RELATIVE TO

HORSE-RACING.

HAT from and after the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand seven Horses to be hundred and forty, no person or entered by the persons whatsoever shall enter, start, or run any horse, mare, or gelding, for any Plate, Prize, Sum of Money, or other thing, unless such horse, mare, or gelding, shall be truly and bean fide the property of, and belonging to such perion to entering, farting, or running the fame horse, mare, or gelding; nor shall and no one perany one person enter and fart more fon to enter merè than one horfe, mare, or gelding, tban ene berse for one and the fame Plate, Prize, for the same Plate, &c. Sum of Money, or other thing; and in Case any Person or Persons shall, after the said twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand seven hundred and forty, enter, slart, or run any horse, mare, or gelding, not being the property, truly and base fide, of fuch person so entering, starting, or running the fame for any Plate, Prize, Sum of Money, or other thing, the faid horse, mare, or gelding, or the on pain of forvalue thereof, shall be forfeited; feiting such to be fued for and recovered, and borfes, or the disposed of in manner as is hereinvalue thereof. after mentioned; and in case any perfor person or persons shall enter and start more than one horse, mare, or gelding, for one and the same Plate, Prize, Sum of Money, or other thing; every such horse, mare, or gelding, other than the first entered horse, mare, or gelding, or the value thereof, shall be forfeited; to be sued for and recovered, and disposed of in manner as herein-after is mentioned.

Penaltyof 2001. for running for less than 501. Any person that shall enter, start, or run a horse, mare, or gelding, for less value than fifty pounds, for feits the sum of two hundred pounds.

Every person that shall print.

Penalty of 1001. for advertifing Prizes of less walue than 50h Every person that shall print, publish, advertise, or proclaim any money, or other thing, to be run for, of less value than fifty pounds, forfeits the sum of one hundred pounds.

Races to be begun and ended in one day. Provided that every Race that shall be thereafter run, for any Plate, Prize, or Sum of Money, be begun and ended in one day.

Matches may be run at Nowmarket & Black Hambleton, for any Sum under 501. Horses may run for any sum on N ewmarket-Heath, in the Counties of Cambridge and Sussolk, and Black Hambleton, in the County of York, without incurring any penalty.

for a plate, as the duty for one year; which said money shall be paid, for the use of his Majesty, his heirs and succeffors, into the hands of the clerk of the course, book-keeper, or other person authorised to make the entry of fuch horse, mare, or gelding, being to flart or run for fuch plate, prize, fum of money, or other thing, as aforesaid; and if any on penalty of owner of fuch horse, mare, or geld-20l.

'ing, shall, previous to the starting, neglect or refuse to pay the said sum of two pounds, two fhillings, for fuch entrance, to the clerk of the course, book-keeper, or other person authorised to make the entry as aforefaid, the owner or owners of every such horse, mare, or gelding, shall forfeit and pay the fum of twenty pounds, to be recovered and applied in fuch manner as herein-after in directed.

Penalty on clerk of the course. Sc neglecting to account with Distributer of Stamps.

And be it further enacted, that every clerk of the course, book-keeper, or other perfon, so receiving the said sum of two pounds, two faillings, as entrance money, shall within fourteen days after the receipt thereof, give an account of all monies received. by him for horses so entered to start

as aforesaid to the Distributor of Stamps in the county where the race was run, upon demand made by fuch Distributor for the same, and producing his appointment as Distributor under the hands and seals of three of the Commissioners of his Majesty's stamp-duties; and in case of not accounting for and paying the same, he shall, for every default in not delivering fuch accounts, pay the fum of one hundred pounds; and for every default of payment of the monies due on fuch accounts, forfeit and pay double the amount of the monies due on the faid accounts at the time of fuch default.

Allowance to be made to the clerk of the course, &c.

And it is hereby enacted, that the faid head Diftributor of stamps, to whom such money shall be paid as aforesaid. shall make an allowance of one shilling in the pound to fuch clerk of the course, book-keeper or other

person as aforesaid, for all monies so accounted for and paid by him to such Distributor at aforesaid.

KING'S PLATE ARTICLES.

TT is His MAJESTY'S Command, that thefe ... following Rules be observed by the Owners and . Riders of all fuch Horses, Mares or Geldings, as shall run for His Majesty's Plates at NEWMARKET.

