ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

CHARLES E. ROWE, my father, who brought me up in a Christian home and taught me the old fashioned virtues of honesty, responsibility and fidelity - the cement that holds a family together. My father was the starting point for my quest for Rowe information. He told me he didn't know exactly where in Ohio his grandfather came from - only that it was in eastern Ohio and hilly, and that he had spent a number of years in Monroeville, Ind. before moving to Hudson, Ind. My father also knew that his father had a first cousin Neal Rowe that lived in Garrett, Ind., and that the Rowes in Fairfield Twp., DeKalb Co., Ind. were some relation. He also recalled his family visiting some relatives on the Rowe side near Fairfield Center and that his father once stopped to see a relative around Corunna.

THELMER ROWE, who resided north of Helmer, Ind., was my next contact. I had supposed we were an English line since Rowe is an English name. He told me that our line is definitely German and that the "e" had been added to "Row" only in recent years.

ORA ROWE, the best known Rowe in Fairfield Twp., having served as Trustee for a number of years. He said he was the grandson of Frederick Row of Garrett, Ind., and that Neal (Cornelius) Row and his father George Row were brothers. He also said that he knew my father's grandfather John (Adam) Row well, and that he was a brother to his grandfather Frederick Row of Garrett. He told of a number of people in the community that attended the Rowe Reunions that were held many years ago. For the most part, he didn't know exactly "how" they were related. Ora Rowe was past 90 years old at the time we visited him, and his mind was very sharp.

MAE MORRISON, a delightful woman past 80 years old when mother and I visited her in her nice home at Camden, Mich. She was raised in Fairfield and her recollections were invaluable. She had us stay for supper and served fresh fish she had caught and a delicious home-baked pie.

BARBARA KEPLER THOMAS (Mrs. Stanley Thomas, of Canton, Ohio, is the person who found our family in Ohio and got us together. She saw my ad in the Tri State Trader and wrote that there are lots of Rowes in Holmes Co., Ohio, where she used to visit her grandparents when she was a child, and would do some checking there if I wanted her to. I couldn't have had a luckier break nor found a better friend. She proceeded to check records in the Holmes Co. HISTORY OF THE RAU ROW ROWE FAMILY IN PENNSYLVANIA

In Gernsbach, thirteen kilometers from Baden-Baden, (West Germany today) there are Bible records in existence that reveal the presence of the Rau family as far back as 1579. In the Evangelical Parish of the Gernsbach Mission the church records are available for perusal. Some of the members of the family were still there in 1794, and later. The birth record of one George Friederich Rau, born July 12, 1798, is there, and his parents were Phillip Jacob Rau and Helena Salome Hermann Rau. Other church records give the parishoners Ludwig Rau and wife Elisabeth Blichenmacher, also John Henry Rau and Rosina Christina, wife, nee Jacobin.¹

The church Bible records in Baden-Baden go back only till 1870, although today there are many Raus in the area.² There is even a fountain monument in the square to some early Rau!³ Not all the Rau members came to America. But -

Religious persecution and political pressures drove thousands of Europeans during the 16th and 17th centuries to the shores of the new land of America. Rau immigrants from the Palatinate of Bavaria in Germany came with their wives, families, or singly to the American colony fleeing religious wars and persecution of Protestants by the Catholics.

George Rau-Row-Rowe was born in 1723, probably in Baden-Baden, Germany. My ancestor arrived in Philadelphia on the ship "Phoenix" from Rotterdam on October 1, 1754. Captain John Spurrier was in charge of the 554 passengers: "inhabitants from Francona, the Palatinate and Zweibrucken, seventeen Roman Catholics, twenty-five Mennonites" included. Baden province was part of the Palatinate of the Rhine during the period of the large Palatine emigration to America. Refer to The Story of the Pennsylvania Germans by William Beidelman and I. D. Rupp's Thirty Thousand Names of Immigrants.

George Rau-Row-Rowe took the oath of allegiance in Philadelphia, then he and his wife Mary Magdalene and the two small sons John and George, Jr., proceeded to Northumberland County, in the Susquehanna Valley of Pennsylvania.

He laid claim to tracts of land, 100 acres applied for on August 6, 1766, and surveys made May 27, 1767, land known as Row's Land. On June 12, 1772, George had 50 acres in Penn's Township surveyed. One of the original land grants to Row's Land was surveyed and signed by the first Governor after Pennsylvania became a state (1787). Ruth Row Clutcher has the documents. "On May 18, 1774, he was granted a warrant of survey for fifty acres of land in Northumberland (now Snyder) County. He was

assessed for the first time in Penn Township in 1776. It is believed he became a resident on his land soon after the granting of the warrant and lived there until his death. This tract of land lay back (north) of the present Salem (Rau's) church. His wife was named Mary Magdalene, George, Jr., and John were their sons and both Revolutionary soldiers."¹

"George, Senior, served as a Private in Captain Michael Weaver's Company of the Northumberland County Militia and may also have been in Lt. Spee's party of Rangers. His widow's application for a pension follows: 'George Row, Sr. enlisted in a Battalion of Northumberland County Militia, commanded by Col. Peter Hosterman. He was stationed at Foutz (Focht's) Mill in Buffalo Valley in July, 1780, was wounded by the Indians in the defense of this place. A musket ball pierced his breast and he died within five hours after being wounded. His Widow Mary Magdalene is much in need of a pension. The pension was granted. The Widow Row was a member of the Lutheran congregation at Rau's Church about the year 1790".² George Row was 58 years of age when he was killed by the Indians.

The Revolutionary War service records of George Row, Senior, in addition to the Pennsylvania Archives account, are carefully preserved in the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission in the Division of Archives and Manuscripts, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. One certifies for George, Sr., "a tour of active duty in Northumberland County Militia which he performed as a member of Lt. Jacob Spee's Company serving on the Frontier May-June 1780."³

Another certificate states that George Rowe, Sr., served a tour of active duty in Northumberland County Militia as a member of Captain Michael Weaver's Company during period of June 17-26, 1780.⁴ It was in this second tour of duty that he was killed.

George Rau-Row-Rowe was one of the first persons buried in Rau's (Salem) cemetery and his grave is marked. Tombstone inscription on the monument erected to George Row, who gave 50 acres for the founding of the Lutheran Church, and is now in the graveyard back of the "Rauen Kirchen" at Salem, Pennsylvania, reads:

Letters of Administration on August 24, 1780, for George Row, Sr., deceased, were granted to George Row, Jr. and the sureties for Administrator were Andrew Morr; George Conrad. This letter of Administration is listed on page 18, Will Book I, Sunbury Orphan's Court. Letters to Testamentary of George Row, Sr., estate and credits were settled satisfactorily.

On the north of the present Row Church property the Rows early acquired title to considerable tracts of land. From the Records of Rau's Church, (Salem Lutheran & Reformed), New Salem, Pa., (which book was in the custody of Mr. Eugene Keefer, the Church Historian for both congregations using this present church) the following:

"Date of Warrant from Warrant Book dated 1775-6 page 92 remaining in the Land Office of Pennsylvania specified that a tract of land date of warrant April 4th, 1776, granted to Melchior Stoch, Michael Weaver, John Schock, and George Ulrich, Co., situated joining the land of Martin Treaster, late the property of Conrad Wiser deed and land of George Rau in trust for the purpose of erecting a Lutheran Church and Schoolhouse, Northumberland County."

In the Church Records there is no written evidence of the details of the first old log church. A Reverend J. W. Wampole furnished a bit of information in a booklet which he compiled on the church, but his booklet was, unfortunately, not included in the Church Records history. There was mentioned "an interesting booklet showing a church settlement June 3, 1805". Other entries aside from offerings are made in this booklet. It was called - "Das Opfer Buchlein in der Lutherischen un Reformiten Gemienten, in das Rauen Kircha". The first entry in this booklet stated: June the 3, 1805, Johannes Rau and Johannes Maurer had a church settlement with the church council; and paid 8s and 4p to Georg Miller and Johannes Filman..... Sermons were preached in German from the pulpit until about 1898.

The present church which stands on the land given by George Rau is the third one built there since George's time during the Revolutionary War period. It is referred to in all the local history books as "Rau's Lutheran and Reformed Church", "Row's Salem Lutheran & Reformed Church", "Rauen Kircha", "Row's Church at Salem, Pennsylvania". Today there is a stained glass window over the front door which reads: "Salem Lutheran and Reformed Church". There are stained glass Memorial Windows in the Sanctuary to various Rowe ancestral members.

Two congregations use this church building. One is the Lutheran and Reformed group and the other is the Congregational Church. They share the church facilities on alternate Sunday mornings. The choir director, Mr. Eugene Keefer, is also the church historian for both congregations. 1967.

The Bi-Centennial of Rau's Salem Lutheran and Reformed Church was observed October 12 - November 2, 1975. Many Rowe descendants from all over the United States came for the affair.

ROWE'S FROM ALL OVER THE UNITED STATES ATTENDED RAU'S CHURCH BICENTENNIAL celebration. The church bulletins for October 19, 26 and November 2, 1975, gave this information: (Special thanks to Ellen Rowe Zschau)

FIRST CHURCH HISTORY: In the year 1766 the original application was made to the Province of Pennsylvania for a Grant of Land by Lutheran settlers and granted to Melchior Stock, GEORGE RAU, and others. The "Log Church" was built in 1775 using the timber near the church site. The land grant consisted of 92 acres and 137 perches. Reformed worshipped in the church occasionally, and were given equal rights in 1802. At times the first church was used other than worship as a place to smoke meat. The first log church building measured 30 x 35 feet and seated about 400 people. A gallery was on three sides with the pulpit on the north side. Doors were on the south and east sides. Traveling Lutheran ministers were: Rev. Henry M. Muhlenberg, Rev. John N. Kurtz, Rev. John M. Enterline. Reformed "circuit riders" were: Rev. John William Hendel, Sr., 1779 Rev. Jonathan Rahauer, 1792 Rev. George Geistweit.

