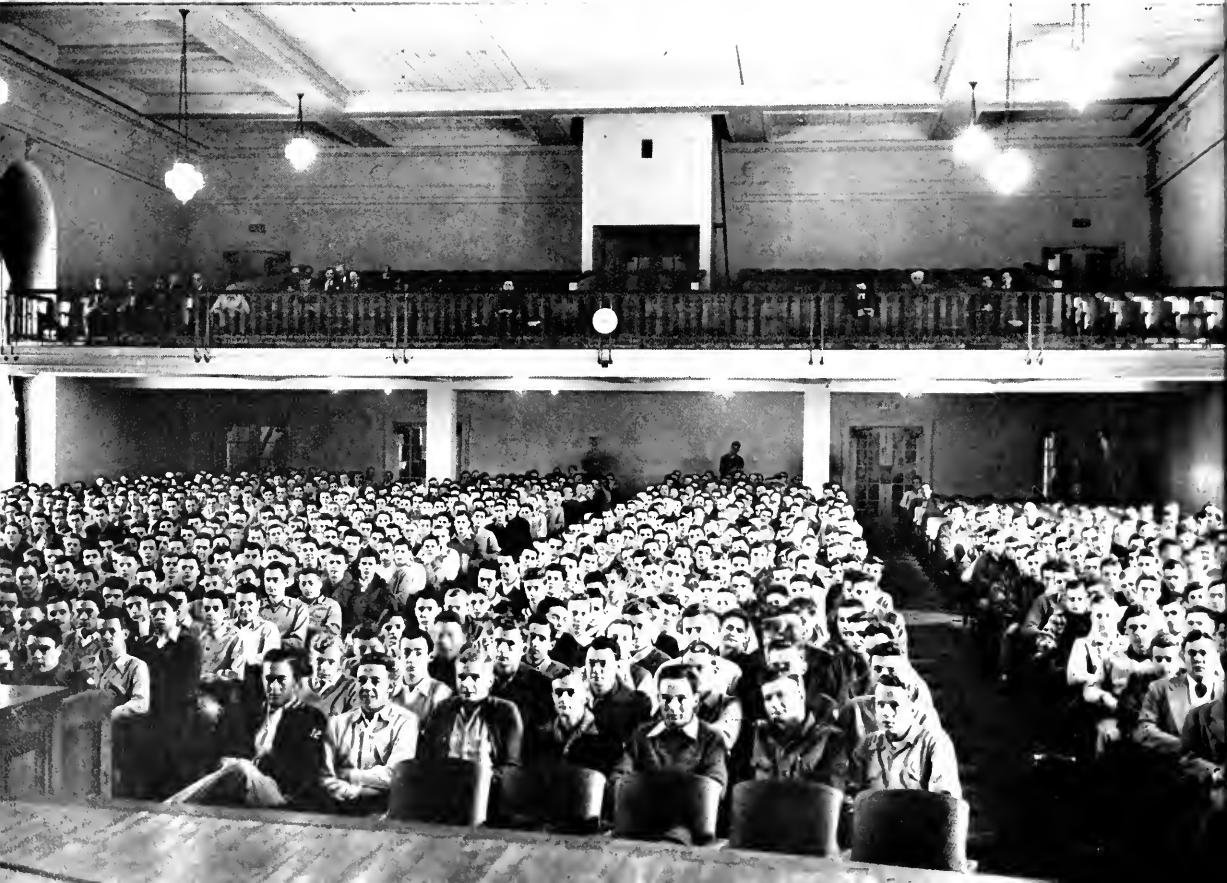

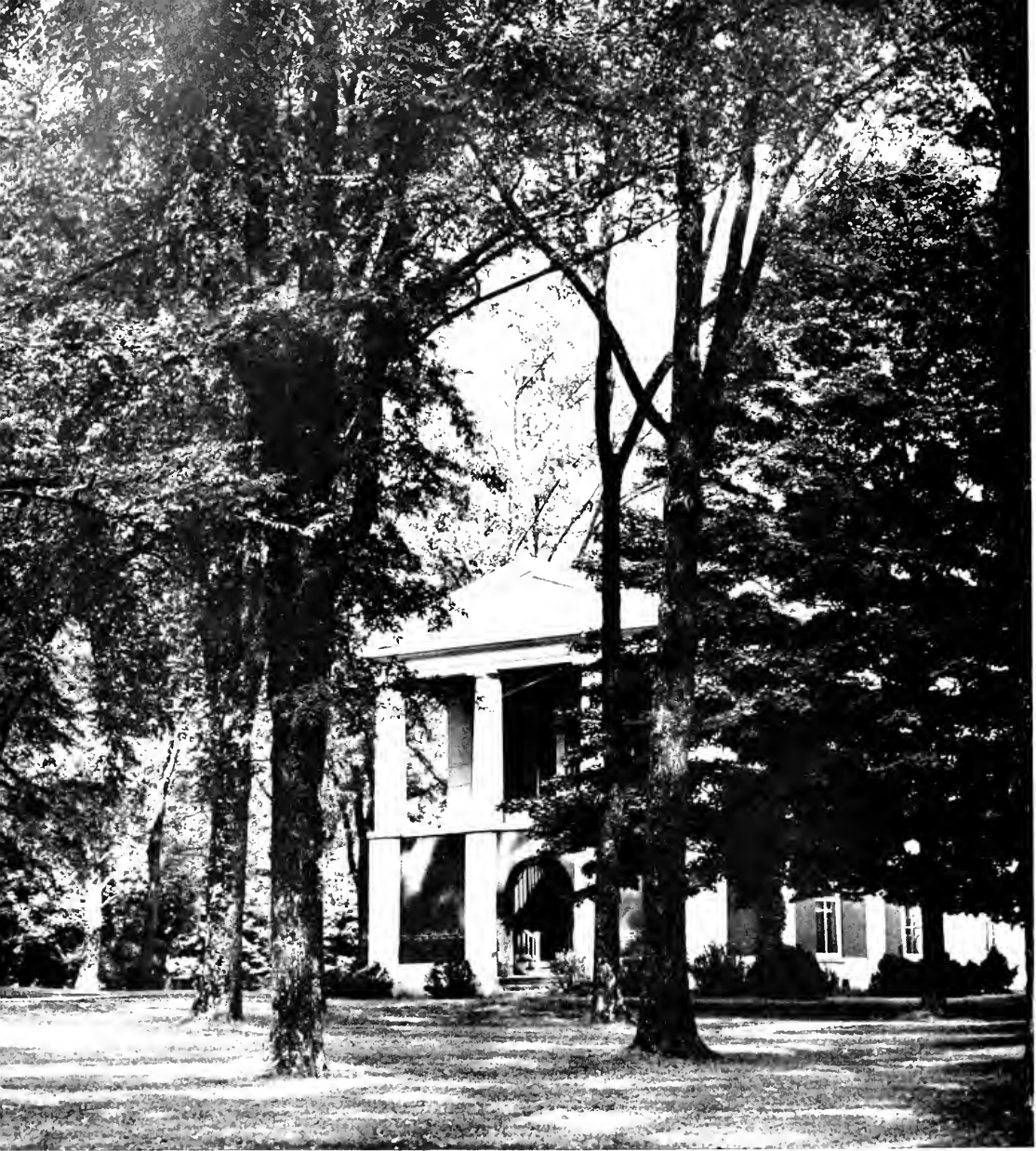
To the memory of Professor Fleagle, whose every act and word seemed to symbolize what is comprehended in the term friendship, the staff affectionately dedicates this book.

In postal competition the team has won three out of seven. The Hearst Trophy results have not been released.