2. LVERY horse, mare or gelding that runneth for the faid Plate, shall carry twelve stone;

fourteen pounds to the stone, three heats.*

II. Every person that putteth in a horse, mare or. gelding for the said Plate, is to shew such horse. mare or gelding, with the marks, name, and name of the Owner, to be entered at the King's Seables in Newmarket the day before they run; and shall then produce a certificate under the hand of the breeder, that his horse, mare or gelding, be no · more than fix years old the grass before.

III. Every borie, mare or gelding that runneth, is to flart between the hours of one and four in the afternoon; and to be allowed half an hour

between each heat to rub.

IV. Every horse, mare or gelding that runneth on the wrong fide of the Posts or Flags, or is distanced "in any of the hears, shall have no there of the faid

Plate, nor be suffered to run any more.

V. The horse, more or gelding that winnerh any two heats, winneth the Plate; but if three several horfes, mares or geldings, win each of them a heat, then those three, and only they, to run a fourth heat; and the horfe, more or golding that winneth the fourth heat, shall have the Plate.

By order, this is fince aftered to ONE HEAT.

VI. And each horse, mare or gelding's, &c. place as he or they come in, by the ending post, each hear, as 1st, 2d, or 3d, &c. shall be determined by fuch judges as shall be appointed for that purpose, by the Master of the Horse. And in case any horse, mare or gelding shall be then, or after proved to be above the age of fix years the grass before, the Owner or Owners of fuch horse, mare or gelding, shall be made incapable of ever run-

ning for any of the King's Plates hereafter.

VII. As many of the riders as shall eross, jostle or strike, or use any other foul play, as shall be judged by fuch person or persons as shall be appointed by the Master of the Horse, such rider shall be made incapable of ever riding any horse, mare or gelding for any of His Majesty's Plates hereafter: and fuch Owners shall have no benefit of that Plate; but fuch Owners may be permitted to run any horse, mare or gelding for any other of His Majesty's free Plates hereafter.

VIII. Every rider shall, immediately after each heat be run, be obliged to come to the endingpost with his horse, mare or gelding, then and there to alight, and not before, and there to weigh to the fatisfaction of the Judges appointed for that

purpose.

IX. And in case of neglect or refusal thereof, such winners and riders shall be immediately declared incapable of running or riding any more for this

or any of His Majesty's Plates hereafter.

X. And in case any difference shall arise relating to their ages, or in their running, or to these His Majesty's orders, &c. the same to be determined by fuch person or persons, who shall be appointed by the aforesaid Master of the Horse.

These articles will continue in force for succeeding years, unless directed to the contrary by His Majefly.

ARTICLE FOR A COCK-MATCH.

RTICLES of agreement made the day of 179 between J. S. and D. H. First. The said parties have agreed, that each of them shall produce, shew and weigh, at the Cockpit day of next, beginning at the hour of feven o'clock in the faid morning cocks, none to be less than three pounds fix ounces, nor more than four pounds eight ounces; and as many of each party's cocks as come within ounces of the other party's cocks, shall fight for guineas a battle; that is guineas each cock. in as equal divisions as the battle can be divided into. as pit's or day's play at the cockpit aforefaid; and that the party's cocks that win the greatest number of battle-matches out of the number aforesaid, shall be guineas, as odd battleentitled to the fum of money; and the fum is to be made thakes into the hands of Mr. before any cocks are pitted, in equal shares between the parties aforesaid; and the parties further agree to produce, shew and weigh, on the faid weighing day, cocks, for byebattles, subject to the same weight as the main-cocks before-mentioned, and those to be added to the number of main-cocks unmatched; and as many of them as come within one ounce of each other, shall fight

for two guineas each battle, to be as equally divided as can be, and added to each pit or day's play with the main of cocks; and it is also agreed, that the balance of the battle-money shall be paid at the end of each pit or day's play; and to fight in fair reputed filver spurs, and with fair hackles; and to be subject to all the usual rules of cock-fighting, as is practised at London and Newmarket; and the profit of the pit or day's play to be equally divided between the said parties, after all charges are paid and satisfied, that oftally arise thereupon. Witness our hands, this

Witness, T. W. J. S. D. H.

RULES for MATCHING and FIGHT-ING of COCKS in London, which have been in Practice ever fince the Reign of King Charles II.

To begin the same by fighting the lighter pair of cocks (which fall in match) first, proceeding upwards to the end; that every lighter pair may fight earlier than those that are heavier.

In marching, (with relation to the battles) it is a rule always in London, that after the cocks of the main are weighted, the match-bills are compared.

That every pair of dead, or equal weight, are feparated, and fight against others; provided that it appears that the main can be enlarged by adding thereto, either one battle or more thereby.




