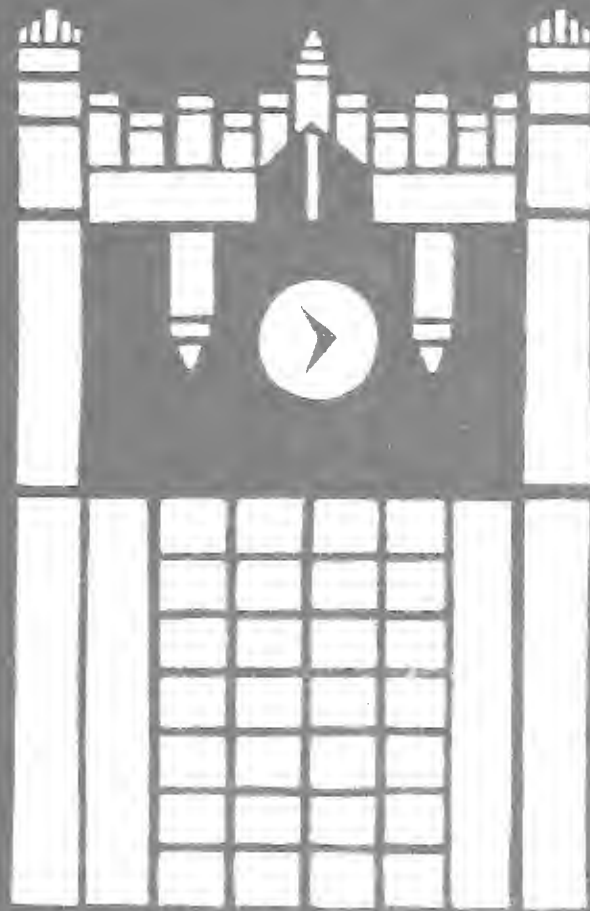

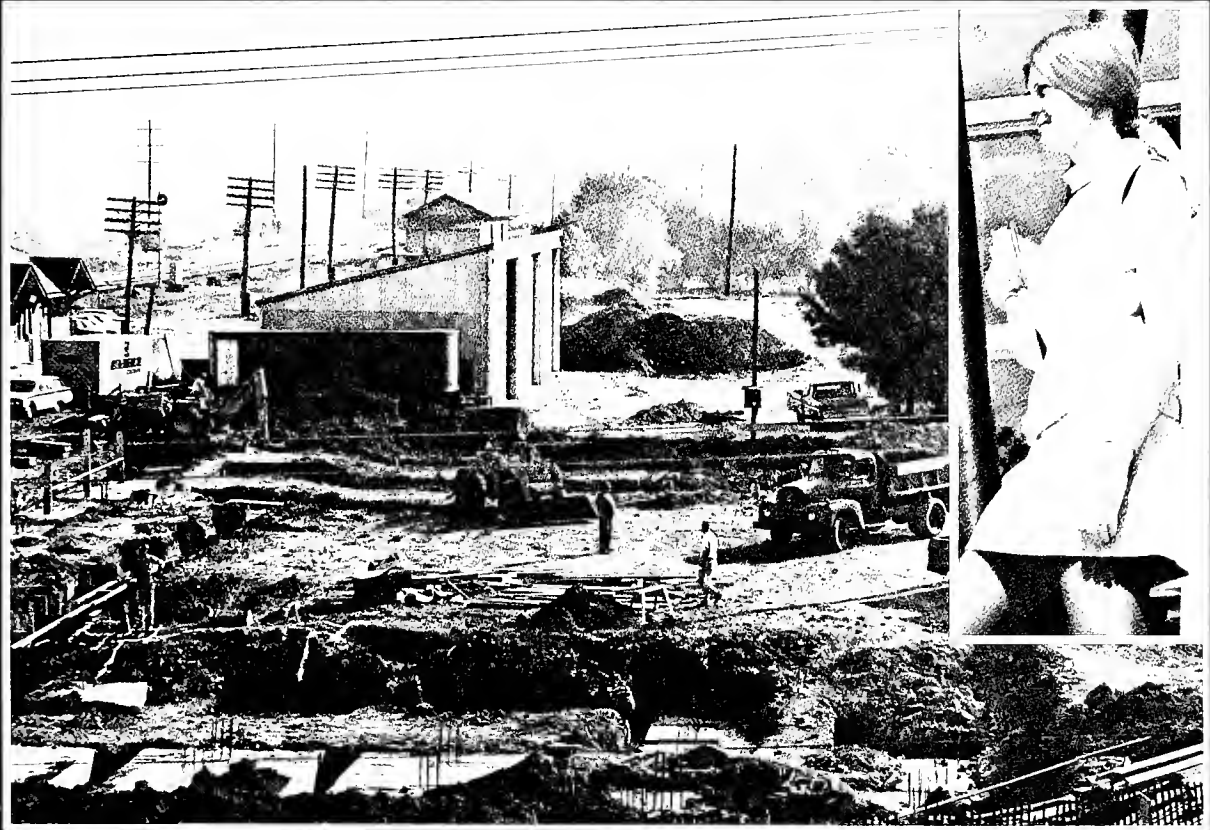

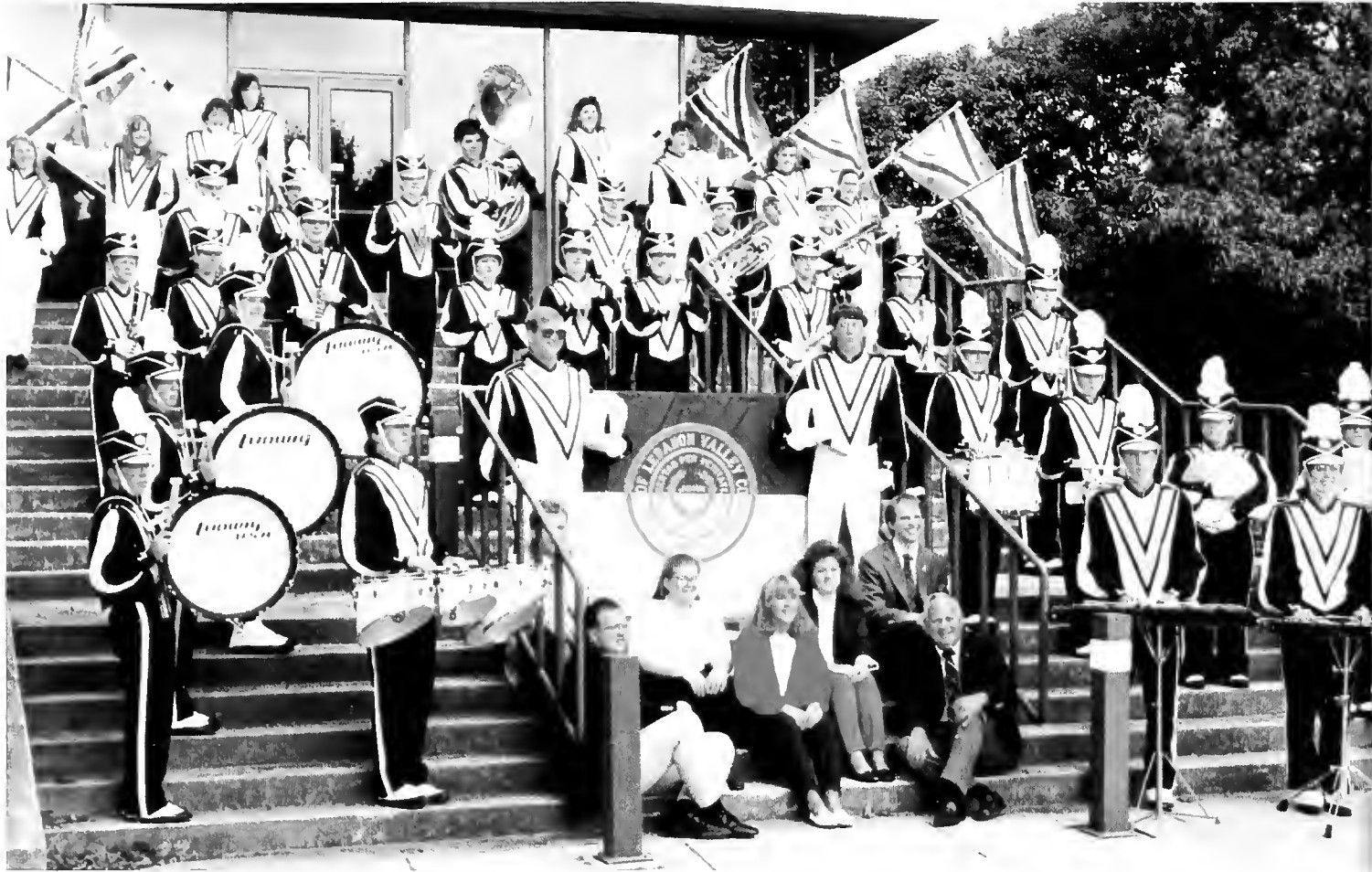

FOUNDER'S DAY BEGINS THE 125TH

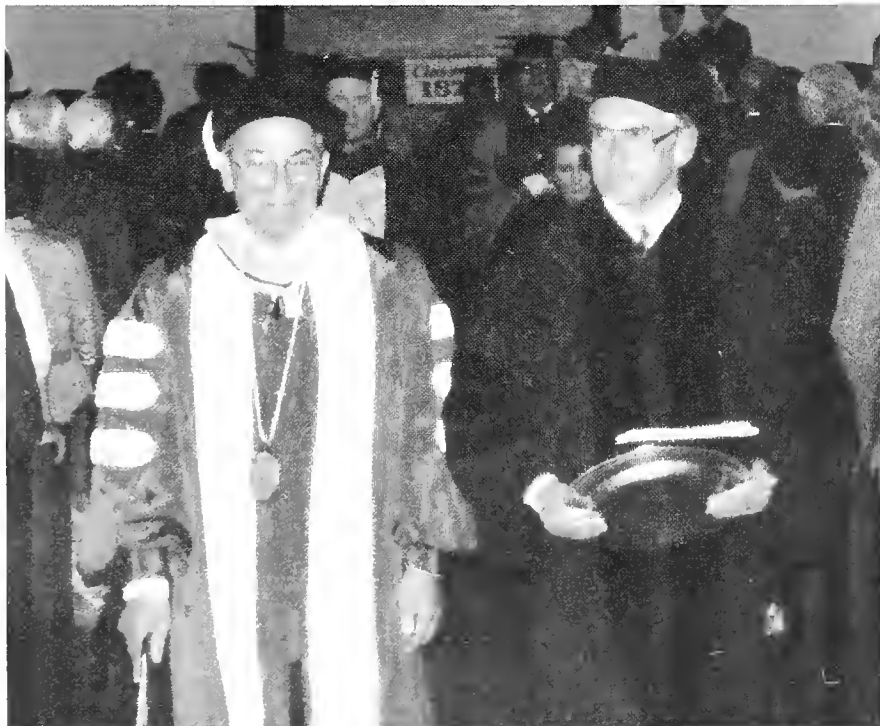
The twelfth annual Founder's Day celebration was held on February 19, 1991. This year's ceremony was especially festive because it marked the beginning of Lebanon Valley College's 125th Anniversary celebration. The program began in Miller Chapel with the Convocation. The ceremony included the unveiling of "The Lebanon Valley", a landscape painting of the LVC community. The oil painting is the work of Doug Osa, a Kansas City artist who was commissioned by the college to depict the campus in its rural setting.

This year's recipient's of the Founder's Day Award were Richard and Nancy Zimmerman. Mr. Zimmerman is Chairman and Chief Executive of Hershey Foods. Mrs. Zimmerman, an alumni of LVC, is President of the Board of Harrisburg Symphony Association. She is also the chairperson of the volunteers of Hershey Library and a member of the Hershey Museum Board.