Ministers to the Church were: Lutheran - 1775 Rev. John M. Enterline, 1790 Rev. Frederick W. Jasensky, 1798 Rev. Christian Espich, 1802 Rev. John Herbst, 1804 Rev. John Conrad Walter. The Reformed ministers were: 1802 Rev. George Geistweit, 1804 Rev. John D. Adams, 1812 Rev. J. John Dieffenbach, 1813 Rev. Yost Henry Fries.

SECOND CHURCH HISTORY: Preparations and work began in 1812 for building a new "brick" church. But work was delayed by the absence of workmen who left to serve in the war. The cornerstone was laid on Sunday, August 7, 1814. On May 12, 1816, the "Brick Church" was dedicated as "RAU'S EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN AND REFORMED CHURCH".....

THIRD CHURCH HISTORY: The Brick Church was demolished in 1897 and the cornerstone for the present church was laid on May 30, on the same site as the second church. Dedication was on May 24, 1898. In 1968 the Reformed congregation affiliated with the Lutheran and the church is now known as Salem Evangelical Lutheran Church. A renovation program was started in 1971, providing for more classrooms, library, social hall, etc. A kerosene chandelier consisting of 12 globes was electrified and is now the focal point of the main worship center. At the completion was the three Sunday nights' celebration of two hundred years of worship as the Salem Congregation of original Rau Church. Display of artifacts and memorabilia from the early years was in the new basement of the church.

GEORGE ROW, JR., was probably born 1750-1 in Baden-Baden, Germany. He was the second son of George and Mary Magdalene Row. In the 1770's he married Anna Margretha Weaver, daughter of Michael and Anna Barbara (Moyer) Weaver.

George, Jr., "was assessed for the first time in Penn Township in 1776 and in 1781 was taxed with 100 acres of land and personal property. In 1790 his family consisted of one male over and seven under 16 years, and six females" ¹

As a Private, George, Jr., served in Captain Michael Metz's Company of Northumberland Militia in 1780 at an unspecified time during the Revolutionary War. ²

In late June, 1780, when George, Sr., was killed by the Indians at Foutz Mill in Buffalo Valley, his oldest son John was away fighting the Indians as a private in the Northumberland County Militia. After George's death, John then took his Dad's place in Captain Michael Weaver's Company. After George's death, John then took his Dad's place in Captain Michael Weaver's Company. John served a tour of duty of two months as a substitute for his father. ³

Thus, George, Jr. was appointed administrator of his Dad's affairs as George, Sr. died without a will. George, Jr. had these lands deeded in the family's name. Then he deeded 40 acres of Row land in 1793 to his oldest son John with the provision that John take care of Mary Magdalene, George's mother and John's grandmother.

After settling family affairs in Pennsylvania, George, Jr. and his family left Pennsylvania in the fall of 1793 and migrated to Kentucky. He left his two oldest sons John and Frederick in Penn Township. Accompanying George and Anna Margretha were sons Martin, Andrew, Michael, David, and Daniel, and daughter Catharine. On December 4, 1794, another son Samuel was born in Logan County, Kentucky.

From notes sent by Ellen Rowe Zschau, she wrote the following biographical account of the George, Row, Jr., family:

(following 1794 records of) "land surveys for both George II and his sons Martin and Michael. The son David is mentioned as a chain carrier assisting with the Logan County surveys. Marriage records exist for Martin, Michael, David, Daniel, Catherine. The family then moved (1805-1809) to southern Indiana. George II died in Posey County in 1818 and is buried northwest of Mt. Vernon at the Aldrich Cemetery. His wife Margareth, is also buried there. She died in 1820. Posey County records exist that George Row II's estate was administered by his son, Samuel, and was admitted for consideration May 21, 1821. After the family moved to southern Indiana, some went to Harrison County, and others in Posey County.

FURTHER FACTS ON ROWE RELATIVES

JOHN RAU-ROWE, son of Jacob was married to Elizabeth Anderson (1777-1856). This couple had seven sons: Jake (1808-1878), George (1809-1896) John (1810-1868), Henry (1813-1899), Peter (1815-1888), Daniel (1817-1898), and Benjamin (1820-1895). John and Elizabeth Anderson Rau moved to Indiana in 1841.¹ John Rau's children spelled their name Rau but their descendants spelled the family name Row and Rowe. Present-day descendants spell it Rowe and pronounce it "ow" to rhyme with "cow".

John and Elizabeth must have returned to Pennsylvania in later years prior to their deaths. They are both buried in Rau's Church cemetery, Salem, Pennsylvania.

A twentieth-century descendant, of John's son Peter, lives in Elkhart, Indiana. Jack Roland Rowe (sixth generation grandson of Jacob Rau-Row-Rowe) compiled in 1968 the Rowe Family Genealogy of descendants of Jacob and his son John and Elizabeth. Many of these descendants live in Indiana today.

LEWIS ROWE, great grandson of George, Jr., was the sixth child of Jonathan and Sarah Jane Bause Rau. He was born in 1850. He never married. Lewis died in Los Angeles, California, about 1918. He had gone to Klondike during the Alaska gold rush. He struck gold, but lost it all in a ship wreck on the way back to "the States". Lewis then went into the real estate business with a partner in Los Angeles. The partner eventually decamped with their profits and Lewis died a poor man.²

DANIEL HAMILTON ROWE, born August 3, 1845, at Corydon, Harrison County, Indiana, was the son of Elias Rowe (1819-1878) and Sydney Gochenour Rowe (b. Va. 1823 - d. 1855 Ind.). Elias Rowe was one of the sons of Daniel Row and Mary Server Row, and grandson of George Rowe, Jr. and Anna Margretha Weaver Rowe.

Daniel Hamilton, known affectionately as "Uncle Ham", served in the 59th Indiana Infantry, during the War between the States, as a Musician in Co. K Volunteers. He went to Martinsville, Illinois, following his discharge from the Union Army. Here he met Mary Catherine Hutchings. They were married November 1866. Both of their children died when quite young. After Mary Catherine died in 1890, Uncle Ham moved to Greenup, Illinois, where he eventually married Widow Sarah Bright. Mrs. Bright had a musically talented young son. Uncle Ham and the boy hit it off beautifully, spending much time singing and playing instruments. The step-son went to college where he studied music. In the meantime Uncle Ham, who was a mechanical wizard along with his musical ability, had been tinkering with an old-fashioned reed organ. He rigged up a cylinder of sheet brass, devised a system of punching holes in the cylinder, with matching small metal pins on an inner roll that revolved around inside the cylinder. By using this device which had to be operated by a hand crank, and pumping pedals simultaneously was impractical. He, therefore, applied the same principles and built a much more refined instrument which he attached to a piano - the first player piano!

When the step-son was informed of the project he begged Uncle Ham to patent it, but Uncle Ham just was not the type to push or promote his project. His continued tinkering produced a very good working model. His step-son brought his friends home and they all enjoyed playing and listening to Uncle Ham's player piano. They questioned Uncle Ham many times, and he explained how he had built it and how it really worked. He never pursued getting his idea patented.

Some years later, tradition has it, some one of these young men had Uncle Ham's concept put on paper and patented.

Uncle Ham died Mary 24, 1929, and is buried in Greenup, Illinois. He never received "official" credit for creating the first "player piano", although his family and friends attest to his ingenuity. But his player piano invention lives on.¹

ADAM ROWE is included in family folk-lore as a relative of George, and served with John Row in Capt. David McClure's Company at the time of Dunmore's War or shortly thereafter. Adam is listed as serving 152 days. It is quite probable that Adam Row was on the Ohio River before 1774, coming down from Buffalo Valley, Pennsylvania.

Early Pennsylvania Marriages Before 1790, states that one Adam Row and Susannah Welsh were married August 22, 1774. In 1775 Adam and his wife settled a couple of miles north of Fishing Creek near New Martinsville, Virginia (now in state of West Virginia) according to an account in Upper Ohio Valley Pioneers. A surveyor's report in 1785 shows a run emptying into the Ohio River about two miles north of the mouth of Fishing Creek, formerly known as "Row's Run".

In a journal kept by an Englishman, Nicholas Cresswell, while seeking his fortune in the Western country, an entry was made while on his way on the Ohio concerning one "Row a Dutchman". Portions of the diary read:

Wednesday, July 5, 1775...Proceeded to French Creek, where Cresop's people overtook us...Friday July 7th, 1775 Got to a plantation belonging to one Rows a Dutchman. Bargained with the old woman for as much mush as we all could eat (this is hasty pudding made of Indian meal) for about two dollars worth of Gunpowder. We had the corn to grind on a hand mill and I thought it an age before we had done and the mush made. I suppose we might have et till we had illed ourselves before we had satisfied our voracious appetites. Have eaten no bread for 28 days. Saturday July 8th, 1775 This morning one Captn David McClure came here....

It was natural that David McClure would stop at Fishing Creek to see Adam Row who had previously served in his Company.