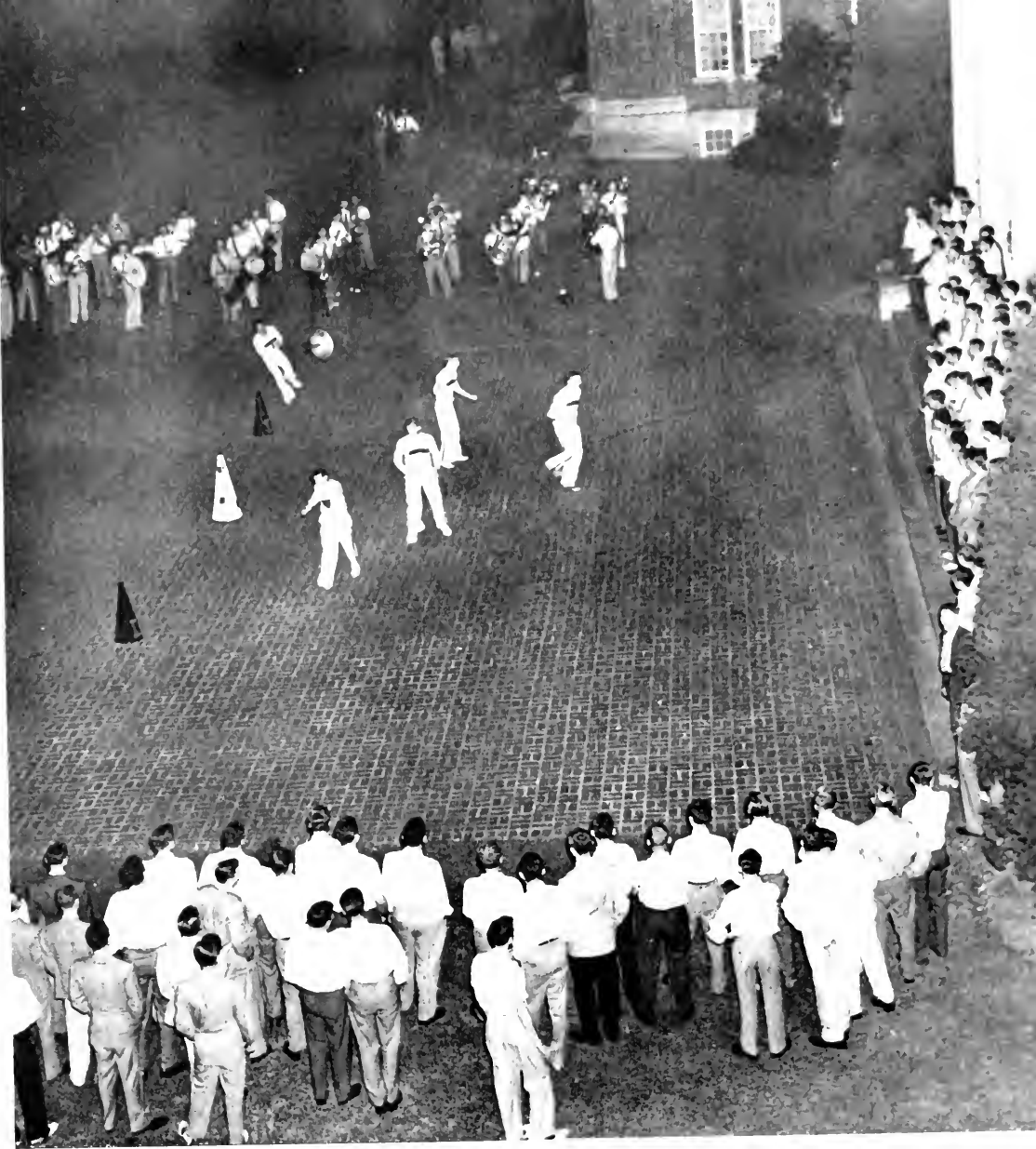

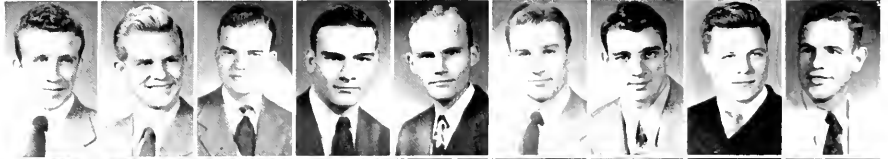

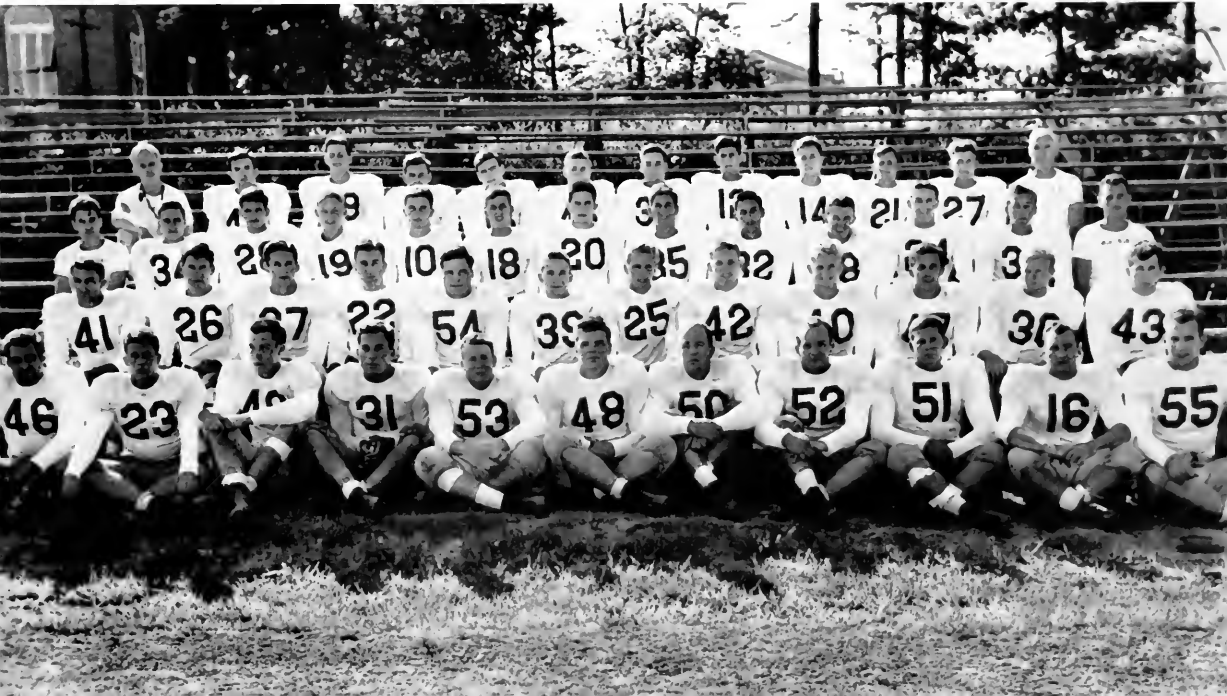
THE COACHING STAFF

With the victory over Furman University Thanksgiving Day, the Davidson Wildcats drew the curtain on the most successful season in football since 1933. In addition to a great record of six wins, three losses, and one tie, the Cats also drew national recognition as one of the leading defensive teams in the country. Bettering last year's record of sixth in the nation defensively, Davidson College was ranked fourth in total defense, allowing only 148.7 yards per game, was also fourth in pass defense, and was thirteenth in rushing defense.

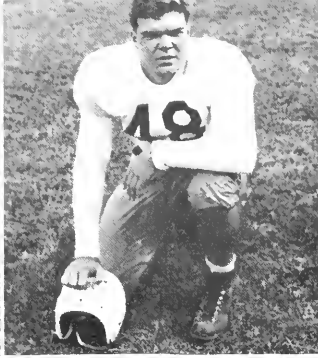

DAVIDSON 19—ELON 0

A hard fighting pack of Wildcats threw all of its scoring power into the second quarter, and downed the Elon Christians 19-0 in the first game of the season for both schools. At Richardson Field, a good crowd saw Davidson amass sixty yards on six plays, seventy three yards on five plays and thirty seven yards on eight plays to overpower a game but weaker Elon eleven.

The first score came early in the second quarter as the ball was moved from the Davidson 40 to the Elon 31 on successive gains by Erwin, Sifford, Anderton and Pahl. Bert Anderton then passed to Mike Williams for 24 yards, and scored from the eight yard line on the next play. The third and final score came late in the first half on a pass from Carl Sheppard to Rhea Adams.

The Wildcats stopped the only serious threat of the night by the Christians in the third quarter. Elon had first and ten on Davidson's two, but were unable to push across for the score. The Cats gave up only 3 yards to Elon for their total offensive attempts.