The anniversary celebration continued later in the day when students, faculty, administration, and community members gathered in Mund College Center for a birthday party complete with a five foot high birthday cake.

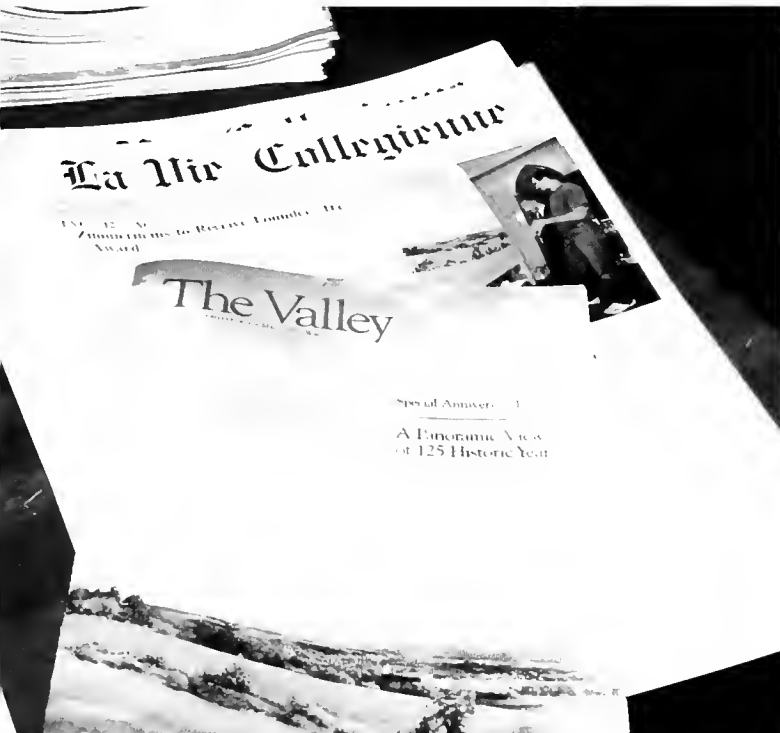

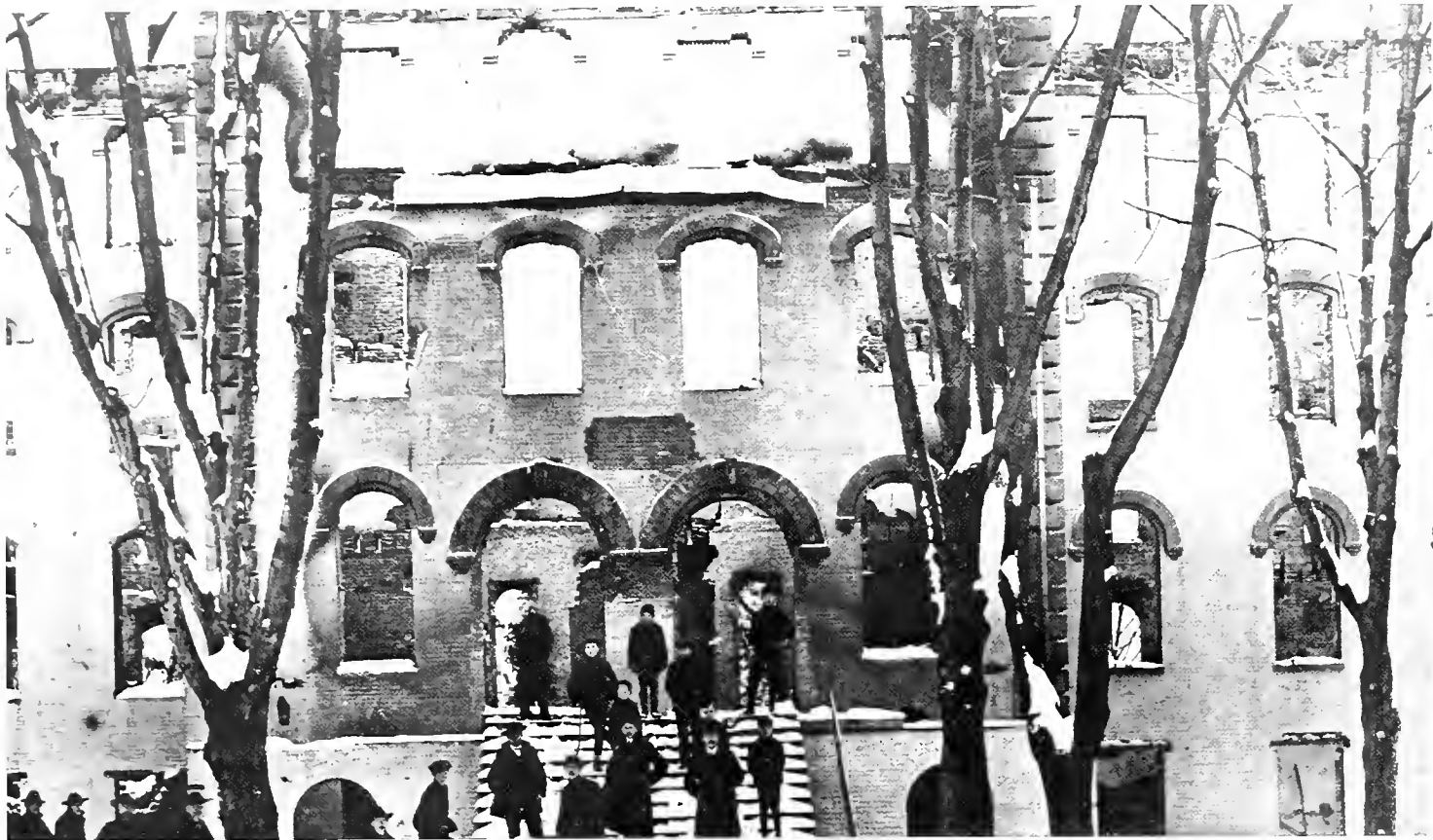

The original Administration Building was destroyed by fire on December 24, 1904.