In November of the following year, 1776, while in the vicinity of Grave Creek, and within 400 yards of the garrison, the eldest son of Adam Row was killed and scalped, and the younger, who was with him, was reported missing.

ADAM ROW (continued from page 7) On Jan. 2, 1777, Adam Row is appended to the pledge to serve as militia under Capt. Wm. Harrod to assist in the defense of Grave Creek fort. While on his way down the Ohio in March 1780, in the Company of Capt. Harrod, Row and a young man by the name of Isaac Perry went ashore at Fishing Creek to get Row some articles he had hidden under the floor of his cabin. They found several Indians at the cabin who fired on them, killing Perry. Adam's family had been fortified at Tomlinson's. Capt. Harrod has seen fresh Indian signs and had warned them against going back to the cabin. Row escaped, but the Indians were between Harrod and Row and their canoe so they could not get to their boats again. They were obliged to retreat to Ft. Henry until later the next day. Then they had to go around back water and were delayed in reaching Wheeling as scheduled. The cabin referred to in 1780 is probably the same which Adam Row had in 1775 when he was visited by McClure and Cresswell.

Sometime between 1784 and 1793, Adam Row and his family, becoming very tired of fort life, departed for Kentucky. They were attacked by Indians, who scalped the wife and captured little Daniel who was never heard from again. An older child Jacob hid himself and slept in damp leaves in a pit made by an uprooted tree - took sick and died. Adam later went on to Kentucky. From DeHass, in his History of Upper Ohio Valley Pioneers, pp. 325-326.

In the Second Census of Kentucky, 1800, in Washington Township Adam Row is listed as a resident. On November 17, 1796, the Washington County Court House Records state that Adam Row was issued a license to marry Priscilla Reed. He also was a witness to a will there in 1796. In 1798 he was paid three shillings for one wolf scalp.

Nothing further is known about Adam Row. No records have been found either in Kentucky or in Ohio Valley records about him or his descendants.

Pittsburgh Pay Roll MMS 14, 15 in Virginia State Library, Richmond gives his record of service with Capt. McClure and Capt. Harrod. Herman Boye, Map of the State of Virginia, 1827, shows the portion of Row's Run based on a manuscript map of Tyler County prepared in 1821. The survey of land made for Henry Enoch on May 27, 1785, on the "Ohio River Fishing Creek flat" set forth that the land was settled by Adam Row in 1775, from Buffalo Valley.

ADDENDUM: The service record of the above Adam Row has been approved by NSDAR. His service under Capt. David McClure for 152 days is cited as well as service in the Jefferson Militia under Capt. James Samuels who was under General Clark, in Kentucky for 36 days.

JOHN RAU ROW, eldest son of George and Mary Magdalene Row, was born in 1749 in Germany. He came as a small child with his parents and younger brother George to this country in 1754. He grew up in the Buffalo Valley of Pennsylvania, was baptized in the Lutheran faith, and a member of Rauhen Kircha, the land for which his father George gave.

John Row was a resident for a time in 1772, but not a landowner, in Stumptown, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. On September 22, 1773, John Row was granted a warrant of survey for 100 acres of land in Northumberland (now Snyder) County and soon thereafter he became a resident of Penn Township. He was an inhabitant in 1776 of Northumberland County and a member of the Committee of Safety of Province of Pennsylvania.¹ He was assessed in Penn Township in 1778, and 1787 he was taxed with 200 acres of land and personal property.²

John Row married Catharine Schock.³ (A John Schock was one of the trustees of land warranted April 4, 1776 by George Rau in trust for the purpose of erecting a Lutheran Church and schoolhouse, Northumberland County.)

John and Catharine Row are listed as sponsors at the baptism of Elisabeth Row, infant daughter of George Row, Jr. and Magdalene Row, and at the baptism of the infant son John of George, Jr. and Magdalene Rowe.⁴ These baptisms are also listed likewise in Rauhen Kircha baptismal records which I read. John Row was also mentioned in these church records as one of the original settlers in the Salem area of Pennsylvania. He was a mason.

In 1790 U.S. census this John Row family consisted of "3 males over 16 years and 3 females". His children of which there are records were George Row (born 1774), Henry Row (born 1775), and Michael Row (b. 1794). John Row was a Revolutionary soldier from Penn Township, a Private from 1778-1787 in Northumberland County Militia of Pennsylvania. He was listed as one of the Revolutionary soldiers buried in Row's Church Cemetery, Salem, Pa., in an unmarked grave.⁵

In a Deed dated October 31, 1793, at the Sunbury Court House, Pennsylvania, it stated that George Row, Jr., transferred 40 acres of his land to John Row, oldest son of George Row, Sr., (deceased), provided that "said John do provide for and maintain Mary Magdalene, mother of said George (Jr.), during the natural life of her the said Mary Magdalene", mother of John and George, Jr., Row. There is no record of Mary Magdalene, known as "the Widow Row", in the church books after 1795 when her widow's offering, as a member, was given. So it is assumed she died, thereafter.

40 acres transferred from George Row to John Row, oldest son of said George, provided that said John do provide for and maintain Mary Magdalene, mother of said George, during the natural life of her the said Mary Magdalene and for divers other causes and considerations him hereto moving, hath given, granted, bargained, sold, released, ensconsed and confirmed and by these presents doth give, grant, bargain, sell, release, confirm unto the said John Row his heirs and assigns, all that certain tract, piece and parcel of land situate in Penns Township in the County of Northumberland, aforesaid adjoining lands of George Hessler, Peter Maurer and Samuel Hendricks, containing 40 acres and allowance, it being the same tract of land which was granted unto said George Row by his warrant dated the ...day of ...anno domini 179..., together with also all and singular the ways, roads, waters, water courses, buildings, improvements, rights, liberties, and privileges, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining and the revisions and remainders thereof to have and to hold the same described tract of land and premises hereby given and granted or intended to be, with the appurtenances to the said John Row, his heirs and assigns, to the only proper use and behoof of him, the said John Row, his heirs and assigns forever.

Note: The above was copied by Elizabeth Imbody Adams, and has been taken from her "Rau-Row-Rowe Family in Pennsylvania" that she compiled in 1969 and presented to the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, through the Caroline Scott Harrison Chapter, Indianapolis, Indiana. Since then, from time to time, I have been in touch with Elizabeth Imbody Adams and Ellen Rowe Zschau, and they have been especially in touch with each other since they are descended through George Row, Jr. son of the immigrant. Both Ellen and Elizabeth have visited and done research in and around Rau's Church and at Sunbury. I have not found anyone that has directed their research on John or John Frederick, son of Geo.¹.

These pages 9 and upper portion of page 10 were taken from the 1969 compilation of Elizabeth Imbody Adams, while pages 1 through 9 were taken from her compilation a few years later. Originally, Mrs. Adams interpreted the above deed "40 acres transferred from Geo. Row to (his brother) John Row, oldest son of said (the father) George". However, at the present time Mrs. Adams and Mrs. Zschau believe "40 acres transferred from Geo. Row to (his son) John, oldest son of said (Geo., Jr.) George". As new information is found, old records have to be reassessed, in the light of the added information.

1. A search of records in Centre, Union, Berks, Dauphin and Lancaster counties might be helpful. I have done some research in Columbiana Co., Ohio - one of the deed holders lived in Berks Co., Pa. More research needs to be done here. My George Row, 4th generation, married 1823 in Columbiana Co., Ohio. His father was living in Holmes Co., Ohio, and he soon after moved there himself. I believe the grandfather John Row may be found in Jefferson or Stark County, Ohio records.

FREDERICK ROW³ (George², George¹)

Frederick Row was one of the sons of George Row, Jr. and Anna Margretha. He was born in 1775. In the Rau's (Salem) Church cemetery his old tombstone reads: "Frederick Rau Gebornen Dec. 25, 1775. Starb Jan. 31, 1859." His wife's tombstone next to his has the inscription: "Elisabeth Weib von Friederich Rau Geb. Martz 30, 1776 Starb April 9, 1849." After Elisabeth died Frederick lived with William, their son. Frederick Row was a mason, a craftsman of his trade. Folks in the Salem area say that chimneys and fireplaces that he built still stand today!

The names of Frederick and Elisabeth Row's children named in his will are: William, Peter, John, Samuel, George, Jonas (Jonathan), Catharine, Elizabeth, and Polly. All of these children and some of their spouses are buried in the Rau's (Salem) Church cemetery.

Peter Row, son of Frederick and Elisabeth Row, was born June 30, 1803. He married Lydia Fetters (born December 16, 1810, died March 5, 1884). Two sons of Lydia and Peter married sisters who were rumored to be very pretty. Children were: John Rowe who married Lydia Luck, Isaiah who married Mariah Luck (pronounced today as "Luke" by their descendants in Selinsgrove, Pa.), Catherine, Elizabeth, Lydia, Emma, Margaret, and Samuel. Their graves are marked in Rau's (Salem) Church cemetery. Peter died September 8, 1885.

Isaiah Rowe was a wealthy man residing in Mifflintown, Pennsylvania. It was said that he made his money as a gunsmith or in manufacturing gunware. He was an officer of the bank there. He was a trusting and well-liked citizen. But, he signed notes for practically everybody in the township who borrowed money from the bank there, and died a poor man. His widow had to sell his estate and the beautiful, brick colonial, 10 bedroom home to pay his debts after his death. It was rumored that one Roscoe North, President of the First National Bank persuaded Isaiah Rowe, a director of First National Bank to co-sign all loans and notes - which Isaiah had eventually to pay off. He thus had actually given his wealth away, a poor businessman indeed.