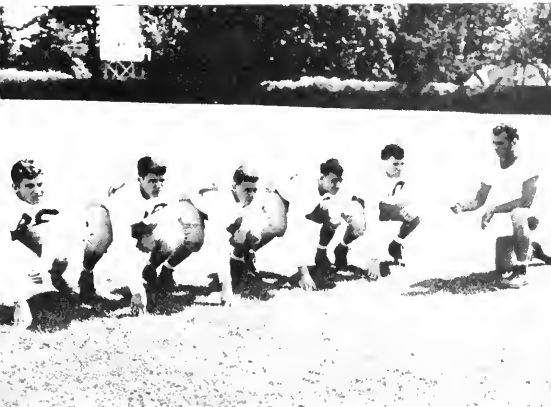

DAVIDSON 0

WILLIAM and MARY 21

After outplaying the powerful William and Mary Indians for the entire first half, the underdog Davidson Wildcats gave up three touchdowns in the final half in losing 21-0.

Outscored, but never outfought, the inspired Wildcats threw a real scare into the Indians late in the first period. A pass from Rice to Buck Williams put Davidson on the Indians' 23-yard line and two plays later, Mapes, on an end around, passed to Cheek in the end zone. The catch was ruled out-of-bounds by the officials ("the camera showed it was good") and William and Mary took over on downs after the next play had netted only three yards. The second scoring chance failed when Cloud of William and Mary intercepted Buck Williams' pass in the end zone and William and Mary took over on their twenty.

Buddy Chandler and Bill Boyd were two of the outstanding defensive guards who kept Jack Cloud bottled up most of the afternoon. To Sifford and Williams went the offensive honors.

DAVIDSON 0 — N. C. STATE 14

For the second straight weekend the Wildcats of Davidson met defeat at the hands of one of the stronger Southern Conference teams, but only after N. C. State had capitalized on two costly mistakes by the Wildcats, could they claim the victory. The first came in the second quarter, when Anderton, attempting to kick from his own end zone, fumbled a wet ball, which was recovered by Joyce for the touchdown. State's second break came on a fumble of an attempted pass, which put them well into Davidson's territory and made the 14 score possible.