- A** The Admissions Department was established in 1949 with Clark Carmean as its first director.
- B** The men's and women's Basketball teams were organized during the 1893-1894 school year.
- C** LVC was the first school east of the Allegheny Mounts to be co-educational from its inception.
- D** The Death League, a secret society that attempted to intimidate the freshmen, was officially disbanded by the Administration in 1951.
- E** The current English House was originally built in 1887 as the home of President Lorenz.
- F** The Football team was organized in 1897, and has been going strong ever since.
- G** The Graduation celebration in 1870 included the first three graduates of LVC.
- H** President Lucian Hammond, 1871-1876, added the Science Department to the college curriculum.
- I** Student initiative raised a portion of the money needed to build the Allen W. Mund College Center, which opened in 1970.
- J** Mr. John Synodinos currently serves as the college president and is responsible for many of the recent changes on campus.
- K** Kreider Hall, a men's residence hall, was torn down to make room for the Garber Science Center in the early 1980's.
- L** Lenny the Leopard is a stuffed leopard that is displayed in Faust Lounge and was shot by a member of the class of 1918.
- M** Mary Capp Green Residence Hall for Women was dedicated on May 18th, 1957 and is now one of LVC's co-educational residence halls.

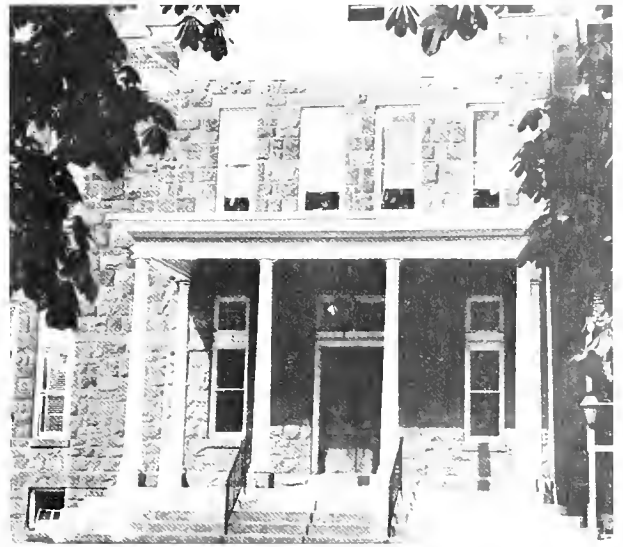

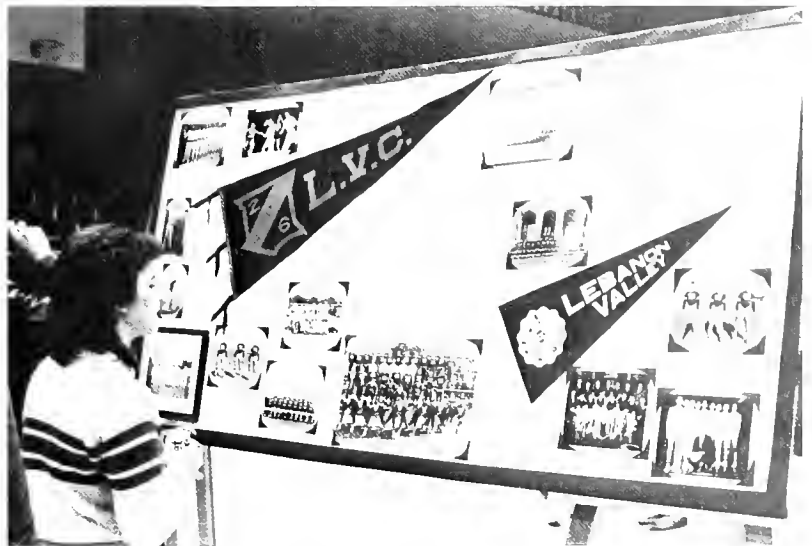

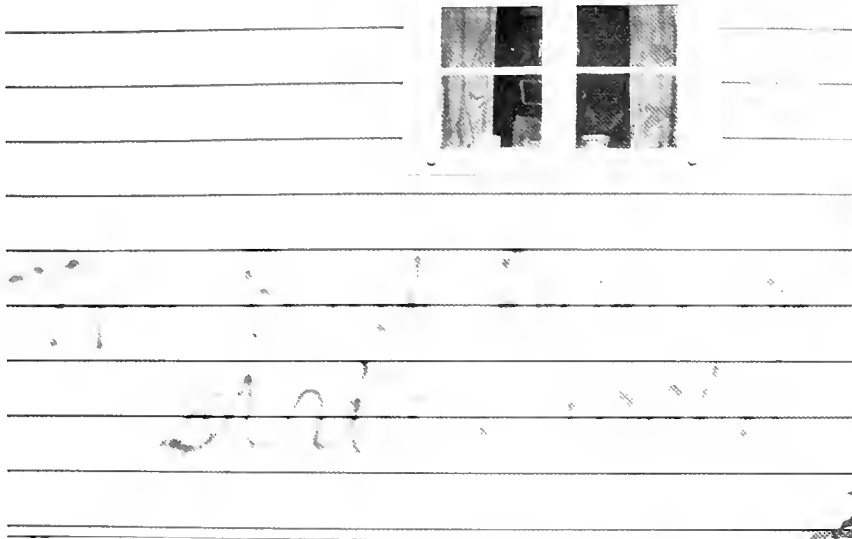

- O**Some obvious recent changes on the campus include the renovated Lynch Memorial Building and Laughlin Hall.
- P**Dr. Arthur Peterson served as the college president for three years starting in 1984.
- Q**Quiz Bowl was started in 1981 by Robert Clay, professor of Sociology who later served as Registrar.
- R**President Ulysses Roop initiated the construction of the current Administration and Carnegie buildings in the early 1900s.
- S**The Spring Arts Festival was first celebrated in 1970 and remains a major celebration of Spring every year at LVC.