Isaiah and Mariah Luck Rowe had eight children: Frederick, Charles, Francis (Frank), Diana, Isaac, Maria, Robert, and William. Isaiah was born November 28, 1832 and died August 30, 1903. Mariah's birthday was December 10, 1828, and she died August 23, 1907. Isaiah and Maria were married by Rev. C. G. Erlemeyer on March 12, 1857. They lived in Penn Township, raising their children in Mifflintown. They were members of Rauens Kircha, bringing their children up in the Lutheran faith. Isaiah and Maria are both buried in the Ray's Church cemetery.

Two of the Rowe young men, Isaac and Francis, married two of the beautiful Andrews sisters, Elizabeth and Ella, whose family lived over the mountain ridge in Reed's Gap, Pennsylvania. The parents of Elizabeth and Ella, John and Sarah Daugherty Andrews, were of proud Scots-Irish stock and held in high esteem by their neighbors and friends.

After their marriage February 13, 1889, Isaac and Elizabeth Andrews Rowe moved to Fostoria, Ohio, several years later. They raised their seven children in the Lutheran faith of their forefathers. Isaac had a dairy farm just outside of town. The children of Isaac and Elizabeth were:

Walter, Frederick, John, Golda Sarah, Albert James, Kenneth, and Florence Katherine.

Isaac and Elizabeth Andrews Rowe were my grandparents. It is said that folks around Fostoria referred to Elizabeth as "that stately and beautiful Mrs. Rowe." She was described as being about five feet ten inches tall, with big brown eyes and shiny, silky, thick brown hair. Grandpa was a mite taller than she, with twinkly blue eyes, wide cheekbones. I remember a precisely-trimmed mustache, and silvery, white hair - a truly handsome and distinguished old gentleman. Grandmother saved my life when I was four years old, and my dress caught fire at Christmas-time from a gas heater on the farmhouse back porch. Grandmother died the next year after a gall-stone operation. Grandpa never remarried.

Golda Sarah, the fourth child of Isaac and Elizabeth Rowe, is a five foot three-inch replica of her mother Elizabeth. She married my father William Harold Imbody, from Marion, Ohio, who is the fourth son of Robert Malvin and Rebecca Harruff Imbody. After my birth in Akron, Ohio, and my sister's birth in Athens, Ohio, my Daddy's business interests moved us to the Carolinas where my sister Marjorie and I grew up.

Although my mother was raised in the Lutheran Church, she joined the Methodist Church, my father's faith. Thus, Marjorie and I were brought up in the Methodist Church. Marjorie married a Lutheran, Lt. Colonel Roy A. Lange, and joined his church. Their children are being raised in the Lutheran faith. I married a Methodist, the Georgia gentleman Robert Lee Adams, and our children are members of the Methodist Church.

The greatest sorrow in my parents's life was the death of my sister in 1966 from cancer.

At the present time, we may not have established with certainty the precise relationship of all these Rau-Row-Row individuals, but that they are related is certain. The connecting thread that binds us is found here and there - sometimes it is weak, or has come apart, while at other points it is relatively strong.

Church, deed, will, probate, guardianship, tax, marriage, birth, service, cemetery, Bible, family and other records need to be found - and those already found need to be constantly reassessed in the light of new findings.

My first contact with anyone working seriously on the Row family in Pennsylvania, was Ruth Row Clutcher. Apparently, she is the pioneer in working to unravel the Rau-Row Church Row's. She wrote that when her husband retired they moved from Philadelphia back to Snyder County, Pennsylvania. There were many Row's still living in the area and as a hobby she started collecting data to see just how she was related. She obtained information from early church records, the three court houses in what is now Northumberland, Union and Snyder Counties, local cemeteries, the works of several local historians and in conversations with several older individuals. As most beginners in genealogy, her first findings were not always documented, but she by her own statement, did not enter anything she did not feel was authentic.

I was excited to find a George Row born 1774 to John and Catherine Schock Row in the records she had compiled, since my George Row buried in New Bedford, Ohio, per his tombstone information, indicates he was born in 1774. When I wrote back to Mrs. Clutcher to find out where she had obtained that information, she no longer had a record of the source, but affirmed that she had not entered anything she did not feel was authentic.

The tie back to this area in Pennsylvania was reinforced by the obituary of Lewis Row "Lewis Row was born in Center County, Pennsylvania, October 18, 1802. Emigrated with his parents to Holmes County, Ohio in the year 1810. Lived in Holmes, Coshocton, and Tuscarawas counties alternately until the year 1851 when he emigrated to Owen Co., Indiana. His father died when he was in the tender age of about twelve years (about 1814), and his mother died when he was about thirty-five years old. He had three brothers and four sisters, all of whom preceded him in death.

"The deceased was married to Elizabeth Smith, October 25, 1825, and lived in the holy state of matrimony fifty years, five months and twelve days. This union was blessed with nine children; five sons and four daughters. Two of the sons preceding him in death some thirty years. He had fifty-six grandchildren and fourteen great grandchildren.

"His earthly sorrows were brought to a close on the 7th day of April, 1876, at 1 o'clock, p.m. Through the kind mercies of an All Wise God his life was prolonged to 73 years, 5 months, and 19 days. His funeral took place on Sunday, April 9, and was attended by a large concourse of sorrowing relatives and friends. The services were conducted by Rev. Mr. Jarvis in English, and Rev. J. F. Lautenshleger in German.

Also, from "A History of Baltic" (originally Rowville, founded and named after Lewis Row), by Clarence Troyer 1948, beneath the above obituary,

Mr. Troyer continues: "Below is a copy of a postal card written to J. A. Row, Neutral, Kansas by Hannah Long to notify him of the death of Mrs. Lewis Row.

Brighton, LaGrange Co., Ind.
September 17, 1888

Dear brother I will let you know that mother died last night a little past 10 o'clock will be buried tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock.

The same book gives a family record of Nicholas Row, gives his death date as June 1814, but not his birth date. His wife is shown as Mary Gonser born Nov. 4, 1780, died July 27, 1838. Their children are listed including Lewis Row born Oct. 18, 1802. In the Penns Creek Lutheran Church records, Haines Twp., Centre Co., Pa., the birth of Lewis Row is recorded "Lucas" born 18 Oct. 1802 to Nicholas Rauch and Magdalena - same date!

1800 Census, Haines Twp., Northumberland (later that year became Centre) County, Pennsylvania lists George, Nicholas, John and Peter Row as heads of households. Prior to 1850, census records did not name other members of a family, but simply numbered them in various female and male age groups. Also, in the Aaronsburg Lutheran Church records for 1800 are found Nicholas Row (wife not named), Geo. Rau (wife not named), Johannes Rau (wife not named); took communion 5 April 1801, Henrich Gansert (apparently the father of Nicholas' wife Mary Gonser), Magd. Rauh, Georg Hauh, Magd. Hauh (the latter two probably should be Rauh and were recorded, translated or transcribed in error). Confirmed on the same date was Hannah Rauh. Communion list for 5 June 1802 shows Nich. Rauh, Magd. Rauh, Henrich Gansert. Henrich Gansert and Elizabeth in 1802 were sponsors at the baptisms of a Berner infant and a Kreamer infant in 1804. In 1800 Henrick Gansert is the sponsor of a Miller infant. Subsequent records in the Aaronsburg Lutheran Church show George and Magdalena Rauch, George and Magdalena Rauh, Peter and Elizabeth Rau/Rauch. In 1806 Nicholas Rauch and Magdalena were the sponsors for an unnamed infant of Georg and Magdalena Rauch. The last record I have found for Nicholas and Magdalena Rauh was Jan. 26, 1807 in the Penns Creek Lutheran Church, Penn Hall, Centre Co., Pa. The Penns Creek and Aaronsburg Lutheran church were on the same circuit. A birthdate of 5 Oct. 1802 is given for Elizabeth dau. of John Rauch and Elizabeth in Penns Creek Lutheran Church record. Before 1810, in the Aaronsburg church Rauhs were sponsoring Pontius infants, and Pontius' were sponsoring Rauh infants. Similar close relationships are shown with the Schneider, Hubler, Miller, Hering, Krebs, Dorman families. Other names in the church include Auman, Neidig, Hay, Kriechbaum, and Hanes. These names are found again in the Holmes, Coshocton, Tuscarawas Cos., O. with Row families after 1810 or so, and again about 1850 in and around DeKalb County, Indiana where Rows settled.

Rev. L. A. W. Ilgen from Germany had a circuit of Lutheran churches in Centre County, Pennsylvania, at Aaronsburg, Rebersbury, Loop, and Penns Creek. The records are in German and have to be translated and copied. Latter day citizens who apply for their birth certificates are well aware of the frequent mistakes in records. It seems that ministers would jot down notes to record at their convenience later, or merely hold the information in their memory until a convenient time to record the record. Unfortunately, days, weeks, months, and sometimes even years elapsed before the convenient time appeared, and not surprisingly there were omissions and mistakes. Doctors, until very recent years, followed the same procedure in recording births in the legal records. Many tales are told of ministers and doctors coming to the court house with their pockets stuffed with odd bits of paper, to "catch up" with the recording of vital information, which hadn't been very well documented in the first place, and by then their memory was hazy for specifics. A few recorders were very faithful and precise, and even had good penmanship.

In translating records from German to English (not all German script is good penmanship) there may be trouble in interpreting the original, and for that reason the copy may have errors. Later copiers of the copy will make their own errors, too. All these factors need to be born in mind when evaluating Rev. Ilgen's records, Rau Church records and others.

