Dedication Leland Park

Leland Park is just as much a staple in E.H. Little Library as the green carpet itself. However, after the close of the 2005-2006 academic year, Park will be retiring, and closing the books on his now forty years as the director of the library. A graduate of Davidson College in 1963, Park earned his master's and doctoral degrees in library sciences at Emory University and Florida State University, but his credentials cannot hold a candle to the incredible work he has done for and through the library, student body, and faculty. The library's collection is impeccable, and anything not immediately at your fingers is but a click or phone call away. Upon entering E.H. Little, the research desk proudly greets you with a kind face, eager to help you delve into your research.

This is no accident: with Park's work as a reference librarian, he recognizes the role of the library as a center for deepening research and making learning interactive and accessible. Park has led a first-rate staff, and they are respected for their merit: students regard them as miracle-workers, and professors regard them as infallible. Leland Park entered Davidson in 1959 as a freshman and will be leaving as only the third director of the library in the history of the college; he leaves us not only a legacy, but an incredibly huge pair of shoes to fill.

After graduating in 1963, Park went on to earn his master's and doctoral degrees before returning to Davidson to work. Since becoming director, he has greeted every incoming freshman class at the library during Orientation, helping to perpetuate and foster the unique relationship Davidson College shares with its beloved library.





Park counts his staff as his most important legacy, and regards them highly, noting that the library is an intergral part of the Davidson College experience, and that both the student body and the faculty highly respect and utilize the staff's expertise.