The Wildcats completed six out of nine passes, while allowing State only one for nine. Several times during the night affair, the Cats were able to penetrate deep into the Wolfpack's territory, but failed to have the final scoring punch. Each time they were pushed far back by the terrific punts of "Footsie" Palmer, who averaged 53 yards per kick for the night.

DAVIDSON 12 — WOFFORD 7

A favored Davidson eleven had to come from behind in the final period to defeat a scrappy Wofford team in Charlotte's Memorial Stadium. Trailing 7-0 at the half, the Cats, sparked by Jake Wade, roared back in the third quarter and drove the four-yard line on successive gains, where Mack Erwin plunged over for the score.

The second score for the Wildcats came midway in the fourth quarter on a pass from Anderton to Cheek. Neither try for the PAT was good and the final score read Davidson 12-Wofford 7.

Wofford's lone tally was made when Cheatham took Sifford's kick on his own thirty, and raced seventy yards down the sidelines for the touchdown. Despite this, Davidson was able to hold the Terriers to a net rushing of 18 yards while we collected a total of 168 yards. Wofford was credited with the completion of only one pass out of eleven attempts, as the Cats hit on 6 out of 14.

DAVIDSON 49—HAMPDEN-SYDNEY 0

The Davidson Wildcats, exhibiting powerful running and passing attacks, spearheaded by half backs Auburn Lambeth and Jim Sifford, overwhelmed an underdog Hampden-Sydney 49-0 in the homecoming classic at Death Valley, Va.

Lambeth passed for three touchdowns and completed two more for a perfect afternoon of five for five. He scored on a twelve yard reverse to figure in the fourth of Davidson's eight touchdowns.

The longest run of the day was unreeled by Mike Williams who intercepted a Tiger pass on his own eight-yard line and raced 92 yards for the score. Sifford scored twice from 31 and 12 yards out respectively. Other touchdowns were made by Blanks, Roberts, Mack Erwin, Turner and Wade. Mapes converted for the lone extra point, following the fifth touchdown.

DAVIDSON 0—WASHINGTON & LEE 32

The Wildcats, riding a three-two won-lost record, for the third time failed to break into the Southern Conference winners column going down in defeat to the Generals of Washington and Lee 32-0.

Scoring after only five minutes of the first quarter had elapsed, Washington and Lee held on to their 7-0 lead throughout the first half. The Wildcats, weakened by the loss of full back Carl Pahl and wing back Doug Rice earlier in the week, were unable to make a contest of it, and Washington and Lee rolled on for one TD in the third period and three in the final quarter.

Davidson, through the brilliant line play of Buddy Chandler and the continual line bucks by Mack Erwin, was able to rack up 13 first downs to 10 for the Generals, but were outclassed in the other departments.



The Davidson graduates, who were on the campus for homecoming despite bad weather, were renewed in the true meaning of the "fighting spirit" of the Wildcats, as the eleven came back twice to stave off defeat by a favored VMI team.

V. M. I. struck paydirt early on successive gains by Ragunus and Steward. Ragunus was good for 54 yards and Steward accounted for 24 more. The Wildcats weren't out of the ball game though and on the first play from scrimmage after the kickoff, Sifford pitched to Sheppard and the speedy tailback outdistanced the V. M. I. secondary for fifty five yards and a touchdown. Buck Williams added the point to tie the score. V. M. I.'s second drive was stopped just before the end of the half by a magnificent goal line stand.

The Keydets from Lexington, Va., scored on a long drive midway through the third quarter and the situation again looked bad for Davidson. But Cliff Turner, up from the '45 junior varsity, put the spark back into the Wildcats, and substantial gains by him and Mack Erwin, plus the passing of Bert Anderson, put Davidson in scoring position on the four, where Erwin went over for the score. Williams point made the score read 14-14 and the game ended in a tie.

DAVIDSON 13 — RICHMOND 7

As if to show that the tie with V. M. I. was not an accident, the Davidson Wildcats defeated a favored Richmond University eleven in Richmond on the following Saturday. The Cats received the kickoff and kept possession of the ball until Mapes took a pass from Anderton for the touchdown after a march of 87 yards.

The second Davidson scoring march went 83 yards in a pattern similar to the first effort. Buck Williams set it up with passes to Mapes and Sifford good for 10 and 28 yards respectively. Anderton completed the drive with a 6 yard pass to Cheek for the score. Buck Williams added the extra point to make the score 13-7 at the half.

Richmond came back in the second half and after being stopped on the two by a hard charging Davidson line, scored on a pass from Laluna to Long good for 26 yards. The remainder of the contest was hard fought with neither team able to reach the double stripes.

DAVIDSON 28—THE CITADEL 7

After two weeks of rest, the Davidson Wildcats again proved the experts wrong by literally clawing a favored Citadel eleven to shreds. From the first it was all Davidson, as the Wildcats unleashed a powerful running attack aided by vicious blocking that ruined the Bulldogs Homecoming Day.