Professor Writes Annville's Poetry



"We're celebrating Annville life along with celebrating the release of *Porches II*," said Dr. Philip Billings at the Marcia Pickwell Benefit Concert in Lutz Hall on Sunday, November 11.

In 1970, Dr. Billings began teaching English at Lebanon Valley College. Fourteen years later, the idea was sparked to write a collection of free-verse poems about the interesting lives of the older residents of Annville. In 1987 Billings decided to set the poems to music. During this past summer, it was suggested he hold his book release as the annual Marcia Maurine Pickwell benefit concert sponsored by Sigma Alpha Iota, Delta Alpha Chapter.

"The Annville residents I wrote about feel like movie stars today because everyone wants their autograph," said Billings.

During the concert, three poems were set to music and Dr. Billings also read several selections from his newest book. Sally M. Drum, a 1958 graduate of LVC, and Michael Kohler, a 1980 graduate of LVC, performed songs based on poems about "Hot Dog" Frank Aftosmes, Nellie Barnardo, and Raymond and Helen Clodoveo. Pianist accompaniment was provided by adjunct associate professor of music Nevelyn Knisley.

Billings said he found the event just as thrilling as the release of his first book.

"It's like a reunion. People from Annville meet their old friends again and get together with family. A lot of memories are rekindled."

For each book Billings said they used no scientific method to select people to write about. He interviewed a person (often husband and wife) while Dan Massad, a LVC adjunct instructor of art, sketched their portrait. After listening to the taped interview, he wrote a free-verse poem.

"It was just as difficult to write poems for the second books as for the first for every person is different," said Billings. He then showed the finished poem to the subject to check for accuracy.

"Everyone was really cooperative and happy to work with me on this project. I was pleased with the support response."

Instead of the pencil sketches of the first book, the people featured in *Porches II* are illustrated by pen and ink portraits. The second volume also features a special section of eleven short poems about children in Annville. Billings' second volume of *Porches* is dedicated to those people in *Porches I* who passed away.

Mrs. Vivalo is a writer of children's literature and was in the process of trying to transfer her published works into paperback books. While on sabbatical some unfortunate events occurred. Following these tragedies, Mrs. Vivalo felt that she could not give adequate time and energy to her position as a full-time professor, thus, she submitted her resignation.

Mrs. Vivalo has been a great asset to the English and Honors departments at Lebanon Valley College. She enhanced her classes by bringing her creative and professional experiences to them. She was admired and respected by students and faculty alike and her presence on campus will be missed. We wish her luck and happiness in all of her future endeavors.