Geo. Rauh and Magdalena had six children baptized in the Aaronsburg church. Sponsors of their children included Nicholas and Magalena Rauh, Elizabeth Pontius, Suanna Schneider, Elizabeth Schneider, Jacob and Eva Hering. The dates range from 1800 through 1810. Nicholas Rau had only a daughter baptized there in 1800 and the sponsor was Johannes Rau. From 1802 through Jan. 26, 1807, Nicholas and Magdalena Rauh are found in the Penns Creek Lutheran Church, Penn Hall, Centre County, as is John Rauch and Elizabeth in 1802, which may be the ancestors of many of the Elkhart County, Indiana Rowes.

It appears that Nicholas Rau left Centre County first, as he is not in the 1810 census there, although George is. Some descendants of Nicholas have said that he lived in Somerset County, Pennsylvania for awhile before moving to Ohio about 1810 to 1812. It seems that Georg Rau moved to the same area in Ohio about 1817. He was in German Twp., Coshocton County (later became Holmes Co.) about 1817. He is in German Twp., Coshocton Co. in the 1820 census. Nicholas had died June 1814 and his wife is in the 1820 census as is a young man John and spouse both between the ages of 18 & 26 - this is likely George's oldest son. Deeds show that Nicholas' family was in Sec. 21 and George settled beside them in Sec. 22, as did George Jr. George's sons?, Peter, Michael, and Jacob settled in Sec. 24, 1 acre of Jacob's land went to the Lutheran Evangelical Church in New Bedford in 1847. Samuel Row (son of George) sold out his 150 acres in Sec. 7 in 1847. In the 1850 Census Samuel Row is living in Fairfield Twp., DeKalb County, Indiana, as are Jacob Row and Jacob G. Row. It seems whenever the family moved, some members stayed behind, whether it was from Pennsylvania to Ohio, or from Ohio to Indiana. Occasionally some left behind would later join those who went ahead, but more often they stayed and planted their roots deeply in that community.

Nicholas Row's descendants were quite well documented by Wm. C. Row of South Bend, Indiana. In the 1930's he had over 100 family group sheets. After much searching, I was able to acquire a copy of his records.

DIEDRICH RAU FAMILY

I believe I might be doing Row/Rowe researchers who look at this book a disservice if I failed to present the following church record found in the Pennsylvania Traveler, August 1969.

HISTORY OF DE KALB COUNTY

GEORGE W. ROW is a native of Holmes County, Ohio, born Nov. 14, 1831, a son of Jacob Row, grandson of George Row and great-grandson of Frederick Row, who was a soldier in the war of the Revolution. Jacob Row was born in Union County, Pa., Jan. 1, 1802, and when fifteen years of age went with his parents to Holmes County, Ohio, where he grew to manhood and married Magdalene Guttery, a native of Harrison County, Ohio, daughter of Samuel Guttery, who came from Londonderry, Ireland in an early day. In 1847 they moved to DeKalb County, Ind., and entered forty acres of Government land and bought forty acres, which he cleared and improved. He died Aug. 17, 1873. They had a family of eleven children but five of whom are now living. George W. Row was fifteen years of age when his parents moved to DeKalb County, and his youth was spent in assisting his father to clear and improve his farm. When twenty years of age he learned the shoemaker's trade, at which he has worked at intervals since, in connection with farming and working at the carpenter's trade. He saved his earnings and bought forty acres of wild land which he improved, and in 1866 sold it and bought the farm where he now lives, which contains nearly forty-seven acres of valuable land. When he settled on his farm it was heavily timbered with the exception of eighteen acres, and that was only partially improved. He has been an energetic economical man, and now has a pleasant home. He has taken an interest in all the public affairs of the township, and has held the office of Constable four years, and Magistrate twelve years. In politics he is a member of the Green-back party. He was married Jan. 1, 1860, to Harriet F. Shook, a native of Crawford Co., Ohio, daughter of Samuel and Ann (Shong) Shook. To them have been born four children - Albert E., Charles A., Emma Ann, and Bertha May. Mrs. Row is a member of the German Reform church.

Note: It is so easy to believe anything we see in print is a fact, however, if you were interviewed for a biographical sketch, without the time and opportunity to search old records, is it not possible that you might make some mistakes? The above George W. Row could not check with his father, because his father had already died, and it is doubtful if he ever saw his grandparents after leaving Ohio at the age of 15. Those of you who have submitted material for publication are also aware that it is not uncommon to find that editing has changed the matter somewhat, as have, too, typographical errors.

In trying to verify the above biographical sketch, one also runs into the German custom of giving more than one child the same name, which happens to be the same name as the father's and/or the grandfather, cousins and uncles. Of course, each probably had two or three other names that are also carried by various relatives, but not necessarily in the same order, and these individuals are called by one name by some individuals and still another one of their names by other individuals, and this can vary, too by different periods of time, which probably had something to do with living in close proximity with another relative called by the same name and in order to lessen confusion, another name was then used for one of the individuals.

The biographical sketch indicates that Jacob was born in 1802 and came with his parents to Holmes County when he was 15 years old - this would be 1817, and other data seem to indicate that this was about the year that Geo., Sr. came to that area of Ohio. The only other Rows in the 1820 Census in German Twp. (then a part of Coshocton Co.) were Molly (Mary) Row (widow of Nicholas Row) and John Row. All of Nicholas' and Molly's children are accounted for in their family record. The other Row is John Row and spouse, both under age 26; no children are shown. Analysis of these census records seem to support the record on the opposite page that Jacob Row was the son of George Row that came to Holmes Co. in 1817 (was actually Coshocton Co. - no Holmes Co. then).

George " 1810 Census, Haines Twp, Centre Co., Pa. (This twp. was taken from Northumberland when Centre Co. was formed in 1800, after the Census had been taken in Haines Twp. that year.) The snag here is that in the sketch on the opposite page, Jacob Row is said to have been born in Union Co., Pa. in 1802. Union Co. was not formed until 1813 from out of Northumberland Co. Furthermore, a George Rauh and Magdalena are shown in the Aaronsburg Lutheran Church Records Haines Twp., Centre Co. in 1800 through 1810. During this time they are shown to have a daughter Elizabeth born Jan. 11, 1802 and baptized Mar. 14, 1802 which conflicts with the sketch on the opposite page. It is not too difficult to imagine that Jan. 1 should've been Jan. 11 or vice versa, but the recorder or copier would've made quite a grave error to have placed the name Elizabeth if it should've been Jacob. Georg Rauh & Magdalena are shown in that church to have had a son Jacob born Mar. 29, 1810 and baptized May 27, 1810, however it is quite possible that they named two sons Jacob. In this same church Nicholas and Magdalena are the sponsors of the baptism of an infant of Georg and Magdalena Rauch born Dec. 18, 1805 and baptized Feb. 9, 1806. Nicholas and Magdalena's children were baptized in the neighboring Penns Creek Lutheran from 1802 until Jan. 26, 1807, although they had one child, Elizabeth bapt. at Aaronsburg in 1800.

* I was very eager to see the 110 Family Records that had been compiled in 1933, and immediately sent a letter to Wm. C. Row at the South Bend address, but it was returned. I wrote letters to a number of South Bend Rows but they had no knowledge of Wm. C. Row now any such collection of records. I was very concerned that this collection was in someone's attic trunk and forgotten, or worse yet, had been destroyed. In my correspondence with Allen D. Sheneman in California, he had suggested I contact Mrs. S. D. (Gladie Gonser) Sprunger of Walkerton, Ind. We had been exchanging information and when I told her of this problem she got to work on it and discovered that Wm. C. Row had died in 1956 and was a retired mail carrier. I placed queries in magazines and newspapers and finally Wm. C. Row's nephew, Fred Rensberger of Lakeville, Ind. wrote that he had the records and that I could see them. Mr. Row had written the records in a large leather bound journal, in beautiful clear handwriting. I photocopied the entire book which is a fairly complete record of the descendants of Nicholas³ Row.

In any case, a John Row born approximately this date was with these early Row families in Ohio. He does not belong to Nicholas Row and the only other possibility would be Peter Row who keeps eluding me both in Centre Co. (Haines Twp.) and in Holmes Co., O.

Children names are not given in this census, but there are 3 m. under 10, 1 m. under 16, 1 m. under 18, 1 m. under 26, 2 fe. under 10 and 1 fe. under 16. The only other Rows there in that census are the widow Molly Row with her family and John Row and wife with no children, and both under the age of 26.

Eliza (Snellenberger) Deetz wrote from Fairfield to Elijah Row in Benton, Ohio April 1, 1865 "I got a letter from Conrad (Snellenberger) last weak..and he wrote that your father is with them and I would like to know where your mother is and how she gets along.." Geo. S. Row raised Conrad as his own child, and Conrad was now married and living in Holmes Co. Probably George's wife was with her Snellenberger relatives in Fiat, Ohio off and on (she had stomach cancer per her death record) and is buried with her Snellenberger relatives in Fiat Luth. Cem. Elijah Row kept a Bible record naming relationships, starting with Father.