Scoring from the two early in the game, Sifford started the fireworks that finally ended in a 28-7 rout. In the second quarter Anderton shook loose from the one after sparking a drive 48 yards.

In the final period Davidson went wild with Pahl and Erwin scoring after 45 and 31 yard marches. Buck Williams converted successfully four times for a perfect record. Citadel's lone tally came on a 77 yard runback of the second Davidson kickoff, the score coming one play later on a two yard buck by Sparks.

Davidson held the Bulldogs to one first down, minus one yard's rushing, and no passes complete, while collecting 19 first downs for themselves, and a total of 301 yards rushing and passing. Citadel's All-State guard Henderson was pushed everywhere but out of the stadium by a hard charging Wildeat line.

In the final game of the year, played Thanksgiving Day in Greenville, S. C., the Davidson Wildcats won their third in a row by downing an underdog Furman eleven 20-6.

Furman received the kickoff and held the ball for the whole of the first period with the exception of four plays by the Wildcats. Early in the second quarter Moates scored for Furman to climax two long marches. Davidson trailed 6-0. But the Wildcats came right back, and on the second play from scrimmage following the kickoff, Sifford took a 10 yard pass from Anderton and raced 53 yards for the tying touchdown. A few minutes later Anderton grabbed a Hurricane fumble out of the air and ran 45 yards for the second score that put the Cats ahead 13-6 as Williams converted. The third and final score for Davidson came in the closing minutes of the first half as Check took a pass from Sifford and scored on a play that covered 60 yards.

Neither team was able to strike pay dirt in the second half and the final score read 20-6. Thus Davidson finished the 1947 season with a won-lost record of six victories, three defeats, and one tie.

An offense minded Davidson basketball team took the floor against the Kannapolis Y. M. C. A. to start the 1948 season, trouncing them 80-31. Not once did the Wildcats slow the aggressive pace which they had set and at the close of the season had amassed a total of 1604 points, an average of 57 a game.

The return of five lettermen formed the nucleus from which Coach Norman Shepard molded a great team. These five, Buddy Cheek, Mike Williams, Jake Ashmore, Whit Cobb, and Bill Iverson, plus a talented aggregation from the '47 Wildkittens and the freshman class were able to put the Wildcats near the top in the "win" column. Bobby Maner took over one of the vacated spots on the first team and became one of the spark-plugs of the squad.

With the best season's record in years, 18 won and 8 lost, Davidson easily secured one of the invitations to play in the Southern Conference Tournament by finishing fourth in the conference. Seeded fourth in the tournament, the Wildcats met the University

Individual honors went to Buddy Cheek and Mike Williams, the co-captains of the team. Cheek was high scorer for the team with 360 points and second high scorer in the conference. He was named on both the All State and All Southern conference teams for his outstanding offensive and defensive play. Mike Williams was named on the second All State Team and was runner-up to Cheek in the 'Cats scoring with 297 points. Whit Cobb finished third with 296 points.

Despite the wonderful record made by the Wildeats this year, we are expecting even better things next year since the team will lose no one by the graduation route. A year of experience and playing together gives us great hopes for the fighting Wildeats of 1949.