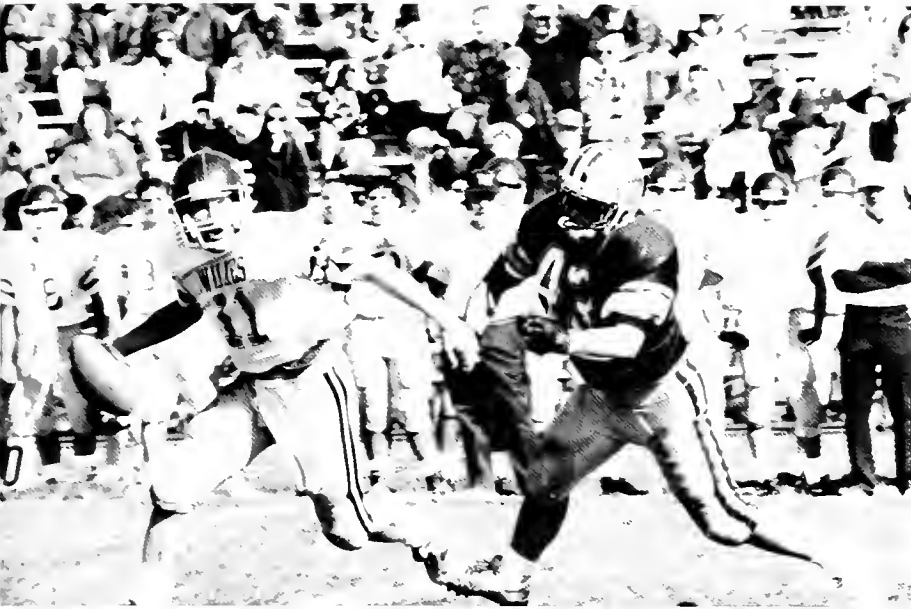

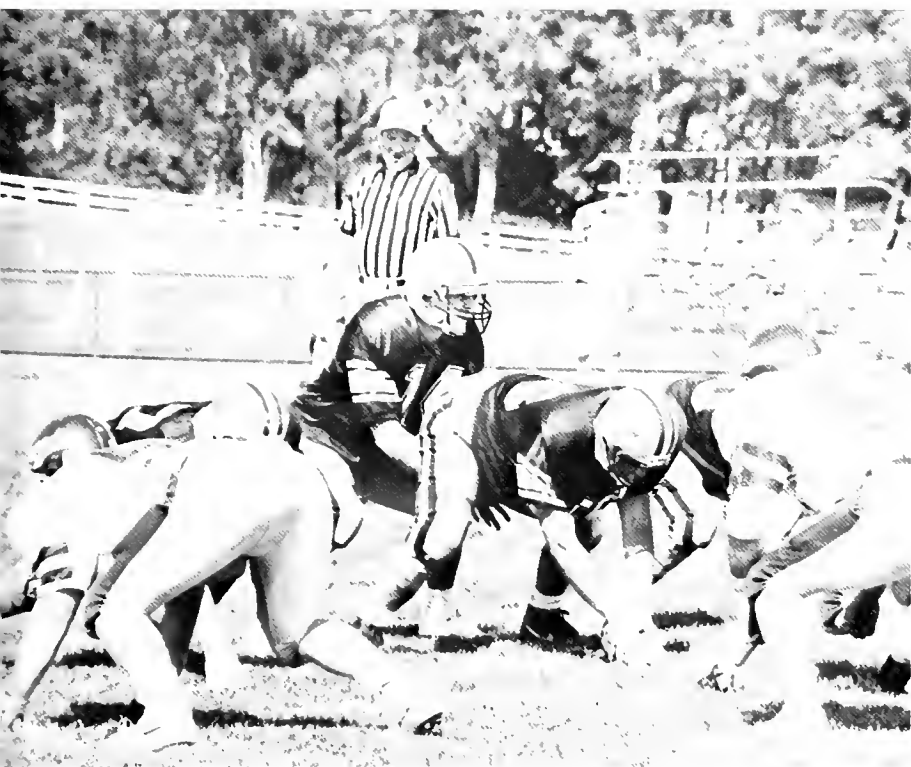


Senior Chad McNaughton sacks Wilkes' quarterback.

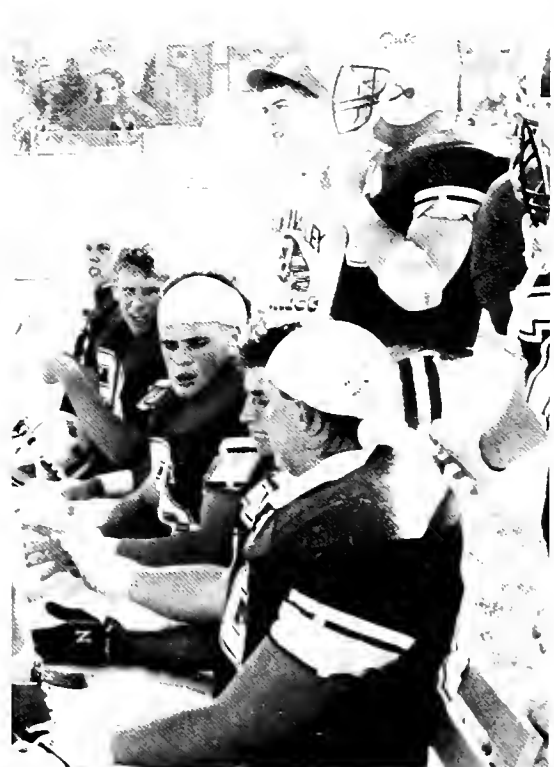
The cheerleaders try to hold back a much inspired Dutchmen team.

Quarterback Bob Schwenk calls a pass play to get the ball into scoring position.