In the same church records we find the death record of Mary Magdalena Snellenberger Row's father, Georg Snellenberger, and his surviving wife's name is given - Margaretha Raush. In Columbiana Co., O. deed records show Geo. Snellenberger as a grantor as early as 1813. As late as 1860 Snellenbergers in DeKalb Co., Ind. and as late as 1864 in Allen Co., Ind. are signing off deeds (Quit Claim) in Columbiana Co., Ohio. A John Roush was in Lisbon, Ohio (Columbiana Co.) in 1807. Perhaps this was Geo. S. Row's grandfather or some other relative and it was because of these relatives in Columbiana Co. that he happened to meet and marry the Snellenberger girl. Her ancestry traces back to John Geo. Roush, a Rev. soldier, and his father, Geo. Casper Roush, also a Rev. soldier. John Geo. Roush's wife was Christina Morr, dau. of Andrew Morr, Jr., Patriot.

His papers indicate that he was drafted and mustered in at Newark, Ohio, on Sept. 22, 1864. Eyes- gray, hair - dark, complexion - light; height 5'8". Occupation - laborer. Elijah Row was an excellent wagon maker and a fine furniture craftsman. His grandson, Geo. L. Row of Millersburg, Ohio, has in front of his fireplace a "mammy's bench" made by Elijah for his wife. One end had a front-rail to hold the baby in, and Elijah's wife could sit at the other end and do her needle-work and rock the baby at the same time. With the rockers and front-rail off, it looks like a deacon's bench. Geo. L. Row also has the appointment of his grandfather as Postmaster of Saltillo, signed by Elijah Row and the Probate Judge of Holmes Co. in 1864. Elijah Row kept a Bible Record of his family, and named each person's relationship to him, starting first with "Father - George S. Row". I was very excited when I learned the Geo. L. Rowe had this Bible and that my own grt. grandfather was listed as "Brother - Adam Rowe was borne on the 27th day of June 1838". On the family page was also listed "Cousin - Conrad Snellenberger was borne March the 24th 1841".

Eliza Deetz Row was the "doctor" and mid-wife for miles around, riding a horse, saddle-bags loaded with equipment and medication, off in an instant any time of day or night. Her grandson, Geo. L. Rowe of Millersburg has her medical notebook, full of her hand-written notes (many obtained from a reputable physician in practice many miles away) of remedies for particular ailments. There was a large lot between their house and the church in Benton, and in this garden she raised many of the herbs she used in treatment. Her heart and homewere always open, and the morning often brought surprises of newcomers in the household that had come by the previous night. Eliza janitored the Lutheran church next door. At the 75th Anniversary of the church held on Dec. 30, 1956, her son Albert Rowe told that he knew his mother had taught the Men's Class over 30 years; how she janitored the church and doctored the community.

Mary Lidy's grave has been lovingly marked by her grandchild, Hazel (Rowe) Lake. It is likely that Mary was born in Quincey, Pa per her brother's Civil War enlistment "I, John G. Lidy, born in Quincey, in the State of Pennsylvania.." John's obituary states that he was born in Huntington Co., Pa. It is more likely that his enlistment is the accurate information. Quincy is about 4 mi. from Waynesboro in Franklin Co. Franklin Co. was organized in 1784. There are records of "Leidi family" in Jacob's Lutheran Church near Waynesboro in 1802 and I found 5 Lidy families in Franklin Co. in the 1810 Pa. Census index. After leaving Monroeville, Mary went up into Michigan and eventually married a man by the name of "Chase" - perhaps around Lake Odessa. Sometime after his death she stayed awhile in Hudson with her son George and family. George's wife is reported to have found her a very congenial woman, and the grandchildren remember her reading her German Bible. In her large German Bible she had written her name and birthdate as well as those of her husband and children. The handwriting is in English and difficult to make out. More about the family is learned from her brother's obituary. "John Lidy was born in Huntington Co., Pa., Aug. 15, 1829, and died at Millersburg, Ohio, Sat. Oct. 18, 1902, aged 73 years, 2 months and 3 days....also leaves four sisters, Mrs. A. J. Stiffler, Mrs. Elizabeth Cromer of Mansfield, Ohio, Mrs. Catherine Gibson of Tillamook, Ore., and Mrs. Mary Rowe of Ft. Wayne, Ind. (Monroeville is near Ft. Wayne, although she may have been in Ft. This places Jacob's father, George Row in Holmes Co., Oh 1816 or 1817. I can find only one George Row in census and tax records in that area at that time. Holmes Co. was not yet formed, but George Row,(see p. 28) from all data I can find settled in German Twp., Coshocton Co., Oh about 1817 - this twp. later was used in the formation of Holmes Co., Oh. From the 1820C. it would appear that Jacob is still living at home with his parents. It appears that he is still living at home in the 1830C. Marriage records in Holmes Co., O. reveal that he married Martha Guthrey Dec. 26, 1830, which would be after the census was taken. Jacob is found in his own household in the 1840C. German Twp., Holmes Co., Oh and in the 1850C. living in Fairfield Twp., DeKalb Co., In. The Biographical Sketch indicates that Jacob was the grandson of Frederick Row, and that Jacob Row was born in Union Co., Pa. Union Co. was not formed until 1813, but I would suppose that Jacob was born in the area that may later made up part of Union Co. An unexplained Frederick Row appears from time to time in old Northumberland Co. records and it would seem that in some records he was called John and other records Frederick - a very common problem in these German families. My maiden name was Estella Spindler, daughter of Laurel and Nora Rowe Spindler, and an only child. My mother came from Zeke or Zax Rowe. I have his obituary but can't find it right now. My grandfather Nicklous Demas Spindler lived, and had a 160 acre farm near Fairfield and Hudson, Ind. We lived in our house and Delia Husselman, my cousin, whose step-father was David Rowe, and married to Delia's mother (neighbors?). She was a sister to my father, so the Rowe boys were double cousins of mine. We went to the old Neidieg School and John Urey was our teacher. Dr. Harold Urey, the scientist was a classmate of ours and I correspond with his sister Martha in California....My grandfather Rowe was married to Sarah Allen. His (her?) mother was married two times-to Shatto the second husband, and Grandma Allen Rowe had William, Newton, Calvin and Jesse (Shatto) half-brothers and one sister (half-sister) Lena, Mrs. John Bickel. Grandma's full brothers were Frank Allen and a sister Almada Allen Randall who lived in Pennsylvania. Grandma's family was David, Nora-my mother, William, Oliver, Edgar, Elza, Emma Blanche, and Mable Rowe (Sell). One brother Albert was killed at 20 by a train.

Grandma was a wonderful person, was left when her husband died at 52. Her youngest Mabel Rowe Sell was 3 years old, so she had a hard time in life. Mabel was left an orphan at 13, and the family of five was wiped out with typhoid fever. We then lived in Cleveland and mother (Nora) went out to care for them. It was all so sad, I remember going out and five died in the period of four months.

Mabel Rowe Sell had four children, Robert a builder, Paul a high school teacher, Ruth a housewife. Mary married a minister and college professor in Houghton, N.Y. Mary is a teacher, also. My aunt was and is a lovely person. She had many strokes and has been on her back. Is a wonderful Christian. She is an ordained Wesleyan Methodist minister, and yes, gave lectures all over. She was an eloquent speaker and spoke to large audiences and to all the churches in Canton, Ohio, where she lived many years. She graduated from Theology School in Cincinnati, then became Matron of Bethskare Home in Canton. After marriage she became Supt. of the home for many years and she was the means of helping many girls to become good women. She was loved and highly respected in Canton and did a lot of Court work. I was close to her as I moved to Dalton, Ohio, and it is 20 miles from Canton.

My mother's grandfather was Jacob Row and her father Zake. I think his name was Zachariah. Nora was the oldest daughter of Zake's. Geo. and brother Ez or Ed, and sisters were Hannah and Sarah Rowe. Hannah married to P. Ling and Sarah to H. Hoffmeyer. I remember them and visited with my parents in their home. Aunt Sarah lived in Hart, Mich. and Hannah in Steuben Co., Ind. Geo. was the father of Bertha Tuttle and Emma Getts. I am not sure who Della Wittig, wife of Fred was. Her sister Ella Deeds were cousins of mother on the Rowe side..and we were related to a John Rowe. I visited a Rowe about three years ago while at my cousin, Mrs. Husselman's home. His name, I am sure was Ora. He remembered us well and I think said we were cousins back away - maybe my grandfather. He was a Trustee and knew Earl Husselman well as he was a county commissioner 9 yrs. My cousin's husband also a cousin by marriage to Aunt Emma Rowe Husselman, mother's sister, and she had one son

Correspondence from Estella (Spindler) Warnock continued:

who owned the Hamilton News in Hamilton, Ind. He died suddenly a year ago. His half-brother was Oak Husselman, the attorney in Auburn, who also is deceased but has a son who is an attorney in Auburn. My cousin was Horace H. Geo. Rowe who married Aunt Harriet Shook was mother's uncle. He lived west of Hudson. Mother had a cousin Charles Rowe.

Mother had an uncle minister, either Ed or Chas. Rowe, and the other one was a cousin. Somewhere Della Wittig and Henry Deeds' wife, I think Ella was her name, were cousins of my mother. I remember as a little girl going to visit all these people. We belonged to the United Brethern Church and went to Maple Grove and sometimes to Hudson. At Maple Grove there was a Rowe family who they use to say was cousins in some way. Now bear with me, as I am doing this hurriedly.

I have Uncle Geo. Rowe and Aunt Harriet's picture. Do you have one? Also, Emma Rowe Getts and Bertha Rowe Tuttle.

Mr. and Mrs. Henry Row, 11409 South Row Rd., Monroeville are hosts for several family reunions this Summer in connection with the 100 year anniversary of family ownership of the Row farm.