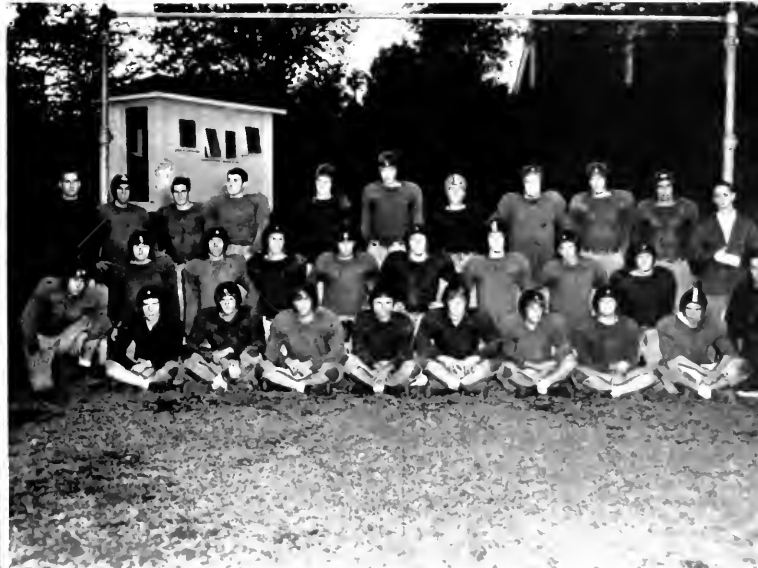

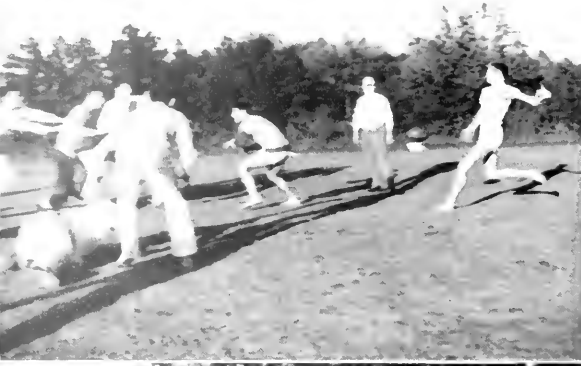

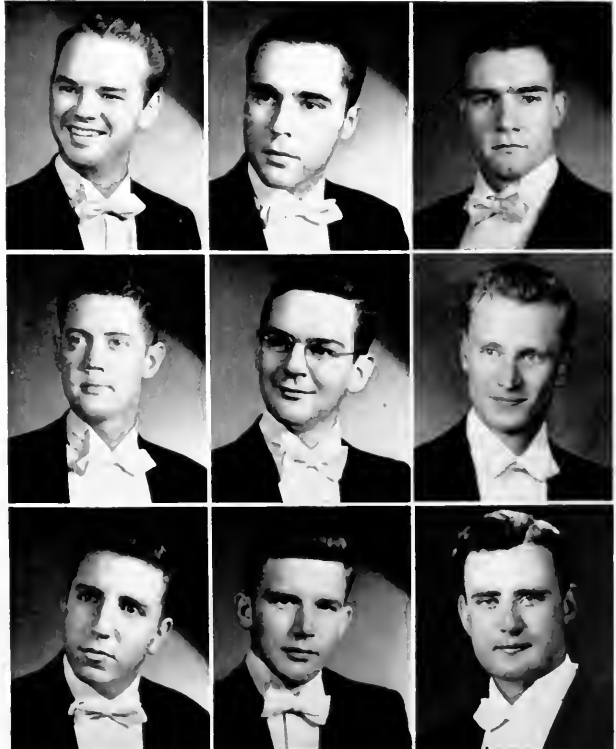

Pi Kappa Alpha, one of the older and larger college fraternities, is the perpetuation of the friendship of six students at the University of Virginia during the college year of 1867-1868. These six founders had fresh in their minds the memories of the Civil War. Their problems were in some measure similar to those of the entire South in its woe of reconstruction. Life at the University at that time was simple and devoid of many things now considered collegiate. Friendships were peculiarly warm and ideals were deeply cherished. As one of the founders has stated, "They little imagined the tree that would grow from their planting, but they planted well and deeply in the subsoil of friendship and idealism." After its founding on March 1, 1868, growth was rapid. The mother chapter took the designation Alpha, and chartered Beta in 1869 at Davidson College. From the South, Pi Kappa Alpha spread to the Southwest and Pacific coast. Shortly after the turn of the century, chapters began making their appearance in the East, so that today Pi Kappa Alpha has 80 active chapters distributed through almost every state, with a total membership of over 24,000.

From its birth, Pi Kappa Phi has grown steadily and consistently. It is most pronounced in the South but chapters have been established all over the United States.

Today Pi Kappa Phi is composed of forty six undergraduate chapters and twenty seven chartered alumni groups, with a membership in excess of seven thousand.

The chapter at Davidson was the first chapter to be established in North Carolina. It was formed in 1912 as Epsilon Chapter. Since its establishment Epsilon has seen over five hundred initiates pass under its colors.

Inspired by the rich and noble traditions and ideals of the Old South, a band of brave and hardy gray-clad veterans founded the Kappa Alpha Order at Washington College, Lexington, Virginia, during the war-torn days of 1865. General Robert E. Lee, then president of the institution that now bears his name, served as a living symbol of their chivalrous principles as they dedicated their lives to serving Dieu et les Dames. But fifteen years later, Sigma chapter was established on the Davidson campus, and is now one of the 69 strong active chapters which dot the South from coast to coast. Crimson and old gold mark the glory of the Knights of the Kappa Alpha Order, while the Red Rose and truly Southern Magnolia are the fraternity flowers, emblematic of Southern chivalry and deference to woman.

The Snowy White Owl on the Fiji crest spread his wings over the nation and Phi Gamma Delta now has 74 chapters in the United States and Canada. The Bachelors Club, founded in 1914 by eight Davidson men, brought the purple clematis to the "Hill" in 1923 when they became Delta Kappa Chapter of Phi Gamma Delta. Ever since the Wildeat's lair has reverberated to the favorite tunes of this singing cannibalian clan, "The Fiji Rag," "Smoke Dreams," and "Fiji Honeymoon." The White Star radiating from the Black Diamond has become the symbol of true brotherhood and close fellowship.

