford College' rolled into action. He asked me a simple question, 'if you could afford Guilford, would you stay?' 'Of course,' I replied. That was all

Ed Lowe, the music director, told me that I qualified for a Choir Scholarship and would be receiving additional funds the following year. Charlie then asked if I would consider living with him at his house just off of campus. I said I would, but there was a new dean of student life that was strict with the rules. One of the toughest mandates that particular year was that off-campus housing was reserved strictly for upperclassmen and that freshman and sophomores were not eligible. I put my request in to move off-campus and was denied immediately. I let Charlie know, as he seemed to know a few people in high places. At the time I was rather naive and didn't fully understand Charlie's influence and position as 'Mr. Guilford College.'

Early into the summer I received a telephone call form a very angry administrator. He reluctantly allowed me to move off campus to live with Charlie. He said he didn't know how I did it, but even the President's wife, Beverly Rogers, called to request I be allowed to live with Charlie. He ended the call with, 'I'll allow this one, but I'll be watching you.' I am not sure where he is today, but I know Charlie is still at Guilford. I'll wager he gets his way too. If were not for Charlie, I would not have been able to remain at Guilford."





Just days before new students arrived for the Fall Semester, the Guilford College Ook toppled to its side. The enormous corpse was hard to miss, spread out as it was next to New Gorden.

Although no one actually witnessed its fall, groundskeeper Barbara Hill was the last to see it in an upright position. Shortly after mowing under The Oak at 7:45 a.m. on August 17th, she glanced back to see that it had fallen, crushing a picnic table under its weight.


The memorial service held a week later was one of Guilford's most publicized events of the year. The Oak was remember for its prominence and impressive size, and honored for its service as the college logo and symbol since the early 1980's when President Bill Rogers sketched it in its full glory.