Henry's grandfather, Daniel A. Row, purchased the farm in 1873. At the time he was a shoe cobbler in Monroeville where he lived with his wife and five children. He moved the family to the farm in 1882. Daniel was born Aug. 30, 1829, in Holmes Co., O., one of ten children of Andrew and Susanna (Sheneman) Row. He married Margaret Marquardt Aug. 30, 1868, in Allen Co., the youngest daughter of nine children of John and Ann Marquardt. Margaret was born April 9, 1849 and died Oct. 14, 1931. Daniel died in 1914. Of Daniel's six brothers and three sisters, the family has scattered to Iowa, Arkansas, Ohio and Michigan.

Henry's father, Samuel Row, inherited the farm with his brothers and sisters, then purchased their shares. Samuel was born in November 1873, married Nettie Freeze (1874-1946) of Van Wert Co., O. Samuel died in 1952. Daniel, Margaret, Samuel and Nettie are buried in the Monroeville Memorial Cemetery.

When Samuel died in 1952, Henry inherited the farm with his three brothers and two sisters, and purchased their shares, also. Henry married D. Lorraine Rohlf, Sept. 11, 1938. They are the parents of four children: Paul, Dorothy M., Owen and JoAnn. They also have four granddaughters.

My query happened to be in the same issue of the Fort Wayne News-Sentinel (Sat., June 16, 1973) as the very interesting Henry Row item on the left.

My parents, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Row, and his sister and husband, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Kressley, visited the Henry Row homestead several years ago.

Henry Row shares our common ancestor, Geo. Row³ (John², Geo.¹). According to Deed Records, Henry's grandfather Daniel Row was preceded to the Monroeville area by his first cousins, John Adam and Cornelius Row, and by a Henry Row, probably his older brother that later settled in St. Joseph Co., Ind. Cornelius went back to Holmes Co., Ohio after a short time but John Adam was there from about 1868 to 1900 when he moved to Hudson, Ind. John Frederick Row, John Adam's brother, moved to the Monroeville area, too, and seems to have been there for 20 years or so before moving to Garrett, Ind.

George Snellenberger was probably living or working in the neighborhood of the large Roush family, near Freeburg, Pennsylvania (then Northumberland Co. and now Snyder Co.). The 1790 Census lists an Anthony Snelleberger and these Roushs as well as the Rows who had a descendant who married the above George and Margaretha (Roush) Snellenberger's daughter Mary Magdalena, all listed on the same page and living near each other in Northumberland Co. and German Lutherans. Margaretha Roush's grandfather, George Casper Roush was born in Germany in 1721 and sailed for America from Rotterdam, Holland in 1742 on the British ship "Robert & Alice" and arrived in Philadelphia where he took the English oath of allegiance on Sept. 24, 1742. His wife was Anna Maria . In 1749 he was a landowner in Lancaster (now Lebanon) Co., Pa. and some of his older children were baptized at the Hill Church. About 1770 Casper Roush and other families (possibly Snellenberger and Row, too) moved into the section around Freeburg. In 1774 Casper Roush and Andrew¹. Morr, Sr. applied for land to build a church. Both of these men served in the Revolutionary War. Andrew Morr, Sr. was the father of Christina Morr who married Casper Roush's son John George and thus both of these men were our Margaretha Roush Snellenberger's grandfathers and through her our ancestors, too. See Snyder County Pioneers by Dr. Charles A. Fisher, 1938.

George Snellenberger moved to western Pennsylvania where most of his children were born. A death record in the Holmes Co, Ohio courthouse states that his daughter Mary Magdalena Row died June 10, 1868; aged 69 years; place of birth, Westmoreland Co., Pa.; parents, George and Mary Snellenberger. This would put George Snellenberger in Westmoreland County by 1799. An 1805 Tax List shows him living in Hemphill Twp., Westmoreland County. Census records indicate that all of his children were born in Pennsylvania except the youngest child born 1813 in Ohio. Records in Columbiana Co., Ohio show that George Snellenberger was granted a deed in Center Twp., Section 29 in 1813, and he is still living there at the time of the 1830 Census. At the time of the 1840 census he seems to be living with his son John in Hardy Twp., Holmes Co., Ohio. At the time of his death in 1854 he was a member of the St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Bucks Twp., Tuscarawas County, Ohio and his death record is recorded there in German, stating that he was the father of four sons and four daughters, all still living. That he was born on 11 April 1772 and died on the 29th of May and they buried him on the 31st, and further states that his wife was Margaretha Roush, and that she had eight children, all of them living.

JOHN AND CATHERINE (SHOCH) ROW

Since writing pages 20 and 21, new information has been received from Mrs. W. Dale Todd, 2409 Bay Blvd. #5, Indian Rocks Beach, FL 33435. While she and her daughter were researching the Todd line, they found Eli Todd and Anna Row were married on April 30, 1818 in Circleville, Pickaway Co., Ohio. Their further search in Pickaway County records revealed that Anna's parents were John and Catherine (Shoch) Row. They found an indenture dated June 7, 1815 which revealed that Catherine, wife of John Row, was a daughter and heir of the late Matthias Shoch of Northumberland county in the state of Pennsylvania. This indenture names the several heirs of Matthias Shoch, all of whom were residents at that time in Union Co., Pa., with the exception of Henry Shoch and Christina his wife and John Row and Catharina his wife, both couples residents of Pickaway County, Ohio. Death records in Pickaway Co., Ohio, show that John Row died Nov. 8, 1834, age 61 years, 11 months, 17 days and that Catherine Row died Dec. 9, 1845, age 73. Other records show that John Row came to Pickaway County in 1808.

These findings proved that we were dealing with two different John Row's on page 20. While I have not personally had the opportunity of doing research of legal records in Centre, Union, Synder and the parent county of Northumberland, I went again over the compilations of Dr. Charles A. Fisher of Selinsgrove, Pa., History of Centre and Clinton Counties, Pa., by John Blair Linn and his Annals of Buffalo Valley, tax records copied from original lists in the Northumberland court house by Mary Lontz, and the census records I have copied. I went through my many Row/Rowe notes that had not previously seemed applicable to this family, and found material from Sciota, Ross, and Pickaway Counties, as well as Putman County, Ohio, and some of this material was found to belong, after-all. Much, much more needs to be found.

Mrs. Todd sent a photocopy of another petition she found in Pickaway County, Ohio, filed Aug. 14, 1839 by Michael Row, demanding partition of certain real estate, names his mother, Catharin Row "the widow of John Row dec'd" and the other heirs, which gives us the names of the living children at that time, although not their order of birth:

ANDREW MORR, JR., was a son of Andrew Morr, Senior. He was born on Apr. 30, 1727, supposedly in Germany, and died in what is now Washington Twp., Snyder Co., and his will was probated at Sunbury, Pa. on May 18, 1801.....In 1758 Andrew lived in what is now Shaefferstown, Lebanon Co., Pa., but was then Heidelberg Twp. of Lancaster Co. His wife was Catherine Elizabeth _____, and she was born on Apr. 17, 1732. On Sept. 3, 1766, he made application for a warrant of survey for 160 acres adjoining the land of Geo. Bumbach and Charles Brunk, on the Middle Creek, in what is now Washington Township. Andrew and his father and their families came to the new land in 1770 or 1771. In 1772, "Widow of Andrew Morr" was assessed in Penn Township, but as Andrew evidently became the owner of his father's holdings, we do not find his name on the Penn tax list until 1776. In November of the year he was elected assessor of Penn Twp. and on Feb. 13, 1777 he was a member of the Committee of Safety for Penn Twp., and thus became one of those who helped establish our present country. In 1780 he was constable of Penn Twp. In 1781, he was assessed with 400 acres of land, a sawmill, gristmill, and personal property. In 1787, he was one of the viewers for the formation of Beaver Twp. In 1790, he was appointed a viewer to help fix the boundary lines of Mahantango Twp. In 1801, he lived in the village of Freeburg. The Lutheran Church, north of Freeburg, was sometimes known as Morr's Church, because Andrew and his father had much to do with the founding and support of it. In 1794, Andrew and his wife gave the church a fine silver communion set, which was inscribed with their names. This set is still in existence, although no longer in use. In addition to other property, Andrew owned an oil mill and a distillery. He dealt extensively in real estate, and at one time was one of the largest realty owners of this section. His wife, Catherine Elizabeth, died about 1795, and he married the widow Dewald. Andrew and his two wives are buried in the cemetery of old Zion or Morr's Church. Only the grave of his second wife is marked....The children of Andrew Morr and his first wife were: Christina, 1757-1793, (married John George Roush, a Revolutionary soldier).

JOHN GEORGE ROUSH was the 6th child of George Casper Roush and his wife, Anna Maria. "George" as he was commonly called, was born in what is today Lebanon Co., Pa., on Aug. 2, 1753, and died near what is today Freeburg, Pa., in 1822 or 1823, and is buried in an unmarked grave in the old Zion Lutheran Cemetery, about a mile north of Freeburg. His father is buried there, too. His first wife was Christina, the oldest daughter of Andrew Morr, Jr. She was born on Aug. 4, 1757, probably at Schaefferstown, Lebanon Co., Pa., and died near Freeburg on June 7, 1793. George came to what is now Washington Twp., Snyder Co., with his parents in 1770, or before....in 1787 he was taxed with 300 acres of land....In 1801, he contributed to the fund for the erection of the First Lutheran Church at Selingrove....The children of George and his first wife were, Margaret (Mrs. George Shellenberger, or Snellenberger, who moved to Ohio)....