At the Kappa Sig House

It was in 1869 at the University of Virginia that five men, having opportunity to join one or more of the fraternities then existing at the university, but wishing to belong to the same fraternity, decided to found a new one and adopt the Greek letters Kappa Sigma as its name. Expansion during the early years was slow and uncertain, however, the early perseverance to establish chapters in the United States has led to a rapid and consistent growth of the Fraternity. It is perhaps significant, because of the strength of the fraternity and the care with which chapters have been placed, to note that but few of its chapters are now inactive. There are at present 110 active chapters, which are located in approximately half of the universities and colleges located in the United States and Canada which have chapters of national fraternities. Delta was founded at Davidson in 1890, more than half a century ago, and was among the first active chapters in the country.

Sigma Phi Epsilon was born on November 1, 1901, on the campus of Richmond College in Richmond, Virginia. There were twelve friends who joined together for the sole purpose of friendship and, with their farsightedness, founded a fraternity that has now taken its place among the great ones of the fraternity world. The twelve friends founded a group which they called the "Saturday Night Club," the program of which was "to recruit the best men of the college that they might be more closely bound together." They succeeded finally in the establishment of a new national Greek letter group. Thus the infant fraternity grew into the strong, powerful organization it is today, enumerating the birth of all its active chapters in every section of the country and of its alumni members in every part of the world. Its growth has been carefully planned and regulated so that today Sig Ep chapters are to be found on the campuses of nearly every important college and university of America. North Carolina Epsilon chapter of Sigma Phi Epsilon fraternity was founded here at Davidson in 1927, the outgrowth of the old Pyramid Club.

At the Sigma Chi House

Sigma Chi was founded June 28, 1855 at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, by seven undergraduate students who desired to found a new fraternity based more closely upon the Christian ideals. Sigma Chi has since grown into one of the largest national fraternities with 114 active chapters and over 37,000 members. The Delta Lambda chapter at Davidson received its charter in March of this year. This was the culmination of work instituted during the spring term of 1946 by a group of 15 men who, recognizing the need for another national fraternity on the Davidson campus, established the Delta Kappa local fraternity.



The Campus Club

One half of the Davidson student body is made up of independents. This year a number of these men formed a social organization. This was the consummation of a plan started last Spring by eleven planners, led by Ray Thabet and Carl Eborn, and followed a chapel talk by Ernie Stricklin. The two cardinal principles of this organization are Democracy and Frugality. Any student not belonging to a local chapter of a social fraternity is invited to join at fees within the financial range of all. The lounge of the Carolina Inn has been designated by the College as a "House." Founded October 13, 1947, this organization has adopted the name "The Campus Club."

With the familiar words of O' DAVIDSON we bring the 1948 edition of the QUIPS AND CRANKS to a close.

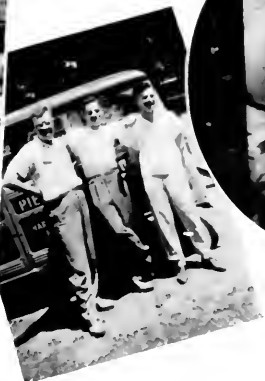

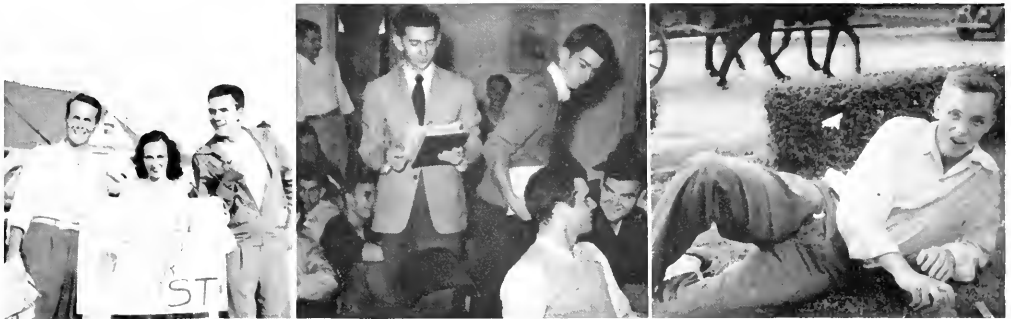

10. Don't be too anxious about getting just dues. Do your work, be patient, keep your disposition sweet, forget self, and you will be respected and rewarded.

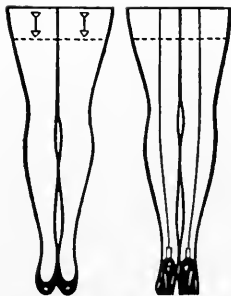