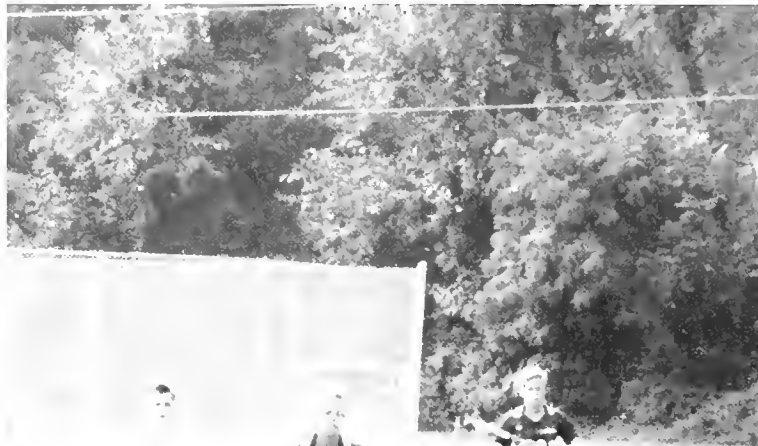

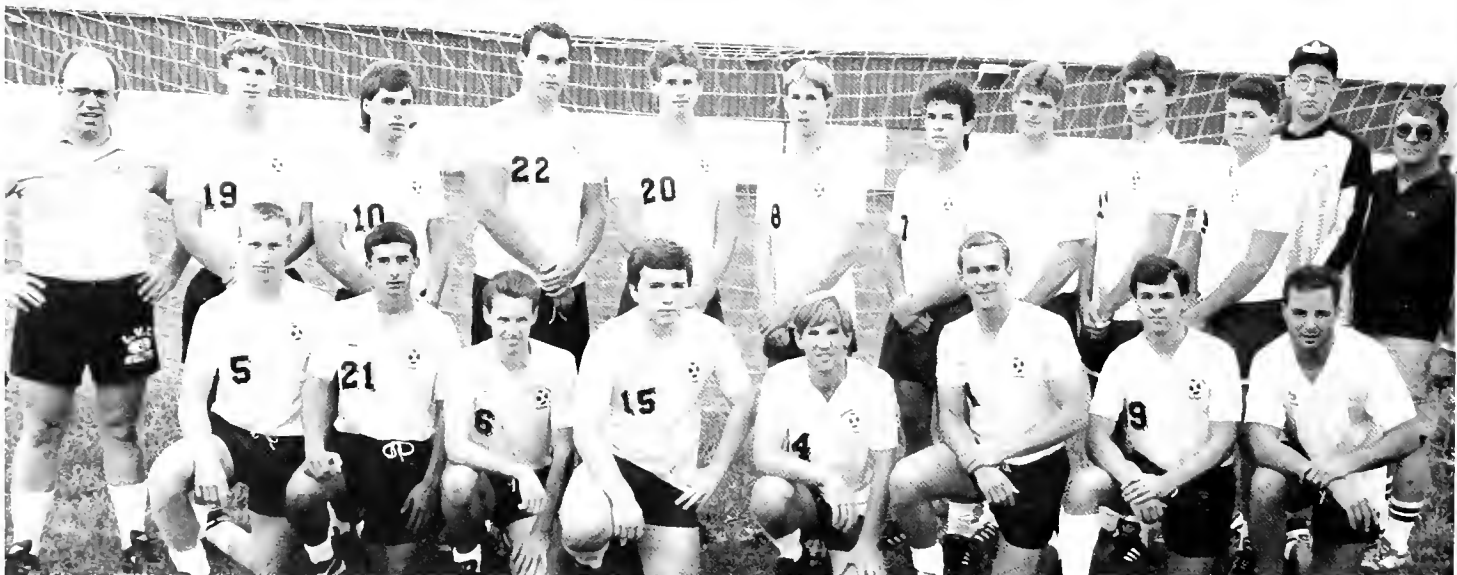

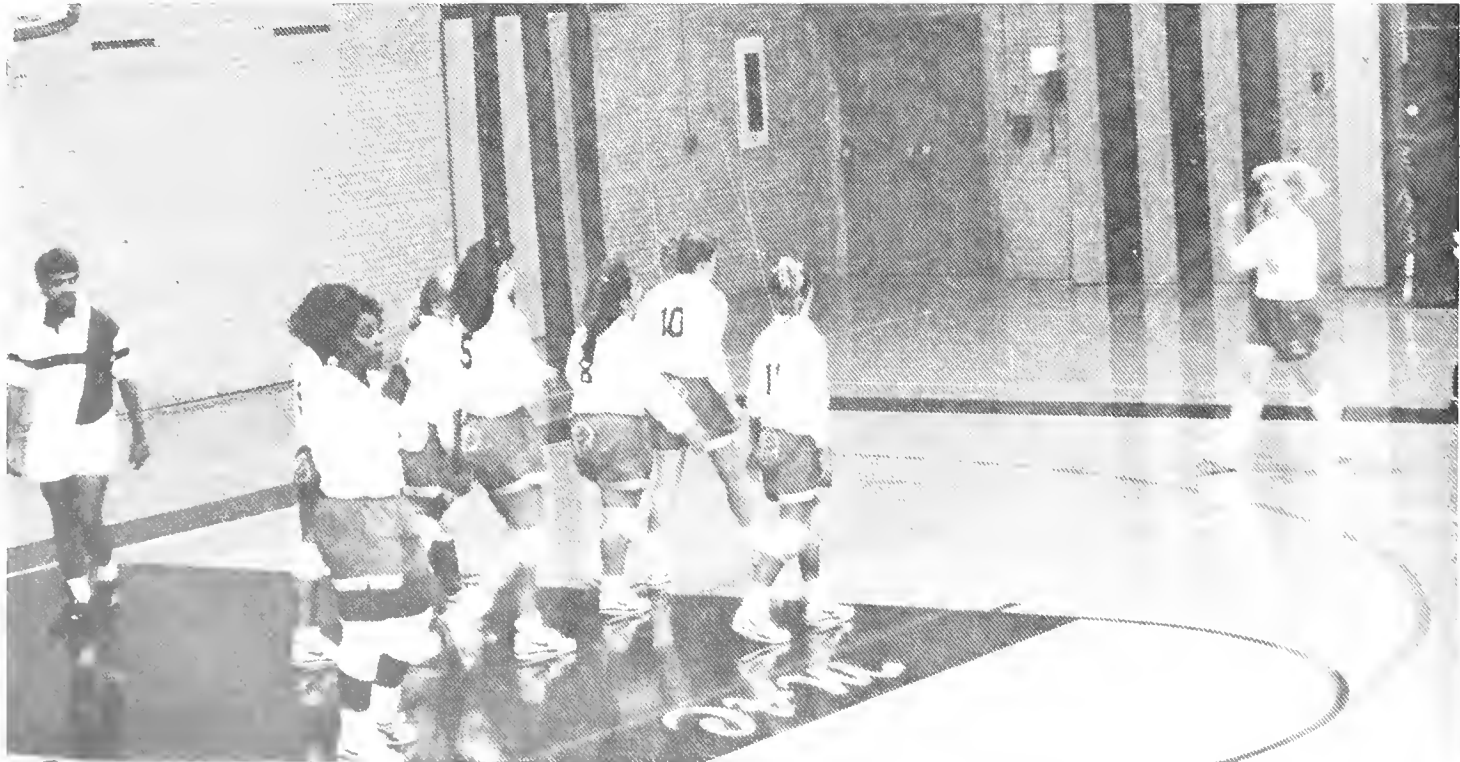