* Row's Church at Salem, Pa. is only about 6 or 7 miles from Morr's Church north of Freeburg. I mentioned to some Rowe's at Salem that our Morr ancestor gave that church a silver communion set. They said "Oh, that famous set!?! Someone stole that a few years ago - it was in all the papers - it had everyone so upset. I don't think it was ever found."

Mary Krieger signed a receipt for \$6.00 due "my part of the estate of Michael Row" per 1850 Holmes Co., O. record. This indicates that she was the unmarried Michael's sister, and was, too, the daughter of Geo. and Anne Magdalena Row. Mary's m. record is recorded in Coshocton Co., O. (Holmes Co. had not yet been formed). Samuel Krieger's father, Jacob Kreiger; left a will dated May 16, 1813 in Coshocton Co., O., Will Book 1, p. 52, which mentions his wife Catherine; sons Jacob, Peter, Daniel, Samuel and John; daus. Elizabeth, Molly, Catherine, Gertrude, July and Susanna. Mentions property in branch valley, Pennsylvania. (Probably Brush Valley, Miles Twp., Centre Co., Pa. The 1797 Miles Twp., Centre Co. Taxable inhabitant list includes Jacob Kreiger and the 1801 Miles Twp. Centre Co. Taxable Inhabitant list includes, George, Jacob and Peter Kreiger.) The Execs. of Jacob's will were George Kreiger & Jacob Kreiger. The Witnesses: Conrad Roth, Daniel Kreiger and Henry Shannevan (probably Sheneman). In the 1840 C. Samuel & Mary (Row) Krieger were living in Crawford Twp., Coshocton Co., O., but in the 1850 C. they were living in German Twp., Fulton Co., Oh. Letter to Mr. and Mrs. Elijah Row of Benton, Ohio (see p. 38), from their niece, Lizzie Reyher (Eve Elizabeth). See p. 37. The letter is now in the possession of Elijah's grandson, Geo. Rowe of Millersburg, Ohio:

Garrett, Ind.

Monday evening

May 19, 1884

Dear Uncle and Aunt, We this afternoon received your letter bearing the sad news of your dear daughter's death. I condole with you most sincerely on this sad event, and if sympathy of friends can be any consolation under the trying circumstances, be assured that we all share in your sorrow for her loss, but her death teaches us that sooner or later we must all make the journey across that majestic river, let us hope therefore that in the golden summer of another life, children, mother and father will gather again in a sweet reunion, where sorrow and partings will be unknown.

We are all well but father's health is very poor, he has gone to Kansas. Started from home last Wednesday night and expected to arrive at Atchison, Kan. on Friday and remain there till this morning. So I presume he is on his way from Atchison to Larned at which place he will arrive sometime tomorrow morning. We have not heard from him since he left Chicago and I am getting so anxious to hear from him for he has been having spells of smothering nearly every night for the last two mon. One of the doctors says it is heart disease and is liable to drop off at any time. Some of the doctors say it is liver and kidney disease. At any rate I think his case is a very critical one and if the change of atmosphere does not help him I shall not have the least ray of hope of his recovery for he is getting pretty old and his whole system seems to be run down, I am just frantic to hear from him. He was fifty-eight years old one week ago to day. One week ago yesterday brother George and family and Aunt Rachel was down to see him and we gave him a little surprise. My stepmother was sick so I got up a big dinner for him prepared things at my house and took them out home without his knowledge and we children all clubbed together and got him a nice suit of clothes and presented him with it as a birthday gift. I wish you could have been here and seen how pleased he was. He said the thoughts of his children being so thoughtful of him pleased him many times more than the clothes did, but poor man he has always worked hard for his children and still works hard whenever he is able and often when not able. I will forward your letter to him at once. I hope when this reaches you it will find your family all rested to health when you write tell me how many children you have and give me their names. I have one little girl 19 months old. Brother George's have one boy and one little girl baby 4 months old. Isaiah's have three boys and one girl living and one boy and one girl dead. I must close for I can think of nothing to interest you but hope you will write to me soon. I will send you my baby's picture when I write again. Her name is Carrie Mabel. I am getting along well. Have a good husband he is a pardner in his father's drygoods and clothing store and is doing well. With these few remarks I close hoping to hear from you all very soon.

Obituary: Emma Ann Rowe, daughter of George W. and Harriet Shook Row was born on August 10th, 1872, in Fairfield Twp., DeKalb Co., Ind. On Aug. 19, 1890, was united in marriage to William F. Getts who preceeded her in death on April 29, 1927. Also a daughter, Edna Rigby on Dec. 28, 1925 and four sons, Clifford F. on Oct. 28, 1922, Harry V. on Oct. 28, 1935, Edgar W. and Perry E. who died in infancy preceeded their mother to her Eternal Reward. There are many Laudenslagers and Aurands throughout the cemetery, as well as Rowes. There are many Boyer, Romig, Luck, Woodruff, and some Erdly, Knause, Bower, Kessler, Kreamer, Mease, Fries, Stahl, Klinger, Miller, Mohr, Wilt, Benfer, Smith, Gearhart, Artley, Maurer, Fisher, Walborn, Gemberling, Stetler, Dietrich, Kramer, Wagner, Krouse, Hendricks, Shaffer, Shoch, Pontius, Kreider, Fisher and quite a few Bickel. I was able to spend only a couple hours at this beautifully situated church and cemetery in July 1977, and therefore could not copy many inscriptions.

"In the latter part of the year 1793, according to the authority of Rev. John Tomlinson, present pastor, Rev. Christian Espich, who was at that time at Sunbury, visited Penn's valley, and through his efforts Salem Evangelical Lutheran Church was organized and preparations made to build a church...The records from 1794 to 1799 are incomplete. The Rev. Christian Espich performed pastoral duties in the congregation until 1800, when the Rev. Ludwig Albrecht Wilhelm Ilgen, of Hehlingen, Markgrafschaft, Germany, was called to the charge. ..The Rev. Ilgen continued to serve the congregations connected with this charge, viz: Aaronsburg, Rebersburg, Loop, and Penn's Creek, until his death on the 20th of August, 1823." From Haines Township in the History of Centre Co., Pa. by John Blair Linn.

RAU-ROW-ROWE IN PENNSYLVANIA

Since learning that John Row was born in 1772 and died Nov. 8, 1834, in Circleville, Ohio, and that his wife, Catherine Shoch, daughter of Mathias Shoch was born about 1772, having died Dec. 9, 1845, at the age of 73, per Pickaway County, Ohio, records, I have re-evaluated my Pennsylvania Row/Rowe records. Please read the first two paragraphs of page 70.

The authors I have consulted all mention that the 1776 list of inhabitants/taxables for Penn Twp. was imperfect, damaged and/or not complete, nor do they all interpret the names exactly the same. However, there is general agreement that in 1776 the list of married men included 1) John Row 2) George Row 3) George Row, Jr. 4) Martin Row. One reports in addition another Martin which he interprets as "Martin Raw" and another copier interprets as "Martin Brau", so this may or may not have been a Row. I believe we can safely assume that all these four above mentioned men were at least 21 years of age and born in 1755 or probably earlier. Because of possible intermarriages with the Rau-Row-Rowe family, I will mention that the previously mentioned copiers of the tax/inhabitant lists also mention Tobias Bickle, Henry Kriger, George Laudenslager, Fight, George, and Jacob Levin-good, Martin, George and John Shoch, Lawrence Shallenberger, and Casper and George Roush - these were all in Penn Twp., Northumberland Co., Pennsylvania. Another copier also has the name of Jacob Raush, and another lists as a single man Simeon Bickle. Andrew Dellman is also found in one of the lists as a single man.

The 1780 tax lists show the same four Rau/Row men in Penns Twp., Northumberland County, In addition are 5) Martin Row, Jr. 6) Ludwig Row. This would seem to indicate that Martin, Jr. was born by 1759 as was Ludwig. This would indicate, I believe, that Martin Sr. was born by 1740.

The 1790 tax lists show a John, George and Martin Row - three Row men in Penn Township. From other records we know that both George Sr. and Martin Sr. had been killed by Indians. Also, in Penn Twp. are found John, Simon, and Tobias Bickle, and also a single man Tobias Bickle; Andrew Dillman; George Lantenslager; Valentine Loudesleger; Jacob Lebegut (Levengood?), Geo., Jacob, John and Philip Shock, Melchoir and Peter Stock, and Mathias Schoch, as well as single men John & Stophel Schock; Lorentz Shollenberger, Stophel Shatzberger, Casper and Geo. Roush. Not to be omitted in Anthony Snellenberger in Penn Twp. (3 males over 16 and 1 female).

A 1796 list in Mahantango Twp. (now Snyder Co., Pa.) includes Frederick, Sr. and John Albright; Jacob Eckhart; Jacob & John Livingood; Jacob Livingood, saw-mill; Jacob Roush, Sr., Jr.; Frederick Stah; John Stahl; no Rau/Row/Rowe found. (Annals of Buffalo Valley by John Blair Linn)

The 1799 additional taxables in Penn Twp. per Linn include a John and Frederick Row, masons.

The 1797 list in Haine's Twp. (Northumberland Co.) show Dietrich Row, and the 1801 list in Haine's Twp. shows Geo. Row (blacksmith) and John Row (weaver). Also, found are Geo. Pontius and John Neidigh. In the single men's list is Peter Row. (History of Centre & Clinton Co's. by Linn 1883.) Please see the same book for many other Pontius names; also check Annals of Buffalo Valley by Linn.
