For 38 years Dr. George G. Struble has been a member of the faculty of Lebanon Valley College, serving as head of the Department of English for 20 years and secretary of the faculty for 33 years. During that time he has been a dedicated teacher and fervent exponent of the ideals of a liberal arts education. Well read and informed, he has become Time Magazine's most effective representative on the campus. Nine generations of students have shivered in anticipation of and survived his "shotgun" tests. Last spring he was honored with an Alumni Association Citation.