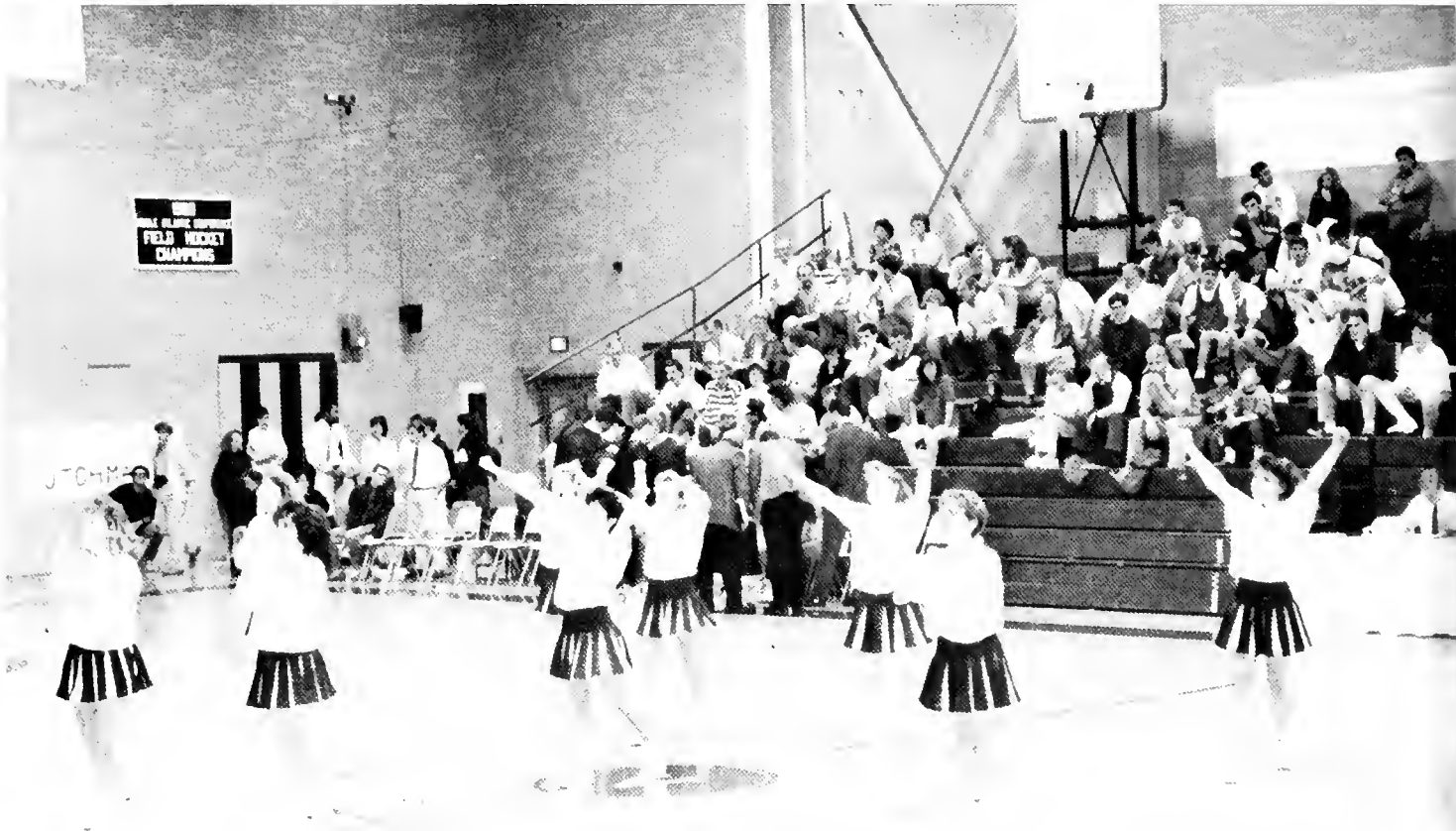

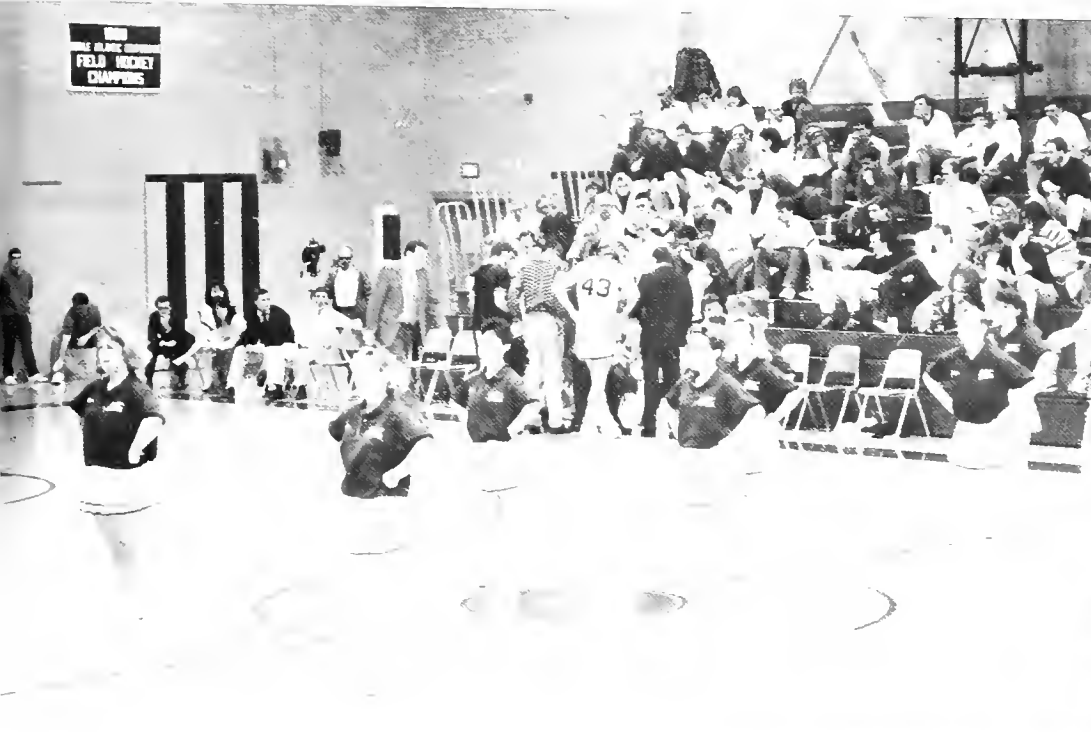

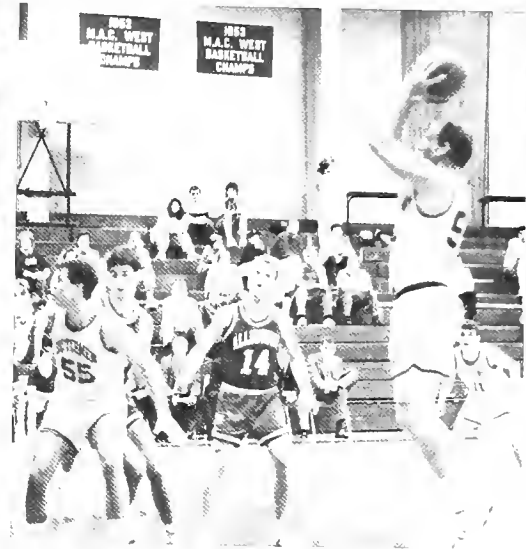
